2. ANNOUNCEMENT



2.1 Furness District Motor Club Ltd will organise an Interclub Special Stage Rally on Friday 2nd and Saturday 3rd December 2022 in Grizedale East and Grizedale West forests.

3. **JURISTICTION**

The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the F.I.A.), these supplementary regulations, Regulations issued by the various championships, and any written instructions issued by the event organisers.

5. **ELIGIBILITY**

5.1 The event is open to competitors holding a valid Motorsport UK competition licence; Drivers must hold a "RS Inter Club Stage Rally" licence or above, Navigators must hold a "RS Inter Club" licence or above.


- 5.2 Competitors must be current members of an ANECCC Motor Club, a registered contender in the championships listed in SR4.2, or a member of Furness District Motor Club.
- 5.3 The event is open to foreign participation. Foreign competitors will need to email the Entries Secretary a letter of authorisation from their ASN prior to 19/11/22.
- 5.4 Technical Regulations, as laid out in Section R of the Motorsport UK Yearbook, apply.

6. FORMAT

- 6.1 There are 4 special stages as follows;
 - Stage 1; approx. 5.0 miles. This will be run in the dark.
 - Stage 2; approx. 8.8 miles
 - Stage 3; approx. 9.5 miles
 - Stage 4; approx. 18.8 miles
- 6.2 Total stage mileage is 42.1 miles.
- 6.3 Total road mileage is 37.5 miles.
- 6.4 Entries should be submitted online via the <u>www.rallies.info</u> entries system (from 09:00hrs 08/10/2022).
- 6.5 "Signing on" will be done electronically via the www.rallies.info system.
- The Road Book, Service Pack, competition numbers and your "usual paperwork" can be collected upon successful completion of pre-event scrutineering.
- 6.7 All competitors will be conventionally seeded.
- 6.8 There will be one service halt on Saturday, at Skelwith Fold caravan site, of 45 minutes between stages 3 and 4.
- 6.9 There is no auxiliary service available.
- 6.10 There will be no Parc Ferme overnight, but secure parking will be available at Skelwith Fold (service area) for those that require it.
- 6.11 Servicing is unrestricted between MTC2 and MTC3.
- 6.12 All cars will be fitted with a tracking device prior to MTC1.
- 6.13 Special stages will be timed to the nearest preceding whole second, in accordance with R26.5



7. ROUTE



- 7.1 The whole route is covered on OS Map numbers 90 and 96 or 97 (1:50,000 series). Outdoor leisure 1:25,000 Map number 7 (English Lakes SE Area) cover the stages.
- 7.2 Practising or testing on the Special Stages on this event is forbidden (R26.7)
- 7.3 Subjective Route Notes;



Competitors may purchase direct from Patterson Pace Notes or On the Pacenote, comprehensive Subjective Route Notes and DVD footage of the stages. For ordering details see separate adverts in these Regulations. Only the Route Notes provided by Patterson Pace Notes or On the Pacenote for Grizedale Stages Rally 2022 may be used. (R25.9) This does not preclude competitors themselves from recording information during the event for use later on in the event (R25.9.2)





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8. ENTRIES



- 8.1 Entries open on Saturday 8th October 2022 and close at midnight on Saturday 19th November 2022.
- 8.2 Entries should be submitted online via the <u>www.rallies.info</u> entries system from 09:00hrs 08/10/2022.
- 8.3 The Entry Fee is £664 which includes one competing car, one service vehicle, and one trailer. In addition, there is a further £35 for your mandatory "SportTraxx" tracking device for the competing car. That's a total of £699 for those struggling with the maths. It excludes optional road section insurance.
- 8.4 Any entry not paid within 7 days of submission will be deleted and will need to be re-submitted.
- The maximum entry for the event is 100. The minimum entry for the event is 70 The maximum for each class is 30. The minimum for each class is 3. 9. CLASSES



9.1 The event will consist of 5 classes as follows. These are the classes that will be used for results and awards purposes on this event. Championship positions, if based on position in Class, will be determined by the championships themselves.

Working Class Cars up to 1400cc. (RF1.0, RF1.4, 1400S, 1400C)

Lower middle Class 1401cc to 1600cc. (B10, H1, H2)

Middle Class 1601cc to 2000cc. (RF2.0, N3, B11, H3, H4)

Upper Middle Class 2001cc and over (B12)

Upper Class All 4WD cars. (N4, NR4, R2(B), B13, B14)

- 9.2 All vehicles must comply with the Motorsport UK Technical Regulations for Historic or Stage Rally Cars.
- 9.3 Where there are less than 3 entries in a class, that class *may* be amalgamated into the class above. Class amalgamations will be notified on the website before the closing date. H29.1.3 (g).

10. SCRUTINEERING



- 10.1 Scrutineering will take the form of traditional, physical scrutineering
- 10.2 Scrutineering will include checks on crash helmets, flame-resistant overalls, FHR's, camera mountings. We recommend hand sanitiser or wipes (minimum 60% alcohol) are carried in the car.
- 10.5 All vehicles must be taxed and insured for the Public Highway R6.2.7 The VED (Road Tax) and MOT status of your car may be checked between 1/12/22 and 2/12/22.
- 10.6 The driver is deemed to have full knowledge of the vehicle and its eligibility for the class entered.
- 10.7 All competitors must carry a SOS/OK board, a Red Warning Triangle, Small Spill Kit & a First Aid Kit.
- 10.8 On Board Cameras; (J5.21) The carrying of on-board cameras for personal use is permitted. Any camera should be mounted according to J5.21.5.

- 10.9 Prior to Scrutineering, Competitors will be given;
 - Rally Plates to be fixed to the front and rear of the car.
 - Door Plates in the form of front door panels 46cm x 49cm (ie "traditional style")
 - High visibility numbers, 20cm high, to be positioned at the top of the rear side windows.
- 10.10 Environmental Scrutineering ("Noise Test") will take place after MTC1 and prior to TC1.

11. DOCUMENTATION


- 11.1 The "Signing-on" process will take place online. Competitors are required to "sign on" by midnight on 1/12/22 at the latest. Any competitor not signed on by this time will be excluded.
- 11.2 On successful completion of Scrutineering, Competitors can collect;
 - Service Pack.
 - Road Book.
 - Timecards.
- 11.3 Start Times will be notified via Sportity.
- 11.4 **Insurance**; Vehicles must have Insurance in place which provides Third Party Liability cover that complies with the Road Traffic Act. This can be either, by extending an existing motor policy to cover the event, or, by purchasing additional cover as an adjunct to an existing motor policy.
- 11.5 If you are using an extension to an existing policy, details of that policy must be included on your entry form that the cover complies with the requirements of the Road Traffic Act. Any responsibility for a fraudulent or misleading declaration about existing cover lies with the competitor.
- 11.6 We have applied to Reis Motorsport Insurance for road section insurance for competitors' cars. This will provide Competitors who use the Scheme with the Third Party Liability cover necessary to meet the Road Traffic Act requirements on the road sections of the Event.

The basic rate for Competitors (before any loadings) is £22.00.

If a competitor wishes to purchase this additional cover via the organisers, then they can do so prior to 26/11/22 providing they comply with the following.

- Aged 19 years or over. (Anyone aged less than 19 years old will also be accepted at the same price should their co-driver be a more senior member of their family or over 25)
- Held a Full Licence for a minimum of 6 months.
- No more than 6 points on their licence.
- Had no more than one fault accident in the last 3 years.
- The vehicle has valid Tax, MOT and is currently insured for road use.
- 11.7 Any competitor who falls outside these parameters may be offered cover at equivalent terms or an agreed price, if approval from Reis Motorsport Insurance has been obtained by the event organisers, prior to the event. Contact the Reis Motorsport Team on 0115 965 1020 by COB 27/11/21.
- 11.8 Additional cover provided by this scheme is only effective whilst the vehicle is actively competing in the event and remains under the control or direction of the event organiser(s). Cover will cease immediately if you are precluded, excluded or retire from the event.
- 11.9 The Event Organiser's RTA scheme is provided by Reis Motorsport Insurance and underwritten by Markerstudy Insurance Services Limited.

12. START AND FINISH



- 12.1 The start on Friday (MTC1) will be at Rydal Road car park, Ambleside with the first car due at 17:30hrs. The finish on Friday (MTC2) will be at High Cross, near Coniston, with the first car due at 18:39hrs.
- 12.2 The start on Saturday (MTC3) will be at Yewdale Road car park, Coniston, with the first car due at 09:00hrs. The finish on Saturday (MTC4) will be at Yewdale Road car park, Coniston, with the first car due at 12:17hrs.

13. AWARDS



13.1 Awards will be awarded to competitors as follows;

1st Overall Driver The Coppermines Trophy# plus an award.

- 13.2 Further awards may be notified in the final instructions.
- 13.4 All trophies# remain the property of Grizedale Stages Rally and are to be held for a period of 10 months from the date of the event or until the Organisers request their return.
- 13.5 No crew may win more than one award other than discretionary* awards
- 13.6 Awards will be given to Competitors at MTC4.

14. CONTROLS AND TIMING

We will be operating "Contactless Timing" as far as possible.

- Your Time Cards are simply there for your own records. They will not be handed in at a Time Control or Passage Control.
- When you reach a Time Control (MTC, Arrival, Stage start, Stage stop line, Service time control etc) the marshals will show you your time on an electronic clock. This is the time that will be automatically transmitted to the results team.
- You should write this on your Time Cards. The marshals will transfer their Check Sheet to the results team electronically.
- Results will be available online throughout the rally.
- Provisional results and Final results will be announced by Sportity.
- A full description of the clocks and start procedures will be available in your "rally pack".
- 14.1 The rally will be divided into Road Sections and Special Stages. All controls will be Time Controls. Each road section will be allotted a Target Time and a competitor can calculate his due time of arrival at any TC by adding his Target Time to his actual time of departure from the preceding TC. On any road section following a Special Stage extra time will be allowed over the set average speed to account for any delays at the Special Stage Finish. All stages will have a Bogey Time set at 60mph maximum and a Target Time set at approximately 30mph or less.
- 14.2 Competitors will receive penalties as follows;

1. Under Bogey Bogey time

2. Over Bogey/under Target Actual time taken

3. Over Target Target time (Time taken over Target will count towards

maximum lateness)

- 14.3 The following types of control will be used:
 - a. <u>Main Control (MTC)</u>. Situated at the Start and Finish of each leg of the event. Each competitor will be given a due starting time from MTC1 and the difference between this and the actual starting time will count towards overall lateness. **Competitors will be allowed a total of 15 minutes penalty-free lateness between MTC's**.
 - **b.** Special Stage Arrival (TC). On arrival at the TC competitors must be ready to start the stage (helmets on, fire extinguisher armed, seat belts fastened etc). After control procedure the competitor must follow marshal's instructions and move to the start line. The start procedure will be automatic (R25.7.2, SR 14.4)
 - c. Special Stage Start (SS). At the SS competitors will receive a start time in hours, minutes and seconds. Once a competitor has cleared the TC the start marshal will assume that he is ready to start the stage. As each section is timed separately the time taken from TC to SS is "dead time" and delays are automatically allowed for. The control area from TC to SS will be "Parc Ferme".
 - **d.** Special Stage Finish (SF). At the SF a competitor will be given his finish time in hours, minutes and seconds. The time in hours and minutes will be his starting time for the following Road Section. Any competitor who fails to stop at the Stop Line must not, under pain of exclusion, reverse but must return on foot.
 - **e.** Re-Group Controls (TC). A Re-Group is used to close up gaps between competitors resulting from retirements and delays. The time a competitor is due at the "out control" of the re-group will be given at the "in control". The Re-Group will be "Parc Ferme"
- 14.4 Start Procedure; Stage starts will be controlled by 'Limited Contact traffic lights'. The sequence is;
 - Your due start time comes up when the marshal enters your car number
 - A countdown, in seconds remaining, will start. Red light is illuminated
 - Every 15 seconds a reminder of your due start time comes up as a reminder
 - 10 seconds to go 5 Amber lights come on.
 - 5 seconds to go Red light goes out
 - 5-4-3-2-1 one Amber light goes out each second.
 - 0 seconds to +6 seconds Green light illuminates

15. TRAILERS, SERVICING AND PETROL



- 15.1 The Trailer Park and Scrutineering will be at Miller Bridge car park, Ambleside, from 13:00hrs on Friday 02/12/22.
- 15.2 The Service Area will be at Skelwith Fold Caravan Park, near Ambleside. Only vehicles bearing a "Service Pass" will be allowed entry. Service Passes are available in your Rally Pack. Skelwith Fold will be accessible from 16:00-21:00hrs (Friday) and 08:00-16:00hrs (Saturday).
- 15.3 There is one Service halt of 45 minutes between Stage 3 and Stage 4. FCD 10:37hrs. There is no restriction on servicing between MTC2 (FCD Friday 18:29hrs) and MTC3 (FCD Saturday 09:00hrs)
- 15.4 Competitors will be held responsible for the conduct of their service crews, in particular with regard their behaviour in the Trailer Park and Service Area.
- 15.5 You will be required to provide a groundsheet on which to service to prevent any oil spillage.
- 15.6 There are 2 opportunities to refuel at public fuel stations on road sections during the event;
 - Between MTC1 and SS1
 - Between SS3 & Service
- 15.7 Additionally, there are public fuel stations at Coniston and Ambleside which can be accessed between MTC 2 and MTC3.
- 15.8 We would discourage competitors from self-refuelling in Service, although it is not prohibited. Vital fuels will hopefully be providing a service depending on numbers. See separate contact information.
- 15.9 Health and Safety. Crews are responsible for ensuring that their service crews understand and comply with general Health and Safety issues, and with COVID-19 requirements regarding distancing and PPE. All personnel should take reasonable care of themselves and other persons who may be affected by their actions or omissions during the event. In particular Health and Safety considerations apply to the transportation of fuel and the refuelling of cars. Smoking and other forms of open flame (eg Cookers) will not be allowed where there is the possibility of igniting petrol vapours.



16. DAMAGE DECLARATION



16.1 Competitors will be required to complete and sign a declaration that they have not been involved in any accident resulting in damage to private property or injury to persons or animals, or alternatively, giving details of any such incident where damage or injury occurred. Competitors are required to upload this form to the results team within 24 hours of the finish of the event.

17. JUDGES OF FACT AND DRIVING STANDARDS



"Yes, yes. You may think they're 'old farts' but they do live here, and they do kick up a fuss if you drive like a hooligan on the public road. There's a time and a place for behaviour like that — it's called the forest!"

- 17.1 Driving Standards Observers will be appointed to report on driving standards including speed levels and noise. Some road sections will take place on private land and a strict speed limit will be enforced.
- 17.2 Judges of Fact and Driving Standards Observers will be on duty throughout the rally to observe and report on the following;
 - Making a false start to a stage R8.1.3 (start officials)
 - Time of arrival at controls R8.5.2 (time control officials)
 - Taking an incorrect route on stage R8.1.2 (marshals)
 - Unauthorised servicing R8.1.6 (Safety Car crews, Judges of Fact)
 - Auxiliary Service cars R8.1.6 (Safety Car crews, Judges of Fact)
 - Excessive sound R8.1.7 (scrutineers)
 - Compliance with special restrictions (eg Quiet Zones) R8.3.4 (Judges of Fact)
- 17.3 If any competitor (or their service crew) is seen driving outside the forest in a manner likely to cause PR problems in the area, they will be reported to Motorsport UK for bringing the sport of rallying into disrepute and will be refused a start or excluded from the event and results. R8.4
- 17.4 Grizedale Forest is in a sensitive PR area. The penalty for 'excessive sound' is 10 minutes penalty in the first instance and may go as far as exclusion. Judges of Fact, the Organisers and Start Officials have the right to refuse any car a start, which they deem to be causing 'excessive sound'. Additional noise checks may be carried out during the event. Where "Quiet" and/or "Slow" signs are displayed on the road, or indicated in the Road Book, these MUST be obeyed. R8.3.4

18. SOS/OK BOARDS

- 18.1 Competitors are required to carry SOS/OK boards (R25.4) and it is the competitors' responsibility to provide these boards.
- 18.2 To clarify the use of SOS/OK boards their purpose and use is as follows;
 - R25.4.1 In the case of an accident where urgent medical attention is required, the red SOS sign should be displayed as quickly as possible to alert following cars.
 - R25.4.2 Any crew that sees a red SOS sign displayed on a car, or sees a major accident where both crew members are inside the car but not displaying the SOS board, must immediately and without exception stop to give assistance.
 - R25.4.3 All following cars must also stop and the second car arriving at the scene must inform the next radio point (displayed in the road book and indicated by a blue board at the radio location (3))
- 18.3 Penalty for the misuse of these boards when medical attention is not required will be exclusion (R25.4.8 & R25.4.9) This includes failure to display the board.
- 18.4 Competitors are reminded that in the event of an incident, they should indicate to the first marshal on scene, that they are okay by giving a "thumbs up" to the marshal.

19. RETIREMENT



- 19.1 Cars recovered between stages will be taken to the nearest Rendezvous Point, which will be accessible from the public road and listed in Final Instructions.
- 19.2 No trailers can be brought into the forest for recovery purposes without the permission of the Clerk of the Course or Safety Officer.

20. "SUPERALLY"



- 20.1 Competitors who retire from the event on stage 1 *may* be able to re-join the rally for Stages 2-4 subject to reporting at MTC3 at their due time.
- 20.2 Competitors who retire from the event on Stages 2 or 3 *may* be able to re-join the rally for Stage 4 subject to reporting at TC3c (Service Out) at their due time.
- 20.3 Competitors re-joining under "Superally" will be penalised 15 minutes.

- 20.4 Competitors are required to contact the Chief Scrutineer to arrange technical re-scrutineering. He will issue a "Permit to Re-start" which allows you to re-enter the event. Failure to present this permit at MTC3 / TC3c will result in exclusion.
- 20.5 Competitors must re-join in their original seeded position.
- 20.6 Competitors must be the same driver and navigator, and in the same car, as originally entered in the main event.
- 20.7 Competitors who re-enter under "Superally" will not be eligible for any awards.

21. PENALTIES



- 21.1 Penalties will be as listed in Chart 32.13. (Page 350 of the Year Book)
- 21.2 Between MTC1 and MTC2, and between MTC3 and MTC4, there will be **15 minutes** penalty-free 'lateness' where target time is exceeded on road sections or in service.
- 21.3 Timing on special stages will be to the preceding whole second.

- 23.4 Your Road Book, Time Cards, Service Pack will be given to you on successful completion of Scrutineering.
- 23.5 Final Instructions will be available online from 19/11/22.
