## 1. INTRODUCTION

### 1.1. Tennessee Rally USA 2024

This rally will be run in compliance with the ARA 2024 General Competition Rules (GCRs), Rally Technical Rules (RTR), Rally Competition Rules (RCR) and these Supplementary Regulations.

As an exhibition-only rally, it will not count towards any championships.

Modifications, amendments and/or changes to these Supplementary Regulations will be announced only by numbered and dated Bulletins (issued by the Clerk of the Course).

### 1.2. Road Surface

## 4. ENTRIES

### 4.1. Closing Date for Entries

---

Competitors wishing to take part in Tennessee Rally USA 2024 must submit their entry form duly completed before Friday, May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024 at 23:59 hrs (US Eastern Time).

### 4.2. Entry Procedure

---

Entry and payment must be made online at EnterRally.com . A current ARA competition license is required to enter the event. ARA will send email to ARA license holders announcing the opening of online entries. Please contact [ara@ara-rally.com](mailto:ara@ara-rally.com) should you require assistance with the online entry system.

Rally participants must be either ARA licensed (competitors, their crew members, media, officials) or registered as volunteers on the ARA website.

All competitors will be required to have an ARA license to enter, including foreign competitors.

### 4.3. Number of Entries Accepted and Classes

---

The maximum number of entries is **45**. If more than 45 entries are received, the Organisers will create a wait list. The Organizer reserves the right to accept or refuse any entry. Any entries not accepted will receive a full refund of the entry fee.

This event will use FIA timing and is built around the timing of a Speed Factor of 40. Entries that fall below this may struggle to stay on time and may incur road penalties. As determined by the CoC those with a speed factor under 40 **will** be allowed. See Article 12.2 of these Supplementary Regulations for details.

Cars eligible to enter Tennessee Rally USA are:

- All cars complying with 2024 ARA Rally Technical Rules.
- Cars stipulated under Art. 12.1 of the 2024 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations.

#### 4.4. Entry Fees and Packages

## 4.5. Refunds

---

Entry fees will be refunded in full only:

- To participants whose entry has been rejected
- To participants who withdraw their entry 14 days before the closing date for entries or earlier.
- In the case of the rally not taking place

Organisers may refund 30% of the entry fee to those competitors who withdraw their entry less than 14 days before the closing date for entries, or who were unable to start the rally, if the ARA certifies a reason of “force majeure”.

Competitors may revise or withdraw their entry prior to the closing date by completing an entry update/withdrawal form available in the Registrar Folder on the Sportity App. Once entries close withdrawals and entry revisions are actioned by filing an inquiry and following RCR 4.11

## 5. INSURANCE

Third-party liability insurance covering bodily injury and property damage, effective during the competition, will be provided by a policy secured by USAC and displayed on the Official Notice Board.

Competitors, service crew members and all event participants including officials, marshals, staff, stewards and all other volunteers who have obtained an ARA license, completed the online ARA waiver process and have been issued and are in possession of an event wristband will be covered by a secondary USAC participant accident insurance policy which covers excess medical expenses to their primary medical insurance provider.

Competitors are reminded that, as per ARA Regulations, they must carry their own liability insurance during recce. This may be checked at any time by rally officials.



## 6. ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATION

### Organizer's Advertising & Identification Numbers

---

Rally Plates and Optional Advertising must be affixed on the car before scrutineering as defined in the ARA Visual Package guidelines on the ARA website, and the 2024 ARA Rally Technical Rules Art. 3.2.

### Restrictions

---

The advertising of tobacco products is prohibited.

## 7. TYRES

### 7.1. Tyres specified for use during the Rally

---

The make and model of tyres used during the rally is free.

### 7.2. Quantity of Tyres

---

There will be no limit to the number of tyres for use during the rally.



## 8. FUEL

### 8.1. Ordering Procedure

---

All competitors are expected to supply their own fuel, in compliance with all relevant parts of the ARA Regulations.

VP Racing Fuel will be available for pre-purchase and delivered to the event. It must be ordered by May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024. Pick up time and place will be announced in a bulletin.

### 8.2. Closing Date for Ordering VP Racing Fuel

---

All competitors using VP Racing Fuel must place their fuel order through the ARA website ([www.americanrallyassociation.org/contingency](http://www.americanrallyassociation.org/contingency)) no later than Friday May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024.

### 8.3. Fuel Distribution

---

All drivers may use either VP Racing Fuel, other brands of competition fuel which they themselves supply, or commercially available pump fuel, dispensed directly into competing cars from pumps at filling stations nominated in the Road Book as Refuel Zones, or when distributed from a centralised system by the organiser where a Refuel Zone is not in a gas station.

Service crews will transport fuel for their car from the designated fuel depot (location, procedures and opening schedule to be announced in a bulletin) to each Refuel Zone, where they will be responsible for the refuelling procedure as set out in Articles 5.8.2 to 5.8.7 of the 2024 ARA RCR.

Refuelling outside the Refuel Zones specifically designated as such in the rally itinerary and road book is forbidden.

### 8.4. Refuelling in the Service Park

---

For environmental and safety reasons, no refuelling is allowed in the Service Park (no refuel from cans, drums or similar) except when necessary as part of service (i.e. changing of fuel tank, changing of fuel pump, changing of fuel filter, changing of any other item of the fuel circuit). Emptying and/or refilling is permitted in a service park provided that:

- The work is carried out with the knowledge of the Service Park Operations Officer.



- Fire extinguisher with operator on standby to be provided by the competitor.
- No other work is carried out on the car while the fuel circuit is open and/or during the emptying and/or refilling operation.
- No person other than the people directly involved in the refuelling operation is to stand within 10ft of the car.
- Only sufficient fuel is added to reach the next refuel zone.

## 9. RECONNAISSANCE

### 9.1. Registration Procedure

All crews taking part in the reconnaissance must register at the Rally Secretariat to get all the necessary documentation before starting reconnaissance. Registration for reconnaissance can be completed according to the following schedule:

Wednesday June 12 <sup>th</sup>	12:00 – 20:00
Thursday June 13 <sup>th</sup>	07:00 – 10:00

The reconnaissance ID sticker supplied during registration must be attached onto the reconnaissance car on the inside of the windshield (co-driver's side) and must be visible for the duration of the reconnaissance period.

### 9.2. Specific Restrictions

Tennessee Rally USA 2024 will allow only two passes of recce, according to the schedule in Appendix 2. Reconnaissance outside the scheduled times is forbidden from the opening date of entries to the publication of the official final classification.

On special stages and other gravel roads, the speed limit is 30 mph unless traffic signs or lower limit zones are indicated. According to Tennessee law, the speed limit when passing populated areas in rural undivided roads is 30 mph, even if it is not posted; a list of these areas will be published in a bulletin. Be aware that the State of Tennessee also has a "basic speeding law", which stipulates that motorists can be ticketed by police officers who judge the motorist's speed to be unsafe, even if under the posted speed limit. Speeding during recce will be punished in accordance with ARA RCR 1.2.1 g, and Article 12.1 of these Supplementary Regulations.

Competitors are reminded that stages will be open to normal traffic during reconnaissance and that they must drive in a manner that does not endanger or inconvenience other traffic or people living near the stages.

The maximum number of passengers on each special stage for reconnaissance is limited to two per entered crew.

All stages driven more than once in the rally will be considered as one stage for reconnaissance purposes.

Under no circumstances may crews drive in the opposite direction of the rally in the special stages according to the schedule, unless directed by the Organisers or authorities. Entering and leaving the special stage elsewhere than through Start and Finish controls is prohibited.



### 9.3. Speed control checking devices

---

As per ARA Bulletin 2024-4, all competitors must make one IOS or Android smartphone available and equip their reconnaissance cars with the smartphone-based application RS Lite developed by the Status Awareness Systems (SAS). This application must be open and working at all times during reconnaissance. Competitors will receive their individual event access codes during reconnaissance registration.

## 10. ADMINISTRATIVE CHECK-IN

Administrative Check-In and Reconnaissance Registration will take place at the rally secretariat following the specified schedule (Art. 3 of these Supplementary Regulations). All competitors must pass administrative checks before proceeding to pre-rally scrutineering.

All competitors and service personnel must have signed up for a license at <http://rallylicense.com/> before Administrative Check-In.

## 11. SCRUTINEERING, SEALING AND MARKING

Before pre-rally scrutineering, competition numbers, rally plates and optional advertising, if accepted, must be affixed on the car.

### 11.1. Scrutineering Venue and Timetable

---

Pre-rally scrutineering will be held at the Chattanooga Whiskey Riverfront parking lot, according to the following timetable:

Initial scrutineering (by appointment)

Thursday June 13th, 2024, 10:00 to 16:00

Re-scrutineering of cars having failed initial scrutineering (by appointment)

Friday June 14th, 2024, 08:00 to 11:00

Please contact the Rally Secretary to request a scrutineering appointment, before the start of administrative checks.

### 11.2. Driver's Safety Equipment

---

Although drivers and co-drivers are not required to be present, all items of clothing and equipment -including helmets and FHR (Frontal Head Restraints)-intended to be used must be presented during scrutineering.

Please see also Appendix 5 in these Supplementary Regulations.

### 11.3. Installation of Safety Tracking System

---

All competitors must make provisions in their rally cars for the installation of the ARA Safety Emergency Console System. The system will be installed during scrutineering. Systems may be collected either by the crew or a representative as per the schedule in Article 3. No deposit will be collected for the rally safety tracking equipment, but all the damage caused will be invoiced by the ARA afterwards.

For installation and operating instructions see Appendix 6.

The ARA Safety Emergency Console System devices must be removed in the Final Parc Fermé and must be returned no later than 23:00 on Sunday, June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024 to the secretariat.

## 12. OTHER PROCEDURES

### 12.1. Driving Infractions

County Police, State Police and National Forest Rangers will inform the Organizers of all infractions committed by competitors during the rally. Any competitor who is reported by law enforcement as having committed a traffic violation of any kind from the start of administrative check-in (including recce) and until the publishing of the final official classification, will be imposed a fine by the Clerk of the Course, separate from that which may be imposed by law enforcement, according to the following:

- Speeding: 500% of the fine amount imposed by law enforcement, up to the limit set by 2024 ARA GCR 7.5.
- Other traffic infractions: 200% of the fine amount imposed by law enforcement.

These fines are in addition to the penalties specified in 2024 ARA RCR Art. 6.2. The proceeds of these fines will be donated to the Polk County Department of Education.

### 12.2. Exceptions to ARA Regulations

As part of the effort to test the viability of running a rally under FIA World Championship rules in the future, some exceptions to the 2024 ARA Regulations have been requested and granted by the ARA. The following list details those affecting competitors during the running of the rally:

- The concept of "lateness times" will not be applied in this rally. This means that crews will be given a single target time from the Start control of a Special Stage, to the next Time Control. Stop control marshals will not give any crew a new target time, regardless of their time taken to finish the stage. All penalties for late and early arrival at controls will apply, and control operation will be completely normal otherwise. (RCR 5.3.9, RCR 5.4.4)
- As stated in Art. 12.1 of these Supplementary Regulations, speeding fines will be imposed, additional to any imposed by law enforcement for speeding or other traffic violations, and any other fines and penalties imposed by the 2024 ARA RCR. (RCR 1.4.2, 1.2.1.g, 2.3.3)
- During recce, only one crew, consisting of the driver and co-driver entered, will be allowed in each vehicle. (RCR 1.2.1.c)
- End-of-day time controls will not allow early check-in by default. Only those controls listed as such in the itinerary and these supplementary regulations will allow early check-in. (RCR 4.3.2)
- The maximum permitted lateness will be the same for all controls: 30 minutes, with no exceptions for start-of-day controls. There will be no

minimum interval between cars at any control other than special stage starts. (RCR 4.11.6)

- Starting cars with external batteries inside parc fermé areas will not be allowed. However, the crew, their team members and officials will be allowed to push cars from a regroup or parc fermé inside the service parks to the team's service area, at their Service IN time. (RCR 4.11.8)
- It is forbidden for competitors to swap places inside a control area, unless ordered to do so by rally officials. (RCR 5.4.6)
- There will be no "maximum permitted earliness", however, all normal early check-in penalties will still apply. (RCR 5.6)
- Failure to comply with the 15mph speed limit inside service parks shall result in a \$25 per mph over the speed limit fine applied by the Clerk of the Course, in addition to the time penalties defined in the 2024 ARA RCR. (RCR 5.7.b, 6.2)
- Towing cars anywhere along the route is forbidden, and considered illegal assistance, to be penalized as such by the Stewards. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, being towed by other competitors. (RCR 6.2 / 6.7.2)

---

## 12.3. Drivers' & Co-Drivers' Meeting

All drivers / co-drivers are required to attend a Meeting in rally HQ on Friday June 14th, 2024 at 16:00. Special procedures and safety related issued will be addressed at this meeting..

---

## 12.4. Ceremonial Start Procedure and Order

The Ceremonial Start will take place in the Parc Exposé area inside Rally Campus, on Friday June 14th, 2024, at 18:00. All cars must be inside the Parc Exposé area by 17:30. The start order for the ceremonial start will be at the discretion of the organizers in the interest of spectators and media.

The start order of the competitive element of the rally (Section 1) will be as per 2024 ARA RCR 9.2.

---

## 12.5. Finish Procedure

The rally will end at Time Control TC 14E (Finish Area IN - Station Street). After this control a pre-finish holding area will be established and crews will be directed to the podium in the specified order outlined in the Finish Podium Protocol (to be published in a bulletin) at the appropriate times.

Immediately after taking part in the Podium Ceremony, crews must drive directly to Parc Fermé in the Service Park in Chattanooga and leave their cars there, where they will be held until released by the Stewards.



## 12.6. Flexi-Service

---

Service C (saturday night) will be a Flexi-Service, where competitors can choose their service time within a prescribed window. The operation of Flexi-Service is as follows:

Classified cars will check into TC 7A Tech Zone IN at their due times, go through technical inspections, then check into TC 7B Tech Zone OUT - Parc Fermé IN, which is the entrance to Parc Fermé. Crews will leave their cars in Parc Fermé until a time of their choosing, when they can return to Parc Fermé to fetch their car, check into TC 7C Parc Fermé OUT - Flexi-Service C IN and head to their service areas. Once they have checked into TC 7C, their 45-minute service time will start running, and they will have to take the car back to Parc Fermé before their 45 minutes run out (TC 7D Flexi-Service C OUT - Parc Fermé IN).

TC 7D will close at 22:00, so all classified cars not re-starting after retirement will have to be back in Parc Fermé by that time.

A team mechanic or another team representative can remove the car from Parc Fermé and return it (that means checking into TC 7C and TC 7D) on behalf of the crew, but all normal control procedures and penalties will apply in any case.

All other Services will follow normal service procedures.

## 12.7. Permitted Early Check-In

---

Competitors are allowed to check-in early without incurring a penalty only at:

- "Flexi-Service OUT - Parc Fermé IN" control TC 7D

## 12.8. Tyre Warming and Exhibition Driving

---

Tyre and brake warming and exhibition driving maneuvers are forbidden anywhere outside of active special stages, unless expressly permitted in the road book. This prohibition will be in effect from the beginning of Administrative Checks and until the publication of the Final Classification, covering the days of the Rally, Recce and Ceremonial Start. This includes, but is not limited to: the service park, road sections, ceremonial areas, control areas and regroupings. Violations will be referred to the Stewards.

## 12.9. Official Time used during the Rally

---

### Start Intervals

---

The minimum start intervals between all cars from the start of Section 1, and for the remainder of the rally, will be 2 minutes.



---

## Time Zone

The official time throughout the rally will be that of the GPS satellite constellation. The time zone is US Eastern Daylight Time (GMT -4).

---

## 12.10. Media Activities

There will be a “Meet and Greet” and Pre-Event Party at Chattanooga Whiskey Co. for Stakeholders on Thursday 13th of June, 2024 at 21:00. All drivers will be required to attend and sign autographs for Stakeholders and VIP guests. Co-drivers are exempted from attending.

Post-rally scrutineering will be held on Sunday June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024 starting at 21:00 hrs in the Chattanooga Whiskey Riverfront parking lot.

Those crews selected by the Stewards for final scrutineering will be notified by the Clerk of the Course and are required to move their cars to the Scrutineering Area and provide the proper equipment and technicians.

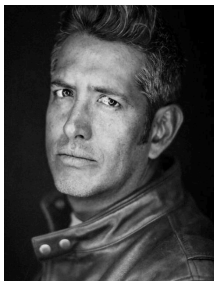

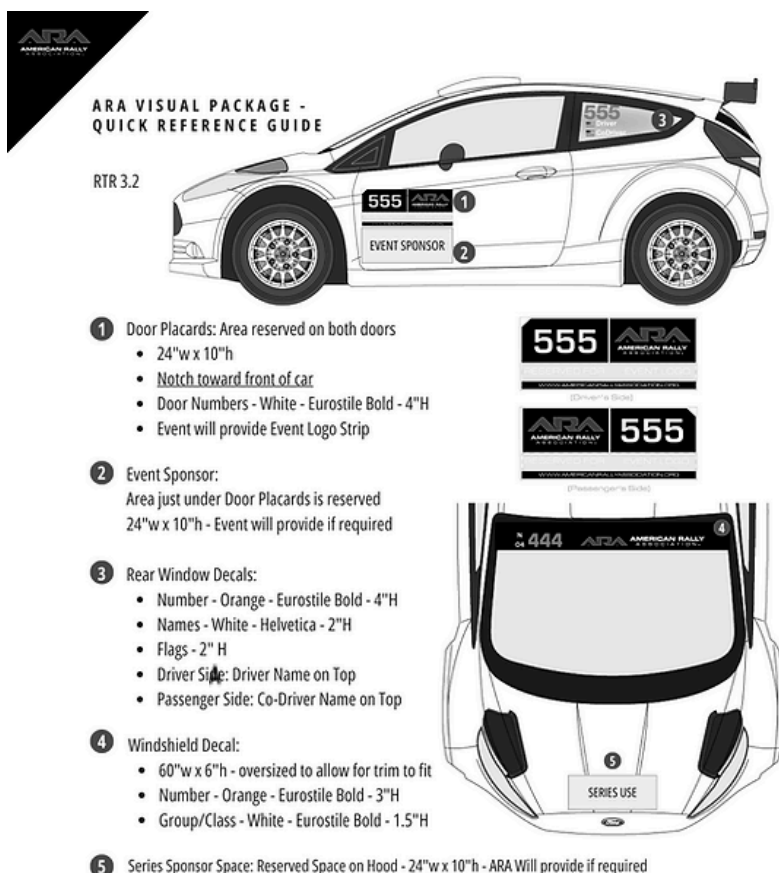

## APPENDIX 5 - SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

In addition to 2024 ARA Rally Technical Rules Art.1-compliant safety equipment, competitors will be allowed to use 2024 FIA International Sporting Code Appendix L Chapter III-compliant safety equipment, at the discretion of the Chief Scrutineer.

Safety equipment means helmets, frontal head restraint (FHR), safety belts, flame-resistant clothing comprising overalls, gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, balaclavas, socks and shoes homologated to the aforementioned standards.
