Round 5 KVR Motorsport Stages post-event Report

Round 5, the KVR Motorsport Stages has certainly shaken up the STRC Points Tables! It also shook up a couple of crews on SS1 with Car 1, Donnie MacDonald/Andrew Falconer and Car 27, Martyn Douglas/Rian Walker both doing significant damage to their cars in separate incidents, but fortunately no damage to themselves. The resulting delays impacted the schedule of the event, but "hats off" to the Event Organisers and Marshals who swiftly got things running again and back on time!

Here is what some of the STRC registered crews reported:

Car 6 - Ben MacDowall/Alan Scott - 4th overall

Really good to be back at Crail. We got up to the pace we wanted pretty much straight away which was great! A poor tyre choice for stage 4 caused us to lose a good bit of time between us and 3rd place, but a change of tyres for 5 and 6 got the pace back up. Sadly, not enough to get into the top 3 but enough to secure 4th. Cracking job from Alan on the notes as always, who reported it was a cracking day out. Purely there for ballast and a bit of encouragement, but Ben needed very little of that, that's for sure, a cracking drive from him!

Car 7 - Des Campbell/Rhys Donaldson - 5th overall

I did enjoy it to be fair. A good event, we bedded ourselves in quietly, but didn't except a nice wee fight on from Peter O'Neill! With one stage to go we were 3 behind! We dialled in a very aggressive set up and bolted on our best Pirelli's and went full formula 2 kit car mode!!! I've probably not driven at that level for 2/3yrs and boy was it a MASSIVE BUZZ!! Rhys was incredible on the notes and navigation when required, especially in that critical stage 5. Then we found out there was a stage 6 hahaha!

Car 8 - Chris Thompson/Pete Gibson - 8th overall

Making the long journey up from Englandshire worthwhile with a top 10 finish

Car 9 - Joe McKeand/Charlotte McDowall

Gutted not to finish - a hole in the back of the gearbox after stage 4. Hopefully get it sorted for Argyll!

Car 14 - Martin Burke/Owen Paterson

Car 15 - Ross Chalmers/Andrew Side - 7th overall

We had a brilliant day. My first class win for me with the car. Thoroughly enjoyed all the stages and thankfully the rain stayed off until the after the rally.

Navigator's first time sitting with Ross, and he didn't disappoint with a 7th overall and a 1st in class. The car ran with no issues only having one visit to a tyre wall, brushing across the whole of the navigator's side of the car.

Car 18 - Peter O'Neill/Eilidh Williamson - 6th overall

A great day, consistent throughout all the stages. Very pleased with our final result of 6th overall and 2nd in class.

Car 19 - Steven Street/Robert Wood

We tried some new suspension settings in SS2 but weren't happy with them so reverted to known settings for SS3. We felt good until we ended up on top of a pile of tyres. Note to self - don't trust the maps - recce is a must! The rest of the day went OK but we are still suffering gearbox niggles. Need to get the head down and get ready for Argyll.

Car 20 - Ross MacDonald/Michelle Hunter

We spent the day learning the new car. Unfortunately, we lost the brakes completely on ss2, doing a lap with the peddle going straight to the floor which lost us a load of time, but we slowly crept back up the leaderboard, re-gaining confidence. We were happy with the direction we were heading after that . Plenty more to come pace-wise though.

Car 21 - John O'Kane/Meghan O'Kane

We had a great day. Dad loves the car, and it is definitely a bit different to drive than the Escort! I loved it too... might need to steal it at some point!

We got on really well for the first laps of SS1 until unfortunately a brake flexi burst coming to the end of a straight, and a last-minute attempt to pull the handbrake to scrub speed didn't go as planned when we caught a tyre which sent us dramatically into some more tyres! Hoping we can have the car sorted in time for Mach1 in a few weeks!

Car 28 - Ian McEwan/Daniel Johnstone

Enjoyed a great event. Getting better and car improving all the time. Delighted with our finish. Some great battles in all classes so a positive for the sport!

Car 29 - Colin Hay/Jess Jamieson

Gearbox main shaft bearing housing sheared from the box causing the crown wheel pinion to strip on stage two. Felt good in the car and still enjoyed the limited seat time. Downside might be that our Machrihanish entry may be in doubt as our getting there is dependent on parts availability. Fingers crossed.

Car 31 - Drew Barker/Shona Hale

Skiffed a bale with the DRIVER'S side front wing and cracked it! Caught a few cars. Let a few past. Were really pushing on in the last 2 stages and very pleased with our result - 25th overall. 6th in class.

Car 32 - Gavin Lloyd/Gordon Clark

Another cracking event for us. Chuffed to come away with class win and a top 20 finish. The car ran well all day although we were rapidly running out of front tyres and had to buy new rubber for the last 2 stages. We enjoyed our day! The event was run very well and the stages were nice and fast. Thankfully the weather was on our side. Thanks to the organisers and marshals for allowing us to have our fun. Car 34 - Ross Carbry/Michael Thomson
