Art. 1. Introduction

Art. 1.1 Preamble

This event will be run in compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code (ISC) including appendices, the FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations (FIA CCRSR) including appendices, the WADA/NADA Codes, and the FIA Anti-Doping Regulations, as amended from time to time. The National Road Traffic Regulations of the countries the event passes shall apply. Unless provided otherwise by these Supplementary Regulations, the provisions of the above Rules and Regulations shall apply.

Any modifications, amendments and/or additions to the Rules and Regulations shall be made in the form of numbered and dated bulletins. Bulletins will be issued by the Organiser, up to the commencement of administrative checks with the approval of the FIA, after the administrative checks by the Stewards of the Meeting. Exceptionally, modifications to the itinerary may be made by the Organiser. Additional information will be published in the Rally Guide. All FIA regulations can be found at <https://www.fia.com/regulations>.

The various documents will be written in English and Spanish. In case of any discrepancy the English text will be binding.

This designation must be made before the closing date for entries for each baja, using the form on the FIA website (link above). **No changes** may be accepted **after the closing of entries** for each baja.

The FIA Baja Cups for **Teams** is reserved for **legal entities** holding a competitor’s licence. Only registrations with a proof of payment of the registration fee will be accepted.

Art. 4.5 Payment

Any entry not accompanied by the entry fee shall be, according to Art. 3.9.3 of FIA International Sporting Code, null and void. The entry fee shall be paid directly to the PODIUM platform.

Art. 4.6 Entry fee refunds

The entry fee shall be refunded in full:

- if the event does not take place
- to teams whose entry application is rejected.

The organiser may partially refund entry fees if a competitor cannot take part in the event due to a duly proved case of force majeure.

Art. 5. Insurance Cover

According to the existing Regulations in Spain the insurance policy arranged by the Organisers covers the guarantees required by the RFEDA (ASN):

- * Liability to third parties, in accordance with Spanish Legislation
- * For personal injury up to a limit of 70 million euros per occurrence
- * For property damage up to a limit of 15 million euros per occurrence

The insurance cover will come into effect from the start of Administrative checks and will cease at the end of the Event or, at the moment of retirement or disqualification. Vehicles taking part at the shakedown will be also covered by this policy.

In case of an accident the competitor or his representative must notify in writing the Clerk of the Course in as short time as possible and a maximum of 24 hours. Must explain the circumstances under which the accident occurred. Likewise, must mention the names and addresses of any witnesses.

Competitors are reminded that only the damage caused by the Organisers and the entered drivers are covered by the insurance policy taken on by the Organisation. Injury to the drivers themselves or damages to participating cars are not covered by this insurance.

Entrants and competitors are free to take on at their own convenience any individual insurance policy that they deem fit, independently from the liability insurance above mentioned.

In case of an accident, competitors and drivers agree to hold harmless and keep indemnified the event's promoters and Organisers against all claims.

The service vehicles, even those bearing special plates issued by the Organisers, may never be considered as official participants in the rally. They are therefore not covered by the insurance policy of the rally and remain the sole responsibility of their owner.

Art. 6. Advertising and Identification

See Appendix 3 of these SR “Decals and positioning of supplementary advertising”.

The organiser will provide each crew with the advertising and identification panels, which must be affixed to their vehicles in the stated positions prior to scrutineering. No modifications to the panels are allowed. However, they may be cut out if the shape of the bodywork does not allow the panels to be affixed in one piece.

Art. 6.1 Obligatory organiser’s advertising

Rally plate:

Size of rally plates (width x height):

- General: 43x21cm
- Groups Challenger/SSV front plate: 19x18cm



These plates must be affixed, parallel to the wheel axle, to the front and rear of the Vehicle. These plates shall incorporate the Competitor’s race number and may include advertising.

Size of race number panels (width x height):

- Groups Ultimate/Stock: 36x36cm
- Groups Challenger/SSV: 30x30cm



These panels must be affixed to the right and left sides of the vehicle, on the front door, in the area between the wheel arches provided they are fully visible from the side, and on the roof of the Vehicle, readable in the direction of travel.

Windscreen Band

This banner, which may incorporate the Competitor’s race number, must be affixed to the upper part of the windscreen. No other advertising sticker may be affixed under it.

Size of windscreen band (width x height): 110x10cm

Dashboard Stickers

These stickers, designed to remind crews of safety-related information, must be visibly displayed on the dashboard.

Size of dashboard stickers: 12x8cm

Art. 7.2 Identification of the tyres

In accordance with Art. 10.6 of the FIA CCRSR, FIA Priority drivers entered with Class T1+ vehicles must use tyres fitted with FIA barcodes.

If a tyre is also equipped with a specific permanent RFID Tag approved by the FIA (see FIA Technical List No. 54) and integrated in the tyre during the production process, before moulding and before the vulcanisation of the tyre itself, the data of the RFID Tag may also be used to identify this tyre.

Art. 7.3 National laws or special requirements

Art. 8. Fuel / Refuelling

All type of fuel must follow Appendix J Art. 266. (Art. 56 of the FIA CCRSR).

The use of a Diesel fuel in compliance with Appendix J Art. 266-B.2.3 (Paraffinic Diesel, including HVO) or Art. 266-B.3.3 (AS Diesel) is mandatory for all T1+ class vehicles fitted with a Diesel engine

The 20 minutes time allocated for refuelling is included in the scheduled time for the road section for refuelling purpose:

- Friday, May 8, after TCP0 (Start Stage Prologue)
- Saturday, May 9 after TC 0 (Start Stage 1 – Section 1)
- Saturday, May 9 after TC 1 D (Start Stage 1 – Section 2)

The complete original FIA homologation form / FIA Technical Passport and all other necessary certifications/documents must be available for final checks.

Art. 10.2 Drivers' safety equipment

All items of clothing including helmets and FHR (Front Head Restraint) intended to be used, e.g. HANS devices, must be presented for scrutineering. They shall be checked for compliance with Appendix L, Chapter III.

Each vehicle must be equipped with a medical kit from the FIA Technical List n°83, that must be placed inside the cockpit, and a survival kit according to FIA CCRSR Appendix IV-2.1 and the defined Safety Type (see SR Art. 1.4).

Art. 10.3 Installation of the Safety Tracking System and Navigation System

Art. 10.3.1 Safety Tracking System (FIA CCRSR Art. 12.1)

All vehicles must **only** be fitted with the Safety Tracking System(s) provided by the Organiser. The instruction for the use of the Tracking System is in the Appendix 5 of these Supplementary Regulations.

Art. 10.3.2 Navigation System (NAV-GPS; FIA CCRSR Art. 12.2)

Crews on BAJA TT CUENCA 2026 will be equipped by the organization with ANUBE'S STELLA system that integrates the vehicle to vehicle communication system into the GPS.

Tracking system devices shall be collected during the Scrutineering.

The device must be installed before scrutineering.

ANUBE will collect the devices from the vehicles at the finish Parc Fermé or service park for retired competitors. The information relevant to the installation of the system on the vehicle is available on the rally website and from ANUBE.

The Competitor must contact directly ANUBE to order the support/power supply kits for this equipment. The components kit is not included in the entry fee.

All competitors on the rally must have this system mounted to pass scrutineering.

This system must be working during the running of each Stage including on the road sections.

If it is noted that if the system is not working due to the crew fault it will be reported to the stewards.

Any competitor caught by another competitor must pull over and allow themselves to be overtaken complying with the regulations of article 47 of 2026 FIA CCRSR. Any infringement will be penalized by the Clerk of the Course according to Appendix I FIA CCRSR 2026.

Art. 10.3.3 Connection of the Systems (FIA CCRSR Art. 12.3)

The specifications for the standard power connector are laid down in the FIA CCRSR Appendix VI. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that the Safety Tracking System(s) always remain permanently connected and switched on with the antenna connected throughout the duration of the competition.

Art. 10.3.4 GPS Data Logger

Vehicles selected by the FIA after the publication of the entry list may be equipped with a GPS Data Logger to monitor their performances during the event.

Art. 10.4 On-Board Cameras

Art. 11.5 Prologue

There will be organized a "Prologue" as stated in article 32 of 2026 FIA CCR SR, serving to establish the start order for the following Section of the event.

The interval between the last FIA vehicle and the first vehicle of the national event will be 5 minutes.

The Clerk of the Course may, for safety reasons and with the knowledge of the Stewards, increase this time interval.

Reconnaissance of the Prologue is **NOT ALLOWED**. The Organizer will put at the disposal of the participants a video footage of the route of the Prologue and will publish it in the DNB (Sportity app) according art. 3 (Programme).

The maximum time allowed to make the Prologue is 20 minutes.

Maximum time allowed may be modified by the Stewards upon the proposal of the Clerk of the Course in case of non-predictable circumstances (climate, modifications in section distance, etc.).

If a competitor fails to start, does not complete the Prologue section as required in the regulations or fails to attend the start position selection process, he will be penalised as per Appendix I to the 2026 FIA CCR SR.

Art. 11.6 Finish procedures

At the end of the last stage, all cars go to the Parc Fermé until its opening on the instructions of the Stewards.

The prize-giving ceremony will take place at the "RECINTO FERIAL LA HIPICA" Sunday 10th at 16:00.

After having parked their vehicles in the Parc Fermé at the passage of the finish line, the participants' team (Crew) must remain available by telephone (mobile phone) until the publication of the final classification.

The podium and prize-giving will take place according to Article 3 of these regulations. The presence of both crew members is mandatory.

Art. 11.7 Permitted early check-in.

With reference to Art. 38.2.11 of the 2026 FIA CCRSR, crews are authorised to check-in ahead of time without incurring a penalty at the following time controls:

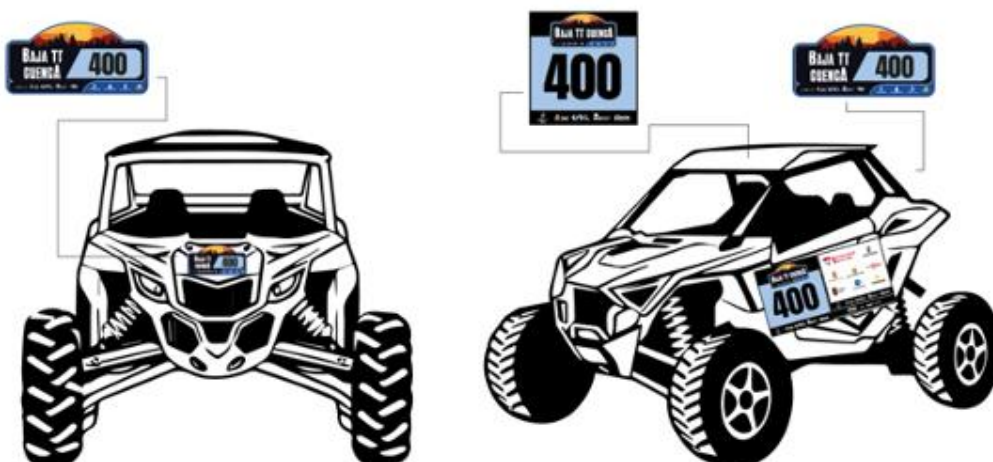
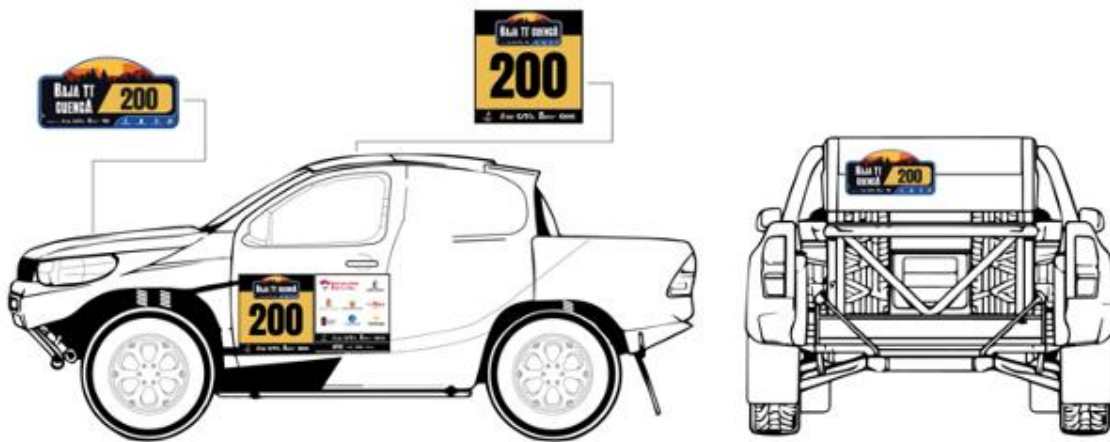

Appendix 4 – Extracts from FIA ISC Appendix L relating to overalls, helmets and any other safety requirements.

All competitors are reminded of Appendix L of the FIA International Sporting Code, in particular its Chapter III - Drivers' Equipment.

Helmets (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 1)

All crews must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the FIA standards listed in Appendix L.

Wearing an open-face helmet is prohibited on vehicles that are not designed with a windshield. Crews of vehicles without windscreens must wear full-face helmets, of which the chin bar is an integral part of the helmet structure"

Frontal Head Restraint (FHR, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3)

All crews must use FIA approved FHR systems homologated to FIA standard 8858.

Approved FHRs, anchorages and tethers are listed in Technical List N° 29.

See also helmet compatibility chart in Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3.3.

Flame-resistant clothing (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2)

All drivers and navigators must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for navigators), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2000 standard (Technical List N°27) or to the FIA 8856-2018 (Technical List N° 74). Please pay special attention to the prescriptions of Art. 2 **concerning the correct wearing of the clothing elements! See also FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations Article 47.1.**

Any FIA-approved 8856-2018 garment customised using printing or transfers must be accompanied by a certificate from the manufacturer.

Overgarments

In case of rainy and/ or muddy conditions, the usage of a waterproof overgarment on top of the drivers' equipment is authorized provided it complies with EN 14116.

The use of garments with index 3 is strongly recommended. Any other kind of overgarments, especially karting ones, will not be accepted.

Biometric Devices (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2.1)

Drivers may wear a device to collect biometric data during racing.

- If the biometric device is integrated into a protective garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856, the garment shall be homologated to FIA Standards 8856 and 8868-2018.
- If the biometric device is a stand-alone device, then the device must be homologated to FIA Standard 8868-2018 only. This device must be worn in addition to the garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856.

Wearing of jewellery (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 5)

The wearing of any type of jewellery, such as but not limited to, neck chains, bracelets or watches is prohibited during the competition. Exceptions to this rule, providing the CMO and/or Medical Delegate do not consider that due to size or location they may delay rescue or hinder emergency care, are:

- i. the wearing of watch(es) by navigators, on the condition that the watch(es) is worn over the overall,
- ii. the wearing of a single band-style ring providing it does not restrict the natural range of motion of the hand, and
- iii. the wearing of body piercing(s) providing they are not worn in and/or around the oral cavity.

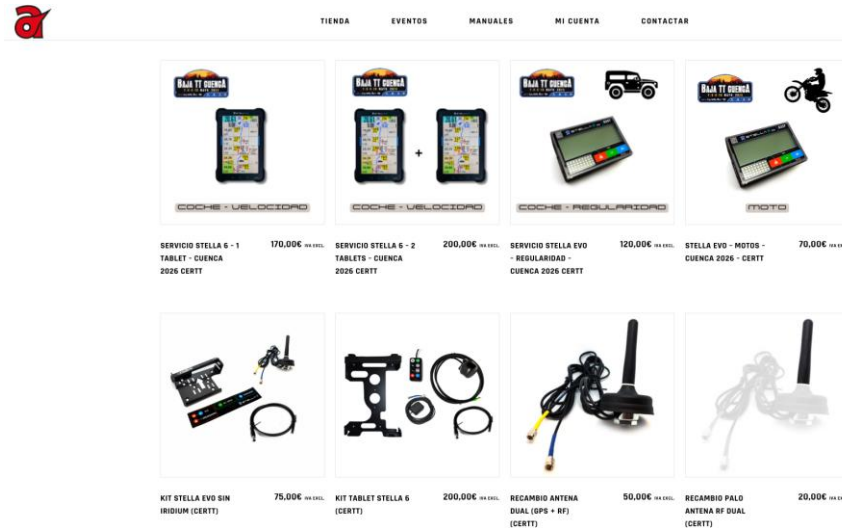
