1 INTRODUCTION AND WELCOME

1.1 WELCOME

The *Rallye du Chablais* celebrates its 20th edition this year and will be part of the FIA European Rally Trophy, the Swiss Rally Championship, the Junior Swiss Rally Championship, and the Swiss Historic Rally Cup.

The *Rallye du Chablais* wishes to maintain the basis of its success, the friendly atmosphere, the warm welcome, the attentive detail to service and assistance, up-to-date technology and comfortable facilities focussed on each participant.

In addition to the organiser's attention to detail, this is a wonderful showcase for the region, with a varied route, mainly on asphalt roads between lake and mountains. A warm welcome awaits you in the picture-postcard countryside in the principal resorts and towns of the Chablais regions of Vaud and Valais.

The Headquarters are based in Aigle (60 km or 37.3 miles from Lausanne) serves as the focus for the route which passes through famous places in the valley and in the mountains: Villars, les Diablerets, les Mosses, Collombey, Champéry, Val-d'Illiez, Monthey, St-Maurice, Evionnaz, Lavey-les-Bains and Bex. The whole region is criss-crossed by a variety of Special Stages.

The 20th Rallye du Chablais will begin on Thursday 30. May 2024, with Administrative and Technical Scrutineering. An official cocktail for the crews will take place in Aigle from 7:30 pm. Departure of the first leg will take place on Friday morning with 8 Special Stages in the programme. On Saturday 1st June, the second leg will be held, followed by the final Rallye finish and then the evening in Aigle.

1.2 HISTORY OF THE RALLYE DU CHABLAIS

Since 1982, the region has hosted a car rally. Previously known as the Rallye des Alpes Vaudoises, the *Rallye du Chablais* has existed in its present form since 2004. The best Swiss teams are to be found amongst previous prize-winners.

Moreover, since 2006, we have benefited from the patronage of the best rally driver of all time: Sébastien Loeb! The multiple world champion has already competed several times in the Rallye. His participation is incredibly fortunate and a wonderful vote of confidence for the entire organising team!

During previous editions (pre-pandemic), Ari Vatanen has also honoured us with his presence as well as opening the VHC Rally! He will certainly be amongst us this year again.

1.3 DESCRIPTION

Traditionally, the *Rallye du Chablais* lasts from the Thursday to the Saturday evening. Administrative Scrutineering and Technical Scrutineering will take place on Thursday, and in the evening, there is a reception to welcome and meet the teams, officials and partners, thus officially launching the event. The two Legs are held on Friday and Saturday. The Saturday evening is devoted to Prize-Giving and celebrations.

The *Rallye* route comprises around 600 kilometres (372.82 miles) of which 166 kms (100 miles) are speed stages. There are 14 Special Stages. Reconnaissance of the course will therefore be limited because 7 different stages are run twice. The length of the stages varies from 7 to 20 kilometres (4.35 - 15.53 miles).

The uniqueness of the *Rallye* lies in the physical difficulties of the terrain for the drivers as well as for the mechanics; the Stages unfold between the altitudes of 400 - 1,800 metres (1,312 - 5,906 feet).

1.4 GEOGRAPHY

The nerve centre of the *Rallye* is Aigle (Headquarters, Start Point and Service Park), several kilometres from Lake Geneva (*Lac Léman*), and at the crossroads of the routes crossing the Alps towards France (Chamonix via the Col de la Forclaz), towards Italy (Aosta via the Grand-Saint-Bernard Pass or Tunnel, Domodossola by the Simplon Pass), and the main motorway links towards Lausanne or Berne leading to other parts of Switzerland.

1.5 ORGANISATION

The *Rallye du Chablais* is run by an executive committee of 9 volunteers and by an expanded committee of 60 members, who are responsible for different departments.

During the *Rallye*, the Clerk of the Course can depend on a staff of 300 people of whom 250 are volunteers, from marshals to the qualified emergency medical staff, from timekeepers, fire-fighters, breakdown services to all kinds of technical personnel.

The *Rallye* benefits from the support of local and national radio stations as well as the various Swiss television channels. Around 80 Press accreditations will be issued.

5,000 copies of the official programme comprising 130 pages of media and publicity information in a full-colour A4 format will be published. There will also be a national advertising campaign with prominently displayed posters along with radio and television coverage. The *Rallye* will also produce its own 13-minutes long television programme, which will be distributed to all interested parties.

The military, political, cantonal and tourist authorities provide invaluable support for the *Rallye du Chablais* for which we are extremely grateful.

1.7 INFORMATION CONCERNING THE RALLYE DU CHABLAIS 2024

As a round of the FIA 2024 European Rally Trophy, the Rallye will take place from 30. May to 1st June and will count equally towards the Swiss Rally Championship, the Swiss Rally Cup, the Swiss Junior Rally Cup, the Michelin Trophy and the Swiss Historic Rallies Cup.

Since its inception, the Rallye du Chablais has succeeded in evolving and at the same time keeping its traditional characteristics. As usual, the 20th edition proposes an itinerary in which each Leg will start and finish from Aigle. The competitors will battle it out over two full days in the Chablais region where the roads seem to have been specifically laid out for Special Stages. There will be 14 Special Stages which will cover 166 kilometres (100 miles).

The action begins on Thursday evening with the presentation ceremony.

On Friday three Stages will be run twice, with regrouping in Aigle and then access to the Service Park.

Saturday morning, there will be a further two Special Stages which will be driven twice with regrouping in Monthey, followed by access to the Service Park.

After the lunch break, two further Special Stages will be run twice with regrouping in the Val-d'Illiez.

Saturday from 6.30pm, crews who have finished the Rallye can mount the podium set up at the Former Military Arsenal, Aigle. **Prizegiving will take place from 09.00 pm.**

B TEMPORARY IMPORTATION FORMALITIES FOR VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT

8.1 Temporary importation

As Switzerland is not part of the European Community, you must present one of the following documents to Customs when crossing the border with your vehicle and spare parts:

- An ATA Carnet (which may be obtained by French applicants from their local Chamber of Commerce and Industry).
- A temporary import request (DDAT) which can be completed at the border with the help of a freight agent.

The ATA Carnet is recommended as it is considerably less restrictive than a DDAT.

8.2 Temporary authorization for HGVs (Heavy Good Vehicles)

Night driving in Switzerland (from 10 pm to 5 am) and from midnight on Saturday until midnight on Sunday is forbidden to the following categories:

- Truck-trailer combinations over 5 tonnes maximum gross weight
- Vehicles with a trailer of over 3.5 tonnes maximum gross weight

80 km/h A-Roads, single roads and dual carriageways

120 km/h Motorways (100 km/h through tunnels)

Alcohol/Drugs

The blood-alcohol limit is 0.5 per 1000 with zero tolerance for drugs.

Safety Belts

Seat belts must be always worn by the driver and all passengers in a vehicle.

Motorway Tolls – see Article 8.3 of the Rallye Guide.

All vehicles must drive with dipped headlights on during the day.

Speed Checks

Please be aware that there are many speed checks along roads and motorways in Switzerland. The different police forces are equipped with the latest fixed and mobile radar speed detectors. Exceeding the speed limit in a build-up area of more than 15 km/h or 25 km/h on the motorway is a very serious offence which can lead to the immediate withdrawal of your driving licence.

Permission to drive at night or on a Sunday for HGVs - see Article 8.2 of the Rally guide.

APPENDIX 1 : ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Pedestrian access to the Special Stages is free.

1 SAFETY / RED FLAGS

A reminder of the FIA safety regulations:

If the use of red flags is necessary, the following procedures will be adopted:

- a) A red flag must be available at each radio point of the Special Stages (situated at intervals of roughly 5 km/3 miles).
- b) A red flag may not be shown to crews without the express order of the Clerk of the Course, and only shown from the radio points. The flags are to be deployed solely by a marshal who is wearing an easily identifiable tabard (see recommendation in Article 5.2.6) marked with the *radio point* symbol. The time of deployment of the red flag will be noted and the Clerk of the Course will notify the Stewards' Panel.
- c) During Reconnaissance, a road sign with the symbol specified in Article 5.5.4.4 below, must be placed at the site of each radio point. The panel may be small but must be clearly visible to crews taking part in Reconnaissance so they can make a note of the locations in their Road Book.
- d) When a driver passes a deployed red flag, he/she must slow down immediately and maintain that reduced speed until the end of the Special Stage, then follow the instructions given by marshals or drivers of safety vehicles which he/she will encounter. The red flags will be deployed at all radio points preceding the incident.

Failure to obey this rule will entail a penalty at the discretion of the Stewards.

e) No other flag, apart from a red flag may be deployed during a Special Stage.

2 SOS AND OK SIGNS — COMPETITOR SAFETY

a) Each competing car must carry a red reflecting warning triangle, which, in the event of a car stopping within a Special Stage, must be placed in a clear position by a member of the crew at least 50 m (164 feet) behind the vehicle to warn the drivers behind. Any crew not observing this regulation may be subject to sanction by the Stewards.

In case of an accident which does not warrant immediate medical intervention, or a car stops for any other reason at the side of the road in a Special Stage, either temporarily or permanently, the following action must be taken:

- 1) The OK button on the emergency control must be pressed within one minute of the incident.
- 2) Teams are reminded that penalties will be applied by the Stewards according to Article 53.3.3 if the OK button is not pressed in a Special Stage area without the need for medical assistance.







- b) The green "OK" sign must be clearly placed as soon as possible to warn drivers behind them, and any helicopter which needs to intervene. If the crew leaves the vehicle, the OK sign must be clearly visible to all.
- c) A red reflecting warning triangle must be placed in a clear position by a member of the crew at least 50 m (164 feet) behind the vehicle to warn the drivers behind, even if the vehicle has left the road.
- d) The triangle must be placed in view, even if the vehicle has left the road.
 - The Road Book contains a page with instructions to follow in the event of an accident, including what to do if a member of the public is also involved in the incident.
- e) Road Books will contain a page setting out the procedure to be followed in the event of an accident, which should include instructions in the event of an accident involving a member of the public.
- f) The recommended procedure for displaying the SOS or OK signs by crews who have been involved in an accident is to be found in the FIA 2023 Sporting Regulations.
- g) Any crew having to retire from or abandon the *Rallye* must inform the organiser immediately about the retirement except in the case of circumstances beyond their control. Any crew failing to inform the organiser may be subject to sanction by the Stewards.

3 BACKGROUND

a) From 2023 onwards, the FIA will require all rallies which are part of an FIA championship or trophy use a GPS tracking system according to technical list no. 98.

Purpose

To inform the drivers in advance to avoid unnecessary rescue interventions and fines.

System

For the VDS system, beacons will be replaced by smartphones supplied by VDS. The smartphone will be installed on the dashboard within easy reach of the navigator.

b) The beacons will be installed during scrutineering.

At the end of the rally, the beacons will be returned to the last checkpoint (Finish Podium).

In the event of retirement, competitors must return the beacon to the broom wagon at the same time as the or hand it in to the Race Direction.







4 FUNCTIONS

4.1 Red Flag

When the Clerk of the Course deploys a red flag on a Special Stage, the smartphone screen will turn red, and display RED FLAG.

The navigator must immediately click on the screen to acknowledge he/she has received this information. Immediately, the vehicle must reduce its speed and finish the Special Stage on the road, taking into account the fact that emergency vehicles may be driving on the Special Stage and the accident site may be congested.

4.2 Stopping the Car

When a car stops in a Special Stage, the navigator has one minute to acknowledge receipt of the message.

- 1) **TOUCH SOS** if the crew needs medical attention or fire brigade intervention. Normally a second screen will be displayed and it will be possible to request medical or firefighting assistance (it is not yet certain that this function will be available in the *Rallye du Chablais*, but perhaps in other foreign rallies.
- 2) **TOUCH OK** if the car has stopped in a Special Stage, and the crew does not need the use of any rescue equipment.

Please note, the navigator must click the OK button within one minute. If not, a financial penalty may be fixed by the Stewards, (currently between €250 and €1000) after interviewing the crew.

5 SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

Installation tracking system in the car

All this information will be included in the supplementary regulations in the articles dealing with accidents. An appendix with instructions for use and assembly including USB power supply will be included in the Supplementary Regulations and will be given to the crews.

Connect the Interactive Tracker directly to

your USB power supply with the supplied cable. A WHITE LED lights up when connected.

The installation of the Interactive Tracker in the race car is under the responsibility of the competitor who must ensure that it is securely fixed in the passenger compartment and that the box functions correctly. Under no circumstances can VDS Technology be held responsible for a compettor going off the road or any other incident in the event of the Interactive Tracker falling into the competition can.

RESTITUTION

- > At the finding of the rally, it is MANDATORY to return the vehicle to the entrance of the closed park at the finish.
- > In case of withdrawal: Return to the RACE HQ ONLY
