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1. Introduction

- 1.1. The **Sno*Drift Rally** is the 2023 ARA National Championship's premier winter rally. The event also includes the **Sno*Drift** regional rally.
- 1.2 **Sno*Drift** will be run in accordance with ARA General Competition Rules, Rally Competition Rules, Technical Rules and Bulletins, as supplemented by these regulations. The ARA rules and Series Bulletins can be found at https://www.americanrallyassociation.org/rulesandbulletins

Modifications, amendments and/or changes to these Supplementary Regulations will be announced only by numbered and dated Bulletins published using the Sportity App. All Bulletins become an integral part of these regulations.

- 1.3 All stages are on unpaved surfaces and are expected to be snow covered and/or icy. Stages will be plowed prior to the rally although recent light snow may not be cleared. Studded tires are not allowed.
- 1.4 The national competition itinerary includes 15 stages totaling $^{\sim}$ 120 miles of winter stage roads as part of a $^{\sim}$ 260 total mile route. The route is compact and takes place entirely within a 20 x 25 mile rectangular grid with a single, central service location.
- 1.5 The regional competition ends after 14 of the 15 stages. This will allow the regional results and podium ceremonies to be completed before the national entries finish their competition.

4. Entries

4.1 Entry and payment must be paid via credit card online at http://rallylicense.com. ARA will send an email blast to ARA license holders announcing the opening of online entries. You may contact ara@ara-rally.com for issues with the online entry system

Rally participants must be either ARA licensed (competitors, their crew members, media, officials) or registered as a volunteer on the ARA web site. There is a limit of 6 service crew members for each entry.

- 4.2 A 60 car limit will be employed with 5 reserved for the top 5 ARA 2022 National Championship Drivers until the end of Regular entries and the others allotted based on order of full payment.
- 4.3 Entry fees are as follows:

A limited number of extra or oversize service areas are available at a cost of \$200 each. National competitors may order Jemba notes for \$100.

- 4.4 Entry fees include printed items per RCR 3.1 and 7.1.5, recce participation, use of a single service spot and RallySafe tracking and timing. Regional entries will receive a set of Jemba stage notes for their own use as part of their entry.
- 4.5 New for 2023, ARA entrants may revise or withdraw their entry prior to the closing date by completing a withdrawal form available on the Sportity App. Once entries close withdrawals and entry revisions are actioned by filing an inquiry.
- 4.6 Withdrawn entries will be refunded in accordance with ARA GCR 4.9.
 - Prior to 23:59 EST on 1/22/2023 full refund
 - After 23:59 EST on 1/22/2023 and until 23:59 EST on 2/5/2003 full refund less \$150.
 - After 23:59 EST on 2/5/2003 no refund.
 - If the event is cancelled a full refund will be issued.

5. Insurance

- 5.1 Third party liability insurance covering bodily injury and property damage, effective during the competition, will be provided by a policy secured by ARA and displayed on the Official Notice Board.
- 5.2 Competitors, service crew members and all event participants including officials, marshals, staff, stewards and all other volunteers who have obtained an ARA license, signed an ARA waiver and have been issued and are in possession of an event wristband confirming the signature of the waiver will be covered by a secondary ARA participant accident insurance policy which covers excess medical expenses to their primary medical insurance provider.

6. Advertising and Identification

6.1 Vehicles must comply with ARA Rally Technical Rule 3.2 – Identification of Vehicles and Crew.

6.2 **Sno*Drift** will use the event sponsor advertising space allowed by the current ARA rules. Teams may refuse the rally sponsor's advertising by contacting the registrar and paying a \$1000 fee. All ARA series advertising must be properly displayed on competition cars.

7. Tires

7.1 Tires must comply with the current ARA Rally Technical Rules. Studded tires are not allowed.

8. Fuel

- 8.1 Competitors are required to supply/purchase their own fuel and must comply with the fuel requirements noted in the ARA rules.
- 8.2 VP fuel will be available for pre-purchase and delivered on location and must be ordered at least 2 weeks before the event. Details are found at https://www.americanrallyassociation.org/contingency on the ARA web site.
- 8.3 Distribution of fuel at the rally will be detailed in the Rally Guide.

9. Reconnaissance (recce)

- 9.1 Drivers and co-drivers must check in at the event prior to participating in recce. There is adequate time for 2 pass recce on all stages. Teams will have flexibility in their recce schedule but some stages will have specific access times.
- 9.2 Recce Particulars:
 - The speed limit on stages during recce is 30 mph and will be monitored with the 2023 ARA RSLite recce tracking system. Speeding penalties will be assessed per ARA RCR 1.2.1.g.
 - All recce roads will be open to the public including snow plows, school buses, mail trucks and the county sheriff. Inconsiderate or irresponsible driving may result in exclusion from the event.
 - Vehicles used for recce must be normal street vehicles with no lettering or advertising which would call undue
 attention to the vehicle; exhausts must be quiet. No prepared rally cars will be allowed. A 4WD vehicle or vehicle
 with snow tires is highly recommended. The CoC shall be the arbiter of the suitability of all reconnaissance
 vehicles.
 - A Bulletin will be issued February 2, 2023 detailing any additional recce rules, which have the same force as these Regulations.

10. Check In / Registration

- 10.1 All team members attending the event must be designated by the team's key contact by Sunday, February 6. Waivers will be executed online as part of the licensing process. Check in at the event will involve scanning the individuals' licenses and issuing event credentials during the Check In times noted in Section 3.
- 10.2 All aspects of event registration are to be conducted online no later than Sunday, February 5. The following items are verified during online registration:
- Driver and Co-driver ARA competition licenses and valid driving licenses
- Competition vehicle registration
- Service crew member ARA licenses
- Registration of all service vehicles

10.3 All participants (competitors, service personnel and volunteers, (including any minors) must have signed up for a license at http://rallylicense.com

11. Scrutineering

- 11.1 Scrutineering will be held at the Atlanta School Bus Garage during the times listed in the program by appointment only. Information for scheduling appointments will be distributed on January 16, 2023 in the Rally Guide.
- 11.2 Driver's safety equipment and competition vehicles must comply with the ARA Rally Technical Rules available at www.americanrallyassociation.org.
- 11.3 Per ARA RCR 9.3.1, all event required stickers and identification are to be in place when arriving at scrutineering. Competitor ID packages, including ARA door panels, series sponsor's decals, windshield decals, and number packages must be purchased in advance. Event stickers will be provided at team check-in.

ID materials and event sponsor decals must be applied to the satisfaction of the Scrutineer. <u>Teams will not pass</u> scrutineering without all such items properly installed on the vehicle.

- 11.4 Only credentialed ARA officials, Sno*Drift officials, and one car presenter for each vehicle are allowed in the scrutineering area. There will be no logbooks issued at this event.
- 11.5 Teams that do not complete the first leg and intend to restart Leg 2 must be re-inspected prior to the restart by making an appointment with the Chief Scrutineer. His cell is 260-579-3959.
- 11.6 The rally will use the RallySafe tracking and timing system as detailed at www.americanrallyassociation.org/rally-safe. Units will be distributed during scrutineering. Teams must provide for the fitting. If needed, rental RallySafe fitting kits are \$40 each; they must be ordered and paid for during online entry.

12. Service

- 12.1 Standard service spots are 20' wide by at least 45' long. The Friday competition is less than 90 miles and has no service opportunities. The Saturday competition has multiple service opportunities.
- 12.2 Teams desiring extra or oversize service spots or special adjacencies to other teams need to:
 - a) Email the Service Area Chief (joepoz@yahoo.com) by Friday, February 3 and make their specific needs clear.
 - b) Ensure that any oversize or extra service spot payments have been received by the Event Registrar. Complete service details will be published in the Rally Guide on January 16, 2023.

13. Shakedown and Testing

- 13.1 Shakedown stage participation is optional for all crews. Multiple passes are allowed. Participants are limited to the entered crew with full safety equipment in their competition vehicle, which must have passed scrutineering.
- 13.2 Two group test sessions on a closed road representative of Sno*Drift stage surfaces will be available to interested competitors on Wednesday, February 8 -- a morning session from 8:30 AM to 12:00 PM, and an afternoon session from 1:00 PM to 4:30 PM. Sessions cost \$200 per car and can be scheduled on a first paid, first served basis once a team's entry is paid for in full. Contact the Event Registrar to arrange scheduling and payment.
- 13.3 Practice or testing on any Montmorency County <u>public</u> road is forbidden for a period of 90 days prior to and 30 days following the 2023 Sno*Drift Rally, other than the test sessions of 13.1, 13.2, and 13.5.

Teams found in violation will be barred from starting or excluded from finishing Sno*Drift and their entry fees will not be refunded.

Participation in the shakedown stage and/or event reconnaissance during their scheduled times is not considered a violation.

- 13.4 Any practice or testing on a <u>private</u> road or facility within the above-noted boundaries and dates must be conducted with the written permission of the property owner. The CoC is to be given 48 hours advance notice of any such arrangements, including a copy of the permit and contact information for the property owner(s).
- 13.5 Teams desiring a <u>private</u> test session should contact the event Chairman. There are a small number of private test sessions that can be made available on February 8 if desired.

14. Procedures of the Rally

- 14.1 Parc Exposé locations and Leg 1 and Leg 2 specific start procedures (TC 0 and TC 7B) will be issued in a Bulletin.
- 14.2 All control operations will be conducted per section 4 of the ARA Rally Competition Rules and employ RallySafe consoles and tablets.
- 14.3 Stage starts will be counted down by the RallySafe console and monitored by the start marshal and RallySafe regarding jump starts.
- 14.4 Official time is Eastern Standard Time as verified by GPS.
- 14.5 The rally will not have a Super Special stage. The designated National Power Stage is SS 15. It is planned for competitors to run the Power Stage with an extra gap minute.
- 14.6 TC 6A and TC 15A are designated as Main Time Controls and allow competitors to check in early per ARA RCR 5.3.14.
- 14.7 The holding area between Regrouping In and Regrouping Out controls is also a Technical Zone.
- 14.8 To be classified as a finisher teams must start Leg 1 and complete Leg 2 in its entirety. Teams that do not complete Leg 1 must Restart After Retirement in accordance with ARA RCR 6.3 on Leg 2 to be eligible to be classified as a finisher.
- 14.9 Safety Sweep follows a schedule which precludes assisting teams stopped along the route other than ensuring any medical issues receive prompt attention. Teams stopped in a special stage when safety sweep arrives are required to hand over their time card and retire from competition. Teams that withdraw may Restart After Retirement in accordance with ARA rules or request permission from the CoC to rejoin as a non-competitive entry.
- 14.10 Vehicles will be impounded for final checks immediately following the final Time Control at the Atlanta High School.
- 14.11 Podium Ceremonies for the Regional and National category winners will be conducted adjacent to the event finish at the Atlanta High School.
- 14.12 Sno*Drift will be offering two Sno*Attack competitions with cash purses one for 2WD regional and national entries that elect to participate and another for 4WD regional entries that elect to participate. Details to be announced in a Bulletin.
- 14.13 Officials will be identified by their credential card displayed on a lanyard. Marshals will have an orange vest in addition to their credential card and lanyard.
