





BACK IN 1956 THE FOUNDER MEMBERS OF THE NORTH WALES CAR CLUB, ESTABLISHED IN LATE 1955, PUT TOGETHER PLANS FOR THEIR CALENDAR OF EVENTS FOR THE YEAR. ALONG WITH SMALL EVENTS THERE WERE PLANS FOR THE "RALI MAWR" (THE BIG RALLY) TO TAKE IN OVER 200 MILES OF TRICKY ROADS OF NORTH WALES.

It was very soon decided to change the name to reflect on the area – Glynne Edwards, the Club Treasurer, proposed that the event be called the Cambrian Rally, in deference to the Cambrian Mountain Range that spreads down the length of Wales. The proposal was seconded by Morrys Hughes, who was appointed Clerk-of-the-Course, and the event was held on the night of 3rd November 1956, with about 30 crews led home by Elwyn Edwards and Trevor Williams in an Austin-Healey.

In just its' third year (1958) the event was promoted to Restricted status, permitting many more clubs to participate. The 300-mile long route was won by two of the club's founder members Geoff Flint and Geoff Kendall-Jackson in a Jowett.

Popularity of the event increased and in 1961 the Cambrian was selected as a round of the BTRDA and WAMC championships, also the ANWCC series. With over 200 miles each year, it was a tough challenge for the organisers, marshals and the competitors.

1966 was the first time that rallies became regulated, with the RAC appointed by the government to grant permits for events on the public highway. NWCC members David Williams and David Rogers-Jones had all the plans in place for another big event but the RAC were so inundated with applications that they failed to issue the permit in time, so the plug had to be pulled on the event.



Then in 1967 the country was seriously affected by the Foot & Mouth epidemic that crippled the country, but the Cambrian was luckily planned for after the ban was lifted. The event was judged successful and for 1968 became a qualifying round of he Motoring News Rally Championship, the top rally championship of the time and which is subject of many recollections of the past. Our winners were Colin Malkin and John Brown in a Hillman Imp Californian, and they were so successful that year that they became the MN Rally Champions.

1969 again saw MN status with Jim Jones as clerk-of-the-course, a position retained until 1973 when Dave Thomas became involved, having experienced marshalling for the first time on the 1969 event.

Jim Jones had relocated to Anglesey and went on to lead the organisation of the Gwynedd Rally which became the first forest rally event in north Wales. His guidance was instrumental for Dave Thomas and the NWCC team, in establishing the Cambrian as a forest event in 1977. The first stage was a blast round the Great Orme Marine Drive followed by six stages in Clocaenog, the final result decided by just one second – Roger Chilman and Phillip Griffiths just beating local crew Will Owen and Evan Williams, both in Ford Escorts.

And so the Cambrian rally as a stage event was born and well received. 1979 saw a full entry list, attracting competitors from all over the UK. It also saw the Orme road closed by snow for the first time in living history. This all fell on the Friday night and as crews gathered at the Llandudno start it became apparent that the forests of Coed-y-Brenin were totally impassable. Although first car was scheduled to leave the Red Garages start at 0900 there was a delay and at 0930 the decision was taken that the event had to be cancelled.

In the early 1980's Nigel Worswick and Peter Kenyon became the first crew to achieve a hat-trick of wins, 1981-2-3. They also won again in 1996 making it 4 wins. But that was later beaten by John (Bont) Roberts who won in 1985 and a hat-trick in the 1990s (1993-4-5) and a fifth win in 1997.

In 1984 Dave Thomas handed over the role of clerking to Alyn Edwards, and it was not long before the Cambrian became a part of the BTRDA Rally Championship, that status continuing to this day.

Moving into the 21st Century Jon Madoc-Jones took over in charge, and the events began attracting overseas competitors – Mikko Hirvonen won in 2002, a young Jari-Matti Latvala taking the runner-up spot. 2006 saw Andreas Mikkelsen take the honours and in 2009 Mads Ostberg was the winner – all drivers destined to be amongst the world's best.

Also in 2006 was a young Elfyn Evans, second in class in a Nissan Micra – the start of a wonderful career.

Alyn Edwards returned to take charge in 2007 and the event continued to grow in status. In 2019 the Cambrian became a round of the British Rally Championship, and maintains that status to this day, attracting all the leading competitors in the country and beyond. For 2025 the organising team has extended to include members of all the neighbouring clubs, their wealth of experience invaluable to the continued success of the event.

Surely, the team running the early Cambrians could never have imagined what they had started!

## WELSH RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

Like many championships, the PWRC got off to a delayed start when the planned opening two rounds were lost to the damage caused in the Welsh forests by last winter's storms. However, that prompted a rare away day when the championship went to Kielder for its opening round on the Carlisle Stages in April.

Since then, the dry and dusty conditions of the Plains Rally in May and the scorching Nicky Grist Stages in July were followed by the wet and muddy Woodpecker Rally at the end of August. Now the season concludes with the Cambrian and the Wyedean Rally in early November and three crews are vying for the coveted title.

James Giddings and Aled Davies currently top the points after an exemplary season in their Mitsubishi Lancer E9 but chasing hard is Liam Clark, who has had more than one co-driver in his Ford Fiesta Rally2. Clark topped the PWRC points on the Plains and the Woodpecker and only a non-finish on the Nicky Grist due to engine woes has blunted his challenge. Meanwhile, bubbling under but well down the order at present are Matthew Hirst and Declan Dear in their Skoda Fabia R5.

Hirst and Dear missed the opening two rounds but have since taken a win and a second and know that two more victories could yet win them the championship for a fifth time and the fourth time in a row. With the best four scores from six rounds to count, it is wide open coming to Llandudno but all three crews need a big result this weekend to keep up their momentum in the championship contest.

This has been another bumper year for the Welsh championship with well over 110 competitors scoring points across a wide array of classes. Among the other leading contenders are David Tomlin and Keith Ashley in their Ford Fiesta R5, Robert Gough and Jack Bowen in their historic specification Ford Escort Mk2 and Geoff Phelps and Colin Jenkins in their hard charging Ford Escort Mk1.

In the less powerful cars, drivers making a big impression include Dylan Fowler-Bishop in his flying Nissan Micra while Joel Lewis and Jamie Mills have battled hard in their class with their Peugeot 106. With just seven gravel rallies under their belt, they typify the newcomers in the championship who are loving every minute of their forest rallying experience.

## JAMES GIDDINGS

One of the key title contenders for the Pirelli Welsh Rally Championship heading to the Cambrian rally is James Giddings in his Mitsubishi Lancer Evo 9.

This is Giddings' third season in the Lancer, and he's driving better than ever with the hugely experienced Aled Davis alongside on the notes. To date, they have scored strongly in each of the four rounds and know that they need to keep doing that over the final two rounds to maintain their title bid.

They had a scare on the Nicky Grist Stages when a low hanging branch smashed their windscreen and threatened to put them out, but they bounced back and have been strong on every forest event to date.



# CLARK

Currently leading the chase of James
Giddings in the Pirelli Welsh Rally
Championship points is young Liam Clark,
who is getting stronger and stronger in
his Ford Fiesta Rally2.

Clark drove great rallies to take maximum points on both the Plains and Woodpecker rallies in wildly contrasting road conditions to set up his title bid, although an engine issue on the Nikki Grist in July cost him another strong finish.

This is a second full season in the potent Fiesta Rally2 for the 25-year old Yorkshireman who is undoubtedly one of the rising stars of the championship.

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
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
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




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# BRITISHE RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP





The 2025 Probite British Rally Championship (BRC) reaches its grand finale as the Lewis & Hunter Cambrian Rally takes crews back onto the world-class gravel stages in North Wales. Famed from their years on Wales Rally GB, the challenging forests will provide a fittingly epic backdrop to the showdown for Britain's premier rallying crown.

After five hard-fought rounds across both gravel and asphalt, it's William Creighton and Liam Regan who arrive at the Cambrian holding the advantage.

The Castrol MEM Rally Team pairing has already shown their versatility this season with victories on both surfaces in the Toyota GR Yaris Rally2, and despite a tough outing at Rali Ceredigion last month, they remain in control of their own destiny.

With a 16.5-point cushion at the top of the table, a solid score in North Wales would be enough to seal the championship, elevating Creighton from Junior BRC and Junior WRC success to the accolade of British Rally Champion.

Closest challenger Meirion Evans, with Dale Furniss alongside, endured a frustrating run on home asphalt in Ceredigion, where a high-speed off scuppered his chance of keeping maximum pressure on his team-mate.

The all-Welsh Yaris crew remain the only realistic threat to Creighton, but the equation is simple: Evans must win, and hope Creighton fails to score. Anything less, and the title is out of reach.

The joker in the pack could yet be Romet Jürgenson. The Estonian FIA Rally Star driver has shown blistering speed in his first full BRC campaign, and his stunning run to second overall behind stand-in team-mate Jon Armstrong in Ceredigion has kept his mathematical title hopes alive.

But like Evans, Jürgenson's path to the crown requires a Creighton non-finish, making him an outside bet at best. Even so, the M-Sport Fiesta Rally2 ace, guided by Siim Oja, will be determined to prove his pace once more on the Cambrian's legendary gravel.

Further back, Garry Pearson and Hannah McKillop will be out to end their campaign on a high in another M-Sport entry, whilst Max McRae, partnered by Cammy Fair will relish the challenge of classic Welsh stages in his first full BRC campaign.

The Cambrian also brings title battles across the Junior BRC and National titles, ensuring no shortage of storylines as the 2025 season reaches its crescendo. With championship glory still on the line and the famous North Wales forests ready to test every competitor, the stage is set for a finale worthy of the BRC's illustrious history.

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
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#### **WILLIAM CREIGHTON**

William Creighton's list of accolades is already impressive, including the 2022 Junior BRC and 2023 FIA Junior WRC titles. But on his second season of trying, the Northern Irishman is gunning for the coveted British Rally Championship trophy to add to his mantlepiece. Two wins so far in 2025 mean he and Liam Regan head to the final round in the box seat, with just a solid result in their Toyota GR Yaris Rally2 required to be crowned British champions. But the Cambrian is known to be unpredictable – can Creighton deliver the goods?

#### **MEIRION EVANS**

The Welsh pairing of Meirion Evans and Dale Furniss has shone brightly in 2025, taking their Toyota GR Yaris Rally2 to one top score and a string of solid results. That being said, their championship points tally doesn't do their pace justice, and the duo have impressed on both surfaces this season. Despite being Creighton's nearest challenger, Evans would need his teammate to suffer misfortune in Wales to clinch the title, but he will certainly be there to pick up the pieces should the worst happen to the series leader.

#### ROMET JURGENSON

Another BRC driver to have the honour of a Junior WRC title, Estonian driver Romet Jurgenson is arguably the most progressive driver of the series. Winner of the FIA Rally Star programme, Jurgenson and co-driver Siim Oja stamped their mark on the championship with a win in Kielder, before a low point during the mid-season. However, the fightback came in Ceredigion, where Jurgenson was the fastest of the regular BRC contingent to ensure he could head to the Cambrian with a chance at the title. Like Evans, it's a slim one, but the M-Sport Ford Fiesta Rally2 driver is well equipped to fight for all its worth.

With 50 points on offer per event it's going to be a fight, but do not write off Kaz Jenkins, Nigel's wife and co-driver from taking the top spot.

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For the first time for a considerable number of years, the Lewis & Hunter Cambrian Rally is not the final round of the Protyre Autocare BTRDA Rally Series – contenders still have the Grizedale Stages to contend with at the beginning of December and, while it wouldn't automatically be the case, none of the 2025 winners of the prestigious BTRDA Stars (Gold, Silver & Bronze) have been identified. So...



2024 Cambrian Rally winners Matthew Hirst/Declan Dear (Fabia R5) arrive in Llandudno as leaders of the Fuchs Lubricants BTRDA Gold Star Championship. Thus far, they have three maximum scores to their credit whereas winner for the past three years, Elliot Payne (Fiesta Rally2), and co-driver Patrick Walsh have two. They were leading at the mid point of the recent Trackrod Forest Stages before the car's turbo caught fire, initiating their first retirement from a BTRDA event since the Malcolm Wilson Rally in March 2022!

So, while it's perfectly possible that both crews' campaigns could go pear-shaped from here on in, it's likely that the 2025 BTRDA Gold Star Champions will be one of the above...

Meanwhile, the Protyre Autocare BTRDA Silver Star Championship – which caters for purely two-wheel drive vehicles – has also been dominated by two drivers. David Henderson (Escort MkII) took first blood on the Malcolm Wilson Rally and then followed it up with a similar result on the Border Counties Rally. However, appearances by Osian Pryce in a similar car on the next two events netted 'wins' on each before, in his absence, Henderson came good once more on the Trackrod.

Consistency sees Lewis Hooper/Rhys Edwards (Fiesta R2) leading the Silver Star table, and the BTRDA Rally R2 Cup which they won in 2024, from Tom Constantine/Tony Walker (Opel Adam R2). Henderson is next from Steve Ward/John Millington (Escort MkII) who are also in the pound seats in terms of the BTRDA Historic Cup.

Dylan Fowler-Bishop/Dan Evans (Micra) began the Fuchs Lubricants BTRDA Bronze Star Championship (1400s) by narrowly defeating 2023/24 Champions Nigel & Kaz Jenkins (Nova) on the Malcolm Wilson Rally. The husband-and-wife failed to finish the Border Counties, leaving the Micra crew to take another maximum – a feat which they repeated for a third consecutive time on the Nicky Grist Stages...

So, with Ed James/Kevin Lane (Micra Kit Car) maintaining a clean sheet and staying out of the others' way, the order is currently Fowler-Bishop, James & Jenkins but, with less than a maximum score between the three of them, who knows where this will end up!...







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#### NATTHEW HIRST

2024 Cambrian Rally winner MATTHEW HIRST, from Doncaster, leads the Fuchs Lubricants BTRDA Gold Star Rally Championship with just two rounds (including the Cambrian) to go. He was runner-up in 2022 and 3rd last year but a move from a Fiesta to his current Skoda Fabia R5 midway through 2024 has given him, and co-driver Declan Dear, a new lease of life – and speed! Matthew has already accrued three maximum scores this season and it was non-car-related problems that caused him to drop back on the other two events. So, fingers crossed, standing on the top step of the Cambrian Rally podium for the second consecutive time would be just what the doctor ordered!...



#### **NIGEL & KAZ JENKINS**

Husband-and-wife, NIGEL & KAZ JENKINS, from Lydney in the Forest of Dean, have rallying in their bones! They've won the BTRDA Bronze Star Rally Championship for the past two years – with a 'full-house' 180 points in 2023! – and have their sights set on making it three-in-a-row. Kaz's father Phil was Clerk of the Course of the Wyedean Stages Rally for many years while her mum, Lilian, was Secretary of the Event. Moving on, Kaz's son Luke (Watts) also makes regular appearances on BTRDA Series events as a driver... Talk about keeping it in the family!...



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With over 100 Championship registrations in 2025, and nearly 50 cars built and competing, the Championship has two classes; the R50 1600 Mini Coopers originally built from 2000 to 2005, and the similar R53 Cooper S, but with the enhanced supercharged engine.

The Minis are similar in spirit to the Rally First class of the BTRDA; a "showroom" class where the base car is taken (think £500 donor car) and then safety improvements are added (roll cage, bucket seats, harnesses and fire extinguishers) with some better handling for the rough forests (BC Suspension and grippy tyres) topped off by some basic performance enhancement for the R53s (uprated inter-cooler and a faster supercharger pulley). This basic specification means two things; budget rallying (around £10k gets you in to either car) and competitive close stage times. In fact, a Cooper can be built and run from your drive way (ask Owen Cule, one of our drivers), with the whole package getting you in to a rally for £7,500 (driver Andrew Downward will confirm this!). At the Cambrian in 2025 the Championship remains true to its roots in its fifth year; it provides accessible and affordable motorsport, that is close and competitive whilst also being fair and set within a closely knit community. The calendar has five tarmac and five gravel rounds. The first half of the year was mainly focused on tarmac (at Anglesey, Pembrey, Epynt, Warcop and Bala) and then with gravel events at Greystoke, Woodpecker and Trackrod.

Youngster Charlie Mathewson and Ian Bass lead the overall R53 class, with father and son duo the Hearseys lead the R50s. Drivers Tom Hynd and Kyle Wilson are hot on the heels of Mathewson in the R53s though, and look out for local man Sven Grube and Alfie Element in the R50 who lead the gravel Championship, and are not only fast, but spectacular in their driving style.

The Minis are a friendly bunch; father and daughter Guy and Flo Butler compete against each other in their Minis, husband and wife Tom and Sue Hynd fly through the forests and travel to each event from Aberdeen, and George Clarke flies in from Spain for most of the rounds, favouring the Championship for the close competition and budget rallying.

behind the huge "Bangers and Cash" TV series.


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
