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1.1 General information

BAUHAUS ROYAL RALLY OF SCANDINAVIA 2026 will be run in compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code and its appendices, the 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations (RRSR), the National Sporting Regulations which comply with the FIA regulations, these Supplementary Regulations, and the WADA/NADA Codes and the FIA Anti-Doping Regulations, as amended from time to time. The National Road Traffic Regulations shall apply. Modifications, amendments and/or changes to these Supplementary Regulations will be announced only by numbered and dated Bulletins (issued by the organiser or the Stewards).

2.10 Communication and the Official Notice Board

During the event, individual and general communication between all Rally Officials (Rally Control/COC, Rally Secretariat, CRO, Stewards, Technical Staff etc.) and the competitors/crew members will primarily and as far as possible be conducted via Sportity App.

For this purpose, each competitor is required to nominate ONE official representative authorized for the purpose of receiving any official notifications. As some of these notifications can be issued while rally cars are on stages, this person can neither be the driver nor the co-driver. This person should be a team representative who is based in the Service Park during the event.

This contact (name, title, cellphone, email) must be nominated at the latest on Tuesday, 14 May 2026 and sent by email to the Secretary of the Rally, competitor@ercroyalrally.com and will be used both for general and individual communications.

As provided for in 2026 FIA International Sporting Code, Art. 11.9.4, the Official Notice Board will be the Digital Notice Board (DNB), available in the Sportity App and published also on the rally website at ercroyalrally.com. There will be no physical official notice board. All competitors will be informed only by Sportity notifications about the publication of any documents on the Digital Notice Board. Sportity app is downloadable for iOS devices on Appstore and for Android devices on Google Play. Channel password is **ERCRR26**.

4. ENTRIES

4.1 Closing date for entries

The closing date for entries is Thursday 7 May 2026 at 23:59 (CET).

4.2 Entry procedure

Any competitor wishing to take part in BAUHAUS ROYAL RALLY OF SCANDINAVIA 2026 must register and fill in the electronic entry form on the FIA online platform before the closing date for entries.

Priority drivers must complete the electronic form available at: <https://registrations.fia.com/rally>

Non-priority drivers must complete the electronic form available at: <https://registrations.fia.com/ercswe>

Please note that the FIA registration platform requires a user ID and a password to access the entry system. The FIA will need time to register you in the system and open your user account. Please do not wait until the last moment to make your entry in order not to miss the entry closing date.

In addition to submitting the online registration entry form to the FIA, the competitors are also required to send the following documents to competitor@ercroyalrally.com before the closing of entries. Foreign drivers must submit an approval from their ASN in the same e-mail.

The entry application will only be accepted if accompanied by:

- Proof of payment of the total amount of entry fees
- Copy of the International Competitor licence
- Copies of the Driver and Co-driver international competition licences
- ASN authorisation for all foreign drivers and co-drivers (Art. 3.9.4 of the 2026 FIA International Sporting Code)
- Copies of the Driver and Co-driver passports or identity cards
- Copies of the Driver and Co-driver driving licences
- One passport photo for driver and co-driver
- Copy of the first page of the car homologation certificate
- Copies of the car's registration papers
- Copies of the insurance cover (third parties) for the rally car
- Copy of the entry form duly signed

By entering the rally, the competitor and the crew submit themselves to the sporting jurisdictions specified in the 2026 FIA International Sporting Code and its appendices, the 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, FIA ERC Sporting Regulations and these Supplementary Regulations.

4.6 Refunds

Entry fees will be refunded in full only:

- to candidates whose entry has not been accepted
- in the case of the rally not taking place
- In the case of force majeure for the competitor, after investigation by the Stewards. (from RRSR 24.2)

The organisers may refund 50% of the entry fee to those competitors who, for reason of “force majeure” (duly certified by their ASN), were unable to start in the rally. With the request of entry fee refund the competitor must send the organiser a certificate of force majeure given by his own ASN, before Wednesday 20 May (start of administrative checks).

This must be applied for in writing giving the reason for the claim including bank and account details.

5. INSURANCE

5.1 Traffic Insurance

All cars participating in the rally must have a valid obligatory traffic insurance towards third parties. In Sweden, the “Green Card” (International Motor Insurance Card) system is applied. For cars coming from countries outside the Green Card system and EEA-countries, a Nordic frontier insurance must be taken at the border. Traffic insurance guarantee competitor’s cover for civil responsibility towards third parties on road sections. The organiser will issue third party insurance cover for foreign registered cars valid on special stages (incl. shakedown).

5.2 Insurance amounts

Maximum compensation in case of damage is SEK 300 000 000.

Maximum compensation regarding organiser liability insurance is SEK 125 000 000.

5.3 Limitation of Indemnity

The organiser declines any liability concerning the consequences caused by any fraudulent action taken by the competitor, may this be against the rules and regulations of the rally or against the laws of the country.

Any service vehicles or reconnaissance cars, even those bearing the official identification of the organiser, may under no circumstances be considered as official participants of the rally, hence their insurance policies remain the sole responsibility of the owner.

Competitors are reminded that all vehicles (incl. scooters, mopeds, forklifts, ATVs etc.) used inside the service area must be insured and must only be used on the driveways designated for vehicles, i.e. not in spectator areas or such. Extreme care must be taken when using silent electric vehicles, especially in the inside service areas, as the spectator pathways are very close to the driveways and have no fencing in between.

6. ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATION

6.1 Restrictions

All political, religious, or abusive advertising is forbidden.

Advertising for tobacco, tobacco products and smokers’ requisites is forbidden in Sweden. Advertising for alcohol is restricted by law and is not allowed on competing cars, service cars, equipment and/or clothing.

6.2 The organiser's advertising

The organiser’s compulsory advertising on the doorplates is BAUHAUS. There is no optional advertising.

6.3 Identification

Competition numbers and rally plates according to the 2026 FIA Regional Sporting Regulations, Art. 27, will be provided by the organiser. See also Appendix 4.

Numbers and plates must be affixed on the rally car before the car is brought to scrutineering and must be visible throughout the duration of the rally.

The following stickers will be affixed to the car by the scrutineers:

- **At scrutineering:** a Approval sticker, size 6 cm x 6 cm (at roll-cage driver’s side)
- **Before the start:** a “2 min” sticker (on the roof over the windscreen, co-driver’s side) on cars with intervals of 2’.

7. TYRES

All tyres must comply with Art. 13 of the 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulation in conjunction with Appendix V.

7.1 Tyres for all ERC1, ERC3 and ERC4 priority competitors

Tyres must be supplied by an FIA-nominated tyre company. A list of nominated tyre manufacturers for the 2026 FIA European Rally Championship is published on <https://www.fia.com/regulation/category/117>

However, competitors are reminded to comply with:

- 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Art. 13.1.4; Each tyre must have barcode numbers supplied by the 2026 FIA-approved barcode supplier.
- 2026 FIA European Rally Championship Regulations, Art. 13.3.1.
 - Competitors must declare at administrative checks which nominated tyre supplier (as defined in Art. 14.1) they will use for the whole rally.

7.3 Tyres for Junior ERC Championship

For the Junior ERC Championship, only Hankook tyres, sold at the rallies by the Junior ERC Championship tyre supplier, are eligible.

7.4 Quantity of tyres

For Free Practice and Shakedown tyres will not count for the overall quantity.

7.5 Tyre Marking

Only tyres marked by the Scrutineers may be used. Any infringement to this rule will be reported to the Stewards.

7.6 Tyre Marking Zones

- At the Qualifying stage (Technical Zone between the TC and Start)
- After TC 0
- After TC 1C, 5C, 9E and 13C (before the refuel)

7.7 Tyres for use on reconnaissance

Free tyres for gravel.

8. FUEL

- Fuel must be in compliance with Appendix J art. 266
- For environmental and safety reasons, all competitors must refuel in the designated refuel areas. Except as detailed in the regulations for the change of fuel tank, RRSR art 58.

8.1 Refuelling procedure

Crews are required to remain outside their cars during refuelling.

Solely for the purpose of assisting with the refuelling procedure of their car, two team members of each crew with the team passes may access the Refuelling Area. In order to access the Refuel area, all personnel involved in refuelling operations must wear clothing that provides adequate protection against fire and includes at least: long trousers, long-sleeved top, closed shoes, gloves and a balaclava.

Engines must be switched off throughout the refuelling operation. It is required that the crew remain outside the car during refuelling. At the Refuel area, the competitor is responsible to protect the ground with an Environmental mat which shall be composed of an absorbent upper part and an impermeable lower part.

8.2 Fuel for ERC1 competitors

All ERC1 priority drivers must use fuel sold by the FIA-appointed supplier. No later than the closing date for entries for each rally, competitors must order their fuel on the supplier's website: <https://www.myetstorage.com/championships/>

Competitors are responsible for ordering the sufficient quantity for the entire event and for settling directly with the supplier, or supplier's agent, all matters relating to supply and payment. Unused fuel can be either refunded or collected at the end of the rally.

8.3 Fuel restrictions for Junior ERC

Competitors in the Junior ERC Championship are allowed to use only pump filling station fuel (gasoline type 98) from the following petrol station:

Service crews are allowed to fill this fuel in their cans or drums and refuel Junior ERC cars in designated Refuelling Areas.

8.4 Commercial filling stations

There will not be any options to use commercial filling stations during this rally.

9. RECONNAISSANCE

See also Art. 35 in the 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations.

9.1 Procedure for reconnaissance registration

The competitor must send the organiser in advance an information form (see Website/Rally Guide) to competitor@ercroyalrally.com, including details of the reconnaissance car, mobile phone number and place where the crew is accommodated. The form must be signed and submitted by Tuesday 12 May 2026 at the latest.

All reconnaissance and rally materials may be collected at the administrative checks by the nominated competitor representative, holding a written proxy (see Art. 10).

Identification numbers, given at the registration, shall be affixed on the car (windscreen at the top corner, co-drivers side) and kept visible for the duration of the reconnaissance period.

9.2 Participation in reconnaissance only

Any driver holding an appropriate international licence but not entered in the rally may apply to take part in the reconnaissance. The regulations on reconnaissance must be respected in their entirety. A registration form for this purpose will be sent on request. The final permission for taking part in recce is left to the discretion of the organiser. An administrative fee will be charged (see 4.3.3 Reconnaissance Only).

9.3 Tracking system for reconnaissance

All competitors must make one IOS or Android smartphone available and equip their reconnaissance cars with a smartphone-based application RS Lite developed by the FIA official supplier STATUS AWARENESS SYSTEM (SAS). SAS will distribute individual event access codes during the reconnaissance registration.

9.4 Specific and national restrictions

9.4.1 Passages

Crews are authorised to drive a maximum of 2 times through each special stage in accordance with the schedules given in Appendix 2. Reconnaissance Groups 1 and 2 will be defined once the Entry List is published. The special stages must be driven in the same direction as the rally, at a reduced speed and fully respecting the Traffic Laws. All special stages are run twice during the rally but may only be driven as one stage during recce. All passages through the special stages will be recorded by the marshals. Timecards will not be used.

9.4.2 Speed limits

The maximum speed allowed during reconnaissance is 70 km/h on special stages unless another speed limit is indicated by traffic signs or by written instructions in the Road Book (or in Bulletins). All crews are reminded of Art. 34.2 in the 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations.

9.4.3 Tyres

Free tyres for gravel.

10. ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

Document checks will be done online, before the event, but original documents along with the duly signed entry form must be brought to the administrative checks. All required documents as per Art. 4.2 must be scanned and sent to the organizer by using the following address: competitor@ercroyalrally.com latest on 13 May 2026 at 23.59 CET.

Notwithstanding the 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Art. 30.1, drivers and co-drivers are not required to report personally to the administrative checks.

Each competitor must report to the Administrative Checks at their individually scheduled time, which will be published in the bulletin on the DNB. A delay to the Administrative Checks of up to 30 minutes will be penalised by the Clerk of the Course with a fine 150 Euro. A delay exceeding 30 minutes will be penalised by the Clerk of the Course with a fine 500 Euro.

10.1 Documents to be presented

- International Competitor licence
- Driver's and Co-driver's International competition and driving licences
- Driver's and Co-driver's medical certificates of aptitude (if separate from competition licence)
- Driver's and Co-driver's identification cards/passports
- ASN authorisation for all foreign drivers and co-drivers by their ASN, to take part in the rally
- Rally car's insurance cover towards third parties (Green Card)
- Accuracy and completion of all information given on the entry form
- Signatures of entry forms from both drivers and the competitor
- Driver Declaration and undertakings duly signed by the Driver and the Co-Driver
- Car homologation certificate, first page of the car's homologation form with the number (not for Rally1 cars)
- Car registration papers
- eLearning certificate for driver and Co-driver

11. SCRUTINEERING

11.1 Venue and Timetable

Scrutineering / Component Sealing of all other cars:

- Venue: Nobelgymnasiet, Nokiagatan 20, Karlstad, [59°39869 N 13°52329 E](#)
- Date and time: Thursday 21 May from 14:00

Each car should be presented at the Scrutineering in their individual time fixed in the schedule that will be published by the bulletin on the DNB. Any delay at Scrutineering will be penalized by 150 Euro. If the delay exceeds 30 min the competitor will be reported to the Stewards.

In well justified and reasonable cases, the Organiser can arrange a new Scrutineering time for the car upon competitor request (after the time limit fixed in the schedule).

11.2 General requirements

- 11.2.1** Competition numbers and rally plates must be affixed to cars in the stated positions prior to scrutineering. See Art. 6 and Appendix 4.
- 11.2.2** All cars must have a complete certified homologation form available at scrutineering (2026 FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J, Art. 251.2.1.8). In addition, homologation forms for the catalytic converter and roll cage (if homologated), must be with the car at scrutineering.
- 11.2.3** Sealing of the cars will be carried out according to 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations Articles 16 & 17. Therefore, all underbody protection must be removed for scrutineering but must be kept with the car for weight checks. Car's chassis and cylinder block will also be marked (2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Art. 31.1.6). Sealing wires must be installed as instructed by the car manufacturer.
- 11.2.4** After scrutineering, if a car is found not to comply with technical and/or safety regulations, the Stewards may set a deadline to comply with the requirements otherwise start in the event may be refused.

11.3 Mud flaps

Fitting of transversal mud flaps (all wheels) is mandatory in conformity with 2026 FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J, Art. 252.7.7.

11.4 Windows / Nets

The use of transparent and colourless anti-shatter films (maximum thickness: 100 microns) is compulsory on side and sunroof windows, unless they are in polycarbonate (see Art. 253.11 of 2026 FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J). Window nets are not allowed.

The use of silvered or tinted films is authorised, on the rear side windows, on the rear window and on the sunroof, on the following conditions:

Silvered or tinted films fitted on rear side windows must have an opening equivalent to the surface of a circle of 70 mm in diameter so that the driver as well as the contents of the car may be seen from the outside.

11.5 Drivers' safety equipment

At scrutineering competitors must produce all items of clothing including helmets and head restraints intended to be used. Condition of the equipment and compliance with 2026 FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix L, Chapter III will be checked. Also, see Appendix 5 of these Supplementary Regulations.

11.6 Noise level

At any time on the road sections, the noise level must be in conformity with 2026 FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J. See also 2026 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations Art. 18.4.

11.7 Special national requirements

Competing cars must be equipped with two first aid kits and one reflective triangle.

11.8 FIA Safety tracking device (2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations Art. 18.2 and 53.2.1)

All competitors must make provisions in their rally cars for the installation of the FIA Safety Emergency Console System, and the system must be installed before the car is brought to scrutineering.

No deposit will be collected for the rally safety tracking equipment, but all the damage caused will be invoiced afterwards. Systems may be collected either by the crew or a representative.

Competitors are required to either rent or purchase a SAS RallySafe ERC-spec fitting kit, a purchased kit can be permanently installed in the vehicle for all future events. The rental kit can be used for one single event, paid and collected at the FIA Safety Tracking Device collection on the event, and to be returned with the tracker at the completion of the event. For instructions, see Appendix 6 of these Supplementary Regulations. The price to purchase the kit is €150.00, excluding shipping and handling fees. The price for a kit for the single event that has to be returned after the event is €50.00

For installation and operating instructions see Appendix 6.

The FIA Safety Safety Tracking Device may be removed in the final parc fermé by a team member under the supervision of a scrutineer or officials. In any case, the device must be returned to STATUS AWARENESS SYSTEM (SAS) in Rally HQ no later than one hour after the Stewards have authorised the opening of the parc fermé.

Should a competitor retire, the tracking unit and associated cables must be returned to SAS tent in Service Park as soon as possible.

11.9 On-board Cameras

The competitor of any car which carries an on-board camera must have the prior agreement of the Promoter.

The fixings of the camera and camera recorder must comply with the 2026 FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J, Art.253.2.

Competitors wishing to use an on-board camera must apply via the Accreditation Portal at the latest by Monday, 14 May 2026. Any requests presented after this date will not be considered and the competitor will not be authorized to install an OBC on their car.

Those registering for an OBC for the first time should first use this link: <https://qrco.de/WRCOBCRegistration>.

Those who have already applied for an OBC in the last 12 months should use their e-mail address to register via this link (no password required): <https://qrco.de/OBCForm2026>.

An authorization sticker, which must be affixed to the car in the vicinity of the authorized camera prior to Scrutineering, must be obtained from the HQ when collecting documents and other materials (Art 10.2).

Any contacts about OBC prior to the event should be addressed to Miguel Fonseca, accreditation@wrc.com

12. OTHER PROCEDURES

12.1 FIA eLearning course and Drivers' Safety Briefing

All drivers and co-drivers who have not yet participated in any ERC event in 2026 must complete the FIA eLearning course and pass the assessment for FIA Safety Tracking Device by Sunday, 17 May 2026, Certificate of the passes course must be sent to rally office by email to competitor@ercroyalrally.com

See Appendix 6 for more details.

Instructions for the eLearning course will be sent to the competitors by email once the Entry List is published.

12.2 Official time used during the rally

Official time throughout the entire rally will be that of GPS, UTC time + 1 (local time).

12.3 Start order and intervals

The start order as per Art. 41. of the 2026 FIA European Rally Championship.

Start intervals are 2 minutes for ERC1 crews and 1 minute for all other crews. The Clerk of the Course may, for safety reasons and with the knowledge of the Stewards, reposition drivers or change the time interval between them.

The start intervals for the Power Stage will be defined as per Art. 50.3 of the 2026 FIA European Rally Championship.

12.4 Control Procedures and Timecard Handling

The complete set of Timecards for the whole rally (including the QS, Shakedown) will be delivered with the rally materials at the administrative checks. It is imperative for all crews to carry at least all the Timecard sets for a whole day inside the car (cf. for example procedures at regrouping controls).

Time control procedures will be as described in 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Arts. 43, 44, 46, 48, 49 and 55. Any writing on the Timecards can only be done by the rally officials, except filling in the car number and markings on the boxes reserved for competitor's use.

12.5 AI Safety Cameras

In 2026 European Rally Championship season FIA will use AI Safety Cameras to improve the safety of active stage. It is mandatory to carry the camera system by the crew nominated by FIA and published by bulletin. The teams of the nominated crews will be invited to a meeting in which the operation of the system will be explained and shown. The invitations to the meeting will individually be send to the teams. If necessary, during the event the system can be installed in any other car than originally nominated. In such case the team of the crew concerned will be contacted and function of the AISC will be introduced.

12.6 Start procedure

There will be a ceremonial start in this rally. The official start of the rally will be at TC 0.

A start holding area at Karlstad City Square will be established before the TC 0, and the crews are requested to be in this area 30 minutes before each car's individual start time.

There will be a prestart show including presentation of selected cars and drivers starting from 17:30. Further details will be given in a Bulletin.

12.7 Starting system of special stages.

The standard light sequence mentioned in Article 48.2 and Appendix VII, of the 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations will be used.

Should this start system fail the start will be given as specified in Article 48.3 of the 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations.

12.8 Permitted early check-in

Crews are authorised to check-in early without incurring a penalty at TC TZ (after qualifying stage), TC 1A (end of Section 1), TC 9C (end of Section 3) and TC 17A (final time control).

12.9 Organisers promotional activities

PR activities, crew requirements and related schedule for Thursday 21 May and Friday 22 May will be aligned with the ERC1 teams and selected drivers ahead of the event.

12.9.1 Thursday 21 May

PR activities will take place for selected drivers on Thursday 21 May from 18:00 in BAUHAUS warehouse in Karlstad. Invited drivers will be notified via a Bulletin.

12.9.2 Friday 22 May

The opening ceremony show is on Friday, 22 May from 18:00

All ERC1 cars with both crew members, as well as selected cars with both crew members are required for the prestart show. All the abovementioned cars must be present at the line-up at latest by 17:30.

Invited drivers will be notified via a Bulletin

12.10 Junior ERC Family Photo

A mandatory family photo for all Junior ERC crews (drivers and co-drivers) will take place on Thursday, 21 May at 19:30. The exact location will be in close proximity to the service park. Crews are requested to wear their overalls.

Further details will be communicated by the promoter and/or the National Press Officer.

12.11 FIA ERC Meet the Crews session

FIA ERC Meet the Crews session with nominated drivers, and co-drivers will be held in Karlstad City Square in conjunction with the opening show, before TC0. Information will be taken directly with the team by the National Press Officer.

12.12 Media Zones

The Media Zone is located at the entry of the Service Park, prior to the Regroup/Service IN. This Media Zone will be operational as follows: TC5A, TC 9A and TC13A

12.13 FIA ERC Meet the Crew (FIA post-event press conference)

The top three drivers according to the provisional overall classification will be interviewed on or close to the podium. Each driver should be asked a minimum of two questions. The drivers winning ERC3, ERC4, Junior ERC and Master ERC will be interviewed either as they pass over the ramp or prior to/following their respective podium ceremony.

12.14 Deceleration area

In accordance with Article 5.5.4.1 c) of Appendix H of the 2026 FIA International Sporting Code, in order to reduce the arrival speed at the Stop Point on each special stage, the organiser will place two cones on the right and left sides of the road to force crews to slow down. These modules will be placed 100 meters before the Stop Point. The locations will be marked during reconnaissance and are shown on the Road Book.

12.15 Qualifying winner presentation

Fastest crew will be stopped and held at the stop line area until a faster crew arrives or the QS finishes. Winner presentation will be held at the Stopline area after QS has finished. No penalties for being late from TC TZ due to being delayed at the Stopline will be applied by the Clerk of the Course.

12.16 SSS 1 Bråtebäcken

SSS 1 Bråtebäcken will be considered as a super special stage in according to the 2026 FIA Regional Sporting Regulations, Art. 51.2 Starting order and intervals are entirely at the discretion of the organiser, subject to the approval of the FIA and Promoter.

12.17 Re-start after retirement

With reference to Art. 54 of the 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations any crew which fails to complete a section will be assumed to re-start the rally from the start of the next section following the overnight regroup. If not, they must confirm with the Clerk of the Course by completing the form located in the road book and lodging it with the organiser as soon as possible before the publication of the re-start list.

Any crew re-starting the rally must present their cars at the overnight parc fermé at the latest one hour before the start of the next Section following the overnight regroup.

12.18 Power Stage

With reference to Art. 50 of the 2026 FIA European Rally Championship special stage 17, Ölme 2, will be run as the Power Stage. Notwithstanding Art. 50.2 of the 2026 FIA European Rally Championship, Art. 56.2.4 applies at the regroup TC16A/B and while the crews are waiting before TC16A.

12.19 Flexi Service

Service C on Saturday evening are Flexi Services as stipulated in Art. 59 of the 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations.

12.20 Finish procedure

The finish of the competition element of the rally is at TC 17A, the holding area at the podium. Thereafter crews must follow the instructions of officials during the podium ceremony. From the podium, crews are obliged to drive their competing car to the final parc fermé following the route described in the road book. Between TC 17A and parc fermé, competitors will be under parc fermé conditions and will be observed by marshals. Recovery of any competing car which fails to arrive under its own power at the final parc fermé shall be the responsibility of the competitor. The permission of the Clerk of the Course must be obtained before any recovery arrangements are made.

All cars selected for the final checks must be driven without delay to the parc fermé and then to the scrutineering.

12.21 Environmental prescriptions

Organiser's Environmental Policy which will be published in detail in Rally Guide, is considered as an integral part of these Supplementary Regulations and all competitors must comply with it.

12.22 Exhibition driving

Exhibition driving ("doughnuts") is strictly forbidden everywhere due to lack of suitable place. All infringements will be penalised with a minimum of a 5-minute time penalty, applied by the Stewards.

15. FINAL CHECKS AND PROTESTS

15.1 Final checks

Post-rally scrutineering will take place on Sunday, 24 May 2026 at Nobelgymnasiet, Nokiagatan 20, Karlstad

Cars subject to final checks (COC Communication notified to the competitor concerned at the finish TC) must have one representative of the competitor as well as mechanics and proper equipment (in case of dismantling) present at the final checks.

15.2 Protest deposit (2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations Art. 65.2)

The protest deposit is € 1000.

If a protest requires the dismantling and reassembly of a clearly defined part of the car (engine, transmission, steering, braking system, electrical installation, bodywork, etc.), an additional deposit may be specified by the Stewards in accordance with Art. 13.4.3 of the 2026 FIA International Sporting Code.

The expenses incurred in the work and in the transport of the car shall be borne by the claimant if the protest is unfounded, or by the competitor against whom the protest is lodged if it is upheld.

If the protest is unfounded, and if the expenses incurred by the protest (scrutineering, transport, etc.) are higher than the amount of the (additional) deposit, the difference shall be borne by the claimant. Conversely, if the expenses are less, the difference shall be returned.

15.3 Right of review deposit (2026 FIA ISC, Art. 14.4.3)

The right of review deposit is € 1000.

15.4 Appeal deposit (2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Art. 65.4)

The amount of the appeal fee and the appeal deposit/third-party deposit in accordance with Article 14.1.2 of the FIA Judicial and Disciplinary Rules.

15.5 Fines

In accordance with Article 12.8 FIA International Sporting Code, the payment of the fines must be done online, within 48 hours of their notification, at the following address: <https://fiafines.fia.com>

Any delay in making payment may entail Suspension during the period a fine remains unpaid.



APPENDIX 5 – DRIVERS' SAFETY EQUIPMENT

All competitors are reminded of Appendix L of the 2026 FIA International Sporting Code, in particular its Chapter III – Drivers' Equipment. These regulations apply to Shakedown as well.

Helmets (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 1)

All crews must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the following FIA standards:

- 8859-2015 (Technical List N°49),
- 8859-2024 or 8859-2024-APB (Technical List N°107),
- 8860-2010 (Technical List N°33), or
- 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP (Technical List N°69)

Frontal Head Restraint (FHR, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3)

All crews must use FIA approved FHR systems homologated to FIA standard 8858. Approved FHRs, anchorages and tethers are listed in Technical List N° 29. See also helmet compatibility chart in Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3.3.

Flame-resistant clothing (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2)

All drivers and co-drivers must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2018 standard (Technical List N° 74).

Please pay special attention to the prescriptions of Art. 2 concerning embroidery and printing on flame-resistant clothing (manufacturer certificates etc.) **as well as concerning the correct wearing of the clothing elements! See also the 2026 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Article 53.1.**

Biometric Devices (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2.1)

Drivers may wear a device to collect biometric data during racing.

- If the biometric device is integrated into a protective garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856, the garment shall be homologated to FIA Standards 8856 and 8868- 2018.
- If the biometric device is a stand-alone device, then the device must be homologated to FIA Standard 8868-2018 only. This device must be worn in addition to the garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856.

Glasses or contact lenses (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 1.7)

Only glasses or contact lenses for the sole purpose of correcting eyesight and figuring in the international drivers' licence are authorized.

Wearing of jewellery (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 5)

The wearing of any type of jewellery, such as but not limited to, neck chains, bracelets or watches is prohibited during the competition. Exceptions to this rule, providing the CMO and/or Medical Delegate do not consider that due to size or location they may delay rescue or hinder emergency care, are:

- i. the wearing of watch(es) by co-drivers, on the condition that the watch(es) is worn over the overall,
- ii. the wearing of a single band-style ring providing it does not restrict the natural range of motion of the hand, and
- iii. the wearing of body piercing(s) providing they are not worn in and/or around the oral cavity.

APPENDIX 6 – FIA WRC TRACKING SYSTEM - INSTALLATION AND OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Any competitor that wishes to purchase a SAS RallySafe WRC/ERC-spec fitting kit, which can be permanently installed in the vehicle for all future events. The SAS RallySafe WRC/ERC-spec fitting comprises all necessary antennas, mounting and wiring components to be pre-installed in the vehicle, prior to the supply of the FIA Safety Tracking Device at the event. SAS RallySafe WRC-spec fitting kit can be purchased via the RallySafe shop (<https://statusas.com/wrc-kit>) and shipped to the competitor prior to the event, or collected at the event, or alternatively purchased onsite when collecting the FIA Safety Tracking Device at the event. The price of the kit is €150.00, excluding shipping and handling fees.

Any competitor that wishes to rent a SAS RallySafe WRC-spec fitting kit, has an option to rent a kit for the single event for the cost of €50.00, paid and collected at the FIA Safety Tracking Device collection window on the event, and to be returned with the tracker at the completion of the event.
