1. Introduction

This document has no regulatory power – for information only. It will not be distributed in printed form.

The **Sno*Drift Rally** is the 2023 ARA National Championship's premier winter rally. Montmorency County, the towns of Atlanta, Hillman and Lewiston and the area businesses warmly welcome the event.

Access to the Leg 2 Service Area at the Atlanta High School is limited to credentialed participants.

Parcs Exposé and designated spectator areas are open to the public.

The competition itinerary includes 15 stages totaling \sim 120 miles of recently plowed winter stage roads as part of a \sim 260 total mile route. The route is compact and takes place entirely within a 20 x 25 mile rectangular grid with a single, central service location.

7. Tires

7.1 Tires must comply with the current ARA Rally Technical Rules. Studded tires are not allowed.

8. Fuel

- 8.1 Competitors are required to supply/purchase their own fuel and must comply with the fuel requirements noted in the ARA rules.
- 8.2 VP fuel will be available for pre-purchase and delivered on location and must be ordered at least 2 weeks before the event. Details are found at https://www.americanrallyassociation.org/contingency on the ARA web site.
- 8.3 Pre-ordered VP fuel is expected to be available for pickup at the Atlanta School Bus garage during Scrutineering on Thursday. Fuel will not be secured overnight you should plan to pick it up that afternoon.

9. Reconnaissance (recce)

Drivers and co-drivers must check in at the event prior to participating in recce. Wednesday evening is the preferred time; Late arrivals have an opportunity at 8:30 am Thursday morning; Later arrivals may check in beginning Thursday afternoon.

Check in is quick. The driver and co-driver should present themselves together and will need to supply a brief description (make, model and color) and license number of the recce vehicle. A recce ID sticker will be provided for application to the vehicle's front window.

Recce Particulars:

- The speed limit on stages during recce is 30 mph and will be monitored with the 2022 ARA recce tracking system. Speeding penalties will be assessed per ARA RCR 1.2.1.g.
- Vehicles used for recce must be normal street vehicles with no lettering or advertising which would call
 undue attention to the vehicle; exhausts must be quiet. No prepared rally cars will be allowed. A 4WD
 vehicle or vehicle with snow tires is highly recommended. The Clerk of the Course shall be the arbiter
 of the suitability of all reconnaissance vehicles.
- An upcoming Bulletin will be issued with any additional rules beyond those in the Supplemental Regulations and the ARA RCRs.

Recce Planning:

- Leg 1 stages are open for recce only on Thursday and Leg 2 stages are open for recce both Thursday and Friday at the times noted in the Program.
- See Appendix 6 for the CoC's suggestions in planning an efficient recce.

10. Check In / Registration

All participants should register, check in and receive their credentials prior to entering any areas that are part of the event.

ARA has emailed an entry and registration checklist to teams. See Appendix 6. Prior to Monday, February 5th one member of each team must visit the noted site and complete team registration. There is a limit of 6 crew members including the crew's chief (who must be identified) for each entered car.

Check in for teams and officials is at the Senior Center. Volunteer check-in is via a hybrid system with some checking in at the Senior Center and others at their initial stage pickup point. Volunteers will be notified of their check-in process.

11. Scrutineering

Scrutineering will be held at the Atlanta School Bus Garage during the times listed in the program by appointment. The layout is detailed in Appendix 3. Only credentialed ARA officials, Sno*Drift officials, and one competitor car presenter for each vehicle are allowed in the scrutineering area.

All teams must request a Thursday Scrutineering appointment by sending a simple email to Jeff and Barb Harty at: abs2048@gmail.com no later than Wednesday February 1st 2023.

Requests MUST include the name of presenter and a cell number of the presenter along with the time slot (i.e. 2-3 pm, 3-4 pm, etc) requested during the hours listed in supplemental regs. Friday appointments are unavailable except in the case of extenuating circumstances.

All requests will receive a reply email confirming the tech appointment requested.

Any competitor teams that have not requested a tech time will be assigned a time slot for tech after February 2nd to be posted in a bulletin.

All required event stickers and identification are to be in place when arriving at scrutineering.

- Competitor ID packages, including ARA door panels, series sponsor's decals, windshield decals, and number packages are expected to be of a new design for 2023. Contact ara@ara-rally.com for further information.
- Sno*Drift event sponsor stickers may be provided at check in. Teams wishing to opt out of the event sponsor advertising may do so within the provisions of item 6.2 in the Supplementary Regulations.

ID materials and event sponsor decals must be applied to the satisfaction of the Scrutineer. <u>Teams will not pass scrutineering without all such items properly installed on the vehicle.</u>

RallySafe tracking and timing units will be distributed during scrutineering. Teams should ensure the car is prepped for the RallySafe console prior to arriving at scrutineering. Any pre-ordered rental fitting kits will be provided at check in.

Teams that do not complete the first leg and intend to restart Leg 2 must be re-inspected prior to the restart by making an appointment with the Chief Scrutineer. His cell is 260-579-3959.

12. Service

The service route indicating allowed and restricted locations and times for all service crew members was published in Attachment 1 of Bulletin 3 (copy included at the end of this Guide). A minimal set of printed

service instructions will be provided at check in. Crews should make plans to have the Rally Guide reference material handy.

Leg 1 is less than 90 miles and will have no service. There will be a regrouping/technical zone midway through Leg 1 to ensure the field is bunched and to allow drivers and co-drivers a short break. Service crew members are not allowed in the regrouping zone unless specifically requested by an event official to assist in a technical inspection.

Leg 2 Service will be at the Atlanta High School. The school will be open. There are restrooms available and a limited offering of breakfast and lunch items in the cafeteria. The concessions on Saturday are a fund raiser for the senior class so please be generous in your purchases.

The layout of the service area is shown in Appendix 3. Service spots are \sim 20 x 45 ft. Oversize or extra, adjacent spots may be available for purchase for \$200 each. Lots A and B have National entry priority.

Teams using a trailer in service or desiring <u>extra or oversize service spots or special adjacencies</u> to other teams need to:

- a) Email the Service Area Chief (joepoz@yahoo.com) by Sunday, February 5 and make their specific needs clear.
- b) Ensure that any oversize or extra service spot payments have been received by the Event Registrar.

Service assignments will be communicated to competitors on Tuesday, February 7th and will include specific load in times so that the maneuvering of the big rigs can be facilitated.

Trailers used for servicing are allowed in the service area provided they fit within your assigned service spot. If you don't need your trailer for service, please leave it at your motel, or use a drop off lot outside the main service area.

Crews needing to offload their competition car should do so outside the service area proper. There is a large lot south of the Atlanta School that may be used for offloading.

Service area ingress, egress and internal traffic is to be minimized. Only official, competing and service vehicles in possession of an access pass are allowed entry into the driveways at the school. All occupants must be credentialed. Service vehicle traffic in and out of the service area may be prohibited at times while the service area is active. The Service Area speed limit is 15 mph.

Pedestrian access to the school grounds is limited to persons with event credentials.

13. Testing and Shakedown

The Wednesday group testing activity noted in the Supplementary Regulations still has some open spots.

Shakedown stage participation is optional for all crews. Teams planning to participate need to sign up during competitor check in.

Multiple passes are allowed. Participants are limited to the entered crew with full safety equipment in their competition vehicle, which must have passed scrutineering and have the RallySafe console operational.

The Shakedown stage is a good opportunity to check out the car and the team members -- controls will operate the same as those in the competition.

14. Procedures of the Rally

The Atlanta Parcs Exposé are located in the Briley Township Park. Entry is from the intersection of Park and West streets. Do not attempt to enter from M 32. See the layout map in Appendix 3.

Plans are for the national teams to check in between 14:30 and 15:00 and the regional teams between 15:00 and 15:30 on Friday. On Saturday plans are national check in from 9:40 to 10:00 and regional check in from 10:00 to 10:20. A future Bulletin will provide official instructions and include any other Leg 1 and Leg 2 detailed start procedures (TC 0 and TC 6B).

The designated Power Stage is SS 15. TC 6A and TC 15A are designated as Main Time Controls and allow competitors to check in early per ARA RCR 5.3.14.

To be classified as a finisher teams must start Leg 1 and complete Leg 2 in its entirety. Teams that do not complete Leg 1 must Restart After Retirement in accordance with ARA RCR 6.3 on Leg 2 to be eligible to be classified as a finisher.

At the Service Park finish RallySafe consoles and rental installation kits will be collected immediately following TC 14A for regional teams and TC 15A for national teams. Finishers will then proceed immediately to the finish Parc Fermé where they will park and exit the area.

Final checks for selected vehicles will be conducted at the Atlanta School Bus Garage, adjacent to the service area.

Official time is Eastern Standard Time as verified by GPS.

Officials will be identified by their credential card displayed on a lanyard. Marshals will have an orange vest in addition to their credential card and lanyard.







ORCHARD - SHORELINE







Recce travel on stages must only be in the correct stage direction for all stages **except SS 14**. Two-way travel is permitted on SS 14 to allow an efficient 2nd pass. You are not allowed a 3rd pass on SS 14. Recce on SS 14 must be done recognizing the likely two-way traffic.

Efficient recce segments:

South Loop:

- SS 1, SS 2, SS 9, SS 3.
- Total travel around the loop from Atlanta is 33 transit and 25 stage miles.
- Time to complete this loop is ~110 minutes at recce speeds.

North Loop:

- SS 7, SS 14, SS 8
- Total travel around the loop from M-32 and Thornton Rd is 10 transit and 32 stage miles.
- Time to complete this loop is ~90 minutes at recce speeds.

River Thunder Recce:

- 25 miles from Atlanta via M-33 north, Co 624 east, Co 459 and Co 628.
- Travel the stage, U-turn and drive back to the start, repeat the stage. From there take Co 628 west to M-33 and return to Atlanta.
- Allow ~ 120 minutes to travel from and return to Atlanta including 2 passes of the stage.

CoC 2 Pass Recommendation:

- Thursday Make two loops of the south stages followed by one or two loops of the north stages.
- Friday Start with two passes of SS 14 and then spend the remaining time on SS 7-13. You are not allowed to recce SS 1-6 on Friday.

12.3 Service crew movement during the competition is authorized only as indicated in **Attachment 1** to this Bulletin. Unauthorized travel may subject teams to penalties noted in RCR 7.1.10 and 6.4.6.

- 14.14 Competitors who are permanently retiring from the competition are required to complete and submit a Sno*Drift Permanent Retirement slip (found in the Route Book) to Scoring, Clerk of the Course, a Time Control or Sweep Team and hand in their ARA provided equipment.
- 14.15 Competitors who have missed one or more controls and are Restarting After Retirement or rejoining under other circumstances must file a request using the Sportity online inquiry system. The Clerk of the Course and Chief Scrutineer will verify that the team has any required tracking or monitoring equipment and meets the safety requirements before authorizing re-entry.
- 14.16 The Atlanta School property is a drug and alcohol-free zone. Sno*Drift participants are prohibited from the display or consumption of alcohol while on the property. As such the finishers' podium ceremonies will be conducted with alcohol-free champagne for the spray.
