4.2 Entry procedure

Anyone wishing to take part in the JDS Machinery Rali Ceredigion International Rally must register on the FIA's online platform before the entries closing date. *Anyone wishing to take part in the National Rally must refer to the National Supplementary Regulations*.

Priority drivers must complete the electronic form available at: https://registrations.fia.com/rally

Non-priority drivers must complete the electronic form available at: https://registrations.fia.com/ercgbr

Please note that the FIA registration platform requires a user ID and a password to access the entry system. The FIA will need time to register you in the system and open your user account. Please do not wait until the last moment to make your entry in order not to miss the entry closing date. The user account application is available through a link on the registration page stated above.

The entry will only be accepted if accompanied by the total amount of the entry fee. To be accepted, competitors must send a proof of payment of the entry fee by e-mail with the VAT-number of the company (if paid by such) to entries@raliceredigion.co.uk by the closing date of entries.

4.3 Documents required for Administrative Checks

When sending the online registration entry form to the FIA, the competitors are also required to send the following documents to <u>Documentation Database</u> by 8 August at the latest.

The entry application will only be accepted if accompanied by:

- Proof of payment of the total amount of entry fees (incl. VAT)
- Copies of the Competitor and Driver and Co-driver competition licences
- Copies of the Driver and Co-driver driving licences
- Copies of the Driver and Co-driver passports or Identity cards
- Driver's declaration and undertakings forms, signed by the driver and the co-driver
- ASN authorisation, where applicable
- Copies of the car's registration papers
- Certificate of completion for the FIA eLearning Course on FIA Safety Tracking Device
- Copy of the entry form duly signed
- Copy of On-board camera Authorisation (where requested see RRSR Art. 18.1)

4.9 Entry fee refunds

5 Insurance Cover

5.1 Organiser's Insurance

The entry fees include the insurance premium to insure the competitors and other parties as necessary against third party risks whilst taking part in such parts of the Rally on private lands or roads. The indemnity provided under this special insurance is £100,000,000 (Sterling) covering any one incident or accident.

The cover is provided for such period as the Organising Permit is in force.

5.2 Entrants and Driver Requirements

Insurance

Vehicles must have a valid motor insurance policy which provides as a minimum, Third Party Liability cover that complies with the Road Traffic Act. This can be either, by extending an existing motor policy to cover the event, or, by purchasing additional cover, provided under the Event Road Section Scheme as an adjunct to an existing motor policy. If a competitor has an extension to their existing policy, they will be required to sign a declaration that the cover complies with the requirements of the Road Traffic Act. Any responsibility for a fraudulent or misleading declaration about existing cover lies with the competitor.

Where a Competitor elects to provide their own third party road section insurance, they must provide full details of cover in accordance with Motorsport UK Regulation R5.1.2. If a competitor wishes to purchase additional Road Section cover via the organisers then they can do so prior to the event providing they comply with the following:

- is aged 19 years or over
- has held a full driving licence for a minimum of 6 months
- has no more than 6 points on their licence
- has had no more than 1 fault claim in the last 3 years
- is a named driver on a valid motor insurance policy for the vehicle they are driving
- do not have the Third-Party Extension cover on their existing motor policy
- the vehicle has a valid MOT and taxed for the road, unless exempt from doing so

Anyone aged less than 19 years old will also be accepted at the same price should their co-driver be a more senior member of their family or over 25. Any competitor who falls outside these parameters may be offered cover at equivalent terms or an agreed



price, if approval from the Appointed Insurance Broker has been obtained by the event organisers, prior to the event. Approval can be sought by sending an email to contact@reis.co.uk and providing the Drivers' name and date of birth, the date they passed their driving test and details of any motoring claims and/or convictions.

Additional cover provided by this scheme is only effective whilst the vehicle is actively competing in the event and remains under the control or direction of the event organiser. Cover will cease immediately if you are precluded, excluded or retire from the event.

The Event Road Section scheme is provided by Reis Motorsport Insurance and underwritten by First Underwriting Limited.

6 Advertising and Identification

6.1 Restrictions

Tobacco advertising is prohibited in the United Kingdom.

6.2 Organiser's Advertising (Appendix 4)

The advertising on the competition numbers and rally plate will be:

The Organisers optional advertising is shown in Appendix 4.

6.3 Identification

Competition numbers and rally plates according to the 2024 FIA RRSR, Art. 27 and Appendix 4 will be provided by the organiser.

These must be affixed to the car before it is brought to scrutineering and must be visible for the duration of the rally, according to FIA RRSR Arts.27 - 29.

7 Tyres

7.1 Tyres specified for use during the rally

All tyres used during the rally must conform with FIA RRSR Art. 13 and Appendix V.



7.1.1 Tyres for all ERC1, ERC3 and ERC4 priority competitors

Tyres must be supplied by an FIA-nominated tyre company. A list of nominated tyre manufacturers for the FIA European Rally Championship is published on https://www.fia.com/regulation/category/117

7.2 Quantities of tyre

The quantities of tyres for use during the rally by all drivers are as follows:

For competitors eligible to take part in Qualifying, tyres will be taken from the overall quantity, except the spare wheel(s) fitted in the car.

For Free Practice and Shakedown tyres will not count for the overall quantity.

7.3 Tyres for Junior ERC Championship

For the Junior ERC Championship, only Hankook tyres are eligible.

The maximum quantity for Junior ERC competitors for the whole event is 12 tyres to be chosen from the list below:

7.2 Tyres for use on reconnaissance

Only road tyres are permitted to be used on Reconnaissance vehicles. Competition tyres are prohibited.

8 Fuel

Fuel must comply with 2024 FIA Appendix J Article 252.9 (FIA RRSR Art. 62)

8.1 Fuel restrictions for Junior ERC

Competitors in the Junior ERC Championship are allowed to use only pump filling station fuel (gasoline type 98) from the following petrol station:

Service crews are allowed to fill this fuel in their cans or drums and refuel Junior ERC cars in designated Refuelling Areas.

8.2 Refuelling

8.2.1 Refuelling Areas

Except as detailed in Art. 58 of FIA RRSR, competitors may refuel only in the designated Refuelling Areas and commercial filling stations marked in the Road Book.

8.2.2 Refuelling procedure

Solely for the purpose of assisting with the refuelling procedure of their car, two team members of each crew with the team passes may access the Refuelling Area. In order to access the Refuel area, all personnel involved in refuelling operations must wear clothing that provides adequate protection against fire and includes at least: long trousers, long-sleeved top, closed shoes, gloves and a balaclava. Engines must be switched off throughout the refuelling operation. It is required that the crew remain outside the car during refuelling. At the Refuel area, the competitor is responsible to protect the ground with an Environmental Mat which shall be composed of an absorbent upper part and an impermeable lower part.

9 Reconnaissance

Reconnaissance will be according to FIA RRSR Art. 35. The schedule for the reconnaissance is published in Appendix 2 of these Supplementary Regulations.

9.1 Procedure for registration

The competitor must complete by 23 August, a reconnaissance information form available at www.raliceredigion.co.uk including details of the reconnaissance car, mobile phone number and competitor's accommodation.

Reconnaissance registration will take place as follows;

- Wednesday 28 August 16:00 21:00
- Rally HQ, Aberystwyth

Administrative checks will be carried out at the same time as registration for reconnaissance.

Competitors will be issued with reconnaissance numbers that must be fixed to the front and rear windscreens and both rear side windows.

9.2 Specific and national restrictions

9.2.1 Passages

Crews are authorised to drive a maximum of 2 times through each special stage in accordance with the schedule given in Appendix 2. The special stages must be driven in the same direction as the rally, at a reduced speed and fully respecting the Traffic Laws. All special stages may only be driven as one stage during reconnaissance. All passages through the special stages will be recorded by the marshals. Time cards will not be used.



9.2.2 Speed limits

The maximum speed allowed during reconnaissance is 80 km/h (50mph) on special stages, unless another speed limit is indicated by traffic signs or by written instructions in the Road Book (or in Bulletins). All crews are reminded of Art. 34.2 of the FIA RRSR. Competitors should note that all UK speed limits and signage are MPH (miles per hour)

9.2.3 Tracking system for reconnaissances

All competitors must be equipped for reconnaissance with a smartphone-based application RS Lite system provided by the FIA official supplier STATUS AWARENESS SYSTEM (SAS).

The free app is available on the Google Play and Apple App store. Competitors are responsible for having a device capable of using the app with GPS tracking and a battery lasting the entirety of recce. Consideration should be made to make sure the phone or tablet can be charged and there are no 1st party applications that may disable GPS tracking.

SAS will distribute individual event access codes during the reconnaissance registration.

Access Code Costs:

- All Competitors: £20
- Payment must be made during the entry process

See also Appendix 8 - RS Lite for Rally usage

The progress of the Reconnaissance will be monitored via GPS system, by rally officials. Reconnaissance cars not equipped with a working RS Lite App will be reported to the Stewards.

10 Administrative Checks

10.1 Documents to be presented:

See Art 4.3 - Documents required for Administrative Checks.

All drivers and co-drivers must be present at administrative checks.

10.2 Timetable

11 Scrutineering, Sealing and Marking and Installations

11.1 Scrutineering, venue and timetable

Scrutineering Location

11.2 Mud flaps

Mud flaps are optional according to Art. 252.7.7, Appendix J of the FIA International Sporting Code.

11.3 Windows

Silvered or tinted films are allowed on rear and rear side windows only (Appendix J, Art. 253.11). Anti shatter film must be used according to the same article. Window nets are not allowed.

11.4 Drivers' safety equipment

At scrutineering competitors must produce all items of clothing, including helmets and head restraints, which will be used. The condition of the equipment and compliance with Appendix L, Chapter III will be checked.

See Appendix 5 of these Supplementary Regulations.

11.5 Noise level

The maximum noise level permitted is 103 dBA. Cars not complying with this rule will be reported to the stewards and may not be permitted to start. The noise will be measured with a sound meter regulated at "A" and "SLOW", placed at an angle of 45 degrees to and a distance of 50 cm from the exhaust outlet, with the car's engine running at 3,500 rpm.

11.6 FIA Safety tracking device (FIA RRSR Art. 18.2 and 53.2.1)

All competitors must make provisions in their rally cars for the installation of the FIA Safety Emergency Console System, and the system must be installed before the car is brought to scrutineering. For installation and operating instructions see Appendix 6. Systems may be collected either by the crew or a representative.

The antenna for the tracking system requires a 12mm hole to drilled in the roof of the car. There is an option available to purchase an adhesive antenna at a cost of £75 per



car. If this is required it must his must be confirmed and paid for when the entry is submitted.

No deposit will be collected for the rally safety tracking equipment, but all the damage caused will be invoiced afterwards.

The FIA Safety Emergency Console System devices must be removed in the final parc fermé by the crew or by a team member under the supervision of a scrutineer. They must be returned no later than 19:00 on Sunday 1 September to STATUS AWARNESS SYSTEM (SAS) at the Service Park. Should a crew retire, the equipment must be returned immediately to SAS.

11.7 Sealing (FIA RRSR, Art. 16)

Sealing of the cars will be carried out according to RRSR Art. 16. Therefore, all underbody protection must be removed for scrutineering, but must be kept with the car for weight checks.

Car's chassis and cylinder block will also be marked (RRSR, Art. 31.1.6). Sealing wires must be installed according to the instructions given at a later date.

After pre-rally scrutineering, any change of sealed component must be notified by the competitor to the following e-mail: erc-technical@fia.com. This notification must be received prior to the change of part.

11.8 On-board Cameras (FIA RRSR, Art. 18)

Competitors wishing to use an on-board camera must apply via the ERC Accreditation Portal at least one week before the start of reconnaissance.

Authorised cameras will be identified by an adhesive decal and must be mounted in the car at the time of scrutineering. The fixings of the camera and camera recorder must comply with Appendix J, Art.253.2.

12 Other Procedures

12.1 Driver's Safety briefing

All drivers and co-drivers who have not yet participated in an ERC competition in 2024 must complete the FIA eLearning course and pass the assessment for the FIA Safety Tracking Device by Sunday 25 August. The assessment is available on the website https://elearning.fia.com/learn/register in English and French. Instructions for completing the course will be sent to all entered crews by e-mail after the entry closing date. The certificate of passing the course must be sent to the rally office by email to competitor@raliceredigion.co.uk Additionally, the certificate must be presented at the Administrative Checks.



12.2 Time Card

Time cards will be issued at TC QS, TC 0, TC 2B, TC 4A, TC 5A, TC 7A, TC 10E, TC 12A and TC 13A.

12.3 Start order and interval

The start order will follow FIA RRSR Art 41.

12.4 Start procedure - Ceremonial Start & TC 0

The Ceremonial Start will take place in Aberystwyth on Friday 30 August from 16:30.

The start of the rally will be TC 0 at the exit from the Service Park.

12.5 Permitted early check-in

Crews are authorised to check-in early without incurring a penalty at:

TC PF, TC 2A, TC 10D, TC 14A

12.6 Retired cars restarting the rally

With reference to Art. 54 in the FIA RRSR any crew which fails to complete a section will be assumed to restart the rally from the start of the next section following the overnight regroup. If not, they must confirm with the Clerk of the Course by completing the form located in the road book and lodging it with the organiser as soon as possible before the publication of the re-start list.

Any crew re-starting the rally must present their cars at the overnight parc fermé at the latest one hour before the start of the next Section following the overnight regroup.

12.7 Super Special Stage - SS 1/2 & SS 9/10 Aberystwyth

With reference to Art. 51 of the FIA RRSR, SS 1/2 and SS 9/10 will be run as Super Special Stages.

At each of these pairs of stages the following starting procedure will apply;

Crews starting their second run of the stage will start between crews starting their first run.

All crews who have been allocated a start time interval of 2 minutes at the start of the rally will have a minimum interval of 1 minute between their start time and the start time of any crew attempting their first run.

All other crews will have a minimum interval of 30 seconds between their start time and the start time of any crews attempting their first run.

The normal electronic start procedure will be used.

12.8 Power Stage

With reference to Art. 50 of the FIA RRSR, SS 14, Hafod 2, will be run as the Power Stage.



12.9 Finish procedure

The finish of the competition element of the rally is at TC 14A, the holding area at the podium. Thereafter crews must follow the instructions of officials during the podium ceremony. Between TC 14A and parc fermé, competitors will be under parc fermé conditions and will be observed by marshals. Cars selected for the final checks will be driven by the crews or team representatives from the podium ceremony to the scrutineering in a convoy.

12.10 Environmental prescriptions

Teams are obligated to follow the directions and objectives in the organisers environmental policy. Further information will be published in the Rally Guide.

12.11 Official time used in the rally

Official time throughout the rally is that of the GPS. The time zone is British Summer Time (UTC +1).

12.12 Exhibition driving

Exhibition driving ("doughnuts") is strictly forbidden everywhere due to lack of suitable place. All infringements will be penalised with a minimum of a 5-minute time penalty, applied by the Stewards.

12.13 Car Washing

There will be a car wash facility on the road section to TC 14A. The location will be indicated in the road book.

12.14 Helicopters

Only helicopters registered with the event organisers are permitted to fly within the event airspace and land at the designated areas. See the event website for details of how to register.

15 Final checks / Protest / Appeals

15.1 Final Checks

Time and location: see Art. 3 - Programme.

Cars selected for final checks (communicated to the competitor concerned at the finish TC) must have one representative of the competitor as well as mechanics (in case of dismantling) present at the final checks.

15.2 Protest deposit

The protest deposit is **€1,000** (to be paid in cash or by bank transfer)

If a protest requires the dismantling and reassembly of a clearly defined part of the car (engine, transmission, steering, braking system, electrical installation, bodywork, etc.), an additional deposit may be specified by the Stewards in accordance with Art. 13.4.3 of the Code. The expenses incurred in the work and in the transport of the car shall be borne by the claimant if the protest is unfounded, or by the competitor against whom the protest is lodged if it is upheld. If the protest is unfounded, and if the expenses incurred by the protest (scrutineering, transport, etc.) are higher than the amount of the (additional) deposit, the difference shall be borne by the claimant. Conversely, if the expenses are less, the difference shall be returned.

15.3 Appeal deposit

The appeal deposit for an international appeal is €3,000



All protests and/or appeals must be lodged in accordance with Articles 13 and 15 of the Code and, where applicable, with the FIA Judicial and Disciplinary Rules.

15.4 Fines

In accordance with Article 12.8 FIA International Sporting Code, the payment of the fines must be done online, within 48 hours of their notification, at the following address: https://fiafines.fia.com

Any delay in making payment may entail Suspension during the period a fine remains unpaid.



Appendix 4 Decals and positioning of supplementary advertising



A. 2 x Doorplates with competition number

67 cm wide and 17 cm high. The top of the plate shall be placed between 7 cm and 10 cm below the bottom window line. No other signage shall be placed within 10 cm of the plate except the optional advertising panel (Item F).

Advertising: Ceredigion.

Each car eligible to score points in the ERC, ERC3 or ERC4 Championships, must affix a specific panel provided by ERC Promoter

B. 1 x Roof panel with competition number

50 cm wide and 52 cm high. Placed on the roof with the top towards the front of the car. Advertising: Ceredigion.

C. 1 x Rear window competition number

14 cm high. Placed at the rear window. Advertising: JDS Rali Ceredigion.



D. Rally plate with starting number

43 cm wide and 21.5 cm high.

E. Rear side windows

2 x competition numbers 20 cm high - shall be placed at the top of the rear side windows. The name of the driver with his/her passport nationality national flag must appear in the rear side window of both sides of the car (under the starting numbers). For further details see 2024 FIA RRSR.

Optional Advertising

F. 2 x Door Panels

67 cm wide and 20 cm high. The top of the panel shall be placed directly below the doorplates with competition number (Item A).

Appendix 5 Drivers' Safety Equipment - FIA ISC Appendix L

All competitors are reminded of Appendix L of the FIA International Sporting Code, in particular its Chapter III - Drivers' Equipment. These regulations apply to Free practice, Qualifying stage and Shakedown as well.

Helmets (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 1)

All crews must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the following FIA standards:

8859-2015 (Technical List N°49),
 8860-2010 (Technical List N°33) or
 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP (Technical List N°69)

Frontal Head Restraint (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3)

All crews must use FIA approved FHR systems homologated to FIA standard 8858. Approved FHRs, anchorages and tethers are listed in Technical List N° 29. See also helmet compatibility chart in Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3.3.

Flame-resistant clothing (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2)

All drivers and co-drivers must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2000 standard (Technical List N°27) or 88562018 (Technical List N° 74).

Standard 8856-2018 (Technical List N° 74) is mandatory for FIA, ERC, ERC3 and ERC4 Priority driver (and accompanying co-driver).

Drivers and co-drivers can wear additional FIA approved personal underwear, between their skin and the compulsory FIA approved underwear. No other underwear is permitted.

Please pay special attention to the prescriptions of Art. 2 concerning embroidery and printing on flameresistant clothing (manufacturer certificates etc.) as well as concerning the correct wearing of the clothing elements! See also the RRSR, Art. 53.1.

Biometric Devices (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2.1)

Drivers may wear a device to collect biometric data during racing.

- If the biometric device is integrated into a protective garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856, the garment shall be homologated to FIA Standards 8856 and 8868-2018.
- If the biometric device is a standalone device, then the device must be homologated to FIA Standard 8868-2018 only. This device must be worn in addition to the garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856.

Wearing of jewellery (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 5)

The wearing of any type of jewellery, such as but not limited to, neck chains, bracelets or watches is prohibited during the competition. Exceptions to this rule, providing the



CMO and/or Medical Delegate do not consider that due to size or location they may delay rescue or hinder emergency care, are:

- i. the wearing of watch(es) by co-drivers, on the condition that the watch(es) is worn over the overall,
- ii. the wearing of a single band-style ring providing it does not restrict the natural range of motion of the hand, and
- iii. the wearing of body piercing(s) providing they are not worn in and/or around the oral cavity.
