The National Road Traffic Regulations shall apply. Unless provided otherwise by these Supplementary Regulations, the provisions of the above Rules and Regulations shall apply.

Art. 4.1 Closing date for entries

Art. 4.2 Entry procedure

Entries must be submitted in accordance with the FIA RRSR Art. 22 – Art. 25. See also FIA ISC Art. 3.8 – Art. 3.14

Competition Licences delivered by ACI Sport have the same value as an International Licences for the rally.

An electronic entry application (Internet) will be accepted on the organisers' website www.rallyesanremo.it An electronic entry application must be confirmed by way of personal signature by the competitor by the latest at administrative checks. The entry form must be accompanied by a copy of the valid competitor's licence. A change of competitor is permitted up to the close of entries. Only the competitor entered in the event will be allowed to make this request.

All competitors taking part in the rally must ensure that their drivers and co-drivers sign the Driver's declaration and undertakings form as attached in Appendix 6.

An entry application (also made electronically) will be accepted only if accompanied by the total entry fees.

According to the International Sporting Code Art. 3.8.1 an entry compels the competitor to take part in the Competition in which they have been accepted to run, except in case of duly established Force Majeure.

Art. 4.2.1 Driver declaration and undertakings

FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Article 1.1.7: "All competitors taking part in a Championship event must ensure that their drivers and co-drivers sign the driver's declarations and undertakings form as attached in Appendix XIV."

Art. 4.5 Payment

Art. 4.6 Entry fee refunds

The entry fee shall be refunded in full

- if the event does not take place
- to teams whose entry application is rejected

The organiser may partially refund entry fees, if a competitor cannot take part in the event due to a duly proved case of force majeure.

Art. 5. Insurance Cover

Art. 5.1 Introductory remarks

The entry fee includes the insurance premium for the competitors' civil liability to third parties for risks arising from circulation during the rally, along the route (fixed route and/or alternative) described in the Road book or given out by Bulletins and Clerk of the Course Communications.

Art. 5.2 Damages covered by the insurance

The Insurance Policy of the Rally organiser is covering only the damages caused to third parties or properties of third parties by the Rally organiser or by drivers entered in the rally. Any other damage suffered by the drivers or vehicles entered in the rally are not covered by the insurance. The Organiser's insurance does not include Driver to Driver damages.

Art. 5.3 Rally organisers' responsibility

The Rally organiser decline liability for any accident suffered by competitors or competing cars during the duration of the entire event, even in case of cataclysm, riots, demonstrations, vandalism, etc. Competitors and crew members shall suffer all the consequences (material, criminal and sporting) raised by any type of accident.

Art. 5.4 Insurance coverage

The maximum amount covered by the Insurance Policy is € 25,000,000.00 for each accident for damages to persons and for damages to goods.

Art. 5.5 Duration of the insurance coverage

This insurance, for all competitors, will become effective at the start of procedure for car scrutineering. The insurance ceases at the end of the event (Prize giving Ceremony-Podium) or at the end of the post-event scrutineering (for the selected cars), in case of withdrawal, disqualification or exclusion from the rally. In case of withdrawal, the time taken into account will be the closing time of the following TC. Cars having retired and restarting the next day (Art. 54 of the 2024 FIA RR Sporting Regulations) shall not be considered to have permanently retired.

Art. 5.6 Assistance or service vehicles

Vehicles carrying "Service" or "Auxiliary" plates and/or any other plate issued by the Rally organiser, with the exclusion of Rally organisers' Safety and Zero cars and cars used by Officials and Delegates listed in the Supplementary Regulations, are not covered by the event's Insurance policy. These vehicles circulate under their owners' responsibility and shall have their own insurance.

Art. 5.7 Insurance during reconnaissance

Vehicles used by the crews during reconnaissance, even if bearing the event's specific stickers, must be insured by their owners. The Rally organiser bear no responsibility for such vehicles. This same rule applies to the drivers taking part in reconnaissance only.

Art. 5.8 Accident notification

In case of an accident the competitor or his representative must immediately notify it to the Clerk of the course. Place, circumstances under which the accident occurred, causes and consequences must be described. Likewise the names and addresses of any witness or injured person must be indicated.

Art. 6. Advertising and Identification

See Appendix 4 of these SR "Decals and positioning of supplementary advertising".

Advertising restrictions: All political, religious, or abusive advertising is forbidden. Advertising for tobacco, tobacco products and smokers' requisites is forbidden in Italy. Advertising for alcohol is restricted by law and is not allowed on competing cars, service cars, equipment and/or clothing.

Art. 6.1 Obligatory organiser's advertising

Rally plate: Rallye Sanremo

Competition number size: 67x 17cm

Sanremo

The organiser will provide each crew with the number identification (67x17cm), which must be affixed to their car in the stated positions prior to scrutineering. Each panel shall be placed horizontally at the leading edge of each front door, with the number at the front. The top of the plate shall be between 7 cm and 10 cm below the lower limit of the window. **It is not allowed to cut the panel.**

ERT Eligible vehicles

A space measuring 67 x 6 cm, located immediately below the competition number panel, is reserved for the promotion of the FIA European Rally Trophy.

Art. 6,3. Italian Championship Obligatory Advertising (new article)

All Competitors/drivers entered in the Italian Championships: CIAR, CIRP, CI2RM, CI Junior, are required to affix on their cars the following mandatory advertising, supplied by ACI Sport Spa:

- a 15 cm high / 118 cm wide sun-protective band on the front wind-screen
- a 10 cm high / 118 cm wide band on the upper side of the rear window
- a sticker on each external rear view mirror case.

Art. 7. Tyres

Art. 7.1 Regulations regarding tyres which may be used during the rally

See Art. 13 of the FIA RRSR (tyres and wheels).

The maximum number of tyres for running the Rallye Sanremo is limited to 12.

Tyres for shakedown will not count for the overall quantity

Only for the Italian Rally Championship-Junior (CIAR-Junior) crews, the maximum number of tyres allowed for the Rallye Sanremo is 8.

Hand cutting is not permitted for 18", 17" and 16" Tyres;

Hand cutting is permitted in accordance with the patterns submitted by the tyre manufacturer to the FIA, for other tyre sizes.

Cars using 18", 17" and 16" wheels can use FIA WET Tyres; WET Tyres will not count for the overall quantity

Art. 7.2 Tyres for use on reconnaissance

Only road-homologated series production tyres for asphalt are allowed.

Art. 7.3 National laws or special requirements

The use of studded or winter tyres is not allowed

Art. 8. Fuel

All type of fuel must follow Appendix J Art. 252.9. (RRSR Art. 62).

Competitors must use only the official fuel that will be given to them, on payment, inside the refuelling zones. The only authorized fuel is the RON 98 and the MAX RON 102 sold and distributed by the company Panta S.p.A.

Competitors with RC5 cars (Italian RC5N, RC6N and Racing Start Plus cars) may use RON 98,0 or RON 102,0 Fuel. Use of RON 102,0 is compulsory for all other competitors.

Refuelling of diesel or LPG cars, must take place inside the refuelling zones where the competitors must refuel with their own means of refuelling. LPG cars will also be able to refuel in public service areas (fuel stations) which the organizers will identify along the course and notify to the drivers.

Refuelling at RZ1 Is compulsory for all competitors.

Art. 8.1 Fuel Ordering procedure

Fuel can be ordered directly to Panta S.p.A. using the form downloadable from www.rallyesanremo.it of directly at fuelorder@panta.it

Art. 8.2 Closing date for ordering fuel

As per Art.3 of these SR

Art. 8.3 Distribution for non-priority drivers

Above articles applies both to priority and non-priority drivers

Art. 8.4 Refuelling

Art. 8.4.1 Refuelling is only allowed in Refuelling Area (RA) and commercial fuel station. To refuel in the service park is forbidden at any time.

Art. 8.4.2 To access a Refuelling Area, all personnel involved in refuelling operations must wear clothing that provides adequate protection against fire and includes at least: long trousers, long-sleeved top, closed shoes, gloves and a balaclava.

Art.8.4.3 Environmental Mat in a Refuelling Area (RA)

The fuel supplier will protect the ground with an Environmental Mat.

Art. 9. Reconnaissance of Special Stages

Reconnaissance will be according to FIA RRSR Art. 35. The schedule for the reconnaissance is published in Appendix 2 of these supplementary regulations.

Art. 9.1 Registration procedure

Recce cars will be registered at administrative checks.

At registration a "Reconnaissance Card" will be issued and must be filled in and signed with all details of the car that will be used. This card must be kept inside the car during reconnaissance.

Should a crew change reconnaissance car the Secretariat must be informed of the details of the new car, Reconnaissance stickers must be fitted on the new car.

The identification "R" numbered sticker given at the reconnaissance registration shall be displayed and remain visible during reconnaissance on the top middle part of the windscreen.

Each car must be identified with a reconnaissance car number supplied by the organiser. Rally cars used in the event may not be used for reconnaissance.

Art. 9.2 Specific regulations

During reconnaissance, all national traffic regulation must be followed, including but not limited to the speed limits. Please note that the Special Stages will not be closed to public traffic during reconnaissance.

Art. 9.3 Number of Passages

The maximum number of passages authorised for each crew on each special stage is three.

Art. 9.4 Collection of speed control checking devices

During Recce, BeTraced App (https://www.betraced.com/recces-app, available both for iOS and Android phones) will be used for checking speed.

Individual access codes will be delivered during Recce Registration at cost of € 50,00 (+ VAT where applicable)

Speed limit in Special Stages will be **50Km/h**. Infringements will be penalised according to FIA RRSR Art.34.2

Art. 9.5 Free Practice / Qualifying Stage

Art. 10. Administrative checks

Art. 10.1 Documents to be presented:

To keep the time required for the administrative checks to the necessary minimum, make sure to bring and present the following documents:

- Competitors' licence
- Driver's and co-driver's competition licences
- Driver's and co-driver's ID cards/passports
- Driver's and co-driver's valid driving licences
- Driver's and co-driver's signed Driver's declaration and undertakings forms
- ASN authorisation for foreign competitors (if required)
- Completion of all details on the entry form
- Car insurance cover certificate
- Car registration papers
- Driver's and co-driver's valid medical certificate, if not included in sporting licence

Art. 10.2 Timetable

See programme (SR Art. 3)

Individual summons will be included in a bulletin

Art. 11. Scrutineering, Sealing and Marking

Art. 11.1 Scrutineering, venue and time

Cars may be presented at scrutineering by a representative of the team. See programme (SR Art. 3)

Art. 11.1.1 Scrutineering, mandatory documents

- Cars' complete certified homologation
- SOS / OK board (DIN A3 format)

For each car of the FIA Priority Drivers, ACI Priority Drivers and Drivers subscribed to Italian Rally Championship, one spare gearbox and one set of spare differentials (front and/or centre and/or rear) may be used in each rally. These spare components and those fitted to the car will be marked/sealed at initial scrutineering. These cars must have their sump guards removed for sealing of gearboxes and differentials and be kept with the car for the purpose of weighting. cars must be presented wired ready for sealing; popoff valves will be tested before sealing, therefore valves must be presented without sealing wires.

Sealings will be done inside each crew service area by scrutineers;

The installation of the tracking system will be checked at scrutineering.

Art. 11.1.2 Timetable for scrutineering

See programme (SR Art. 3) Individual summons will be included in a bulletin

Art. 11.2 Mud flaps

It is optional to fit transverse mud flaps in conformity with the article Appendix J, Art. 252.7.7

Art. 11.3 Windows

Use of tinted windows is authorized in accordance with Article 253.11 "Windows/nets" of Appendix J of the FIA International Sporting Code.

Art. 11.4 Drivers' safety equipment

All items of clothing including helmets and FHR (Front Head Restraint) intended to be used, e.g. HANS devices, must be presented for scrutineering. They shall be checked for compliance with Appendix L, Chapter III.

Art. 11.5 Noise level

At any time on the road sections, the noise level must be in conformity with FIA Appendix J.

Art. 11.6 Special national requirements

Competing cars must be equipped with:

- A reflective triangle.
- One red "SOS" sign and on the reverse a green "OK" sign measuring at least 42 x 29,7 cm (A/3 size).
- Two fluorescent jackets (one per each member of the crew).
- The original rear car plate must be positioned on the original position.
- The front car plate can be replaced by a sticker but the original plate must be inside the car
- Original of car document must always be inside the car.

Art. 11.7 Installation of the safety tracking system

See SR Appendix 7

Art. 12. Other procedures and regulations

Art. 12.1 Ceremonial start procedures and order

There will be no Ceremonial Start. Before the Start there will be no Start Area according to Art. 40.1 of the RRSR

Art. 12.1.1 Start Order - Leg 1

- Start Order for Section 1: according to promoter and live TV requests.
- Start Order for Section 2: numerical order, starting from the lowest number

Art. 12.1.2 Start Order - Leg 2

- Classification Order after Leg1; First 10 crews in partial classification after Leg 1 in reverse order.

Art. 12.2 Start procedure on Special Stages (Electronic start procedure) The electronic start procedure is as follows:

Start Procedure for Special Stages will be in accordance to Art.48.2 of RRSR Sporting Regulations. The electronic start procedure, clearly visible to the crew from the start line, will be as follows:

- Red light: 10 second to start
- Yellow light: 5 seconds to start
- 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 seconds to start by countdown
- Green light: start sign.

Green Light will remain turned on for 20 seconds.

Should this start system fail the start will be given as specified in Article 48.3 of the 2025 FIA RRSR.

Art. 12.3 Finish procedure

Art. 12.3.1 There will be no specific finish procedure.

The finish of the rally is at TC 12C. From TC 12C up to the finish ramp competitors will be under Parc Fermé conditions and must follow marshals' instructions.

This area will be open only to Officials holding the appropriate pass and the Media for interviews. Following the finish ramp competitors will drive their cars to the Parc Fermé, unless they will be driven to final scrutineering at GTS Centro Porsche – Regione Peirane, 18018 Taggia where they will remain, under parc fermè rules, until they are released.

Prizes for all competitors/crews will be awarded on the ramp, except for the first, second and third in the final classification where an "Olympic-style" podium will be used.

Art. 12.3.2 Availability of participants

Participants who park their vehicles in the Parc Fermé upon passing the finish line, must remain available by phone (mobile) until the final classification has been posted.

Art. 12.3.3 Classification

The final classification will not be distributed after the event. The final classification will be published on the website www.rallyesanremo.it and on the Digital Notice Board Sportity App – Password: SRM25ERT

Art. 12.4 Permitted early check-in

No early check-in allowed

Art. 12.5 Super Special Stage, regulations, and order

The stage will take place on a set up area in Porto Sole – Sanremo (IM).

The super special stage consist of a closed circuit, with artificial slowdowns, of a length of mt 630 to be repeated four times for a total of km. 2,520.

12.5.1 Running of the Super Special Stage

Starting time for T.C.0 - SP Out (Rally Start) will be published according to the program and the interval between cars will be the one indicated in the same; This interval may not be the same for all cars.

The Crews, once checked at Time Control before the SSS (TC1 - Porto Sole) will have to follow Marshals' instruction and line up each on their starting line, ready to start on order of the Clerk of the Course.

No ideal time and actual start time of the stage will be written on Time Cards.

When both cars are ready, start will be given by lights (on each starting line) which will be indicated by using colored lights and countdown:

- 1) 10" seconds to start
- 2) 5", 4", 3", 2", 1" seconds to start
- 3) GO

The start of the Super Special Stage can be given a fraction of a minute and does not coincide with the expiry of the full minute. Jump starts will be detected by timekeeping instruments, and are subject to the penalties provided by RRSR Art. 48.6. Each crew must complete four full laps of the track, crossing the finish line on the same line from which they started.

As soon as the finish line has been crossed, each crew will have to slow down, follow marshals' instruction to exit the stage and stop at the Stop control where they will have to hand in time card to timekeepers that will:

- a) write the time taken to complete the Special Stage, this time will be for each crew, the time between the green start light and their passage over stage finish line
- b) will assign the sector start time for reaching TC1B Regroup IN

Between the TC0 and the Stop control of Super Special Stage crews are neutralized for the time necessary to complete the super special stage.

12.5.2 Mistake on the Super Special Stage

The crew in case of

- Infringement on a chicane
- Different number of laps than expected

will be inflicted a penalty of 30 seconds, added to the worst time in the class to which it belongs (or in the immediately higher class if only one crew is competing in the class) In case of anomalous worst time, the COC can assign a time considered less anomalous among the other four worst times. The time calculated in this way will be the only one valid for the classification, regardless of what is noted on the time card.

12.5.3 Maximum time on the Super Special Stage

A maximum time of 5' will be allowed for finishing the super special stage.

A crew not finishing in that time will be considered immediately retired from the stage; the car will have to exit the stage immediately following marshals' instructions.

12.5.3 Interruption of the Super Special Stage

In case of interruption of SSS1, no matter for which reason, the competitors stopped on the stage, at the unquestionable decision of the Clerk of the Course, may be allowed to repeat the special stage receiving a new start respecting the starting order.

In case of temporary or definitive interruption of the Super Special Stage, the COC may assign to each of the crews involved in the interruption a time that him will judge the fairest.

The crews totally or partially responsible for the interruption of the SSS will not benefit in any case from this provision.

12.5.4 Retirement in the Super Special Stage

If the car fails to complete the test and is unable to continue, it will be transported in park fermé regime, and taken to the Service Park where it can be repaired in compliance of the SR if this is not possible the vehicle must be parked immediately after the stop control of the Super Special Stage.

Both in the first and in the second case:

- The crew will be considered to have checked without penalty at TC1A, 1B, 1C, 1D
- The crew is subject to the usual rules regulations, service restrictions and penalties in time of the rally
- Crews who fail to complete the stage will have the worst time achieved in the class they belong or
 in the immediately higher class if only one crew is competing in the class, plus a penalty of 30"; if
 him consider the worst time anomalous, the COC can assign a time considered less anomalous
 among the other four worst times.
- Crews who have a time that is at least three minutes higher than the best time in their class, will have assigned the worst time assigned of the class or in the next higher class if there is only one crew, see previous paragraph.

Art. 12.6 Special procedures and activities

Art. 12.6.1 Shakedown

During Shakedown service is only permitted in the main service park.

Art. 12.6.2 Tyre Warming Zone (TWZ)

There will be no Tyre Warming Zones according to Art. 44.4 of the RRSR.

Art. 12.6.3 Reconnaissance of SS1 "Porto Sole"

Reconnaissance of SSS1 can be performed only by foot.

Art. 12.7 Official time used during the rally

UTC, Time zone of Italy in October is CEST (UTC + 2)

Art. 15. Final checks / Protests / Appeals

Art. 15.1 Final Checks

Time and location: see programme (SR. Art. 3)

Any teams required to undergo final scrutineering must immediately follow the instruction of the marshals in charge, even if this prevents them from proceeding to one or more time controls (TC). The complete original FIA homologation form and other necessary certifications must be available for final scrutineering. A representative of the competitor as well as mechanics with the appropriate tools (in case of dismantling) must be present at the final scrutineering.

Art.15.2 Protest or petition for review deposit

The protest or petition for review deposit is: **EUR 1.000** (to be paid in cash or by bank transfer)

If the deposit is made by bank transfer, the protest or petition for review must be accompanied by proof of payment. Failing this, or should the Stewards consider that the proof of payment is not satisfactory, the protest or petition for review shall not be admissible.

If a protest requires the dismantling and re-assembly of a clearly defined part of the car, any additional deposit will be specified by the Stewards upon a proposal of the Chief Scrutineer.

Art. 15.3 Appeal deposit

The appeal deposit for an international appeal is: **EUR 3.000,00**

All protests and/or appeals must be lodged in accordance with Articles 13 and 15 of the Code and, where applicable, with the FIA Judicial and Disciplinary Rules.

Art. 15.4 Fines

In accordance with Article 12.8 FIA International Sporting Code, the payment of the fines must be done online, within 48 hours of their notification, at the following address: https://fiafines.fia.com
Any delay in making payment may entail Suspension during the period a fine remains unpaid.



Appendix 5 – Extracts from FIA ISC Appendix L relating to overalls, helmets and any other safety requirements

All competitors are reminded of Appendix L of the FIA International Sporting Code, in particular its Chapter III - Drivers' Equipment.

Helmets (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 1)

All crews must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the FIA standards listed in Appendix L.

Frontal Head Restraint (FHR, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3)

All crews must use FIA approved FHR systems homologated to FIA standard 8858.

Approved FHRs, anchorages and tethers are listed in Technical List N° 29.

See also helmet compatibility chart in Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3.3.

Flame-resistant clothing (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2)

All drivers and co-drivers must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2000 standard (Technical List N°27) or to the FIA 8856-2018 (Technical List N° 74). Please pay special attention to the prescriptions of Art. 2 <u>concerning the correct wearing of the clothing elements! See also FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations Article 53.1.</u>

Any FIA-approved 8856-2018 garment customised using printing or transfers must be accompanied by a certificate from the manufacturer.

FIA Priority drivers (and accompanying co-drivers) must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2018 standard (Technical List No 74).

Biometric Devices (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2.1)

Drivers may wear a device to collect biometric data during racing.

- If the biometric device is integrated into a protective garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856, the garment shall be homologated to FIA Standards 8856 and 8868-2018.
- If the biometric device is a stand-alone device, then the device must be homologated to FIA Standard 8868-2018 only. This device must be worn in addition to the garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856.

Wearing of jewellery (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 5)

The wearing of any type of jewellery, such as but not limited to, neck chains, bracelets or watches is prohibited during the competition. Exceptions to this rule, providing the CMO and/or Medical Delegate do not consider that due to size or location they may delay rescue or hinder emergency care, are:

- i. the wearing of watch(es) by co-drivers, on the condition that the watch(es) is worn over the overall,
- ii. the wearing of a single band-style ring providing it does not restrict the natural range of motion of the hand, and
- iii. the wearing of body piercing(s) providing they are not worn in and/or around the oral cavity.

1. Be Traced

The Be Traced BR001 tracking device is designed to improve the safety and enjoyment of competitors. It is important to be able to manage the device and know its screens so that you can enjoy the best user experience.

Our team will be happy to help you with the installation and to clarify any doubts you may have about using our device.

Attention: To interact with the device's screen, you must press the icons on the display or the keys for at least 1 second and then move your finger away from the screen or stop pressing the corresponding key.

2. The Device

The device needs a connection to the vehicle's electrical circuit and is equipped with its own internal battery. The device must be turned on at all times. The device already has all the data of the Special Stages and the Traits in Transfer pre-installed. Once turned on, the device will show the Transfer screen where the real-time speed will be shown. Details on the "Transfer" mode can be found in section 2.2 of this manual. Interaction with the device is possible thanks to the touch screen, but also with the buttons on the right side of the device. Each key is associated with the icons that will appear on the right of the screen, in each icon there will be the number corresponding to the key to be pressed. The device is set to English mode by default, but you can translate all the information. To translate all the information contained in the device, press the icon highlighted in **Fig. 1**, after pressing you will enter the screen in **Fig. 2**, press on the highlighted bar and choose Italian **(Fig. 3)**.

2.1. Device Mode

The unit has two main modes. When the device detects that it is in a stage it will go into "On Stage" mode, while in all other cases it will be in "Transit" mode:

- 1. "Transit": Outside of a stage, the system goes into Transit. (Section 2.2).
- 2. "On Stage": During a Special Stage, the system automatically enters "On Stage" mode (Section 2.3).

2.2. Transit Mode

Under "Transit" the device will show the following information:

- current time and date (green box in Fig 4);
- real-time speed (red box in Fig. 4);
- signal quality and power supply to the device (no GPS; no connection to the Be Traced server).



2.3 On Stage Mode

Before entering Stage mode, the device shows the "Prepare for Stage" mode. In this mode, the device signals to the crew when a special stage is approaching. Once you have passed the start of the test, you will enter the "On Stage" mode. In this mode, the device shows:

- real-time speed (red box in Fig. 5)
- name of the special stage (blue box in Fig. 5)
- distance traveled since the start of the test (yellow box in Fig. 5)
- current time (green box in Fig 5).

In "On Stage" mode, the "Incident Signal" button will always be present to send any distress requests.

At the end of the Special Stage, the "Flying Finish" screen will be shown (**Fig. 6**), which indicates the end of the Special Stage and the approach of the Stop, in this phase all safety systems remain active.

The device, in "On Stage" mode, can automatically detect an incident using two parameters:

- acceleration/deceleration (calculated in force G) above the alert threshold;
- the device detects a stop in a special stage (**Attention**: if you restart in less than 50 seconds, the accident status is automatically cancelled).

The device, even if only one of the listed conditions is present, will ask the crew if they have been involved in an accident, showing the screen below. If the device detects a deceleration of more than 15G, it will automatically send the emergency signal to Race Direction.

The crew must provide one of the options shown in **Fig. 7.** Tapping the OK icon will bring up the following options:

- OK ROAD CLEAR: the road is clear and the crew is fine;
- OK ROAD BLOCKED: the crew is fine, but the road is ENTIRELY blocked by the stationary car.

WARNING: It is mandatory to provide a response to this notice within 60 (sixty) seconds, otherwise as set out in NG Rally section 6.5.1 published by ACI Sport, you will incur a financial penalty established by ACI Sport in the aforementioned section.

Once you have selected one of the options on the screen, you can return to the main screen by pressing "Remove Status".

When an SOS is sent, the SOS icon and a message corresponding to the request sent appear on the device.

2.4 Sending a manual SOS request

Crew members have the option to send manual distress calls at any time. To send the request, simply press the "Notify Accident" icon shown on the right side of the device, or press the button corresponding to the icon or the button with the danger signal.

Once pressed, the device will show the screen in Fig. 11 and pressing SOS will show the screen in Fig. 12 with the following options:

- "SOS FIRE" to request help for a fire on board the vehicle;
- "SOS MEDICAL" to request the intervention of the medical staff;
- "CANCEL" to cancel the request.

You can always cancel your SOS request at any time, and it is important to do so if your request was submitted in error or is no longer needed. To delete the request, click OK or the corresponding button.

Pressing "Remove State" will cancel the SOS request.

2.5. Red Flag

If a serious accident or any impediment compromises the safety of the competitors on a stage, the Race Director may issue the red flag. As stated by the regulations, when the red flag is activated, all competitors who are before the involved coordinates, must immediately reduce their speed, because there is a serious accident or in any case impediments on a specific section of the special stage.

When the red flag is placed by the Race Director, the device located in the area affected by the red flag will immediately emit an acoustic signal, accompanied by a completely red screen showing the words "RED FLAG" (Fig. 14).

It is necessary to press the "ACK" icon (**Fig.14**) to send the confirmation of having received the red flag to the Race Direction, then the following screen will be shown (**Fig. 15**).

ATTENTION: even if the screen of the device changes after the confirmation of the red flag, the test is still SUSPENDED, it is therefore necessary to continue to follow the red flag procedure until the end of the Special Stage.

2.6 Slowzone

The device is able to show the presence of a Slowzone and its speed limit. As the crew approaches a Slowzone, the following warning will be displayed (**Fig. 16**).

Once you enter a Slowzone, the following screen will be shown (Fig. 17), with the maximum speed limit.

2.7 Virtual Chicane

The BR001 device is able to show a Virtual Chicane and guide the crew to face it in the correct way.

As you approach the Virtual Chicane, the screen shows the following screen (Fig. 18)

2.8 Adjusting the brightness

To change the brightness of the device's screen, use the icons at the top right (Fig. 21).

Press on the icon circled in red to increase the brightness, while to decrease it, press on the icon highlighted by the green circle.
