

## MEDIA SAFETY RULES

1. It is strictly forbidden to be under the influence of alcoholic beverages, drugs or other intoxicating substances at the event!
2. Accredited media representatives must comply with all instructions given by the race stewards, officials and referees.
3. Choose the safest possible location on the track. Always be prepared for unusual situations or accidents on the track. If you are in the immediate vicinity of the track, always keep an eye on what is happening on the track.
4. Accredited media representatives wearing a media vest issued by the race organiser are allowed to be in designated media areas or dangerous areas of the track, but no further than 1 (one) meter from a safety barrier (tape, fence, etc.).
5. Accredited media representatives who are not wearing a media vest issued by the organiser are not allowed on the dangerous areas of the track or in the designated media areas.
6. The performance of accredited media representatives and the equipment they use, or their location in the competition areas, must in no way affect the result of the competitors or the safe conduct of the competition.
7. Accredited media representatives are prohibited from using any ground-controlled flying devices, including drones, unless specifically authorised by the event organiser.
8. Beware of moving race cars! Motor sport can be dangerous and your safety is entirely up to you. Pay close attention to what is going on around you.
9. Do not get too close to race cars. In the service park, allow mechanics to work freely around the race cars. Do not interfere with the work of team personnel.
10. Do not lean against race cars. They may suddenly start moving and their parts may be fragile and/or hot.

11. Do not stand near fire trucks, referee or ambulance vehicles. They may start moving suddenly without warning.

12. If you need to review footage, do not do so in the immediate vicinity of the track. Choose a safer place!

13. Avoid crossing the special stages during the race. If you need to cross a special stage, do so in a place with good visibility and make sure that no race car is approaching.

14. Failure to comply with any point of the Media Safety Regulations may result in the withdrawal of accreditation and expulsion from the event.

15. By submitting a media accreditation application, you acknowledge that you have read, agree to and accept full responsibility for your actions.
