IMPORTANT NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

The road book for this event has been created based on providing instructions that enable crews to traverse the course.

It has been carefully prepared, and independently checked, using non-competitive vehicles at relatively low speeds.

The instructions are our interpretation of the course. They may not contain some items that you consider to be hazards, and they may not contain items that become a hazard.

The instructions cannot, and must not, be used as any form of 'pace notes'. This event is a 'blind event', and competitors should drive to what they can see.

The special stages and liaisons traverse a wide range of public and private roads. Animals, both wild and domestic, may be found on the course during the event. In addition, the course may contain changes in direction, and/or surface, which may not be in the instructions.

The Heartland region has received significant rain events recently. While we have done our best to select roads that are relatively robust and the roads have fared well, there is still evidence of water damage throughout some of the softer roads, along with ruts and potholes throughout the course. Please apply the event's ongoing adage of "**drive to what you can see**" as it remains important – be mindful that not everything can be in the road book, do not ignore cautions, and be sure to read all tulip instructions.

We remind crews that they are ultimately responsible for the manner and speed in which they traverse the course, for their own safety.

Crews should take their own experience and abilities into account and traverse the course in a way in which they are comfortable.

Remember – MOTORSPORT IS DANGEROUS. Drive according to what you can see.

SERVICE PARK

General Information

Service will be mostly at Paxton Square and Burra Community School – in and around the heritage cottages.

The service park will open at 08:00am on Thursday April 23rd.

There is no option for setup any earlier.

The Service Park Manager is June Bunker. Service Park spaces have been pre-allocated. Contact the Service Park Manager for any queries.

Speed limit in Service Parks

The speed limit is 5kph – walking pace – in and around the area. It will be strictly enforced, and reports made to Stewards if necessary – and then a penalty may apply.

Service Park Controls

Time controls will be set up at the entry and exit to all service parks. The time allowed for service will be indicated in the road book. Liaisons to and from Service Park do not form part of the service time provided. Section times have been made long enough to not require the need for ANY speeding.

Car Washing

The use of pressure cleaners is prohibited in the Service Park. Cars may only be washed by use of a sponge from a bucket. Where oils, solvents and degreasing fluids are used all residues must be securely contained, removed from the Service Park and not be allowed to come in contact with the ground. Breaches noted by an official of the rally will result in a report to the Stewards with a recommendation that a fine be applied.

This does not apply to any washing facilities supplied by the organisers.

Facilities

Toilets and rubbish disposal will be available within the Service Park including skips specifically for hard rubbish.

ANGER

Assess your surroundings for potential dangers and get to a safe place, if necessary



A
IRWAY

Open airway, look for any obstructions, maintain neutral head position



R
ESPONSE

Check if the person can respond to you. Ask their name, gentle shake their shoulder. If not responding, move to next step



B
REATHING

Look, listen and feel for breathing. If not breathing, begin CPR



S
END HELP

Call 000 or ask someone else to. Follow instructions/questions of the operator



C
PR

Begin CPR by applying 30 chest compressions, followed by two breaths into the patient's mouth



D
EFIBRILLATOR

Use a Defibrillator and follow the prompts



Safety and First Aid Tips

Most medical problems that arise with such events can be relieved by simple, effective management.

Strains and Sprains

- Sit down in a safe and dry location
- Rest the injured limb
- Ice (wrapped in a wet towel) should be applied for 15 – 20 minutes
- Compression / bandage should also be applied for support
- Elevate the injured limb
- Refer to Medical advice if pain continues or loss of movement is experienced

Minor Lacerations / Abrasions

- Sit down in a safe and dry location
- Inspect the injured site
- Brush any surface items off, i.e. dirt, pine needles etc
- Irrigate the injured site with water
- Leave any embedded items intact in the wound (Support the embedded item and seek medical aid immediately)
- Cover / dress the injured site and assess in 24 hours. Seek Medical advice if uncertain

Burns

- Sit down in a safe and dry location
- Immediately cool the burn site by flooding with water
- Remove excess clothing at the burn site, but DO NOT pull burnt skin / clothing apart
- If the burn is the size of the patients palm or is to the face or neck, then contact Medical assistance immediately.
- For all other burns, continue cooling, being careful not to overcool the patient
- Cover / dress the burnt site and assess in 24 hours. Seek Medical advice if uncertain

Snake Bites

- Assume all snake bites are poisonous and always believe someone when they say they have been bitten by a snake, even though you may not see any puncture marks.
- Management of a snakebite – Pressure immobilisation method:
 1. Rest the casualty.
 2. Don't panic.
 3. Apply direct pressure over the bitten area.
 4. Apply a firm bandage over the bite area first, then bandage down the limb and continue to bandage up the full length of the limb.
 5. Immobilise the limb with a splint and call for medical aid.
- REMEMBER – Do not wash the bitten area. Do not remove the bandage. Do not elevate the limb. Do not walk or run – get help to you.

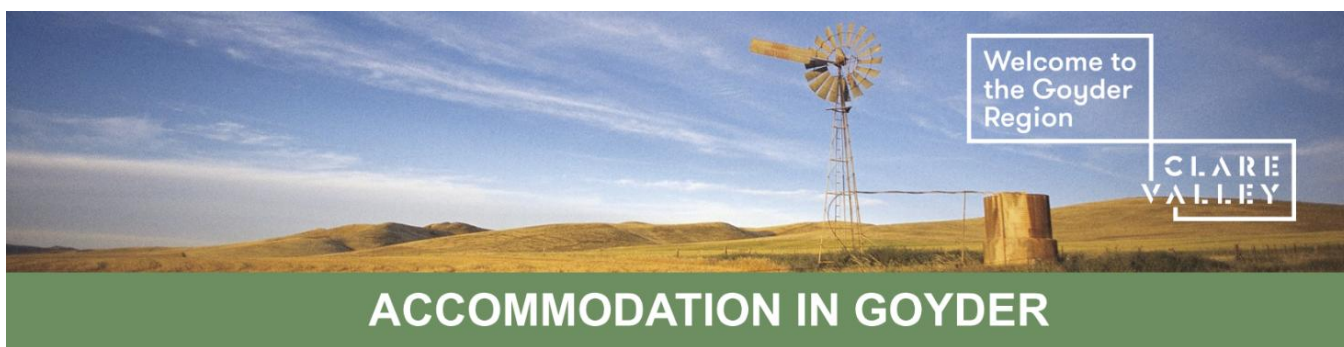

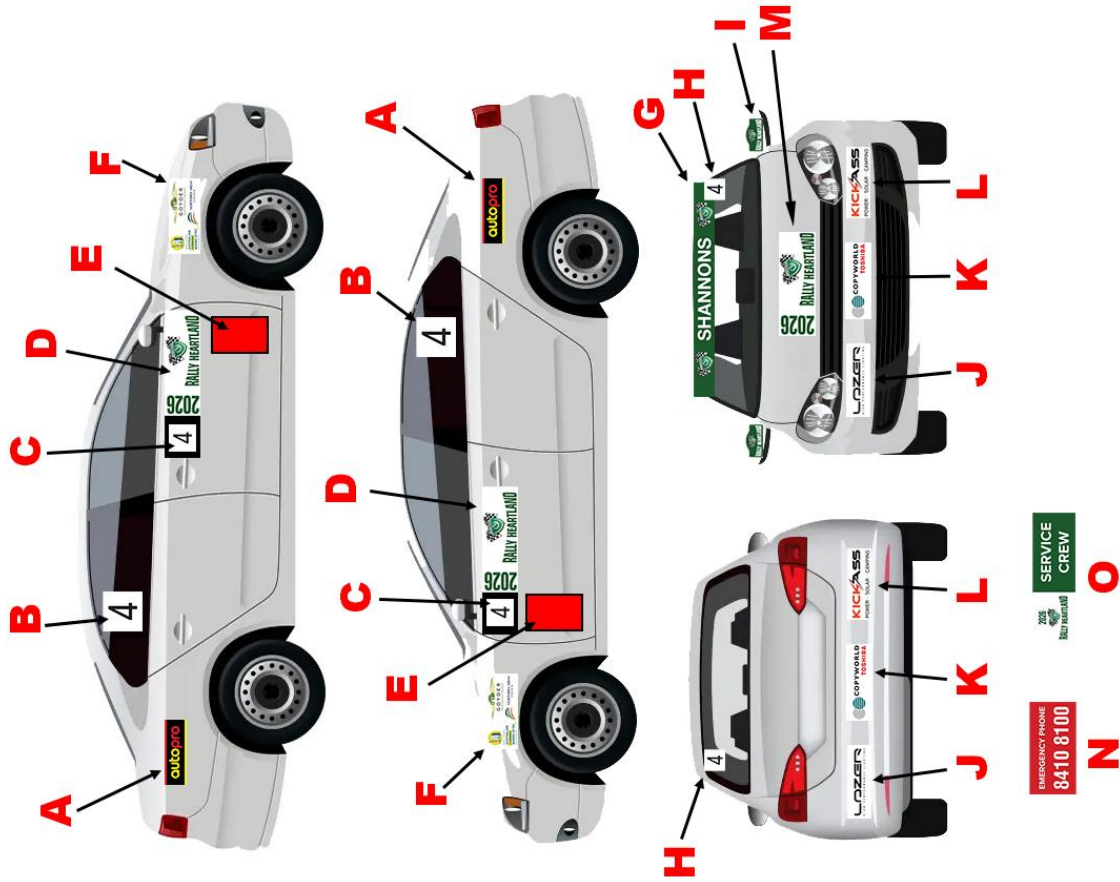

RALLYSAFE TIMING

Timing by satellite using the RallySafe technology and equipment has been employed by RallySA for many events now, and satellite timing will again be used for all time controls, not just for special stages.

Official time cards will be provided.

The process for competitors is as follows:

- a) Competition vehicle arrives at Time Control (TC).
- b) Vehicle is checked in at time control by event officials via the Race Commander Tablet and on the competitor time card.
- c) Vehicle moves to Stage Start (SS) and is checked in by event officials on the competitor time card.
- d) Competitor's RallySafe unit receives Start time via the Race Commander Tablet.
- e) Competitor prepares for Start time and proceeds into stage once the allocated time has come.
- f) Remember NO WHEELSPIN!!
- g) Competitor makes way through stage until Flying Finish (FF).
- h) Once Competitor passes flying finish, the clock is stopped, and time is sent to rally officials.
- i) Stage time displays on RallySafe unit after completing a stage by crossing the Flying Finish. The stage time is no longer displayed on the RallySafe unit after the crew leave the Stop Point, but can still be viewed along with other stage times using the Options button and View Times option.
- j) Competitor then reaches the "SLOW DOWN" signs, where the competitor is required to slow to 10 km/h and then STOP at the Stop Control.
- k) Officials record car details and initial the competitor time card.
- l) Competitor then follows civil road laws to next Time control and/or Stage start.

DO'S AND DON'TS

Do:

- Be unfailingly pleasant.
- Show COURTESY to the "Locals" in the areas through which we pass – after all, they live there and we want to come back in future years.
- Report any INCIDENT or ACCIDENT with another vehicle or property. Use the appropriate accident and injury report forms along with the Withdrawal form in your Road Book or get one from Rally Headquarters or one of the CRO's.
- Obey INSTRUCTIONS of all officials – this will make for a smoother event.
- Respect the traffic laws on PUBLIC ROADS. Speed cameras are used in the state of South Australia. If a competitor is reported by the SA Police as having exceeded the speed limit on any transport stage or during recce, that competitor is liable to incur the normal civil road penalties as well as event penalties applied under the Supplementary Regulations.
- Show COURTESY TO OTHER ROAD USERS – you don't know who they are, but in view of the markings on your car they will certainly know who you are.
- Use the CROs (Competitor Relations Officers) for help with any problems.
- Use CONCRETE or WATER CONTAINER WEIGHTS to hold down any shelters or tentage

Don't:

- LITTER – there are heavy fines for littering in a public place, so carry a litterbag in your vehicle
- DROP OIL anywhere. The Service Park, overnight and Parc Ferme areas are in private facilities. Please pay attention to mechanicals, which drip oil. Use appropriate measures to deal with oil spills.
- DRINK and DRIVE! It is strictly forbidden to consume intoxicating liquor or to use prohibited drugs during the course of the days of competition or within six hours of a competitor's start time for a day and penalties up to exclusion apply (refer to the Supplementary Regulations).
- SPEED anywhere

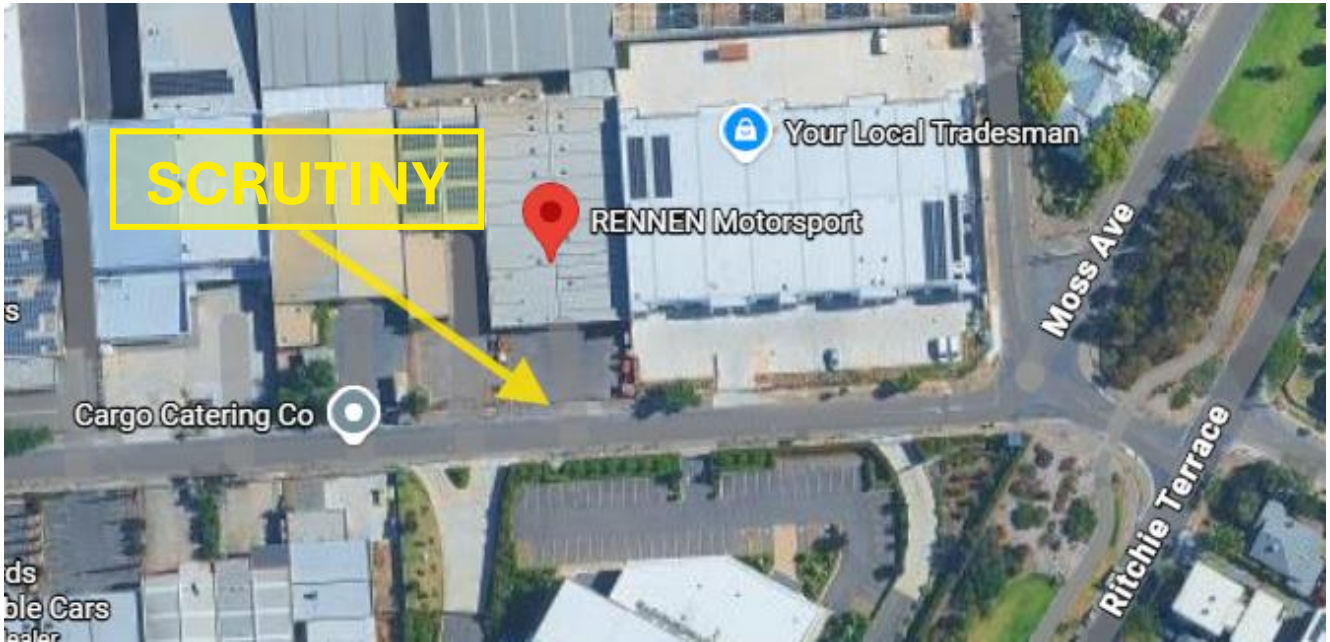

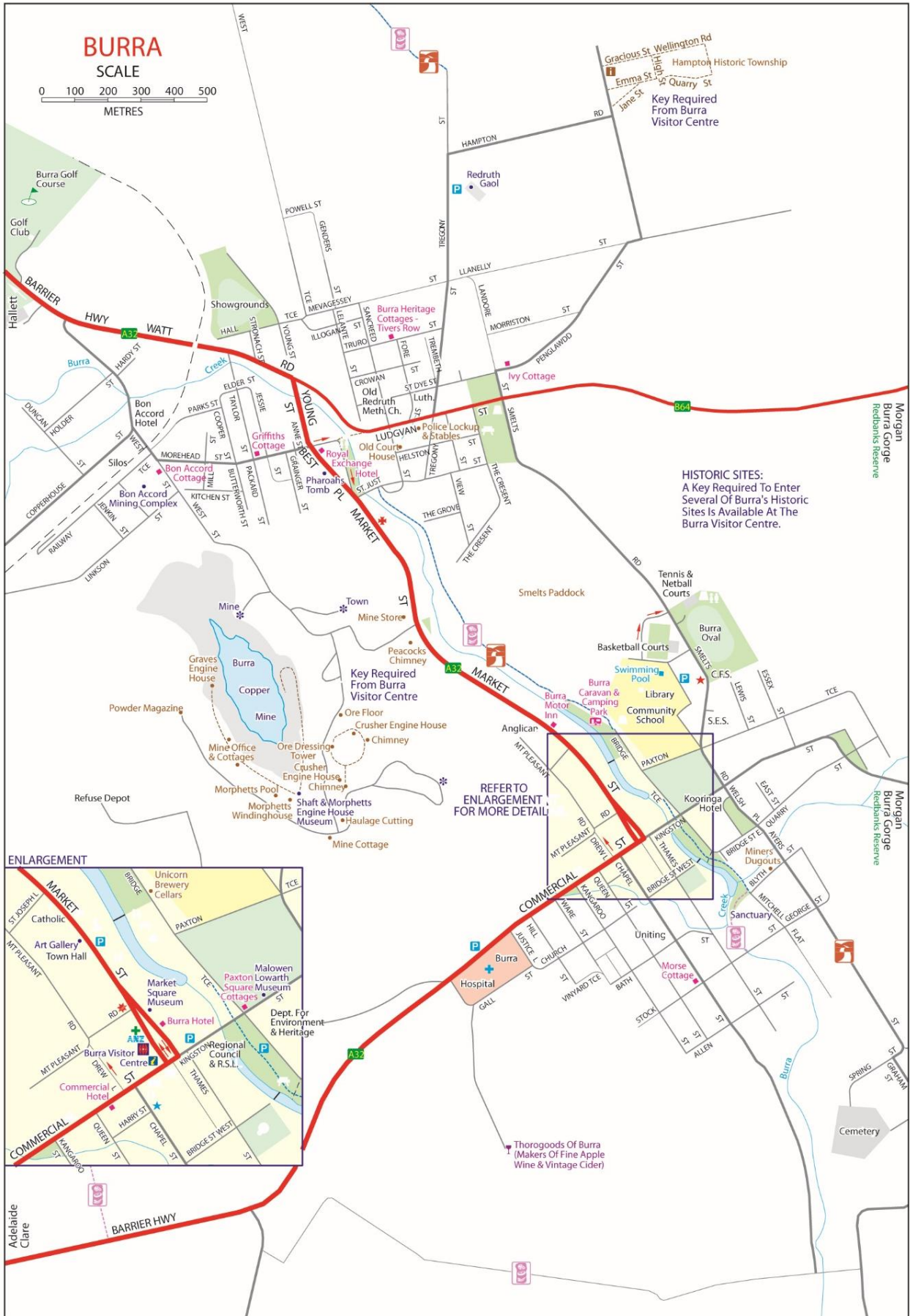

All gates and grids will be signed with the use of “Chevron” boards, one each side of the opening as depicted in the photo to the left.



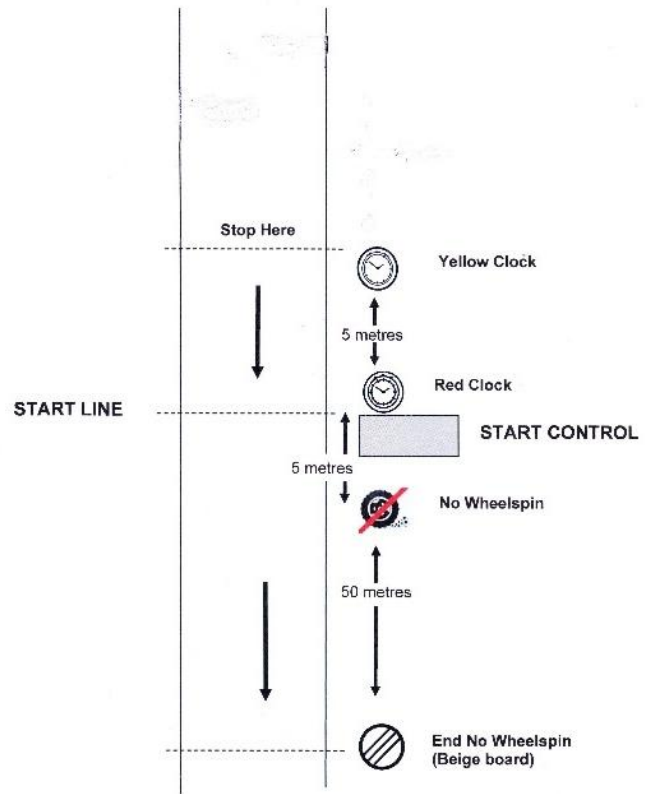
To the left is an example of the X-board which will be erected at nominated CAUTION (!!) and DANGER (!!!) locations, in addition to the standard caution boards.

No Wheelspin Sign at Stage Start

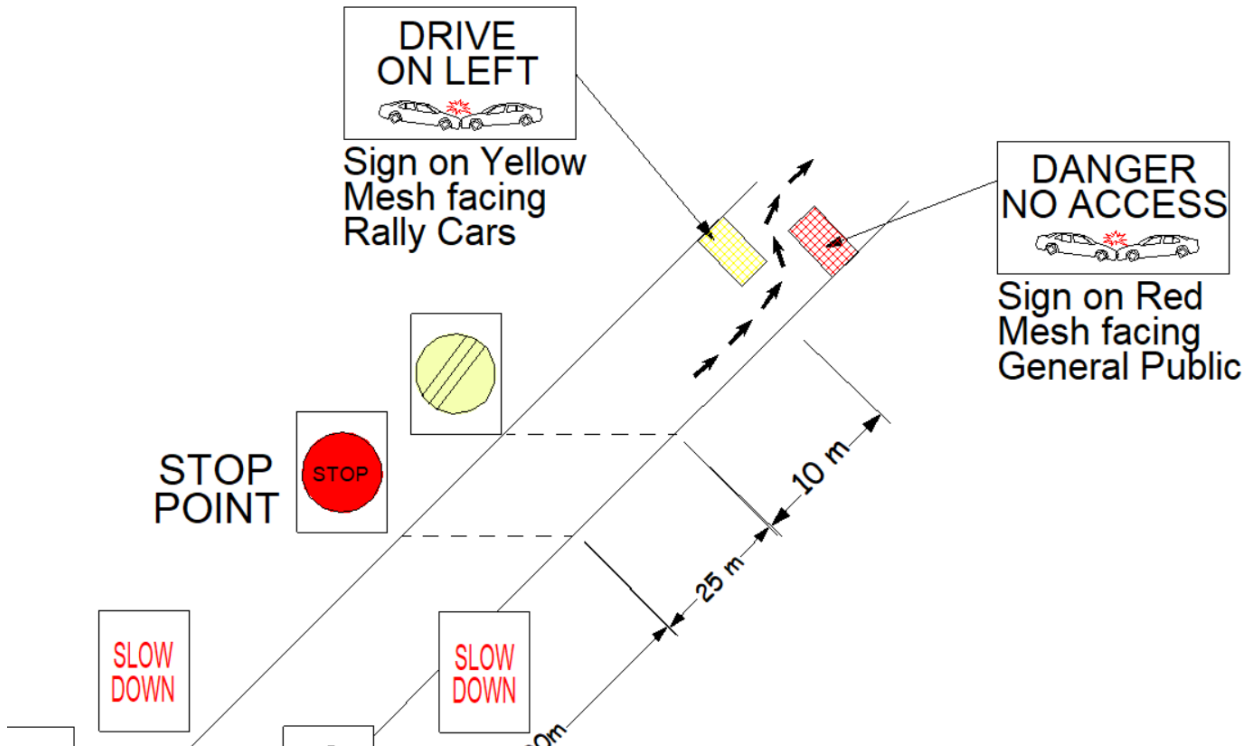
Start Control Setup

A wheel spin start will be defined as “A sustained loss of traction through wheel spin of any driven wheel with no attempt by the driver to curtail that spinning within the area bounded by the starting position and the End of Control Zone sign”.

Momentary wheel slip on the initial bite from acceleration is acceptable.

Any Control Official shall be a Judge of Fact. Penalties for wheel spin breaches at the start of Competitive Stages shall be as follows:	
First offence	Warning - to be communicated to the competitor prior to their start of the next competitive stage. Failing that, prior to their start of the subsequent competitive stage.
Second Offence (after the competitor has received the warning for the first offence)	1-minute penalty
Third and subsequent offences	3-minute penalty per offence and a report to the Stewards
