Recce can be done on the following dates:

Saturday 22nd April	08:00 to 1
Thursday 29th April	08:00 to 1

Sunday 23rd April Friday 28th April 08:00 to 17:00 08:00 to 17:00

COMPETITORS:

Reconnaissance will be according to Motorsport Ireland Yearbook Appendix 25, Article 3.13 and Appendix 29, Article 4.

• You must sign on at rally headquarters before entering the stages for recce.

- Details of the recce car and occupants, including phone numbers at which they can be contacted on during recce must be submitted at sign-on.
- Your competitor IRDS / BRDS cover must be approved and on the Motorsport Ireland database.
- You will be supplied with 2 identification plates, one must be displayed on the outside top left corner of the windscreen and one on the rear window. Failure to do so will be deemed a breach of the reconnaissance regulations.
- Rally cars used in the event may not be used for recce, only standard cars or car derived vans are allowed.
- You are permitted to a maximum of THREE passes through each stage (special stages run more than once are considered to be one stage). Penalty for breach of this rule: Exclusion (Appendix 29), Regulation 4.6.3, current MI Yearbook.
- Each competitor is limited to 2 days of recce.
- Only traverse the stages in the direction of the rally.
- Only enter and leave the special stages through the start and stop locations.
- The stages will be patrolled by Judges of Fact whose decision is final.
- Abuse of Rally Officials will not be tolerated under any circumstances.
- Maximum speed during allowed on a stage during recce is 60kph, unless a lower limit is indicated by a traffic sign, or a written instruction issued by the organisers.

PLEASE REMEMBER AT ALL TIMES:

The roads are not closed, they are being used by public so you should be courteous, give way to oncoming local traffic, do not allow your driving to give a bad impression and remember that it may be a Judge of Fact observing you.









Event Regulations

Art. 9.2 Specific regulations

During reconnaissance, all national traffic regulation must be followed, including but not limited to the speed limits. Please note that the Special Stages will not be closed to public traffic during reconnaissance. The organiser may reduce the allowed speed individually by marking the areas in the road book and along the route.

Any competitor deemed to be in breach of reconnaissance regulations will be reported to the Stewards where the penalties imposed may be start refused and/or a fine imposed and/or disqualification and reported to the competitors ASN Motorsport Ireland who may convene a Court of Inquiry. Your attention is drawn to Appendix 29, Article 4 of the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.

Competitors are only permitted a maximum of THREE passes through each stage (special stages run more than once are considered to be one stage). Penalty for breach of this rule: Exclusion (Appendix 29), Regulation 4.6.3, current MI Yearbook.

Each crew may drive the special stages **only** in the direction of the rally and must always enter and leave the special stages through the start and stop control locations.

Judges of Fact will be appointed to enforce this regulation and will carry special identification. The organisers will also have the co-operation and assistance of the Garda and Officials of local authorities.

Judges of Fact will also monitor competitors driving during recce: e.g. falling into this category is use of handbrake to negotiate acute turns etc. Your attention is drawn to Appendix 29, Regulation 4.6.1 and 4.6.2 of the current MI Yearbook. The decision of a Judge of Fact is final. Judges of Fact may sign your road book.

A list of Judges of Fact will be posted on the Digital Notice Board.

Your attention is also drawn to Appendix 29, Regulation 4.8.1 - 4.8.4 of the current MI Yearbook referring to a competitor found on a stage outside of the 'Recce' period, also refer to 4.9 and 4.10. Reports of breaches of this regulation will be submitted to the President of Motorsport Ireland who may convene a Tribunal of Inquiry.

During Recce competitors must only enter the stage at the start location and exit the stage at the finish location. Traversing the stage in the wrong direction is expressly forbidden.

If you are not sure of being clear of any stage by 17:00 you should not start the stage.

Art. 9.3 Number of Passages

The maximum number of passages authorised for each crew on each special stage is three.

Traversing the stage in the wrong direction is expressly forbidden.
