

Appendix to the Special Race Regulations of the Warm-Up USA 2024

REGULATORY APPENDIX 3rd MIDDLEBURG TROPHY

ART. 1 - ACCEPTED COMPETITORS AND DRIVERS

All competitors entered in the "1000 Miglia Warm Up USA" classic regularity event may take part in the DIRECT ELIMINATION REGULARITY TRIAL, CARRIED OUT IN PARALLEL, and called "1st MIDDLEBURG TROPHY" which will take place on Friday 25 October 2024 in Middleburg (Virginia-USA) according to the program of the "1000 Miglia Warm Up USA" event.

ART. 2 - ROUTE

The race will take place on a track laid out on two parallel lanes 80 meters in length. The time required to cover the track is 15 seconds with an average speed of 19.20 km/h.

ART. 3 - PROCEEDINGS, COMPOSITION OF THE RACE BOARD

Cars taking part in the Trophy must be present at the Start Park on Friday 25 October 2024 at 16:30.

Once they have entered the Start Park, the Organizer will explain how the race will be run.

The City of Middleburg Trophy will be held in two parts:

1) COMPOSITION OF THE SCOREBOARD

In order to carry out the composition of the scoreboard, the timekeepers will draw up a mixed absolute classification between 1000 Miglia Era and Post 1000 Miglia Era cars at the end of the first leg of the Warm-Up USA.

All drivers qualified at the end of Leg 1 on Thursday 24 October of the Warm-Up USA will participate in the 3° Town of Middleburg Trophy. The participants classified between the first and the 14th will be entered in the scoreboard the first against the 14th, the second against the 13th and so on.

The 6 crew not entered in the scoreboard must line up at the starting line of the event respecting the scoreboard posted near the Start and following the instructions of the organization staff. They will have a head to head race, 15th against 20th, 16th against 19th, 17th against 18th. Will pass entered in the scoreboard the winners crew that realized the 2 best results in term of less penalties. In case of a tie, the crew with the oldest car, as indicated in the entry list, will proceed to the next round.

2) ADVANCEMENT IN THE MAIN SCOREBOARD.







The cars must line up at the starting line of the event respecting the scoreboard posted near the end and following the instructions of the organization staff.

The crew that has obtained the least penalties will win the head-to-head race and therefore will access the next round of the scoreboard. The penalties will be assigned at the rate of one penalty for every hundredth of advance or delay with respect to the imposed time.

Following the green light from the timekeepers, competitors will be allowed to enter the racetrack freely within the 30-second time limit, after which they will be deemed to have lost and will be out of the race. If both competitors do not start within the 30-second time limit, the crew with the oldest car according to the entry list will enter the next round; in the event of a further tie, the crew with the best overall classification in the general classification, useful for the creation of the qualifying board, will enter the next round. Once their qualifying round is over, competitors must return to the Start Park and wait for the next round of the race or, if eliminated, stop waiting for the end of the competition.

ART. 4 - TIMEKEEPING AND CLASSIFICATIONS

Timekeeping will be carried out as follows:

- Timekeeping to the hundredth of a second.
- There are no coefficients.
- One penalty shall be awarded for each hundredth of a second of advance delay from the set time.
- The time at the start and end of the event will be measured using a tube;

There is no final classification. The winner of the "3rd Middleburg Trophy" will be the winner of the last knockout round on the scoreboard.

ART. 5 – AWARDS 5.1 PRIZES OF HONOR

The race will have the following honor prizes:

- For both members of the winning crew in the head-to-head elimination phase.
