To access Weeton Army Camp, please exit M55 at Junction 3 and travel north on A585, then after 2.4 miles turn left on to Mile Road B5269, at the end of this road turn left on to Weeton Road where the camp entrance will be found on the right hand side after 1.1 miles. (///national.adjuster.lightens).

Procedure at venue

1. Proceed to unload trailer on the road once you've entered Weeton Army Camp and take the trailer to the trailer park.
2. With the competition vehicle, please travel through the one way system on the roads (diagram on the next page) and report to noise check at 06:00 plus your start number. **Noise closes at 07:45.**
3. Proceed to scrutineering. Note that **scrutineering will close at 08:00.**
4. Any competitor not signed on 90 minutes before their due start time at MTC1 may be excluded.
Signing-on opens at 06:30 and closes at 08:00.
5. Attend the **competitors' briefing at 08:30** by the Results area.
6. Your due **time at MTC1 is 08:59 plus your start number.**

Scrutineering notes

1. MOT certificates and DVLC V5 documents will be checked at scrutineering.
2. Red warning triangle and OK/SOS board are required to be carried throughout this event and used appropriately.
3. A spill kit as per NCR Ch.13 App.11 Part C Art.2.1 must be carried by each car.
4. 2 x High-visibility jackets
5. 1 x Torch
6. We would request that each competing vehicle carries a fire extinguisher / stick – we have had a number of vehicle fires on recent events.

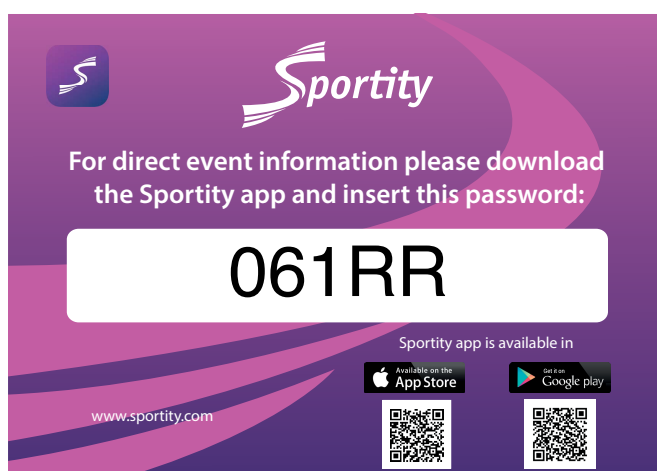
Please ensure that your car is fully ready for scrutineering before joining the queue. No remedial work will be allowed within the scrutineering area and if you fail you will be required to rejoin at the back of the queue for any re-test.

Please can we also remind you that your competing car must comply with Motorsport UK NCR Ch.13 App.11C.

The event will be utilising Sportity for documentation and for the Official Notice Board.

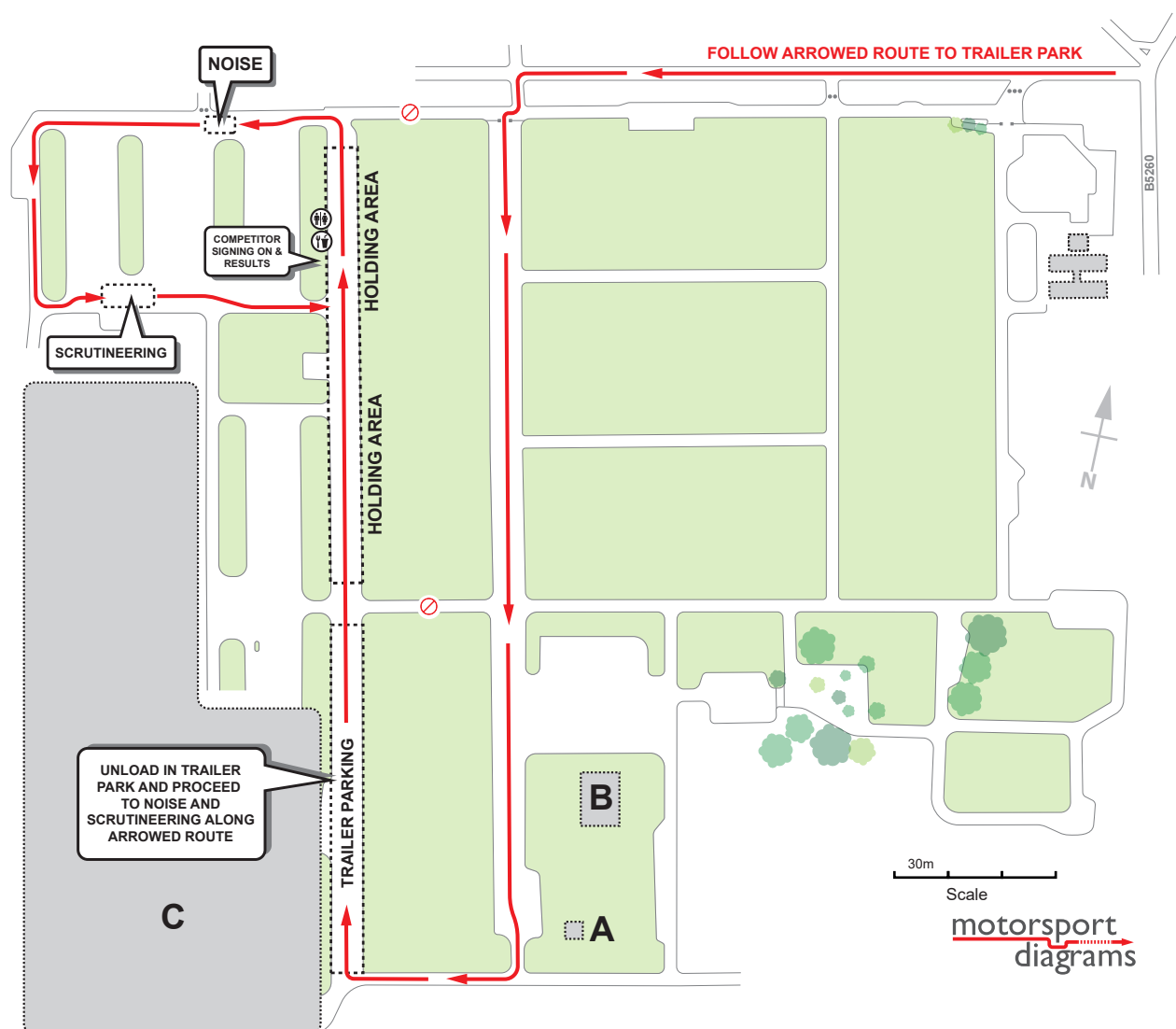
Please note that updates, notices, bulletins etc will be posted throughout the event and so you are advised to monitor updates regularly and allow alerts.

Other information

1. Please remember that this is a Targa Road Rally, and all spare parts must be carried within the competing vehicle. There must be no "outside" servicing in the competitor holding area. In the interests of health & safety, we will allow a tarpaulin, trolley jack and 2 axle stands.
REMEMBER – this is a Road Rally, however as per Ch.13 App.11C Art.26 we will allow a maximum of 8 wheels / tyres, these may be marked by the Scrutineers.
2. Force Majeure notwithstanding the Clerk of the Course reserves the right to cancel any section, or the penalties at a control or check, should he deem it fair to do so, (Force Majeure means that penalties at a control or check will be cancelled if over half of the competitors were unable to reach that control or check).
3. Please refer below for details of control names and abbreviations to be used on the event.
4. **Reconnaissance:**
Test reconnaissance will only be permitted between **07:00 and 08:00** on Saturday 20 June 2026. This will be on foot or push bicycle only. No vehicles, other than official vehicles, will be permitted onto the test prior to the start of the rally. Caution is required as there may be official vehicles moving around the test.
5. **Competitor Briefing:**
As per NCR Ch.6 App.1 Art. 2.3 - there will be a competitor briefing in the Results area, by starting Test 1 you agree to adhere to all points.
Timecards will be handed out here to confirm your presence.
Non attendance will be fined as per NCR Ch.1 App.2 Art.11.6.i
6. **Hogweed**
There is Hogweed present on site, which if touched could give you a burn / rash.
If you do get giant hogweed sap on your skin, be sure to wash the area thoroughly and immediately.
Seek medical advice and do not expose the area to sunlight for a few days.

7. **Out of Bounds on the Site**
There are certain areas within the site that are out of bounds, please ensure that you adhere to this, they are marked on the Site plan on page 3 above:
 - a. Skills House
 - b. 25m Range
 - c. Old hangar base half of the venue, please do not walk/drive on this section.
8. NCR Ch.13 App.11C Art.2.2 – We would like to advise that in-car cameras are not allowed, as the event is taking place on Ministry of Defence property, no recording of any sort is permitted within the site.
9. **Dogs:**
Please note there are to be NO dogs on the venue.
10. **Refreshments:**
If you're in the queue for the catering van and a marshal joins the queue, please could we ask that you allow them in – they are on a tight time schedule from leaving their marshalling post to returning.
11. **Awards Presentation:**
This will be held as soon as possible after the last car finishing the event, subject to weather / light!

Thank you for your co-operation. We hope you enjoy a good day of motor sport; if you do, please tell us, as it will make the work all the more worthwhile. If you don't, please still tell us, we can solve it then for next year.

Your attention is drawn to the following regulations and interpretations**NCR Ch.13. App.11C Art.1.1a**

To be classified as a finisher a Competitor must report to all Main Time Controls and, unless otherwise stated in the Event Documents, attempt at least 75% of the tests listed in the Route Card or Time Card.

Damage to Third Party Property*DAMAGE DECLARATION: -*

Competitors who retire will be required to submit their Damage Declaration to the Event Secretary within 72 hours of the event. Failure to return this form may be penalised by a fine of £100.00. NCR Ch.13 Ap. 5 Art.6.4 applies.

Competitors will be required to complete and sign a report declaring that they have not been involved in any incident resulting in damage to private property or injury to persons or animals, or alternatively giving details of any such incident where damage or injury has occurred within 24 hours of the incident occurring.

Any information given will not incur a penalty but failure to hand in a duly completed form will be penalised by EXCLUSION and reported to Motorsport UK.

DAMAGE TO THIRD PARTY PROPERTY: -

Competitors causing damage to any third party property will be liable for any excess Stockport 061 Motor Club Ltd has to pay to the Motorsport UK insurers and also any cost that is not covered by the Insurers. The excess is currently £500.

The Clerk of Course will be checking all incidents that occur on the Tests and will also be checking out vehicles leaving the Tests for damage. Photo or video evidence may also be used to ensure that an incident report is completed by each competitor for every incident that they have on a Test that results in damage to any third party property.

Amend Supplementary Regulations as follows:

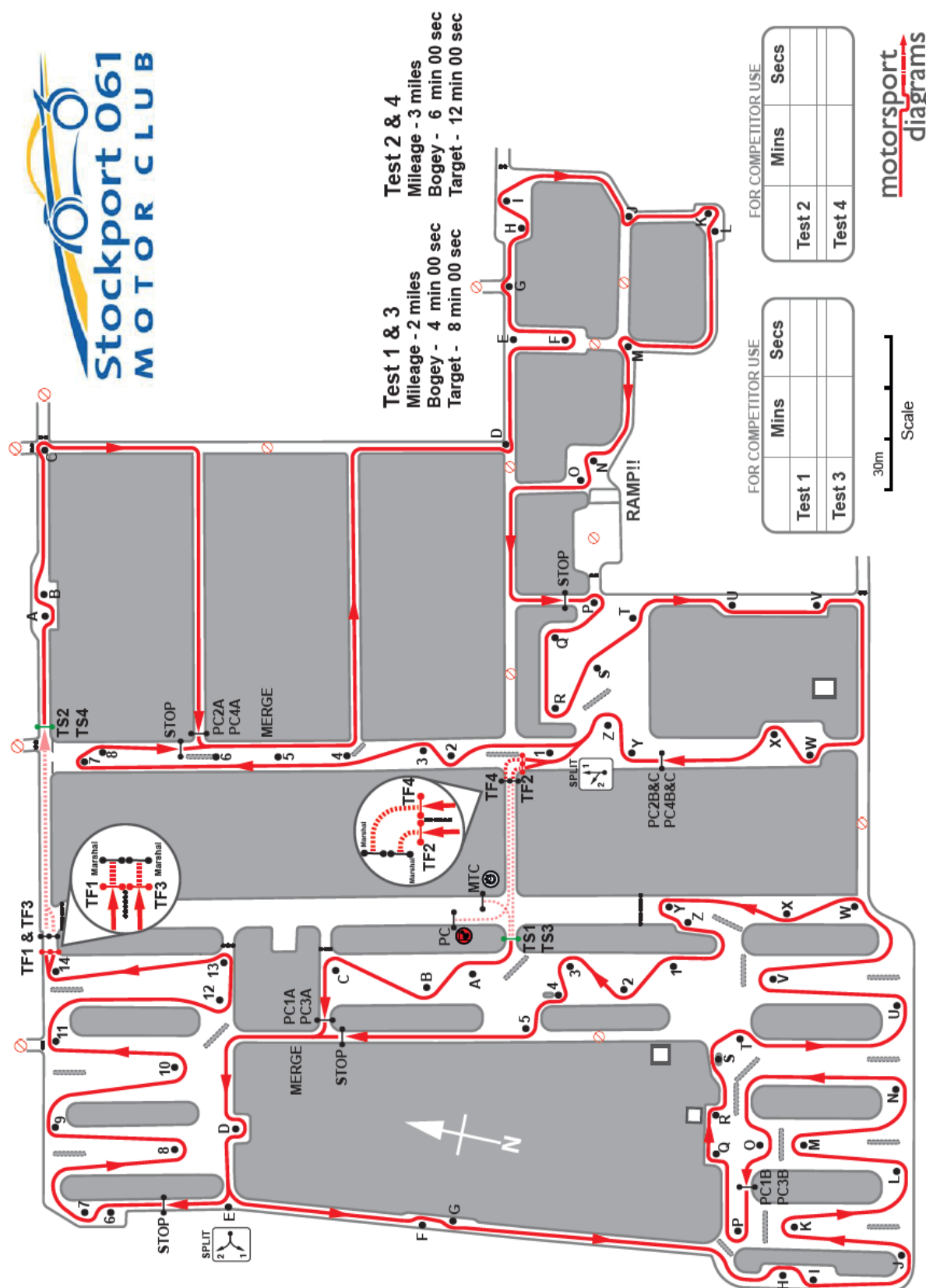
- SR5 Test diagram handouts will be in A3 format.
- SR6 Test starts will be at 1-minute intervals, please remove reference to 30-second starts.
- SR7 One rally plate to be affixed to the bonnet, one to the top left of the rear window and a set of high-viz numbers to be applied to each side rear window of the competing vehicle.
Ch.13 App.9 Art.5.3.
- SR8 Due to only receiving 1 Interclub Historic entries, there will be no Historic class and these will be merged with Expert / Novice as seeding dictates.
- SR12 Add Event Steward – Andy Rushton, Ann McCormack & Kris Pirie
Add Chief Scrutineer – Andy Hardcastle
Add Scrutineer – Andy Bradley
Add Environmental Scrutineer – Gill Bradley
- SR13 Any competitor found to be intentionally blocking the route, or preventing other competitors from reaching a control or check, shall be penalised by disqualification.
Please amend the NCR reference from Ch.13 App.7 to Ch.13 App.7A
Under Ch.13 App.7A 1.1 – the performance will be assessed by time Penalty.
- SR14 Results will be available on <https://www.rallies.info/res?e=703>.
- SR16 Please amend the bullet point 2 to Ch.13 App.3 Art. 12.1.
We would like to remind you that there are to be no “service crew” helping during the day.
There will be no access allowed to Weeton Army Camp other than both competing crew and marshals – no spectators/family/supporters will be allowed in, however should anyone be able to assist with marshalling, please complete the [Registration Form](#) and Nancy Russell will be in touch!
