

1. Access & Parking



ACCESS

Passes & Tickets

All riders will receive tickets for admission to the circuit. These will be e-tickets and sent to the riders registered email address. This will be 3 tickets per rider; 1 for the rider, and 2 for helpers. YOU WILL NEED TO SHOW THESE ON ARRIVAL AT THE CIRCUIT FROM 18:00 WEDNESDAY 18th MARCH. Please note; spectators who do not hold a competitor ticket will not be allowed into the paddock area, or to camp at the circuit overnight.

Access Times

The paddock will be open from 18:00 on Wednesday 18th March. Arrivals before this time will be directed to the A holding areas until this time or as otherwise directed by circuit officials. The paddock will close each evening at 23:00 after which time vehicle movements within the Paddock are strictly prohibited until 06:00 to allow those that have already arrived, to sleep. Arrivals between 23:00 and 06:00 will be asked to park outside the paddock entrance.

Parking

Please ensure that you park all vehicles within the site sensibly and with consideration for others. The area behind the garages is limited and is strictly for garage holders only and living vehicles and hitched vehicles are not permitted to park behind garages without prior consent. A living vehicle is a vehicle used only to sleep in and does not transport your machine. Vehicles must not be left blocking fire lanes and any vehicle left unattended in a fire lane will be removed without prior warning.

2. Paddock Info



Generators

Paddock generators must be switched off at 23:00 and may not be run until 06:30 the following morning.

EXCEPTION: There is a designated area where generators may run all night, this is for the purposes of heating, especially for those with young families or medical conditions, this is once you come over the bridge at Snetterton through the gates then turn right and the first area on the right of the main roadway. Please see map at the end of these instructions. Generators may run 24 hours in the area, this is not a party area please, this is for those that wish to have power throughout the night, we will not accept complaints from anyone parking in this area about generator noise.

Paddock Surface

No marquee stakes or nails are to be driven into the tarmac or concrete. No markings shall be made in any of the pit garages, pit lane or paddock surfaces. Any cables or piping crossing public areas, fire lanes or roadways must be matted or taped down. Any cables or piping not matted or taped down will be removed without prior warning.

Paddock Transport

The paddock speed limit is **5 MPH**.

The use of motorised transport is not permitted under any circumstances, this includes electric scooters, hover boards and e-bikes. The penalty is back of the grid for the first or next race following the offence.

Push bikes are permitted but must adhere to the speed limit and should be used for essential journeys only. Anyone under the age of 16 is not permitted to use any form of transport that is not self-propelled.

Anyone under the age of 16 is not permitted to use any form of transport while the circuit is live, this includes push bikes.

Camping

Grass areas are available outside the paddock. All wastewater must be containerised and disposed of off-site. Please keep noise to a minimum and generators should be switched off between 23:00 and 06:30. Any unruly behaviour by a rider or his/her entourage will not be tolerated and fines or penalties will be applied to a rider or team for any unruly behaviour.

Children

If you are bringing children with you, they MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT HOLDING A COMPETITOR TICKET ON ARRIVAL AND MUST REMAIN SUPERVISED AT ALL TIMES. At No Limits we like the family feel to the paddock, however riders and families are reminded that it is a working area and must be treated as such at all times.

Fuel

Fuel will be available at the circuit pumps

- Thursday 09:00-16:00
- Friday 08:30-16:30
- Saturday and Sunday 08:00-16:00

Refuelling for Teams must be done with the engine switched off and the bike on a rear stand. REMINDER: A maximum of 25 litres of fuel may be stored in each garage.

Pit Lane & Garages



PIT LANE

Pit Lane is a working area and therefore you must ensure you are aware of your surroundings at all times. No Under 16s are allowed in the Pit Lane or on the Pit Wall. There is no smoking in the Pit Lane, Pit Wall or Pit Garages. (This includes E-Cigarettes). Pit Lane operates a one way system at ALL times. Fines or penalties will be applied to a rider or team for any infringement of any of these regulations.

Pit Lane Speed Limit

Maximum speed limit in Pit Lane is 60 KPH (37 MPH). Speed limits will be enforced and penalties issued.

Garage Allocation

Garages will automatically be allocated to Endurance Teams free of charge with a team entry until the closing date for the event, after which time a garage space is not guaranteed.

Race Administration

Race Admin will be located at the top of the paddock below Race Control. Here you will find: Race Administration, Riders Sign On, Official Notice Boards and general information, when this is not manned please ask an official for assistance.

Race Admin Opening Times

Thursday: 07:00 onwards (Test Day Sign On ONLY)

Thursday: 13:00 onwards (Race Meeting Sign On)

Friday: 07:00 – 30 Minutes after last race

Saturday: 07:00 – 30 Minutes after last race

Sunday: 08:00 – 30 Minutes after last race.

You will need your 2025 digital Membership Card and current ACU (or equivalent) licence at Sign On.

Transponders

Hired transponders may be collected from Race Administration during racing sign on. Payment for transponders is £40 and must be paid either online or upon collection of your transponder. Due to 2025 ACU Licences now being electronic and not a physical card, please bring your DVLA licence, to be kept as a security deposit until you return the transponder. Failure to return the transponder by the end of the meeting - the transponder must be sent to the No Limits Office by recorded delivery within 3 days of the meeting. Failure to return within this time will mean a replacement cost of £350 including VAT being passed on to you. Transponders should be returned to Race Administration within 30 minutes of the final race end time.

Technical Control

Technical control will be located within the Scrutineering Bay at the top end of the paddock. Please present yourself and your motorcycle ready to race remembering your DOG TAGS. **You will need your 2026 digital Membership Card on your phone at Technical Control; a barcode will be applied to your machine.**

NO ENGINES MAY NOT BE STARTED BEFORE 08:30 OR AFTER 18:30 ANYDAY

Noise Testing

Noise Testing will take place in Parc Ferme at the end of each free practice session.

If you have been noise tested on the Thursday, DO NOT remove your sticker.

Race Numbers

All machines must be equipped with three number boards – one front and one either side of the machine. These must be visible to the public, marshals and officials. The number on the front of the machine must be at least 14cm tall and all numbers and backgrounds must conform to the colours listed in the No Limits Technical Regulations. The numbers on the front and sides of the machine MUST be the same and correct for the class when entering the Assembly Area. It is in your personal interest that the race numbers are clear and visible. Machines displaying incorrect numbers for the class will receive a penalty.

Briefings

You will need your 2026 digital Membership Card on your phone or your Onboard Pass at the briefing. This will be scanned at the end of the briefing.

Briefing Times

Test Day - Briefing is Thursday at 08:30 in pit lane or technical control (weather dependant)

Endurance - Briefing time is Saturday at 08:15 Hospitality Suite next to the Circuit Office.

General Briefing - Briefing time is Thursday 17:10 or Friday at 08:30 at pit lane exit.

ALL RIDERS MUST ATTEND ONE OF THE TWO BRIEFINGS

Noise**Machine Noise Restrictions**

Engines may not be started before 08:30 and after 18:30. The noise limit is 105dBA measured as per the ACU handbook 2025.

Those taking part in the test day should leave their noise test sticker on the machine.

Paddock Noise

To help everyone get a decent night's sleep, please be mindful of noise levels in the paddock, especially in the late evening and early morning. Sound carries a long way in a paddock environment, and what feels "quiet" near your awning can still be disruptive to others nearby. Quiet hours are from 22:00 onwards, so please keep all noise to an absolute minimum after this time. This includes music, loud conversations and general activity around vans and awnings. Generators are not permitted between 23:00 and 06:30, and we ask that vehicle movements are kept to a minimum, particularly during the night and early morning.

Messaging and Announcements**Paddock Messaging and Announcements**

For the latest paddock messages and event announcements, we use three main channels: the paddock tannoy, the event WhatsApp group, and the RIB on the Sportity app.

Please make sure you join the event WhatsApp group for the latest updates, and turn notifications on so you don't miss anything important. All official bulletins and event-critical updates will be issued via the RIB on the Sportity app, so please check this regularly throughout the event.

If you'd like to listen to the paddock tannoy remotely, details of this service will be available at Race Admin.

Getting on track**Test Day**

All riders should proceed to the assembly area located at the bottom of the paddock off the roadway by the corner to leave the paddock. It is the rider's responsibility to be on time for all practices and racing!! For all practice sessions and races you will be directed by the marshals up the pit lane. Please be advised you may be held for a few moments in the pit lane while the circuit clears of traffic.

Assembly Area (SPRINT ONLY)

Riders for all sprint classes only should proceed to the assembly area located at the bottom of the paddock off the roadway by the corner to leave the paddock. It is the rider's responsibility to be on time for all practices and racing!! For all practice sessions and races you will be directed by the assembly official onto the circuit. Latecomers will be directed down pit lane and will enter the circuit at pit exit.

IF YOU ARE LATE TO THE ASSEMBLY AREA YOU MAY MISS YOUR PRACTICE SESSION OR RACE. THERE WILL BE TANNOY ANNOUNCEMENTS IN THE PADDOCK AND ONLINE SO PLEASE LISTEN OUT.

Assembly Area (ENDURANCE ONLY)

There is no assembly area for the endurance classes, riders should leave their pit garage and proceed onto the circuit via pit lane exit. (This applies for both the practice and race)

While on track**Flags and Lights**

The circuit is equipped with full light panels which will be the primary means of communication to riders. These will be supplemented with flags when necessary – lights and flags have the same validity.

Rain Light Panel / Rain Flag (Fri - Sun Only)

White flag/light with a diagonal red cross.

Static Light / Stationary Flag; drops of rain in this section of the track, not affecting the track surface.

Flashing Light / Waved Flag; more intense rain that is affecting the track surface.

Signalling

All signalling must be done from the pit wall by authorised personnel only and in an authorised place.

During the endurance race, if the Safety Car is deployed, all pit boards must be withdrawn until after the green flag is waved restarting the race. The only signal authorised during a safety car period is PIT IN.

11. After the chequered flag



Practice Starts

Practice starts are permitted only after Wilson (turn 2) off the racing line (riders right) after the chequered flag in practice only. **Practice starts are not permitted on the test day (Thursday).**

Parc Ferme

Parc Ferme is located as you leave the circuit, as described below, there will be a fenced off area next to the technical control bay. Riders must remain with their machine for a short period whilst random safety checks are completed. Those competing in the next race must inform the technical officials in Parc Ferme and they will be released back to the assembly area, but they must remain in Parc Ferme after their second race.

Post Race Podium & Interviews

As we are now live streaming all events, there will be post race interviews for the winner and possibly 2nd and 3rd (time dependant). When you enter the Parc Ferme, there will be a winners area indicated by 1/2/3 boards where the first 3 (on the road) should stop in front of.

12. Getting off track



Exiting the Circuit

After the chequered flag, **ALL** riders will leave the circuit after Palmer (turn 3). Be advised this is a new location to previous years and is on the right at the exit of the corner. This is marked on the approach to the exit as per the images (Right).



To ensure riders are aware of the location of this exit, a bulletin will be circulated at signing on and it will be covered in the ALL riders briefings.

Circuit Exit (Endurance RACE FINISH)

After the chequered flag for all practice and races riders will complete one full slowing down lap and enter the pit lane.

13. Endurance Specific




Recovery Drop Off Point

The recovery drop off point at this circuit will be at the gate next to garage 26 (unless the team is advised otherwise - due to machine condition/rider condition)



Safety Car

The Safety Car may be deployed at any time under the direction of the Clerk of The Course. The Safety Car will enter the circuit on the Senna Straight (Pit Exit). A black board with the letters SC in white will be shown at the start line along with Safety Car Flags at flag marshal posts. The safety car will be deployed as per the Endurance General Regulations. This will be covered in the compulsory rider briefings. **PLEASE NOTE THIS PROCEDURE IS NOT THE SAME AS 2025**



Pit Stops & Minimum Pit Stop Intervention Time

The minimum pit stop intervention time at this venue is : **34.7 seconds** [14.7 + 20]
Any rider whose pit intervention time is below the set time, will be penalised with a calculated time. This time will be the difference between the intervention set time and the pit stop intervention time, calculated between the pit in and pit out loops, multiplied by 5.
Single bike teams - everybody responsible for the refuelling procedure, including the person with the fire extinguisher, is obliged to wear a helmet and overalls/leathers. Specific Endurance Class Regulations have been issued.



Minimum and Maximum Riding Time/Distance

Race time/distance at this round is : 3 hours
The minimum riding time/distance (20%) is : **36 minutes**
The maximum riding time/distance (60%) is : **108 minutes**



Penalty Box

The penalty box will be located near the exit of pit lane, some penalties are listed below and any penalties incurred will be passed to the team via an official, endurance team telegram channel and will be published on timing screens.



Parc Ferme

Parc Ferme is located in the Pit Lane.



Behaviour

Any unruly behaviour by a rider or his/her entourage will not be tolerated and fines or penalties will be applied to a rider or team for any unruly behaviour.

Filming/Photography

Other than the taking of still photographs for personal, non-commercial use, filming or photography is not permitted without obtaining prior permission from MSV and No Limits Serious Tracktime Ltd. MSV may charge for this production. All on-board cameras must be fitted before the machine is taken to technical control and will be assessed at that point.

Penalties

Penalties may be issued to riders in breach of the ACU Handbook or Supplementary Regulations for the event as follows:

Jump Start/Anticipation of the Start – Ride through penalty/up to 20 second time penalty

Failure to clear pit lane when requested – 30 second stop go penalty

Speeding in pit lane (First Offence) – Ride through penalty/ 20 second time penalty

Speeding in pit lane (Second Offence) – 60 second stop go penalty

Speeding in pit lane (Third Offence) – Disqualification

Overtaking under Yellow Flags – 60 second stop go penalty

Overtaking under Safety Car – 60 second stop go penalty

Overtaking the Safety Car – Disqualification

Non-observance of Black or Black/Orange Flag – 60 second stop go penalty

Failure to wear rider identification arm band – 30 second stop go penalty

Failure to notify the Clerk of the Course of a conversion within 30 minutes – 60 second stop go penalty

Smoking in the Pit Lane or Garages (Inc E-Cigarettes) – 60 second stop go penalty

Riders not attending the briefing – Start from Back of the Grid

Rain light not illuminated when required – 30 second stop go penalty

Riding the wrong way along pit lane – 60 second stop go penalty

Endurance minimum pit stop intervention – See section 23 above

Penalties are not allowed to be taken under safety car conditions. Any other penalty as directed by the Clerk of the Course may be imposed during the race or after it including those listed in the ACU Handbook. The Clerk of the Course may use his/her discretion in all penalty decisions and these are for guideline purposes only.

Interpretation

The interpretation of any Rules, Regulations, Bulletins, and Final Instructions will rest with the Stewards of the Meeting, whose decision will be final.
