# 5.1 LOCATION, ACCESS TIMES, AND SURFACE

#### **5.2 SERVICE AREA SIZE**

Standard service areas are 20 feet by 40 feet <u>per race vehicle</u>. An additional, connected <u>standard</u> service area can be reserved during the online registration process for \$100. This fee covers an additional service area at both service locations.

# 5.3 CANOPY, STRUCTURE, AND FLAG ANCHORING

All canopies and structures used at the Leg 2 service park in Johnson City must be anchored with a 40lb weight per leg. The easiest way to achieve this is with a water filled 5-gallon bucket tied to the canopy frame. Staking is not an acceptable alternative to the 40lb anchor weight.

No ground stakes of any kind are allowed at the Leg 2 service park in Johnson City – this includes feather flags using ground stakes.

#### 5.4 SERVICE ASSIGNMENTS

Service assignments will be made by the Service Park Manager and posted on the official notice board (Sportity). Assignments will be detailed by day and stall number. Teams that have paid for extra service area will receive connecting stalls.

To aid the Service Park Manager in making assignments, a link to the <u>Service Special Requests</u> form has been provided in the "pre-event forms" folder on Sportity. All special requests to Service Park Manager are due via the form by the close of entries, but earlier requests will be prioritized. <u>See Schedule for close of entry date</u>.

Requests made after September 4th may not be achievable. Please get your requests in ASAP.

#### 5.6 DIRECTION OF TRAVEL IN SERVICE AREAS

Travel direction is regulated by the service plan for each day. All rally traffic is one way clockwise at the Newport Fairground service area on Saturday. Service plans are available in the appendix.

#### 5.7 ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

Tarps must be in place under race vehicles while servicing to capture potential ethyl glycol and petroleum product spills. Teams should be prepared to quickly clean up any spills using their ARA required spill kit before ground contamination occurs.

#### 5.8 VEHICLES ALLOWED IN SERVICE PARK

Vehicles must have a service access sticker (also the recce identification sticker) to enter the service park. Each team will be supplied with two stickers, one for the service vehicle and one for a recce vehicle. All crew vehicles inside the service park must be parked within the competitors' designated service space and may not spill into a competitor's service space.

Extra parking is available on site but outside of the service area on Saturday.

#### 5.9 RECOVERING COMPETITION CARS FROM STAGES

Crews must inform the Service Park Manager, Service Park Safety Manager, or their delegates prior to leaving the service park to retrieve a retired competition vehicle. The CoC must approve the recovery plans before teams will be allowed to exit service. Crews should NOT show up at any stage finish, start, or intersecting road without CoC approval of their recovery plan.

Due to the technical nature of the roads, cars which retire on stage will likely be pulled to a safe location and left until the competition is completed on that stage for the day. Crews can retrieve vehicles on stage once approval is given by the CoC. There are VERY FEW intersecting roads where crews can enter or exit a stage to recover a competition car. The stages are extremely technical and on-stage recoveries could take a significant amount of time.

Directions to stage ends from service on each day are provided in a separate "Service Crew Recovery Routes" document available on the Sportity notice board.

# 6 TECH ZONES (TZ)

TZs will be in place at the service-in regroup on both days of competition. All teams must have a crew member present at the TZ to support vehicle inspections if necessary.

A TZ may be in place at the remote power stage regroup preceding the TFZ.

# 7 TIRE FITTING ZONE (TFZ)

There will be a tire fitting zone (TFZ) for National entrants during Section 5 of the rally. Any additional regulations for the TFZ will be released via bulletin. Service crews will be allowed to transit to the TFZ via the route provided. The site plan for the TFZ is available in the Appendix.


# 7.1 TIRE AND EQUIPMENT STORAGE

# 8 FUEL

#### 8.1 VP FUEL DELIVERY LOCATION

Fuel drums will be delivered to JD Squared, Inc. in Johnson City, TN. All teams will be alerted via Sportity when the fuel has arrived and is available for pickup. Crews should plan to pick fuel up during scrutineering on Friday.

#### 8.2 FUEL DRUM GROUNDING


<u>Fuel drums must be properly bonded and grounded while in the refuel zones unless actively being transported into or out of the refuel zone.</u> The easiest way to achieve this requirement is to leave fuel drums in direct contact with the ground. Handheld fuel jugs must be sitting on the ground while not in the act of fueling.

#### 8.3 REMOTE REFUEL LOCATION

The length of Section 4 & 5 may necessitate a refuel to complete the route. A Remote Refuel will be available on Sunday in Shady Valley, TN. The site plan with fuel storage location is in the Appendix. Competitors may also refuel at any commercial fuel station that is listed in the route book.

There will be a Regroup & Parc Exposé before the start of SSS7. Competitors will be directed to park in the infield at Newport Speedway upon arrival at TC6D (Parc Exposé Regroup In). During this regroup, normal PARC EXPOSÉ rules apply (See ARA RCR 4.10.1). Event supplied <u>wrist bands</u> will act as a pass for free entry into Newport Speedway.

#### 11.2 WRISTBANDS

Event wristbands are required to enter the scrutineering area. <u>This means that crew members must check-in before presenting a vehicle at scrutineering</u>.

#### 11.5 RALLYSAFE

RallySafe wiring kits must be installed and ready for inspection prior to presenting the vehicle for scrutineering. RallySafe units will be distributed at scrutineering.

# 11.6 EVENT DECALS AND VINYL

All event decals and vinyl must be installed prior to presenting the vehicle at scrutineering. This includes the entire <u>ARA visual package</u> and all event provided decals and vinyl.

# 12 PR ACTIVITIES

#### 12.1 TESTING RIDE-ALONGS

Ride-alongs are allowed during the paid testing session. Anyone is allowed to ride in any car provided they have signed the USAC insurance waiver. The waiver will be available at the test session – see the stage commander.

All riders must wear the following safety equipment at a minimum:

- ARA legal helmet (ARA RTR 1.1)
- ARA legal fire suit (ARA RTR 1.3)
- ARA legal head and neck restraint (ARA RTR 1.2)

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# 14.2 ACCREDITATION PROCEDURE / CRITERIA AND DEADLINE

All media accreditation is completed through the series. Please read the ARA policies and procedures for event media at <u>ARA-Rally.com/media</u>.

#### 14.3 MEDIA CHECK-IN

Media can check-in at any time that competitor check-in is open Thursday-Friday. Competitor check-in is per the <u>schedule</u>.

#### 14.4 ALLOWABLE LOCATIONS FOR RESTRICTED MEDIA

Restricted media (Red vest) may shoot from any location specified as a spectator point. Restricted media must stay within sight of the volunteer marshals and will be reprimanded if an attempt is made to stand in an unsafe location per the ARA media safety guidelines.

Restricted media may buddy system with Unrestricted media (Blue or Orange vests) to gain access to more remote locations. They must stay within eyesight of their designated buddy, and the Unrestricted media member will be responsible for unsafe actions reported by their Restricted "buddy." Restricted buddies MUST CARPOOL with Unrestricted media to get to remote locations. Restricted media are not allowed to drive a vehicle on stage without Unrestricted media in the car for supervision.

**Exception:** Restricted media are allowed to drive alone on stage <u>to captive spectating points</u> while spectator movement is allowed.

#### 14.5 RESTRICTED LOCATIONS FOR ALL MEDIA

Media may not park on posted private property during the rally.

There are three driveways on the route. All are off limits for media parking.

1. Wasp - Mile 1.7

#### 15.1 RECCE GUIDE

In addition to stage notes available for purchase and online recce (see Supplemental Regulations Section 12 Reconnaissance), on-stage reconnaissance will be available on Thursday and Friday, September 12 – 13, 2024.

Open reconnaissance at Overmountain Rally Tennessee 2024 will consist of unlimited passes during the times listed in the Supplemental Regulations Section 3.2 Schedule During Rally Week. The times are copied below for your convenience. Competitors are reminded to review ARA RCR 1.2.1 prior to recce. There is ample time for a two-pass recce within the two days allowed for it. Open times and directions of travel on stages will be restricted and monitored.

Competitors should affix the Overmountain Rally Tennessee recce decal to the recce vehicle windshield.

Competitors should stop and check in with any event official operating an Observation Control in the stage or on a transit.

Under no circumstances may a competitor drive in the opposite direction of the rally traffic, unless instructed by an event official or law enforcement. Competitors may only enter the stage through the start and exit the stage through the finish.

DRIVE CAREFULLY. All roads will be open to public two-way traffic during recce.

# **15.2 MAXIMUM RECCE SPEED AND PENALTIES**

**A recce speed limit of 20mph will be strictly enforced.** Any team traveling over 25mph will be penalized per ARA RCRs Section 1.2.1. The singular exception is an allowed 25mph speed limit on Hellbender stage and any team traveling over 30mph on Hellbender will be penalized per ARA RCRs Section 1.2.1.

The RS Lite application will still alarm at 25mph on all stages.
