The Stewards, having received an Inquiry from Preston Osborn via Sportity reporting a Quiet Zone Violation for Car 62 as reported by RallySafe, have considered the following matter and determined the following:

Driver, Co-driver, and car No: Chris O'Driscoll, Lori O'Driscoll, Car 62

Date and Time (fact): 18 July 2026 20:17

Session: Section 2, TC3C to TC4

Fact: RallySafe created a Quiet Zone report for the Quiet Zones listed in the routebook and displayed on the in-car RallySafe console. The report showed that Car 62 reached a maximum speed of 47mph in a 30mph zone on the way to SS4. The Stewards interviewed the crew of 62 and they admitted that they were having car issues and momentarily accelerated while in a control zone.

Offence: RCR 6.4.1

Decision: In the presence of precise RallySafe Judge of Fact data, the Stewards determine that a penalty of 60 seconds is appropriate, informed by the Observation Control penalties defined in RCR 6.2 and considering the top speed was only achieved momentarily and the average speed through the zone was within acceptable range.

Reason: Quiet Zones are established by the Organizer to mitigate impact on local residents and road users, and to preserve the event's permission to operate on public or transit roads. Exceeding the prescribed limit introduces unnecessary risk to the public and undermines the Organizer's obligations to local authorities and communities.

Competitors are reminded that they have the right to protest certain decisions of the Stewards, in accordance to Article 9 of the ARA General Competition Rules.
