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1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 GENERAL

The rally will be run in compliance with FIA International Sporting Code, Estonian Rally General Prescriptions (ERGP), Terminal Estonian Rally Championship Regulations (EC), these Supplementary Regulations and their Appendices. The competition will be run under the national traffic laws or if these Supplementary Regulations are stipulating otherwise, the above-mentioned rules and guidelines apply.

Changes to the Supplementary Regulations will be announced to all crews by numbered and dated bulletins issued by the Organiser or the Stewards.

FIA International Sporting Code is published on www.fia.com. The Estonian Rally General Prescriptions, Estonian Rally Championship Regulations and Technical Regulations and their appendices are published on uus.autosport.ee and Estonian Rally Championship Sportity channel (password: RallyEST).

The Supplementary Regulations are published in Estonian and in English. In case of different interpretations, the Estonian version applies. If the competition does not take place due to national restrictions or a small number of participants, the crews will be notified no later than Saturday, January 25.

4 ENTRIES

4.1 CLOSING TIME OF ENTRIES

The registration of the competitors ends on Friday, 24th January 2025 at 23:59.

4.2 ENTRY PROCEDURE

- The Competitors must register and fill in the electronic entry form published on the 06th January 2025 on the website <https://uus.autosport.ee/sport/ralli/> and submit the duly completed entry form before the closing time of entries. **A correct and working email address is mandatory!**
- Entries must be submitted in accordance with the EC Art. 22 - 24 and the FIA International Sporting Code Art. 3.8 - 3.14.
- An entry application will be accepted after the payment of the total entry fee.

Crews or their representatives sign the entry form during the Document Checks. Crews must present their valid competitor's license. A change of competitor is allowed until the closing time of entries. Only the competitor entered in the event will be allowed to make this request.

By signing the entry form, the Competitor allows to publish the information mentioned in the entry application in the media.

According to the International Sporting Code Art. 3.8.1 an entry compels the competitor to take part in the Competition in which they have been accepted to run, except in case of duly established *Force Majeure*. A





Competitor who has submitted the entry application but is not able to participate in the rally, must inform the Organizer in written format at the latest by Monday 27th January 2025. The non-notification will be reported to the Stewards for the application of penalties.

4.3 NUMBER OF COMPETITORS ACCEPTED AND ELIGIBLE CLASSES

4.3.1 Number of the Competitors

The maximum number of entries is 90. The Clerk of the Course may increase the number of cars permitted to start. Upon reaching the specified number of entries, the Organizer reserves the sole right to decide which entries will be accepted.

VAT is payable by all Competitors, except those from another EU member state who supply their VAT number with their entry.

Competitors who refuse to carry Organizer's optional advertising (see Appendix 4) must pay doubled amount of the entry fee. Starting numbers and advertising on the rally plate is compulsory and cannot be refused.

Reconnaissance only up to 18 years old juniors according to ERC regulations Art. 7.3.

4.4.1 EC competitors must pay extra entry fee **40 eur** if they want to collect Estonian SprintRally Cup points.

4.5 PAYMENT DETAILS

4.6 REFUNDS

The entry fee will be refunded in full only:

- In case of the rally not taking place due to the fault of the Organizer;
- To candidates whose entry has not been accepted.

The Organizer may partially refund entry fees:

- In case the rally does not take place due to *Force Majeure* - 75% refund.





The Organizer may partially refund the entry fee if a competitor cannot take part in the event due to a duly proved case of *Force Majeure*.

4.7 LIMITATION FOR COMPETITORS WITH RUSSIAN AND BELARUSIAN CITIZENSHIP

According to the Estonian Autosport Union boards decision (02.03.2022) competitors with Russian and Belarusian citizenship are not allowed to participate (uus.autosport.ee).

5 INSURANCE

5.1 INSURANCE COVER FOR THE ORGANIZER

5.1.1 Organizer's liability insurance

EASU visa includes liability insurance covering damage caused to a third party during the competition up to 500 000 EUR. Deductible is 1000 EUR.

Insurer: AB "Lietuvos draudimas" Estonian branch (PZU)

Insurance period: from 01.02.2024 until 31.01.2025

Policy No: 5193645490

5.1.2 Damage caused to a third party

A part of the insurance with AB „Lietuvos Draudimas“, policy No 5193645490 is coverage for damages caused to a third party. However, damages caused by drivers among themselves are not covered by this contract. During the competition, the Estonian Traffic Insurance Act applies outside of special stages.

5.2 INTERNATIONAL GREEN CARD

All crews must hand in a compulsory motor vehicle insurance policy or International Green Card for their car at the pre-event Scrutineering. Without these cards, the crew will not be permitted to start.

5.3 INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR COMPETITORS AND CREWS

All the drivers and co-drivers are obliged to arrange their own accident insurance. The proof should be documented on request at the Document Checks. By signing the entry form, the competitors and/or drivers relinquish any claims to compensations of any kind which might result due to incidents. The relinquishment is applied to FIA, ASN, the Organizer, Officials and other competitors and/or drivers.

5.4 DAMAGE REPORTING

The crews are obliged to notify the Organizer by email (marko@rallyotepaa.ee) about any damage caused on the special stages by their car by the end of event the latest. Violation of this duty will cause the competitor and involved crew to be summoned to a Rally Commission of the EASU.

5.5 INSURANCE COVERAGE EXCLUSIONS

Auxiliary vehicles, reconnaissance cars and vehicles with special plates issued by the Organizer, as well as vehicles with the markings of Organizer's officials, are not covered by the provided rally insurance (except for insured Organizer's cars) and those are always going on their own responsibility.

5.6 DAMAGE COVERAGE EXCLUSIONS

The Organizer refuses from any liability for damage that has been caused by a participant due to unsportsmanlike behaviour regarding rally regulations and these Supplementary Regulations or the State Law. In case of a road traffic accident involving a service car, a reconnaissance car or an official's car with rally plates only car owner's third-person's liability insurance policies are valid.





6 IDENTIFICATION AND ADVERTISING

6.1 COMPETITION NUMBERS

Competition numbers, rally plate and the Organizer's advertising should be affixed on the rally car according to the Appendix 4 of these Supplementary Regulations prior to the pre-event Scrutineering.

6.2 LOSS OR REMOVAL OF ADVERTISING

A crew will be penalised with refusal to start the rally if Art. 6.1 of these Supplementary Regulations will have been violated. If it is ascertained at any point during the rally that an advertisement or sticker supplied by the Organizer is missing from a car, then the crew shall be penalised with a fine of 100 EUR for each missing or modified advertisement or if the advertisement is not affixed according to Appendix 4 of these Supplementary Regulations. Competitor must affix advertising and identifications on the car according to regulations.

6.3 COMPETITION NUMBERS AND RALLY PLATES

Competition numbers and rally plates supplied by the Organiser must appear on both front doors of the car during the whole rally according to the Art. 27 of Estonian Rally General Prescriptions. If it is ascertained at any time during the event that:

- a competition number or one rally plate is missing, this will be penalised by 300 EUR.
- both competition numbers or both rally plates are missing, this will be reported to the Stewards.

7 TYRES

7.1 ELIGIBLE TYRES DURING THE EVENT

The number of tyres is not limited. All tyres used during the rally must be readily commercially available and must comply with Art. 13 of Estonian Rally General Prescriptions. Any infringement to this rule will be reported to the Stewards. **Only spike tires are allowed.**

The following tires (stud tires) are permitted in classes EMV1-EMV8:

- Pirelli WJ / WJA / WJB / WJC 185/65R15 studded 7mm
- Pirelli J1 / J1A / J1B / J1C 205/65R15 studded 7mm
- Competitors must use the specified tires. Additional sizes or stud lengths may not be used. Tires may be used and there is no limit to the number of tires used

7.2 PERMITTED WHEELS

The number of wheels is not limited. The use of wheels larger than 15" is prohibited (except in classification class GAZ).

7.3 TYRES USED FOR RECONNAISSANCE

Tyres used on recce cars must be in conformity with Estonian Traffic Act. Sports tyres and racing tyres are prohibited. Any infringements will be reported to the Stewards and will result in penalty up to disqualification from the competition.





8 FUEL

8.1 FUEL RESTRICTIONS

Fuel must comply with FIA specifications (J 252 Art. 9). Bioethanol E85 is allowed only in national classes EMV5 - GAZ (2WD and 4WD) and Lada EMV. Rally cars must be marked with blue E85 sticker.

8.2 REFUELLING

Refuelling is only allowed in the service area. During the refuel only the refuelling is refuelling of the rally car is allowed, any other activities with a rally car are not allowed (Parc Fermé rules apply).

8.3 REFUELLING PROCEDURE

During refuelling a liquid proof mat has to be used. During refueling, only crew members and support staff (up to 2 people per car) are responsible for fire safety. All refueling crew members must wear clothing that provides adequate protection against fire and includes at least long trousers, a long-sleeved shirt, closed shoes, gloves and balaclavas. Tent doors must be open. All tent heaters must be shut down. Rallycar must be on the ground and movable. Unrelated people must be on the other side of rallycar. In the service area must be 2 fire extinguishers (6kg). Competitors must be out of the race car during refueling, in addition, it is forbidden to use a mobile phone during refueling (including taking photos and videos) Violation of the refueling rules will result in a fine of EUR 100 for each mistake.

9 RECONNAISSANCE

9.1 RECONNAISSANCE REGISTRATION

Registration of reconnaissance cars is mandatory. The information can be submitted together with the entry form or sent to the secretary of the rally (karin@autosport.ee). The information of the reconnaissance cars must be submitted before the start of the Document Checks, no later than Friday 31st January 2025 at 08:00. During the reconnaissance the registered reconnaissance cars will be checked.

If during the reconnaissance the team changes the reconnaissance car for any reason, it must inform the secretary of the rally (+372 5560 9882) and provide new information about the recce car.

The crew will receive identification for their car (2 stickers). This sticker must be affixed on the windscreen and rear windscreen during reconnaissance at all times. Should the recce car change during the reconnaissance, the crew has to reattach the same sticker to the new recce car.





9.2 GPS SAFETY TRACKING SYSTEM

The Organiser will provide each crew with a GPS safety tracking system. The device will be handed out at the Document Checks, and it must be used in the reconnaissance car during reconnaissance and in the rally car. Competitors must install the GPS device in the reconnaissance car before the start of reconnaissance for speed monitoring and security purposes. More information about installation is provided upon receipt of the device. If the GPS tracking system is not used, it will be considered a breach of the reconnaissance regulations. The progress of the reconnaissance will be monitored via the GPS system by the Estonian Police together with rally officials. Evaluation of the GPS data is within the competence of Clerk of the Course. If it will be observed that the reconnaissance vehicle is not equipped with a working tracking system, the crew will be penalized according to the Stewards decision.

9.3 RECONNAISSANCE SCHEDULE

For reconnaissance schedule see Appendix 2.

9.4 RECONNAISSANCE RULES

9.4.1 Reconnaissance

The crews are obliged to follow all reconnaissance rules specified in the Estonian Rally General Prescriptions, Terminal Estonian Rally Championship 2025 Regulations and these Supplementary Regulations.

Reconnaissance will be organised in compliance with Art. 35 of the ERGP and only series production cars conforming to Art. 31.1.2. of FIA RRSR may be used. The car may be painted in multiple colours.

Anti-cutting devices will be used to avoid cutting. These devices will be in place or marked on track before the reconnaissance.

9.4.2 Speed limit

The maximum speed set for reconnaissance at the Special Stages is 80km/h, unless lower speed limit is imposed by traffic signs (50km/h or 30km/h) marked in the Road Book or additional signs placed by the Organizer.

Violating the rules and exceeding the speed limits on public roads will also be fixed and fined by the Estonian Police according to Estonian Traffic Act.

9.4.3 Direction

Each crew may drive the special stages only in the direction of the rally. The crews must always enter the special stages through the start control and leave the special stages through the stop control.

9.4.4 Restriction of reconnaissance

Drivers, competitors, and their representatives are strictly forbidden to visit any road which is or might be used as a Special Stage after publishing of Supplementary Regulations. Failure to respect this rule shall result in the driver being reported to the Stewards.

9.4.5 Number of passages

Recce is permitted maximum 2 passages on each Special Stage. Special Stages run twice are considered to be one Special Stage. Drivers under the age of 21 (year of birth 2004 or later) are allowed 3 passages on each Special Stage.

9.4.6 Number of persons on board

During each passage through a Special Stage, a maximum of 2 persons (the crew) are permitted in the car.

9.4.7 Speeding

Speeding will be penalized by Clerk of the Course according to Art. 34.3.4* of ERGP as follows – per km per hour over the speed limit: all drivers 25 EUR.





9.4.8 Radar detection equipment

The fitting or carrying of radar detection equipment during reconnaissance is not permitted.

9.4.9 Penalties for violating reconnaissance rules

Violation of the reconnaissance rules may be penalised by the Clerk of the Course or Stewards with a fine or refusal to start.

10 ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

Mandatory pre-registration for Administrative Checks will take place on the website from Monday, 06th January at 16:00 until Friday, 24th January 2025 at 23:59.

The detailed schedule for Administrative Checks will be published on the Sportity application on Tuesday, 28th January 2025 at 16:00.

The following documents must be presented at the Administrative Checks:

- Valid competitor's license;
- Valid driver's and co-driver's competition licenses;
- Valid driver's and co-driver's passport or ID card (mandatory for all foreign competitors);
- Valid driver's and co-driver's driving licenses;
- ASN authorisation (mandatory for all foreign competitors);
- Valid personal accident insurance (for non-EU drivers);
- Payment proof for the entry fee;
- Contact phone number.

Details concerning the co-driver can be specified until the end of the Administrative Checks.

11 SCRUTINEERING, TYRE MARKING AND SEALING

11.1 SCRUTINEERING AND SCHEDULE

The detailed schedule for pre-rally Scrutineering will be published on the Sportity application on Tuesday, 28th January 2025. Any competitor taking part in the rally, or their representative must arrive at the Scrutineering and present the car in accordance with the schedule to be issued in a Bulletin.

11.1.1 Documents to be presented at Scrutineering

Vehicle's registration document;

- Vehicle's traffic insurance Policy or Green Card;





- Vehicle's ASN technical passport and homologation books with extensions for cars of groups A, R and N;
- Safety equipment declaration can be downloaded from Sportity application from ERC channel (password: RallyEST) or available for download at <https://uus.autosport.ee/litsents/>.

11.1.2 Technical card

The technical card of the car will be deposited at the scrutineering and will be returned in Parc Fermé at the end of the rally. The card is kept by the scrutineers. A competitor who retires and will not present the car to the scrutineers (Estonian Rally General Prescriptions Art. 53.3.9*) concerning the display of the car will receive their technical card from the ASN after specifying the circumstances of the retirement and imposing a possible penalty. No duplicate card will be issued to them.

11.2 MUD FLAPS

Transversal mud flaps are mandatory and must comply with Appendix J Article 252.7.7.

11.2.1 In technical scrutineering it is allowed to use gravel tyres or winter tyres conform with the Estonian Traffic Act. The use of spike tyres is not allowed.

11.3 WINDOWS

The use of silver or tinted films is allowed only on rear side windows and rear window and must comply with Appendix J Article 253.11.1.1.

11.4 SAFETY EQUIPMENT OF CREWS

Safety equipment of crews must comply with FIA regulations. Additional exemptions resulting from technical regulations are allowed in EMV5 to GAZ classes.

Co-drivers' shoes do not have to comply to FIA Standard 8856-2000 or 8856-2018, but equipment more suitable for the cold conditions may be used.

11.5 NOISE LEVEL

The maximum noise level permitted is 103 dBA. Cars not complying with this rule will not be allowed to start. The noise will be measured with a sonometer set to "A" and "SLOW", placed at an angle of 45 degrees and at the distance of 50 cm from the exhaust outlet, with the car's engine running at 3500 rpm.

11.6 MARKING AND SEALING

Marking of turbochargers will be done during the Scrutineering.

11.7 CAR LIGHTNING

On road sections cars are allowed to use only the originally fitted headlamps with E-homologation. Headlamps without homologation must not be used during road sections. Complying with this provision will be checked by judges of fact. Any infringement will be reported to the Stewards.

11.8 NATIONAL REGULATIONS

Competing vehicles must be equipped with A3 size SOS/OK sign, first aid kit, a reflective triangle, a reflective vest and blinking red/orange light.

12 OTHER PROCEDURES AND REGULATIONS





12.1 SHAKEDOWN

Shakedown information will be published on Tuesday, January 28, 2025.

12.1 START PROCEDURE AND ORDER

12.1.1 Start of the rally

Rally start is on Saturday, 01st February at 10:00 from TC0 (Service Park).

Start interval will be 1 minute for all the cars.

Starting order will be published on the Sportity app and website <https://uus.autosport.ee/sport/ralli/>. First will start Sprintrally competitors.

12.1.2 Start procedure for special stages

The Time Card shall be handed to the crew during the last minute before start.

The electronic start procedure shall be clearly visible to the crew from the start line.

- 30 seconds before the start – 1st blue light switches on
- 15 seconds before the start – 2nd blue light switches on
- 10 seconds before the start – 3rd blue light switches on
- 5 seconds before the start – 1st red light switches on
- 4 seconds before the start – 2nd red light switches on
- 3 seconds before the start – 3rd red light switches on
- 2 seconds before the start – 4th red light switches on
- 1 second before the start – 5th red light switches on
- Start – all red lights switch off

A false start will be registered 50cm ahead of starting line and blue lights start blinking.

12.2 FINISH PROCEDURE

After podium crews are obliged to drive straight to the Parc Fermé. Rally ends with entering the TC 7. The Parc Fermé regulations will be in force until the opening of Parc Fermé, after that the competitors are obliged to remove their cars from the Parc Fermé. All infringements will be reported to the Stewards.

12.3 RETIREMENT PROCEDURE

If a crew retires, they must indicate the reason of retirement to the form in Road Book and return it with the Timecard to the closing car „Green Light” which is equipped with blinking green signal lights and follows the last competitor. In a case of an accident or technical failure at the Special Stage when the competing vehicle stays on the road or less than 3 m from the road the drivers must warn other competitors by placing the reflective triangle not less than 50m from the accident place in a visible place on the same side of the road where the car is located.

Retired crew must IMMEDIATELY inform Rally HQ by phone (+372 5202695) of their retirement reasons.

12.4 RESTART

Any crew which has failed to complete, can re-start the rally from the start of next section.

The Competitor must inform their intention to the Clerk of the Course (communication through the Competitor's Relations Officer) at least one hour prior to the publication of the start list.. For all crews which re-start a time penalty of 5 minutes will be applied for every stage missed. This time penalty will be added to the fastest time of the drivers' class for each missed stage or if it's not available, then the best time of the next slowest class. Should the retirement occur after the last special stage before the overnight regroup, time penalty of 5 minutes will be added to the time of their last special stage.





The car may be repaired at the competitor's discretion, but the car must retain its original body shell and engine block as marked at pre-rally scrutineering. The car must report to Parc Ferme for re- scrutineering on Saturday. The Crew or the Competitor must be present at the re- scrutineering.

According to the EC Art. 9.5.2, crews retired, may use the restart also from the following sections, provided that this is accepted by the Clerk of the Course and the scrutineers. The crew restarting in the middle of the day, is not entitled for Championship points.

The Competitor intending to restart during next section must inform their intention to the Clerk of the Course (communication through the Competitor's Relations Officer) as soon as possible. The final decision is made by the Clerk of the Course after the approval by the Stewards.

12.6 REGROUP

12.6.1 Starting intervals will be corrected resulting from retirements and/or late arrivals before Services A, B and C.

12.7 PERMITTED EARLY CHECK-IN

Early check-in is allowed at TC 7.

12.8 GPS TRACKING SYSTEM

All competitors must make provision in their cars for the installation of the Safety Tracking System. All further details will be given together with the device. Competitor is responsible for installation of the device and fastening the sticker.

Organiser's representatives will check proper installation of the device on Saturday starting from 10:00 in TC0. Competition cars not equipped with the GPS monitoring device will not be allowed to start. Any attempt to tamper with, to manipulate or to interfere with the tracking device fitted to the competition car or any device that hinders the tracking recording by external interference will be reported to the Stewards who may impose a penalty up to disqualification.

The GPS-tracking-system must be returned correctly after entering the Parc Fermé after finish (TC7) or after retirement to the Rally HQ.

12.9 PRINCIPLES OF SAFETY AND TRACKING

Security and tracking devices are connected to a monitoring centre that stores all data received. All data is also stored on the device itself. The device has a self-contained power supply that operates throughout the rally. The device has "SOS" and "OK" buttons. Each device has a unique serial number that is assigned to each crew. During the event the Rally HQ will monitor the location and speed of each crew





12.10 "SOS" AND "OK" SIGNALLING PRINCIPLES

By pressing the "SOS" button a crew reports an accident and requests immediate assistance. Also „SOS“ sign” has to be shown to following competing cars.

In case of an accident or technical problems at a Special Stage, by pressing the "OK" button a crew informs of stopping for more than 30 seconds and that immediate assistance is not required (even if a crew is trying to continue the rally). Attention! In case of stopping at SS, the device automatically sends an "SOS" signal to the centre. If no assistance is required, the crew must press the "OK" button within 30 seconds to remove the "SOS" signal sent by the system. The crew's mobile phone must be switched on (or turned on within 60 seconds), so that the Race Control can reach the crew.

Incorrect "SOS" and "OK" signal transmission will be penalised.

In the case of an accident where urgent medical attention is required, when possible, the red "SOS" sign should immediately be displayed to the following cars attempting to assist (General Prescriptions Art 53.3.1.)

12.11 ENTERING REGROUP AREA AND PARC FERMÉ

GPS tracking officers are allowed to enter the regrouping area and Parc Fermé in order to maintain or repair the GPS tracking systems installed in the rally cars. They must be accompanied by scrutineers and team representatives (driver, co-driver or competitor).

12.12 SERVICE PROCEDURES

Only Service cars (Service car plate) are allowed to enter Service Park. Recce vehicles are not allowed to enter the Service Park. Restrictions on servicing, refuelling, or changing of mechanical parts are listed in FIA RRSR and these comply with Art. 56, 57, 58 and 61 of Estonian Rally General Prescriptions.

12.12.1 Layout of Service Park

Each team is allocated a 7x8m (56 m²) of service area.

Enquiries for extra space in Service Park must reach the Organizer before Monday, 27th January 2025 at 12:00.

The price for extra space is 14 EUR / m².

12.12.2 Speed limit in Service Park

Speed limit in Service Park is 15 kph. Speeding will result in a penalty applied by the Clerk of the Course according to Art. 57.4 of Estonian Rally General Prescriptions 2025.

12.12.3 Behaviour in Service Park

A liquid-proof tarp of at least 3x5 meters must be used under the rally car while servicing In Service Park. Only one service vehicle per each rally car is allowed to enter Service Park. The vehicle must be clearly identified by a "Service" plate issued by the Organiser and affixed on the upper part of the front windscreen. **Recce cars are not permitted to enter the Service Park.**

Damages (nails, screws, and other fittings) to the surface of the Service Park are forbidden. The crew is responsible for damages to their service zone and must avoid causing them. Refuelling is permitted only in refuelling areas. Two fire extinguishers minimum 6kg must be present at each service zone. It is strictly forbidden to use open fire at the service zone (charcoal grill, firewood, etc.). After the rally the service zone must be handed over in tidy condition. Crews are responsible for the removal of their waste and sewage.

12.13 OBSTACLES

Due to safety reasons, barriers will be positioned on the rally route to reduce speed of rally cars. Judges of fact will monitor the right passage of barriers. The list of judges of fact will be published on the Official Notice Board in compliance with ISC Art. 11.16.7. According to Estonian Rally Championship Regulations Art 9.3 competitor, who





fails to correctly pass any additional hindrance and has gained advantage registered by fact judges, will be penalised 1 minute penalty for every offense.

12.14 OFFICIAL TIME USED DURING THE RALLY

Official time throughout the rally is the one of GPS, time zone CET +1.

14.1 ORGANISER'S AWARDS

The award ceremony will take place at Tehvandi Sports Center on the basis of unofficial results after the competition. EMV 10 class cups will be delivered to the teams after the final results are confirmed. If any of the crews has received the prize, but is not entitled to it according to a subsequent Stewards decision, the crew is obligated to return the prize to the Organiser.

15 FINAL SCRUTINEERING, CHECKS, PROTESTS AND APPEALS

15.1 FINAL SCRUTINEERING OF DEFINED VEHICLES

Location: Mägestiku village 58°04'46.5"N 26°24'26.3"E
Date: 01st February 2025
Time: Immediately after the finish podium

All teams required to complete a final scrutineering must immediately follow the instructions of the officials in charge, even if this means not passing one or more Time Control Points (TC). The final scrutineering must be prepared for the submission of the necessary certificates. The representative of the competitor and the mechanics with the necessary tools must be represented at the final scrutineering.

15.2 PROTEST DEPOSIT

Procedure for submitting protests in accordance with Art 13 of the FIA Sporting Code and Art 65 of the ERCG. The protest fee must be paid in cash to the Competition Secretary at the Rally HQ or by bank transfer to the current account of the Estonian Autosport Union: EE202200221002111381 (Swedbank, SWIFT: HABAE2X).





Amount of the protest fee is **1000 EUR**.

If a protest is about another competitor's car, an additional deposit may be imposed by order of the Stewards according to the Technical Commission prescription.

15.3 APPEAL DEPOSIT

Procedure for submitting appeals according to Art 15 of the FIA Sporting Code.

National (EASU) appeal fee is **3000 EUR**.

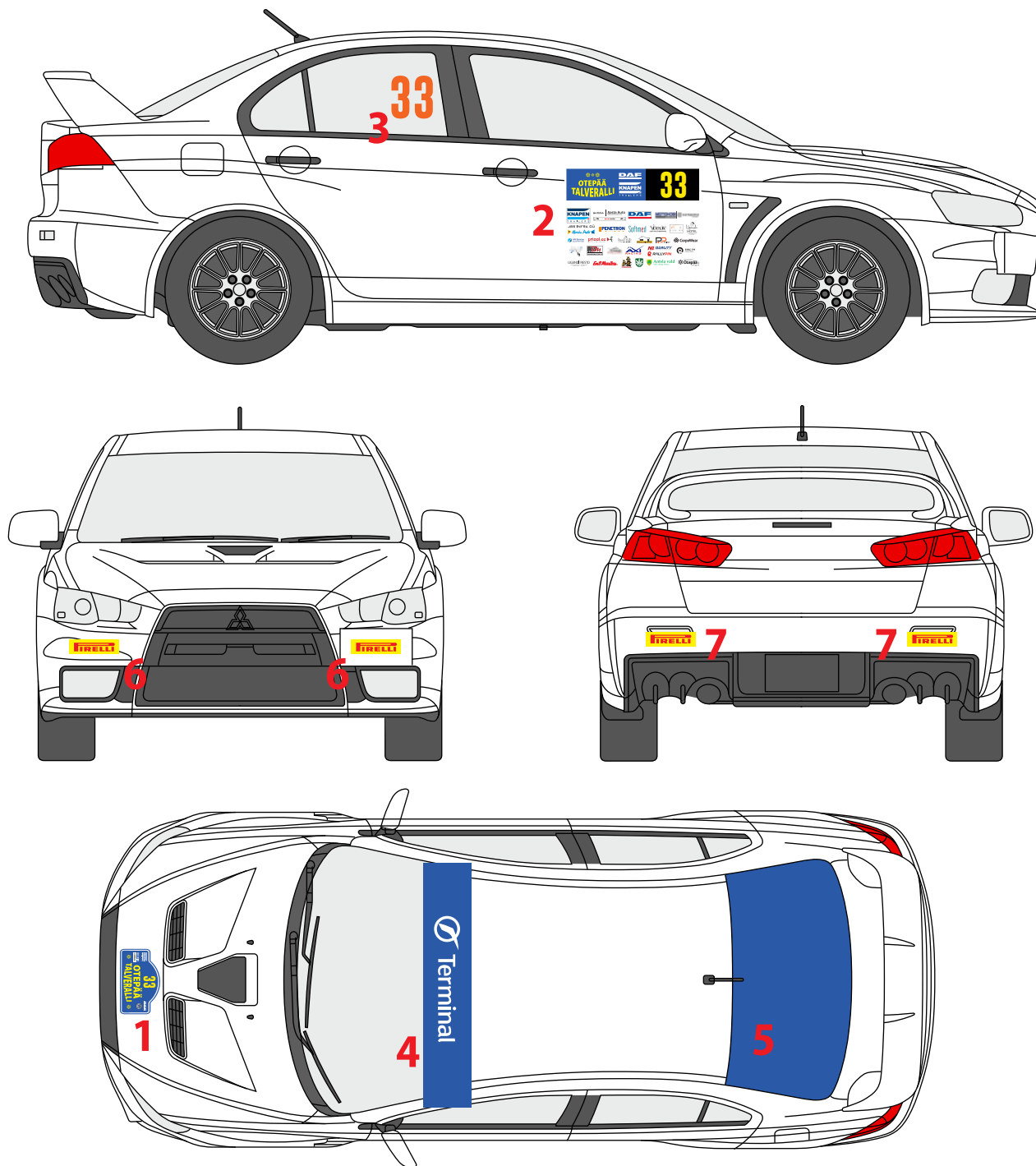
