1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 It's 100 Acre Wood time again. On behalf of the 30-member organizing committee, we want to thank you for choosing this event. We hope to make it a great one for everyone. We cannot do this without the support of 200+ volunteers, so be sure to thank them whenever you see them. This event takes place in Dent, Crawford, and Washington counties in Missouri and it would mean a lot to us and them if you could support them whenever you can. Whether you need hotel rooms, food, drinks, gas, car parts, or souvenirs, try to get them in Salem, Sligo, Jadwin, Potosi, Cuba, Cherryville, or Steelville.

We have many property owners along the stages, most of whom appreciate the show that the competitors put on as they race by, but do remember to be sensible and safe during recce when the roads are open to everyone and while traveling around the area. Most rally attendees are visitors to the area so do your best to be courteous and respectful to our hosts.

2 DESCRIPTION & ORGANIZATION

- 2.1.1 This event will be held under the current American Rally Association (ARA) Rules. The 2026 American Rally Association Rules and Regulations can be found at <https://www.americanrallyassociation.org/rulesandbulletins> The Rally in the 100 Acre Wood (100AW) will consist of two days of competition and is part of the ARA National Rally Championship. The concurrent two-day Super Regional event is part of the Central Regional Championship.
- 2.1.2 National competitors will have one additional power stage at the end of the day on Saturday. Regional competitors will receive their trophies while this is running.
- 2.1.3 The route will be approximately 490 miles in length with approximately 128 miles of competitive stages for national and 430 miles in length and 116 miles for regional. All competitive stages will be held on roads that consist primarily of gravel, and will vary somewhat in width and tightness. Roads vary from sweeping, well-groomed roads to tight and twisty.
- 2.1.4 Any additional changes or additions to these Supplementary Regulations will be announced only by numbered and dated bulletins. The Organizers and/or the Stewards shall decide upon any conditions not foreseen in these regulations.
- 2.2 As has been seen over the past several years, Missouri weather patterns can best be described as capricious. The committee is prepared to conduct this event under any circumstances and will give the contestant competition regardless of weather conditions.

4 ENTRIES

4.1 Entry Procedure:

Entry and payment must be made online at <http://enterrally.com/> ARA will send an email blast to ARA license holders announcing the opening of entry. For assistance with online event registration, contact ara@ara-rally.com. No entry payments can be accepted at the event. Rally participants must be either ARA licensed (competitors, their crew members, media, officials) or registered as a volunteer.

Entries will be accepted for this rally beginning on January 28, 2026, ending on March 4, 2026.

The maximum number of entries accepted will be 85 cars. Initially, 80 entries will be accepted with 5 spots held until February 20 for the top 5 national teams from the 2025 ARA National Championship. If more than 85 cars enter, a wait list will be used and teams will be notified if

their entry is accepted by March 5, 2026. Wait listed entries not accepted will receive a full refund.

Entry Fees include: Jemba Notes, Recce Participation, Tulip route book, one Service Packet, use of a single service site, and the awards dinner.

Competitors needing to purchase extra service spaces may do so for \$200 each.

RallySafe Installation rental kits are available for \$40.

- 4.2 The first 5 paid National and 10 paid Regional teams competing in a Subaru vehicle are eligible for discounts. Discount codes are: National26100AW and Regional26100AW

- 4.3 Withdrawal Policy: An entry may be withdrawn in accordance with ARA GCR 4.9.

4.3.1 Full refund if withdrawn by end of regular entry period, 2359 CST February, 20, 2026

4.3.2 After 23:59 CST on 2/20//2026 and until 23:59 CST on 3/4/2026 – full refund less \$250.

4.3.3 Non-wait listed entries that are withdrawn after March 4 will receive no refunds.

4.3.4 If the event is cancelled a full refund will be issued.

5 INSURANCE

- 5.1 Third party liability insurance covering bodily injury and property damage, effective during the competition, will be provided by a policy secured by ARA and displayed on the Official Notice Board.

- 5.2 Competitors, service crew members, and all event participants including officials, marshals, staff, stewards, and all other volunteers who have obtained an ARA license, signed an ARA waiver and have been issued and are in possession of an event wristband confirming the signature of the waiver will be covered by a secondary ARA participant accident insurance policy which covers excess medical expenses to their primary medical insurance provider.

6 ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATION

- 6.1 Vehicles must comply with the 2026 ARA Vehicle Appearance guidelines. All ARA series advertising must be properly displayed on competition cars.

7 FUEL

- 7.1 Competitors are required to supply their own fuel and must comply with the fuel requirements noted within in the ARA rules. Fuel with an octane rating of 93 (R+M) is available in Salem, Cuba, Steelville, and Potosi and some other surrounding towns, but is not available in Viburnum or at the Berryman Store.
- 7.2 Any competitor who does not wish to refuel in the fuel depot in service may choose to purchase fuel at commercial gas stations on the transit sections.
- 7.3 VP Fuel will be available for pre-purchase and delivered to the event and must be ordered by February 27. Details are found at [LINK](#). Pick up time and place will be addressed in a bulletin when the details are known. The event is not responsible for any fuel not picked up and will be donated to the Fire Dept.

8 RECONNAISSANCE

- 8.1 A reconnaissance session will be held on Thursday, March 12 starting at 7:00 AM in accordance with Section 1.2.1 of the RCR. This reconnaissance session will be open to all competitors. The session is open and you are permitted to drive the stages more than once. All recce must be completed by 7pm, Thursday March 12.
- 8.2 Both driver and co-driver need to check-in at recce check-in.
- 8.3 An itinerary for this reconnaissance will be provided at recce registration, along with any additional bulletins governing the session. You don't have to follow the prescribed route but it will expedite your way to each stage. All competitors taking part in the reconnaissance session must attend check-in.
- 8.4 An advance packet will be emailed to each team by March 5, 2026.
- 8.5 The vehicles used shall have no lettering or advertising which would call undue attention to it and must have quiet exhausts, i.e. nothing that could be mistaken for a rally car by locals.
- 8.6 The speed limit on stages during recce will be monitored with the 2026 ARA Recce tracking system, RSLite. Speeding penalties will be assessed per ARA RCR 1.2.1.h.
 - 8.6.1 As a point of general information, the un-posted speed limit in the state of Missouri is 55 miles per hour for paved roads.
 - 8.6.2 35 mph is the speed limit for all unpaved roads during recce.

8.6.3 All speed limits are noted in the route book and take precedence.

8.7 All recce roads will be open to the public. Inconsiderate or irresponsible driving may result in exclusion from the event.

9 ON-SITE CHECK-IN

9.1 Competitor Check-In will be per schedule in section 3. All team members attending the event must be designated by the team's key contact by March 6, 2026.

9.2 On-site Recce Check-In will take place at the Crossroads Inn & Suites meeting room.

9.3 All competitors and service personnel must have signed up for a license at <http://rallylicense.com>.

9.4 On-site crew check-in will be inside the Dent County Fire House on Thursday, March 12 (10am to 5pm) and at the Huzzah Valley Resort snack bar on Friday, March 13 (10-11am).

9.4.1 Crew packets must be picked up by Friday at the end of check-in. If a team does not have a crew, they must contact the registrar in order to receive their crew packet at recce check-in. This info will be on Sportity as well.

9.5 **Do not bring your trailer to Crew Check-In at the Fire House.**

9.6 Volunteer check-in will be available on Thursday, Friday and Saturday and will be sent to all registered volunteers. All volunteers must register in advance at <https://rally101.100aw.org/volunteerinformation/>

10 SCRUTINEERING

10.1 Scrutineering will be held at the Salem Fire House, 2 South Main St., Salem, MO. **Do not bring your trailers.** You may park trailers temporarily at Dent County Commons for loading and unloading for tech.

10.2 Scrutineering will be held at the following times:

A bulletin will be issued just before the event to finalize the tech appointments.

Friday, March 13: BY APPOINTMENT ONLY. To set up an appointment at Huzzah Valley Resort service area, contact the Chief Scrutineer found in section 2.6.

- 10.3 Logbooks will only be issued at the event by appointment with the Chief ARA Scrutineer. If you need a logbook, you must make an appointment by contacting doug@ara-rally.com as soon as possible.

11 SERVICE AREAS

- 11.1 There will be two service locations for the event.

Friday's service location is at Huzzah Valley Resort 970 MO-8, Steelville, MO 65565. All service spots are on gravel. Hot food and soft drinks will be available for purchase all day.

Saturday's service location is Dent County Commons, 162 County Rd. 2300, Salem MO, 65560. Service spots are mix of pavement and grass. Hot food and soft drinks will be available for purchase all day.

The schedules for the service area are included in Appendix 1 – Itinerary and service area location is shown in Appendix 2 – Maps.

- 11.2 Any teams needing to use a service space larger than 20 feet by 50 feet will be charged \$200, payable with your registration fee.
- 11.3 Service spots will be assigned prior to the event. We will contact teams in advance to help work out the logistics of assigning service spots. Teams with special service needs or problems should contact the Service Coordinator before March 4, 2026.
- 11.4 The provided service vehicle sign must be displayed on any service vehicles to gain entry into service areas. Please display these to make entry to the service park easier.
- 11.5 Tarps are required under all rally cars while being serviced.
- 11.6 TRAILERS:

Trailer parking will be available to competitors across the street from the Salem TCRC, 1200 West Rolla Road (State Hwy J), in Salem, and is shown in a map in Appendix 2 – Maps.

Trailers are not allowed to be kept at the Crossroads Inn in Salem. In addition, trailer parking at other motels may be limited.

Trailers are allowed into the service areas.

Trailers are allowed at the Cuba parc expose at Hood Park on Thursday night.

- 11.7 It is recommended that competitors use a plywood or metal support plate underneath their jack stands while using them in service areas.
- 11.8 Service crew must notify the service area coordinator when they leave to retrieve a car.

12 SHAKEDOWN, PRESS, AND TESTING STAGES

- 12.1 There will be no shakedown stage.
- 12.2 Testing will be available for all competitors on Tuesday March 10 and Wednesday, March 11. All test sessions will be on a first paid, first served basis with paid entry. There will be two sessions each day on a road representative of the event's road surface (same road as 2025). The test road is approximately 2.5 miles long with a road junction turn and will run both directions. The service park for the day is 3 miles from the stage. Each session lasts 3 hours and costs \$250. One session from 9am to 12pm and another from 1pm to 4pm. Jemba notes will be provided. There will be 8 slots available in each session. Due note that at least six teams will need to sign up for the Tuesday sessions in order to hold testing that day.
- 12.3 We have no private testing to offer.
- 12.4 Practice or testing in Dent, Crawford, or Washington Counties is forbidden, other than the official test sessions or with written permission from 100AW organizers. Teams found in violation will be barred from starting or excluded from finishing 100AW, MOR, and Show-Me Rallies and their entry fees will not be refunded.

13 FEATURES OF THE RALLY

- 13.1 A Parc Exposé will be held as part of the starting ceremonies for each day's competition, plus Thursday, March 12, 2026.
- 13.2 The locations and times for Parc Expose are:

Thursday, March 12 Cuba, MO – Hood Park, 1 Hood Park Drive, Cuba, MO 65453

1830-2100. Attendance by co-drivers is optional. Drivers and cars must be present by 1930

Friday, March 13: Downtown Potosi, at the County Courthouse 102 N Missouri St, Potosi, MO 63664

1100 - 1230 Must be present by 1145

Saturday, March 14: Fourth Street, downtown Salem, MO

0830– 1000 Must be present by 0915

Maps describing the areas are provided in Appendix 2, and will also be provided in the competitor route books and service packets.

Drivers and Co-drivers are required to be present in driving suits to show their cars and discuss the sport with spectators and press. Co-driver attendance in Cuba is optional. Driving suits are optional in Cuba.

No refueling may take place within the Parc Expose zone, regardless of whether the Parc Expose has started or finished.

- 13.3 All control operations will be conducted per section 4 of the ARA RCR and employ RallySafe consoles and tablets.

13.3.1 You may check in early at Control TC6A, TC12A for Regional teams only, and TC13A for National teams only.

- 13.4 Rejoining the event/Re-entry after retirement (ARA RAR 6.3).

Competitors who have missed one or more controls and are Restarting After Retirement or wish to rejoin as a Non-Competitive Entry, are required to complete and submit an NCE : RAR : Withdrawal FORM located in the Inquiry folder on the Sportity App before they restart. The Clerk of the Course and Chief Scrutineer will verify that the team meets the safety requirements and has any required tracking or monitoring equipment before issuing a timecard for the Rally Re-Entry.

- 13.5 The Power Stage is stage 13, KP to Ollie Long 3.

- 13.6 Official Finish: Vehicles will be impounded for final checks immediately following the final Time Control.

- 13.7 The committee would like to remind competitors and crews that Salem has an "open bottle" ordinance that prohibits any open container of beer, wine, or other alcoholic beverage from being outdoors within the city limits. We ask that all associated with the rally show respect for both our hosts and the local laws throughout your stay and comply with this ordinance. The Dent County Commons is not within city limits.

- 13.8 Speed Limits:

13.8.1 As a point of general information, the un-posted speed limit in the state of Missouri is 55 miles per hour for paved roads.

13.8.2 Due to the variety of county ordinances, we have set 35 mph as a maximum transit speed limit in the route book for all unpaved roads, except when they are being used for special stages as part of the rally.

13.8.3 All speed limits are noted in the route book and take precedence.

14 PRIZES/TROPHIES

- 14.1 The Awards Banquet will be held at The Dent County Commons, beginning at about 1930 on Saturday, March 14 for all competitors, crew, and volunteers. ARA will award trophies to the top finishing teams in all national classes.
- 14.2 The event organizers will award trophies for the Regional winners. The number of trophies awarded will be determined by the number of cars per class. To award first through third, at least 5 cars will need to be entered in a class. If there are 3 or 4 cars entered in a class, only first and second will be awarded, and only first for 2 or less. There will also be awards for the top 3 overall regional teams.

15 FINAL CHECKS AND PROTESTS

- 15.1 Post-rally inspections and teardowns of any competing vehicle will be performed at the discretion of ARA.




