## **RECCONASIANCE NOTES**

Crews are reminded that all the stages of the Adelaide Hills Rally are council roads that are OPEN to the public. Please be aware of on coming traffic and be as courteous as possible to other road users.

Bugle Ranges – There are 2 stop signs for the railway crossing's on this stage. The railway line is not closed so that means to obey the road rules you must stop at these crossings. During last years reconnaissance of this stage, we received numerous phone calls from residents complaining about the reconnaissance cars ignoring the stop signs. We have already had residents say they will be monitoring these railway crossing's this year. We will also be monitoring it on RallySAFE lite.

Charligate – There is a very large tree fallen down after the first corner of the stage. It has been down for a week so we are now unsure if it will be removed for the rally. It only blocks ¼ of the road so please pace note that it will still be there for the event. It is quite visible before you read the corner.

Charligate- while putting out the tulip markers today there was road works happening between 12km and 12.6km into the stage. This may still be ongoing for the remainder of the week.

The Glen – The council has been grading and upgrading this stage over the past 2 weeks. The stage now has many different road surfaces with different grip levels to be aware of.

Meadows – The second half of this stage has also been graded and had more rubble put down of the road to widen it. This has also made it slippery. This stage is very narrow in places so please be very aware of possible oncoming traffic.

Lastly, please ensure that you turn on your RallySAFE Lite app on your phone while on the stages.
