Art. 1.1 Preamble

This event will be run in compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code (ISC) including appendices, the FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations (FIA CCRSR) including appendices, the WADA/NADA Codes, and the FIA Anti-Doping Regulations, as amended from time to time. The National Road Traffic Regulations of the countries the event passes shall apply. Unless provided otherwise by these Supplementary Regulations, the provisions of the above Rules and Regulations shall apply.

Any modifications, amendments and/or additions to the Rules and Regulations shall be made in the form of numbered and dated bulletins. Bulletins will be issued by the Organiser, up to the commencement of administrative checks with the approval of the FIA, after the administrative checks by the Stewards of the Meeting. Exceptionally, modifications to the itinerary may be made by the Organiser. Additional information will be published in the Rally Guide. All FIA regulations can be found at <https://www.fia.com/regulations>.

The various documents will be written in English *and hungarian*. In case of any discrepancy the English text will be binding.

The entry form must be accompanied by a copy of the valid competitor's licence. If one of the drivers will be the competitor, he must hold a valid a competitor's licence and a driver's competition licence.

Art. 4.2.3 FIA Baja Cups and Points

In order to score points, competitors **must register** with the FIA up to the closing date for entries for the first baja for which they wish to score points.

NEW - Selection of events (FIA World and European Baja Cups): The driver/team **must designate a maximum number of bajas** on which he wishes to score points:

- **Six (6)** for the **World Cup**
- **Six (6)** for the **European Cup**
- **Four (4)** for the **Middle East Cup**

This designation must be made before the closing date for entries for each baja, using the form on the FIA website (link above). **No changes** may be accepted **after the closing of entries** for each baja.

The FIA Baja Cups for **Teams** is reserved for **legal entities** holding a competitor’s licence. Only registrations with a proof of payment of the registration fee will be accepted.

Art. 4.5 Payment

Art. 4.6 Entry fee refunds

The entry fee shall be refunded in full:

- if the event does not take place
- to teams whose entry application is rejected.

The organiser may partially refund entry fees if a competitor cannot take part in the event due to a duly proved case of force majeure. The Organiser reserves the right to accept or reject the refund request. If so, subject to the written request reaching the organizer by email at info@hungarianbaja.com, the refund will be:

- 50 % refund for requests received until 7 days before administrative checks
- 0% refund for requests received less than 7 days before administrative checks

Art. 5. Insurance Cover

The Entry Fee includes a premium for Third Party liability insurance towards third parties during participation in Hungarian Baja.

Name of the insurance company: SRC SPECIAL RISK CONSORTIUM GMBH, Kuniberts kloster 7-9, D 50668 KÖLN.

The limit of the responsibility is 7.500.000 Eur.

- The insurance cover is provided under a Third Party Liability insurance policy arranged by the Organizer.
- The beneficiaries of the insurance cover are the competitors and their service personnel registered with the Organizer, the members of the organization, and the officials of the rally.
- The Third Party Liability insurance covers only damage caused to third parties. Any injury sustained by competitors themselves, as well as any injury or damage caused by one competitor to another, or damage to vehicles participating in the Baja, is not covered by this insurance. The Organizer declines all responsibility for theft or damage to equipment within the various organizational structures, even during hours when security services are in place.
- Competitors are free to take out individual personal accident insurance in addition to the above-mentioned Third Party Liability insurance. All competitors must hold personal accident insurance that includes coverage for repatriation expenses.
- Service vehicles, even those bearing special markings issued by the Organizer, are not considered official Baja participants. Therefore, they are not covered by the rally Third Party Liability insurance and

remain under the sole responsibility of their owners. Hungarian law requires that any vehicle used on public roads in Hungary must have its own valid Third Party Liability insurance, regardless of any additional insurance provided by the Organizer.

- The Organizer shall not be held liable for any damage or accident occurring to competitors or their vehicles during the entire event in cases of force majeure, including but not limited to catastrophes, riots, demonstrations, vandalism, pandemics, or similar events. Competitors and crew members shall bear all consequences (including damages, fines, and penalties) arising from such incidents. The Organizer shall not be liable for any violation of laws by participants.
- The Third Party Liability insurance cover shall come into effect at the beginning of the rally (as defined in FIA CCRSR Art. 2 and/or Supplementary Regulations, including Shakedown, Administrative Checks and Scrutineering opening times, whichever occurs first) and shall remain valid until the Stewards authorize the opening of the final Parc Fermé.
- Insurance coverage for retired or disqualified vehicles applies only to the official route of the rally as defined by the Organizer. Vehicles that retire or are disqualified remain covered provided they proceed directly to the finish control from the location of retirement or disqualification using the most direct route.
- In the event of an accident involving bodily injury or property damage, competitors and drivers waive any right to claim compensation and release the FIA, ASN, the event Organizers, and members of the Organizing Committee from any liability, and agree not to bring any legal action against them in civil or criminal courts in any jurisdiction.
- Third Party Liability insurance is valid during road sections (liaisons), provided that competitors fully comply with Hungarian traffic laws, including speed limits, traffic signs, and all applicable regulations.

Art. 6. Advertising and Identification

See Appendix 3 of these SR “Decals and positioning of supplementary advertising”.

The organiser will provide each crew with the advertising and identification panels, which must be affixed to their vehicles in the stated positions prior to scrutineering. No modifications to the panels are allowed. However, they may be cut out if the shape of the bodywork does not allow the panels to be affixed in one piece.

Art. 6.1 Obligatory organiser’s advertising

Rally plate:

Size of rally plates (width x height):

- General: 43x21cm
- Groups Challenger/SSV front plate: 19x18cm



These plates must be affixed, parallel to the wheel axle, to the front and rear of the Vehicle. These plates shall incorporate the Competitor's race number and may include advertising.

Size of race number panels (width x height):

- Groups Ultimate/Stock: 36x36cm
- Groups Challenger/SSV: 30x30cm

These panels must be affixed to the right and left sides of the vehicle, on the front door, in the area between the wheel arches provided they are fully visible from the side, and on the roof of the Vehicle, readable in the direction of travel.



Windscreen Band

This banner, which may incorporate the Competitor's race number, must be affixed to the upper part of the windscreen. No other advertising sticker may be affixed under it.

Size of windscreen band (width x height): 110x10cm

Spaces on the vehicle that must be kept free for:

- 1 sticker Scrutineering OK (on Driver's side)
- 1 sticker Emergency in the cockpits' dashboard visible by both crew members
- 2 stickers Emergency (both sides of the vehicle and as close as possible to the upper part of doors)

Spaces on the vehicle that must be kept free:

Size of optional advertising panels (width x height):

- Groups Ultimate/Stock: 36x36cm
- Groups Challenger/SSV: 30x30cm

For Groups Challenger/SSV, a metal bracket fixed to the rear rollbars can be added to allow the correct affixing of these panels.

At any time during the Baja, the absence or incorrect positioning of a race number or compulsory identification may incur a penalty as per Appendix I of the FIA 2026 CCRSR.

Art. 6.3 Driver's and Navigator's Identification

Art. 7. Tyres

Art. 7.1 Regulations regarding tyres which may be used during the event

See Art. 10 of the FIA CCRSR and Art. 10 of Variation V2 of the FIA CCRSR
The **maximum** number of tyres to be used by FIA T1+ Priority drivers is 10.

Art. 7.2 Identification of the tyres

In accordance with Art. 10.6 of the FIA CCRSR, FIA Priority drivers entered with Class T1+ vehicles must use tyres fitted with FIA barcodes.

If a tyre is also equipped with a specific permanent RFID Tag approved by the FIA (see FIA Technical List No. 54) and integrated in the tyre during the production process, before moulding and before the vulcanisation of the tyre itself, the data of the RFID Tag may also be used to identify this tyre.

Art. 8. Fuel / Refuelling

All type of fuel must follow Appendix J Art. 266. (Art. 56 of the FIA CCRSR).

The use of a Diesel fuel in compliance with Appendix J Art. 266-B.2.3 (Paraffinic Diesel, including HVO) or Art. 266-B.3.3 (AS Diesel) is mandatory for all T1+ class vehicles fitted with a Diesel engine.

Art. 8.1 Technical Requirements

See Art. 56.2 of the FIA CCRSR (Refuel Couplings)

Art. 8.2 Refuelling Zone

Refuelling may only be carried out at fuel stations indicated in the Road Book. The team is responsible for refuelling operations.

The presence of appropriate fire extinguishing equipment and/or adequate safety measures is mandatory at any refuelling area.

Commercial filling stations are listed in Appendix 7 to these Supplementary Regulations.

Art. 9. Administrative checks

Art. 9.1 Documents to be presented:

(see Art. 22 of the FIA CCSR)

To keep the time required for the administrative checks to the necessary minimum, make sure to bring and present the following documents:

- Competitors' licence
- Driver's and navigator's competition licences (if one of the drivers should be the competitor, he must also hold a competitors' licence)
- Driver's and navigator's ID cards/passports
- Driver's and navigator's valid driving licences valid for the vehicle entered.
- Driver's and navigator's signed *Driver's declaration and undertakings* forms
- ASN authorisation for all foreign competitors and/or drivers and navigators
- Completion of all details on the entry form
- Vehicle registration certificate
- Authorisation of the owner of the vehicle (if different from the competitor)
- Valid Compulsory Vehicle Liability Insurance of the competing vehicle

Art. 10. Scrutineering, Sealing and Marking

Art. 10.1 Scrutineering, venue, and time

Cars may be presented at scrutineering by a representative of the team. See programme (SR Art. 3)

Art. 10.1.1 Scrutineering, mandatory documents

- Cars' complete original FIA Homologation Document (if applicable)
- FIA Technical Passport
- SOS / OK board (DIN A3 format)

The installation of the tracking system and the NAV-GPS will be checked at scrutineering.

The complete original FIA homologation form / FIA Technical Passport and all other necessary certifications/documents must be available for final checks.

Art. 10.1.2 Timetable for scrutineering

See programme (SR Art. 3)

/Individual times to be published in a Bulletin.

A time control (C1) will be installed immediately before administrative checks

Any delay at the presentation at this time control will result in the following fines:

From 1 to 15 minutes	150,00€

Art. 10.2 Drivers' safety equipment

All items of clothing including helmets and FHR (Front Head Restraint) intended to be used, e.g. HANS devices, must be presented for scrutineering. They shall be checked for compliance with Appendix L, Chapter III.

Each vehicle must be equipped with a medical kit from the FIA Technical List n°83, that must be placed inside the cockpit, and a survival kit according to FIA CCRSR Appendix IV-2.1 and the defined Safety Type (see SR Art. 1.4).

Art. 10.3 Installation of the Safety Tracking System and Navigation System

Art. 10.3.1 Safety Tracking System (FIA CCRSR Art. 12.1)

All vehicles must **only** be fitted with the Safety Tracking System(s), provided by the Organiser. The system used during the event will be Geotraq. The instruction for the use of the Tracking System is in the Appendix 5 of these Supplementary Regulations.

The system will be provided at the administrative check and must be installed before the competing vehicle is brought to scrutineering. A €400 deposit (cash euro only) is required for the GPS safety and navigation system, which will be refunded at the end of the competition upon returning the device undamaged. Returning will be at the entrance of Parc Ferme on Saturday, 15th August, or at Rally HQ Secretary in case of retirement.

Art. 10.3.2 Navigation System (NAV-GPS; FIA CCRSR Art. 12.2)

Competitors are obliged to be equipped with one or two Navigation System(s) (NAV-GPS) downloaded with the waypoints given by the Organiser. When a crew uses two NAV-GPS, the primary one will be identified by the supplier with a distinctive label. If a crew wishes to be equipped with two navigation systems (NAV-GPS), this must be indicated on the Entry Form. The additional fee for the second NAV-GPS is €200 + €400 deposit.

The system used during the event will be Geotraq.

Art. 10.3.3 Connection of the Systems (FIA CCRSR Art. 12.3)

The specifications for the standard power connector are laid down in the FIA CCRSR Appendix VI.

It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that the Safety Tracking System(s) and the NAV-GPS always remain permanently connected and switched on with the antenna connected throughout the duration of the competition.

Art. 10.4 On-Board Cameras

See FIA CCRSR Article 11.

Competitors wishing to use an on-board camera must declare this on the Entry Form. The installation of the camera shall be checked during Scrutineering. If the installation complies with the applicable

regulations, an authorization sticker will be issued and must be visibly affixed to the vehicle.

Upon request of the Organizer or any Official, the recordings must be handed over at the end of the relevant Selective Section.

Art. 10.5 Electronic Equipment

Any radio or electronic means of communication, or any other device not expressly permitted in FIA CCRSR regulations is forbidden on board the vehicles.

Art. 11. Other procedures and regulations

Art. 11.1 Drivers' Briefing(s)

See programme (SR Art. 3)

At the first briefing of the event, the participation of at least one crew member is compulsory.

Art. 11.2 Start Area

A Parc Ferme, which will operate as a pre-start area, will be located at Várpalota Főter, behind the Thury Castle: <https://maps.app.goo.gl/mmNXiq98RJyLddp49>.

This will open at 11:00 on 14th August and all cars must be in place by 13:00. Vehicles may be brought by a team representative. The time of entry will be recorded by officials.

Late arrival at this Parc Ferme will be penalised as follows:

For every minute late - €10 fine

The first Time Control of the race (see Appendix 1 – Itinerary) will be located at the exit of the Parc Fermé. Competitors must report to this Time Control according to the Starting List and at their due time, as communicated via DNB.

Art. 11.3 Ceremonial start procedures and order

On Friday evening (14.08.2026), all participants shall proceed from the Parc Fermé to the Starting Ceremony in accordance with the Ceremonial Start List and under the direction of the marshals. Returning to the Parc Fermé after the ceremony is mandatory.

Art. 11.4 Electronic start procedure at Selective Sections

The start of the Selective Section will be controlled by an electronic clock and light system connected to a false start detection system.

When arriving at the start line, the front of the vehicle must be positioned behind the reference marker placed by the marshal indicating the exact starting position. One minute before the start time, and only after the vehicle has come to a complete stop in the correct position, the marshal will remove the marker and the crew shall follow the automatic countdown clock.

The start will be given by means of a light signalling system. A digital display will continuously show the countdown.

The marshals will call out the remaining 30, 15 and 10 seconds and then point towards the starting equipment. From 55 seconds onwards, the red lights will flash once per second. At 00 seconds, the red lights will switch off and the green lights will illuminate. This will indicate the start signal.

Any movement of the vehicle after the marker has been removed and before the start signal is given is prohibited and will be reported to the Stewards.

Art. 11.5 Prologue

A Prologue will be held in the form of a Selective Section and shall determine the starting order for Stage 1. Participation in the Prologue is mandatory. The start interval between competitors shall be identical and at least one minute.

Any crew failing to participate in or complete the Prologue shall be classified in the last position of their respective group. If several crews are in this situation, they shall be classified according to their starting order.

The Prologue shall not count towards the overall classification of the event.

See FIA CCRSR Art. 33.1 for the start order selection procedure.

Reconnaissance of the Prologue is prohibited.

Art. 11.6 Finish procedures

At the end of Stage 2, crews shall bring their vehicles into Parc Fermé located at Várpalota, behind the Thury Castle: <https://maps.app.goo.gl/mmNXiq98RJyLddp49> in accordance with the official timetable on Saturday, 15 August.

Art. 11.7 Permitted early check-in.

Early-check in is allowed at TC1D, TC1F and TC4A

Art. 11.8 Official time used during the event.

Official time throughout the entire rally will be GPS time (GMT +2).

Art. 11.9 Road books delivery

The Organiser will issue the Road Book one day at a time as follows:

- At Administrative Checks: Road Book for Shakedown Stage.
- Before Briefing: Road Book for Prologue + Stage 1, time 13:00
- Upon entering Parc Fermé after the Ceremonial Start: Road Book for Stage2

The official and only Road Book of the event is the hardcopy one.

Art. 11.10 Servicing of vehicles

Art. 11.10.1 Service Areas

Location: Gál Gyula Sportcsarnok, 8100 Várpalota, Fehérvári str. 9.

From TCP0 onwards, service of a competing car may be carried out in Service Areas (Service Parks) and road sections as permitted under the FIA CCRSR.

Access to the Service Park will only be permitted for vehicles and accompanying team cars displaying the official Service/Truck Stickers provided by the Organizer at Registration (Gál Gyula Sport Hall, Várpalota, Fehérvári Street 9). One (1) service sticker per team and a 50 m² service area are provided by the Organizer.

Tampering with or falsifying these stickers will result in the disqualification of the team concerned, upon decision of the Stewards. The stickers must be affixed in a clearly visible position inside the front windscreen of the vehicle.

Car washing and refuelling are strictly prohibited within the Service Park. The only permitted car wash facility is the official car wash (self service) located close to the Service Park: <https://goo.gl/maps/JpHuu1K7uynQRSjK6>

The maximum speed within the Service Park is **30 km/h**.

Trailers must be parked in the designated area outside Service Park.

Art. 11.10.2 Service allowed in Selective Section

In accordance with article 49 of the FIA CCR SR, any service is forbidden during Selective Sections. Only crews with FIA groups vehicles still in the competition for the current Stage/SS may assist each other.

Art. 11.10.3 Flexi Service

Art. 11.11 Shakedown

Participation must be indicated on the entry form, and payment must be made at the same time as the race entry fee.

SERVICE AREA: The Organiser will provide a service area near the Shakedown where servicing of competition vehicles will be allowed.

RUNNING OF THE SHAKEDOWN

Inside the vehicle, all competitors must wear FIA-homologated clothing and safety equipment in accordance with Appendix L.

All vehicles shall start at 2-minute intervals. The starting order shall be based on the order of arrival at the pre-start area.

After the Shakedown, participants must place their vehicles in Parc Fermé between 11:00 and 13:00.

Art. 11.12 Special procedures and activities

Participants who park their vehicles in the Parc Fermé upon passing the finish line, must remain available by phone (mobile) until the final classification have been posted.

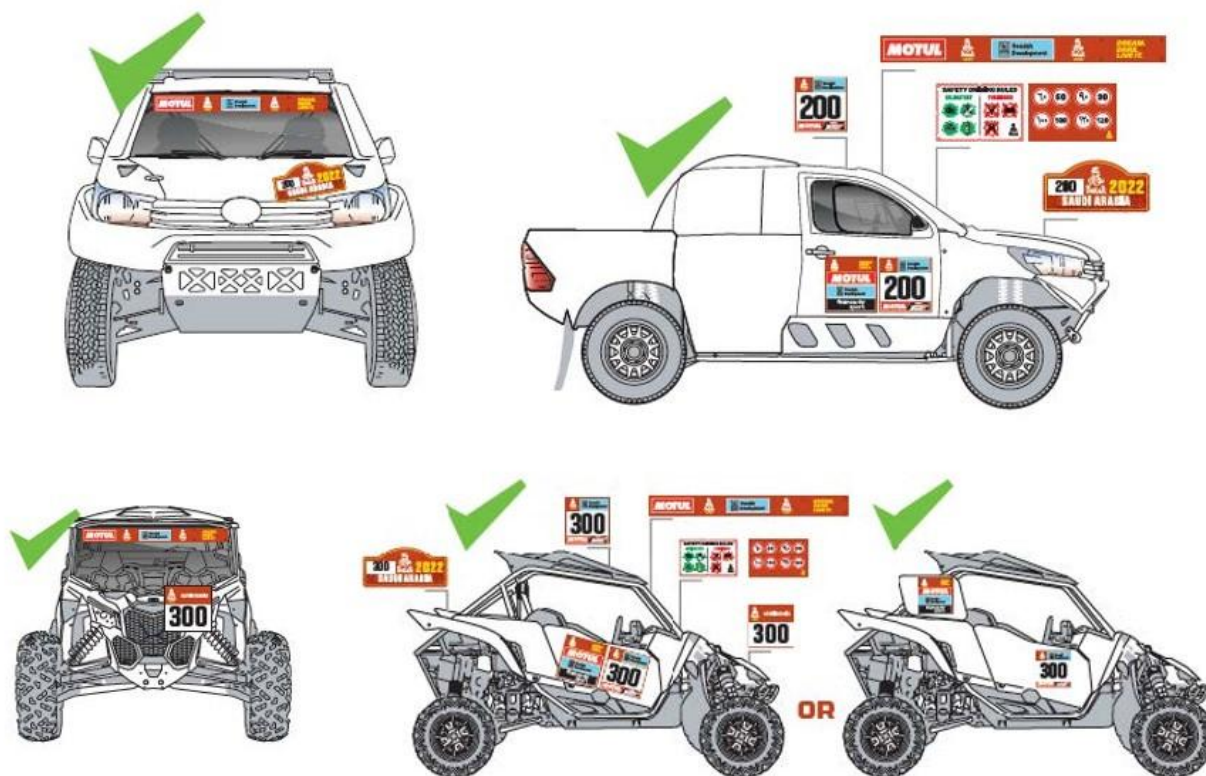

Appendix 4 – Extracts from FIA ISC Appendix L relating to overalls, helmets and any other safety requirements.

All competitors are reminded of Appendix L of the FIA International Sporting Code, in particular its Chapter III - Drivers' Equipment.

Helmets (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 1)

All crews must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the FIA standards listed in Appendix L.

Wearing an open-face helmet is prohibited on vehicles that are not designed with a windshield.

Crews of vehicles without windscreens must wear full-face helmets, of which the chin bar is an integral part of the helmet structure.

Frontal Head Restraint (FHR, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3)

All crews must use FIA approved FHR systems homologated to FIA standard 8858.

Approved FHRs, anchorages and tethers are listed in Technical List N° 29.

See also helmet compatibility chart in Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3.3.

Flame-resistant clothing (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2)

All drivers and navigators must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for navigators), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2018 (Technical List N° 74). Please pay special attention to the prescriptions of Art. 2 **concerning the correct wearing of the clothing elements! See also FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations Article 47.1.**

Any FIA-approved 8856-2018 garment customised using printing or transfers must be accompanied by a certificate from the manufacturer.

Overgarments

If necessary due to weather conditions and after approval of the Clerk of the Course, it is allowed to use a waterproof overgarment on top of the drivers' equipment, provided it complies with EN 14116 standard. The use of garments with index 3 is strongly recommended.

Biometric Devices (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2.1)

Drivers may wear a device to collect biometric data during racing.

- If the biometric device is integrated into a protective garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856, the garment shall be homologated to FIA Standards 8856 and 8868-2018.
- If the biometric device is a stand-alone device, then the device must be homologated to FIA Standard 8868-2018 only. This device must be worn in addition to the garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856.

Wearing of jewellery (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 5)

The wearing of any type of jewellery, such as but not limited to, neck chains, bracelets or watches is prohibited during the competition. Exceptions to this rule, providing the CMO and/or Medical Delegate do not consider that due to size or location they may delay rescue or hinder emergency care, are:

- i. the wearing of watch(es) by navigators, on the condition that the watch(es) is worn over the overall,
- ii. the wearing of a single band-style ring providing it does not restrict the natural range of motion of the hand, and
- iii. the wearing of body piercing(s) providing they are not worn in and/or around the oral cavity.

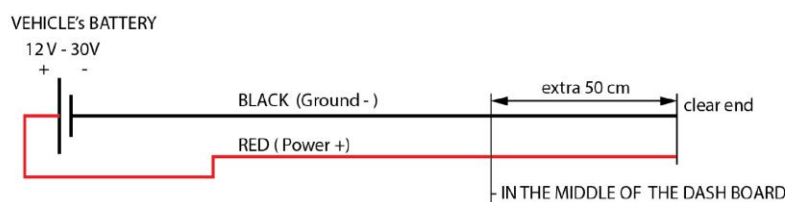

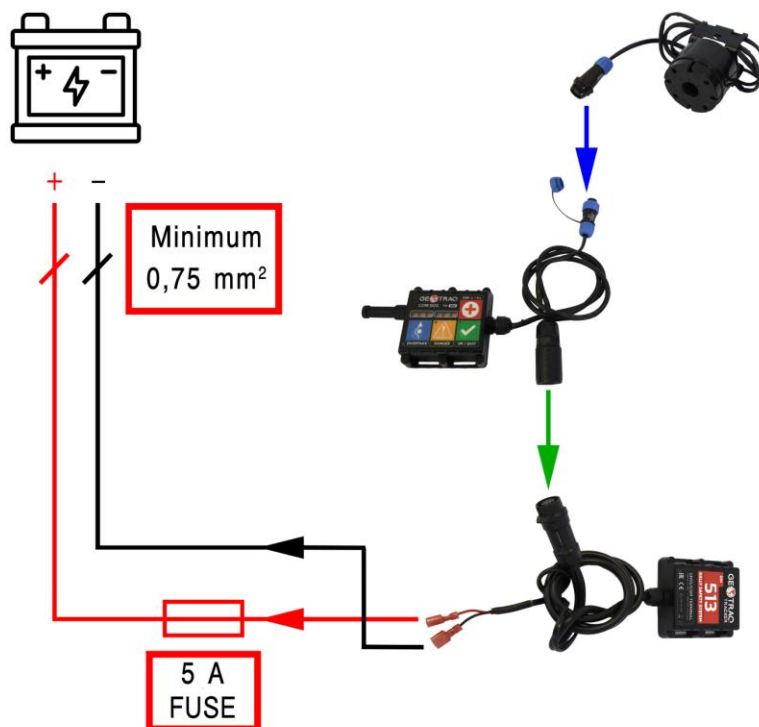
STEP 2 – PREPARE POSITIVE AND NEGATIVE CABLE FROM THE BATTERY TO THE DASH BOARD AND INSTALL INSULATED TERMINAL CONNECTORS (ONLY THOSE SUPPLIED BY THE ORGANISATION)

- **IMPORTANT! THE BATTERY MASTER CUT-OFF (KILL) SWITCH MUST NOT DISCONNECT THE POWER SUPPLY FOR THE RALLY SAFETY SYSTEM.**
- It is the responsibility of the competitors alone to provide, **DIRECT POWER SUPPLY** from the vehicle's battery according to the drawings provided.
- The power cables **MUST** be "flexible" (multi wire), insulated cables – 2 x min 0.75 to 1.25 mm² (**WITH RED** for positive (+) wire and **BLACK** for negative (-) wire insulation color).
- The connection **MUST** have an IN-LINE FUSE - "BLADE TYPE" of 5A.

TERMINAL CONNECTORS

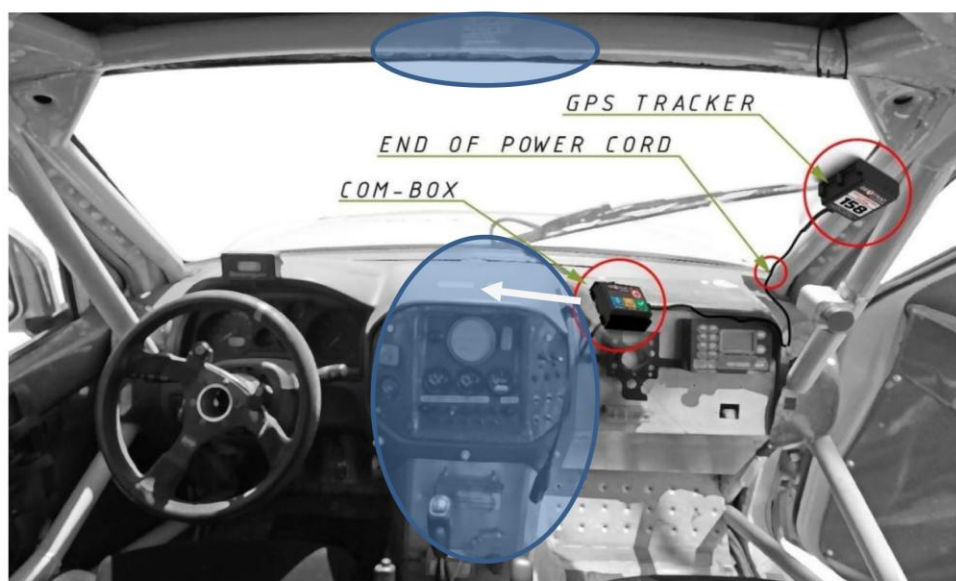
STEP 3 – MOUNTING THE SYSTEM - OVERVIEW

- IMPORTANT! USE PROPER TOOLS TO CRIMP THEM!**

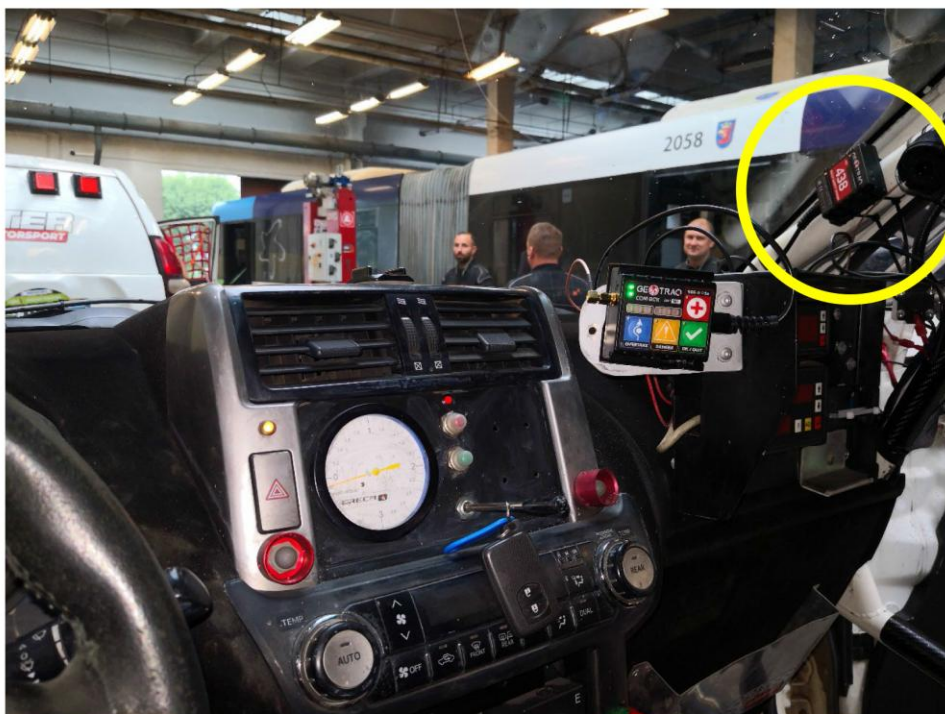


Following a change in the regulations, the 'Com-box' must be mounted in a central location as per indicated areas in blue, to enable both driver & co-driver to be able to reach the SOS button from their seat with seatbelts on. Shown are the mounting positions of the system components.

STEP 4 – MOUNT THE GPS TRACKER ON THE PROPER POSITION

- The best position is the “A-pillar” of the roll cage, or the horizontal member of the roll cage, with the tracker facing upwards.

- **IMPORTANT! THE GPS TRACKER MUST HAVE VISIBILITY TO THE SKY (NO METAL ON TOP OF THE DEVICE)**
- **IMPORTANT! INSTALLATION IS DONE WITH CABLE TIES THROUGH THE HOLES OF THE BASE OF THE DEVICE**
- **IMPORTANT! POSITION THE DEVICE IN SUCH A WAY THAT NO DIRECT DAMAGE CAN BE DONE!**



Installation of the GPS TRACKER on the roll cage “A-pillar” of a Car using cable ties.

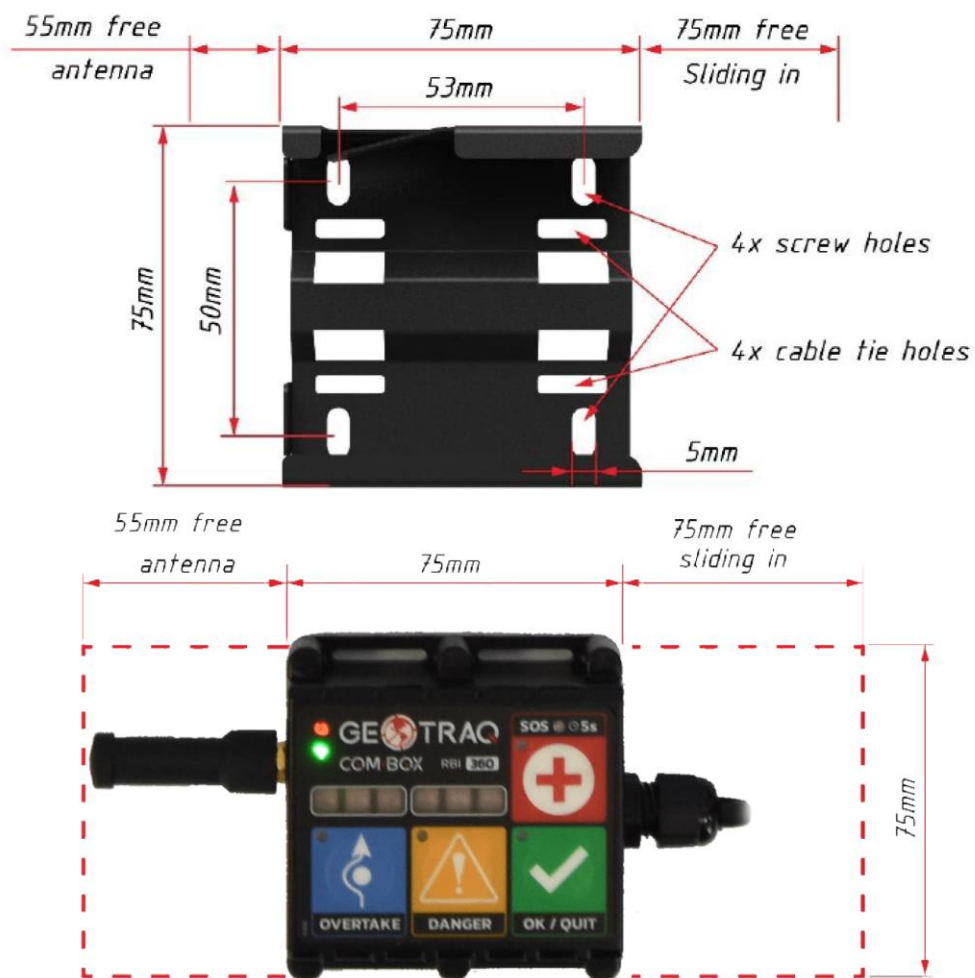
STEP 5 – MOUNT THE COM-BOX MOUNTING BRACKET AND INSERT THE COM-BOX UNIT ON THE PROPER POSITION

- You can bolt the mounting bracket as shown in the graphics below, or you can use industrial grade velcro or double-sided tape to stick it to a good surface or use cable ties to fix it to a central location on the dashboard or to the overhead tube of the roll cage above the centre of the dashboard.
- If needed, additional opening can be drilled to fix it on the required position.

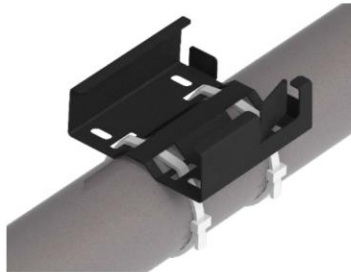
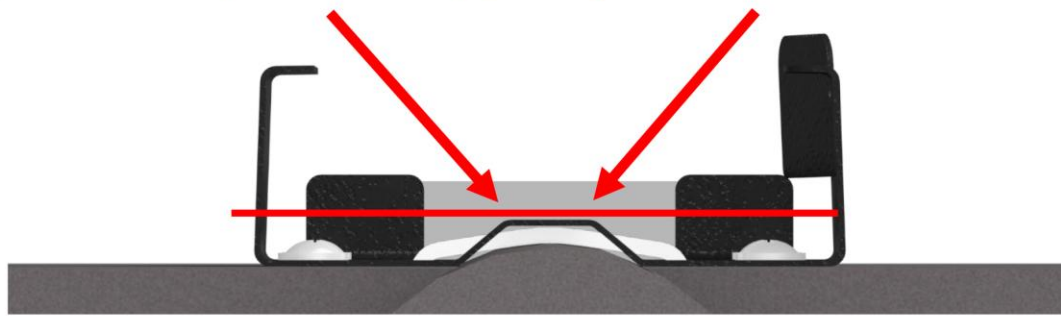

- **IMPORTANT! ENSURE THERE IS SUFFICIENT SPACE AT THE SIDE OF THE UNIT TO ENABLE THE ANTENNA / EXTENSION TO BE FITTED AND SLIDE THE UNIT INTO THE BRACKET!**



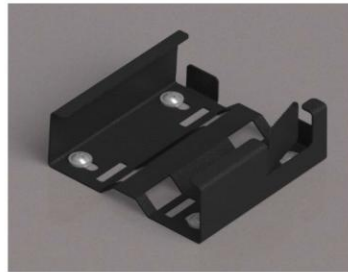
Installation of the Com-Box unit with bracket on the dashboard using bolts. **This must be in a CENTRAL location and not as indicated above, only in front of the co-driver.**

- When the mounting bracket is securely installed, you can slide-in the Com-Box unit in.
- When slid in you MUST lock the device in place by pushing the top locking mechanism.



- **IMPORTANT! THE ANTENNA NEEDS AT LEAST 55mm ON ALL SIDES TO WORK PROPERLY! MAKE SURE NOT TO PLACE IT RIGHT NEXT TO OTHER METAL COMPONENTS!**

STEP 6 – CHECK THE STATUS OF THE RALLY SAFETY SYSTEM.

- First, make sure the antenna is connected (optional extension cable and antenna)
- Second, check the blue connectors (buzzer) are tight
- Third, check the connection of the black connectors between the GPS Tracker and the Com-Box unit
- Finally check the connection of the 2 power terminals (positive and negative)

- **IMPORTANT! WHEN CONNECTING THE POWER TERMINAL MAKE SURE YOU HAVE THE PROPER POLARITY – RED is POSITIVE, BLACK is NEGATIVE!**
- **IMPORTANT! IF ALL THE COMPONENTS ARE CONNECTED PROPERLY, THE COM-BOX UNIT WILL DISPLAY A “GREEN STATUS” ON THE BATTERY ICON AND “BLUE/GREEN STATUS” on the RADIO ICON**

STEP 7 – FINAL INSPECTION AT SCRUTINEERING

- Install the cables loosely using only a few cable ties and in such a way that they can be clearly checked at scrutineering.
- Only **after** you receive **APPROVAL** from the Scrutineer and/or the GPS Technician, you can fully fasten the cables onto the vehicle using cable ties. **DO NOT** overuse cable ties!
- **DO NOT** use insulating or any other tape to group the cables.

- **IMPORTANT! DO NOT PLACE THE CABLES FOR THE SYSTEM IN DIFFICULT OR HIDDEN PLACES (INSIDE THE DASHBOARD OR HARD TO REACH LOCATIONS). THE INSTALLATION WILL BE CHECKED TO ENSURE THE SYSTEM AND ADDITIONAL COMPONENTS ARE PROPERLY INSTALLED AND OPERATIONAL AT SCRUTINEERING AND IF REQUIRED, YOU WILL NEED TO REROUTE THE WIRING.**

STEP 9 – RETURNING THE SYSTEM

When it's time for you to return the system from your vehicle you **MUST** do this in the following order:

- First disconnect the negative (-) wire, then disconnect the positive (+) wire from the cable from your vehicle's battery at the female quick connect terminals.
- Second disconnect the COM-BOX - TRACKER cable
- Third disconnect the Buzzer – COM-BOX cable

IMPORTANT! WHEN YOU RETURN THE SYSTEM TO THE GPS DESK, YOUR EQUIPMENT WILL BE CHECKED FOR DAMAGE & DEFECTS AND IF FOUND – YOU WILL BE REQUIRED TO PAY FOR THE DAMAGE TO THE EQUIPMENT ACCORDING TO THE GEOTRAQ PARTS LIST!

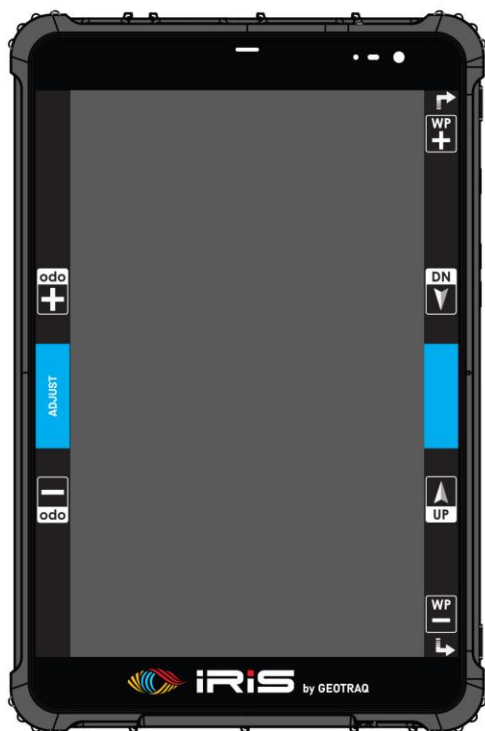

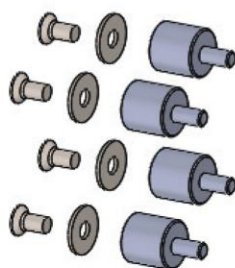

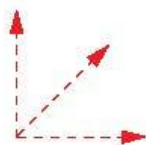
