Medical Plan Day of competition

1. **Positioning the mats:** The chief referee will make sure the mats are positioned so that they can be easily moved for ambulance access. The meet coordinator can assist the chief referee or designate with this. The referee will use the SSC recommendations for mat placement as referenced in the 2024-25 Red Book.

2. On Site Medical Response Team:

- Referee's, Track Stewards, Meet Coordinator, Medical Personnel determined by the sanction, including the safety coordinator who is the designated 911 caller
- Others may include appointed people to assist in holding doors and directing personnel.
- 3. **Meet and Physically walk with the Medical team to all the locations and make sure everyone knows what to do**. Test opening doors and go outside to where the ambulance will enter. Answer questions, take suggestions, and make changes if necessary. Here the team needs to be clear and agree on what to do. You need the support of the chief referee to make sure he/she understands the importance of the EAP. Make sure the cut kits are on the playing surface before the start of practice and competition.
- **4. Medical Staging Area** The staging area for long track (upstairs) events will be to the left of the main doors for close proximity to the ice and the first aid room. Staging short track will be on the east side of the ice located on & behind bleachers. Medical room located in main entrance way to ice surfaces on east side
- 5. **On coaches/Officials meeting**, Present The EAP and remind everyone it is available on Sportity.

Medivac Protocol

- The medical team is ready to intervene at any time
- Upon the injury occurring, the first person to witness will announce to the chief referee where and what happened
- The chief referee at their discretion, will stop the race and signal the medical personnel onto the ice.
- Medical personnel must wait for racing to stop before entering the rink
- Medical team has the authority to evaluate a skater as they deem necessary
- Track Steward(s)/referees may help the medical personnel get to the injured skater
- On Standby: 911 caller with cell phone and address
- On Standby: Person that open doors to ice level and direct ambulance
- The medical personnel decide if 911 will be called and the medical personnel will become the trauma leader.
- An official will be designated to open the doors at ice level and direct the ambulance to the injured skater. If necessary the track stewards will move the mats for the ambulance to have access to the ice playing surface
- The referee or track stewards will direct the skaters off ice and marshal the skaters away from ice level and back to their designated change rooms. This process will take place at the discretion of the chief referee and/or trauma leader.

In the event of the need for entire arena evacuation

All personnel will default to the posted facility emergency plan. Follow emergency exits and meet at the muster area outside of the building on the south side hockey statue and benches.

2nd **floor I**ce level Access to injured skater by EMS through main Pomeroy Sport Center Entrance:

Immediately after entering both sets of entrance doors on the ground level turn to the right and enter the stairwell to the second floor. After exiting the stairwell take an immediate right and pass through skating rink access doors immediately ahead.

1st floor Ice level Access to injured skater by EMS through main Pomeroy Sport Center Entrance:

After entering main set of doors walk directly forward through the 2nd set of doors turn right

Direction from Pomeroy Sport Center to Fort St. John Hospital
