4 ENTRIES

4.1 Opening and Closing Dates:

- Tuesday, March 21st, 2023 Entries Open
- Tuesday, May 2nd, 2023 @ 12:00 Entries Closed & Closing date for submitting Co-Driver details.

4.2 Entry Procedure

Any FIA competition licence-holder wishing to take part in 2023 Jordan Rally MERC must send the due entry fee and the completed entry form to the rally secretariat by *Tuesday, May 2nd, 2023*.

The entry form is available at <u>www.jordanrally.com</u>.

An electronic entry application (internet) may be accepted. If the application is sent by fax, by email or made electronically, the original duly signed entry form must reach the Organisers within 5 days following the close of entries. A copy of the valid competitor's licence must accompany the entry form.

An entry application will be accepted only if accompanied by the total entry fees or by a receipt issued by the competitor's ASN. Competitors other than the first or second driver must hold an appropriate Competitors Licence issued by their ASN. A copy of the Competitor licence must accompany the entry form.







- 4.3 Number of Competitors accepted and Classes
 - 4.3.1 The maximum number of Competitors will be "40". If more than the maximum number of entries is received, the acceptance of entries among the non-priority drivers will be at the sole discretion of the Organiser.
 - 4.3.2 Eligible Cars
 - 4.3.2.1 In accordance with Article 12 and Variation 3 FIA MERC of the 2023 FIA RRSR.
 - 4.3.2.2 In accordance with Article 12.3.4 of 2023 FIA RRSR, FIA Approved cars with ASN homologations and ASN-approved cars are permitted to take part and be shown in the entry list and score points, provided that the cars comply with the safety requirements as stipulated in App J Art.253.
 - 4.3.2.3 National Cars: in accordance with Article 12.3.2 of the 2023 FIA RRSR, these cars are permitted to participate provided they are approved by the ASN Chief Scrutineer and will be classified in accordance with the National Rally Regulations, they will appear on the Championship entry list and classifications, but they will not score points in the FIA MERC.
- 4.4 Entry fees / entry packages for Private Competitors
 - 4.4.1 With the optional advertising proposed by the Organiser (per entry):
 - Private €800 inclusive of VAT
 - Legal €1150 inclusive of VAT
 - 4.4.2 Without the optional advertising proposed by the Organiser (per entry):
 - Private €1600 inclusive of VAT
 - Legal €2300 inclusive of VAT
 - 4.4.3 Definitions:
 - Private Competitor: The Competitor license is in the name of one of the crew members who enters his/her own car and competes under his/her own name.
 - Legal Competitor: ASN, company, team or a sporting association holding a legal Competitor license that enters one or more cars.
 - A person holding a competitor license, but who is not a crew member and who enters one or more cars.
 - Jordanian: the first driver must be a holder of Jordanian passport and the entry must be in his/her name.

4.6 Refunds

The entry fees will be refunded in full:

- To candidates whose entry has not been accepted.
- In the case of the rally not taking place.

The Organiser may refund 50% of the entry fee to those competitors who for reasons of "force majeure" duly certified by their ASN are unable to start the rally.

5 INSURANCE

5.1 Fees

The Entry Fees include the insurance premium, which guarantees the Competitors cover for civil liability towards third parties (Public Liability). The indemnity provided under this insurance is the equivalent of €62'500 as total minimum liability cover. This insurance will commence from the beginning of the Rally until the end of the Event or up to the moment of permanent retirement or disqualification. Cars having retired and re-started shall not be considered to have permanently retired.

5.2 Additional Insurance

In addition to the insurance covered by the Organiser, all Competitors are required to provide their own insurance covering all cars used in Jordan to cover civil liability towards third parties for the entire duration of their visit in the case of foreign crews, or permanent cover in the case of Jordanian residents. This is to cover competitors while they are on the road sections, or on public roads or highways.

5.3 Exclusion of Cover

The service vehicles and cars used for reconnaissance, even those bearing special plates issued by the Organisers, are not covered by the insurance policy of the rally; hence, their insurance policies remain the sole responsibility of the owner.

5.4 Proof of Insurance

All Competitors must be able to present the insurance papers at the Administrative Checks. The burden of proof for a valid insurance rest solely on the competitor.

6 Advertising and Identification

6.1 Restrictions on Advertising

In accordance with Article 29.1 of the 2023 FIA RRSR; competitors are allowed to affix any kind of advertising to their cars, if:

- It is authorised by the national laws and the FIA regulations.
- It is not likely to give offence.
- It is not political or religious in nature.
- It respects the regulations on competition numbers.
- It does not interfere with the crew's vision through the windows.







- It complies with the provisions of Article 10.6.2 of the Code.
- 6.2 National Restrictions on Advertising
 - Tobacco: Advertising of tobacco, tobacco products and imitations, as well as smokers' requisites is forbidden according to the Jordanian legislation on cars, competition/service equipment and on the Team members' outfits.
 - Alcohol: Advertising of alcoholic beverages is strongly restricted by law and not allowed on competing cars, service cars, equipment, and clothes.

6.3 Identification Numbers & Compulsory Advertising

Competition Numbers, Rally Plates and Advertising will be provided by the Organiser and must be affixed as specified in accordance with Appendix 4 of these Supplementary Regulations before Scrutineering.

The text of the obligatory advertising is "2023 Jordan Rally".

6.4 Optional Advertising

Space is also required for the Optional Advertising. The text of the optional advertising will be announced in a bulletin.

- 6.5 Rally Plates
 - **6.5.1** The Organiser will provide each crew with the number identification, which must be affixed to their car in the stated positions prior to Scrutineering and must be visible for the duration of the rally. Details concerning the numbers and rally plates are available in Article 27 of the 2023 FIA RRSR.
 - 6.5.2 Any advertising within this identification is obligatory and may not be refused by the competitors. No modifications are allowed to these panels.
- 6.6 Rear Side Windows

The first initial(s) and surname of the driver and the co-driver, as well as the national flags of the country of the ASN from which they have obtained their competition licences, must appear on the rear side window on both sides of the car, adjacent to the competition number. The names must be:

- In white Helvetica.
- In upper case for the initial(s) and first letter of each name with the remainder in lower case.
- 6 cm high and with a stroke width of 1 cm.

The driver's name shall be the upper name on both sides of the car.

7 TYRES

7.1 Compliance

All tyres must comply with Article 13 and Variation V3 of the 2023 FIA RRSR.

- 7.1.1 Quantities, in addition to complying with the 2023 FIA RRSR, the following quantities and type of tyre are confirmed for use:
 - For competitors entered with RC2 & RGT cars, a maximum of 18 tyres may be used during the rally.
 - For competitors entered with RC3, RC4 and RC5 cars, a maximum of 14 tyres may be used during the rally.
- 7.2 Reconnaissance Tyres are free.
- 8 FUEL








As detailed in Articles 61, 62, and Variation 3 of the 2023 FIA RRSR.

The refuel zone is located at the Exit of the service park, other refuelling zones may be used and will be indicated on the Itinerary.









9.1 Procedure for Registration

- 9.1.1 Reconnaissance Cars must be in Conformity with Article 35.1 of the 2023 FIA RRSR
- 9.1.2 A reconnaissance Time Card will be supplied which must be carried in the car for the duration of the reconnaissance. This card will be signed appropriately recording every run on each special stage. Failure to present this card will result in refusal to participate in the reconnaissance. Photos of Driver & Co-Driver will be fixed on the record cards.
- 9.1.3 Competitors will be issued with 3 reconnaissance numbers that must be fixed to the front windscreen (top centre) and the right and left rear side windows and kept visible for the duration of the reconnaissance period.
- 9.1.4 These numbers and the record cards will be available from Rally Office at Rally HQ according to Article 3 Programme of these regulations.
- 9.1.5 As per Article 35.4.6 of the 2023 FIA RRSR, during each passage through a special stage, only the crew is permitted in the car.
- 9.2 Specific and National Restrictions
 - 9.2.1 In accordance with Article 35.4.3 of the 2023 FIA RRSR, each crew is limited to two passages on each special stage. Any repeated Special Stage is considered one Stage.
 - 9.2.2 The maximum speed on Special Stages during reconnaissance is 80 km/h, any infringement will be penalised in accordance with Article 34.2.2 of the 2023 FIA RRSR.
 - 9.2.3 The fitting or carrying of radar detection equipment during reconnaissance is prohibited.
- 9.3 Location for collection of Speed Control Checking Devices
 - As per Article 35.4.4 of the 2023 FIA RRSR Variation 3, a system of monitoring the speed, route conformity and position of reconnaissance cars during reconnaissance of all Special Stages by means of GPS tracking devices will be used.
 - These trackers must be collected from Rally Office at Rally HQ according to Article 3 Programme of these regulations.
 - The trackers and Reconnaissance Time Cards must be returned to Rally Office according to Article 3 Programme of these regulations.
- 9.4 Competitors Briefing
 - As per Article 35.6 Variation 3 of the 2023 FIA RRSR, a briefing will be given by the Clerk of the Course, his deputy, or an appointed official after the reconnaissance of Leg 2. The attendance of at least one crew member is compulsory.
 - The briefing will target specific points of the supplementary regulations relating to the organisation of the rally, give any clarification concerning the interpretation of the regulations, and remind the drivers of the safety provisions, either specific or general. Team managers may attend the meeting.
 - The briefing will take place according to Article 3 Programme of these regulations at the Rally HQ.
 - A fine of €100 or the equivalent in local currency is imposed on any crew that does not attend the briefing.
- 9.5 Participation in reconnaissance is not compulsory as per Article 35.4.1 of the 2023 FIA RRSR.
- 9.6 During reconnaissance the Special Stages are open to public traffic, crews need to be cautious.

10.2 Timetable

The Administrative Checks will take place in accordance with Article 3 Programme of these regulations at the Rally Office in the Rally HQ, the Team Manager/Representative may attend, the Driver and Co-driver are NOT required to attend. A Bulletin will be issued with the time schedule.

10.3 Late Arrival

Not abiding by the timetable will incur a penalty of €10 per minute late up to 10 minutes will be imposed on the competitors, after which the competitor will be reported to the Stewards.

11 SCRUTINEERING, SEALING AND MARKING

11.1 Venue and Timetable

- Venue: Service Park Dead Sea
- Timetable: According to Article 3 Programme of these regulations. Cars Individual times will be announced in a Bulletin.

Cars may be presented at Scrutineering by an official representative of the Team.

Not abiding by the timetable will incur a penalty of €10 per minute late up to 10 minutes will be imposed on the competitors, after which the competitor will be reported to the Stewards.

11.2 Mud flaps

Fitting of transversal mud flaps is permitted, provided they comply with Appendix J, Article 252.7.7.

11.3 Windows/Nets

The use of silvered/tinted windows is permitted as per Appendix J Article 253.11.

11.4 Driver's Safety Equipment

At Scrutineering, competitors must present all items of clothing including helmets and the head restraint (FHR device) intended to be used. Compliance with ISC, Appendix L Chapter III will be checked.

In reference to Article 53.2.2 of the 2023 FIA RRSR; each competing car shall carry a red "SOS" sign and on the reverse a green "OK" sign measuring at least 42 cm x 29.7 cm (A3). The sign must be placed in the car and be readily accessible for both drivers.







After Scrutineering, if a car is found not to comply with the technical and/or safety regulations, the Stewards may set a deadline before which the car must be made to comply, or they may refuse the start.

11.5 Noise Level

For safety reasons, on special stages only, the possibility of bypassing the exhaust silencer is recommended, provided that the exit of the exhaust gases is in conformity with Appendix J and, for cars fitted with a catalytic converter that the gases themselves pass through this catalytic converter. At any time on the road sections, the noise level must be in conformity with Appendix J.

11.6 Special National Requirements

Each competing car must be equipped with a first aid kit and one reflective triangle. Competitors are also reminded that in addition, two belt cutters must be always carried on board. They must be easily accessible to driver and co-driver when seated with their harnesses fastened (Appendix J, Article 253.6.1.3).

11.7 Installation of Safety Tracking System

11.7.1 As per Article 53.6 of the 2023 FIA RRSR Variation 3 – Tracking System

- For all rallies in the Championship, live satellite or GSM tracking, data recording and emergency signalling devices must be used to monitor the position, movement, and status of all competing cars always during the rally.
- Any attempt to tamper with or to interfere with the data recording devices fitted to competing cars, or any device that fails to record a trace due to interference by the crew, will be reported to the Stewards, who may impose a penalty that may go as far as disqualification.
- Any deviation will be reported to the Stewards, who may impose penalties at their own discretion.
- 11.7.2 All competitors must make provisions in their cars for the installation of the tracking system. For the installation instructions refer to article 21 – <u>Appendix 6</u> of these regulations.
- 11.7.3 A refundable deposit of €500, will be required from all competing cars. The deposit will be refunded upon returning the equipment.
- 11.7.4 Should a crew retire, the equipment must be returned immediately to the supplier of the units. The units may be removed in the final Parc Fermé, so the cars must not be locked.

11.8 On-Board Cameras: please refer to Article 18.1 of the 2023 FIA RRSR.

11.8.1 Additional notes

- The footage maybe recovered and used by the FIA Officials and Organisers.
- Only mountings attached by screws, metal screw clamps, quick clamping collars and metallic inserts are permitted (no bonding, double-sided tape, adhesive material, suction devices, etc.).
- It is forbidden to mount cameras on the outside of the car or for them to protrude beyond the bodywork.
- Non-compliance with these criteria will lead to the vehicle not being authorised to take the start. All camera positions and mountings used must be shown and approved during Scrutineering before the start of the competition.
- 11.8.2 The competitor of any car which carries an on-board camera must have the prior agreement of the Organiser. Authorised cameras will be identified by an adhesive decal and must be mounted in the car at the time of scrutineering. On board camera form is available online at <u>www.jordanrally.com</u> and on Sportity. The form must be submitted to <u>info@jordanrally.com</u> no later than *Monday, May 8th, 2023*.

- 12.1 Jordan Rally Ceremonial Start
 - The Ceremonial Start will take place at the Royal Automobile Museum Amman in accordance with Article 3 Programme of these regulations, it is mandatory to attend by all competitors.
 - A Holding Area will be setup on-site, Competitors MUST enter the Holding Area in accordance with Article 3 Programme of these regulations.
 - The Holding area will be secured. Access is limited to Crew members and Media representatives carrying the appropriate identification.
 - No Time Cards will be given, competitors will follow marshal's instructions.
 - A representative of the team may deliver the car.
 - Competitors reporting late to the Ceremonial start will be penalized with €30 per minute up to a maximum of 15 minutes. Thereafter, they will be reported to the Stewards who may apply penalties at their discretion.
 - The Ceremonial start will be in descending car number order, starting from the last competitor to the first.
 - Cars will start at one (1) minute interval. Then the cars will move to the Service Park and follow marshal's instructions.
 - It is mandatory for all crew members to wear their racing overalls and shoes during the Ceremonial Start. Crews not complying with this will be reported to the Stewards.
- 12.2 Electronic Start Procedure
 - We will be using RBI Sport system with their beams and timing equipment; special stages will be timed to the elapsed tenths of a second.
 - Please refer to article 22 <u>Appendix 7</u> of these regulations for the Start Light procedure in the Selective Sections
- 12.3 Finish Procedure
 - The rally will finish at "TC 12C" Service OUT Finish Holding IN; thereafter crews must follow the marshals' instructions during the Podium. From the Podium, Crews will immediately drive to the Final Parc Fermé.
 - Between "TC 12C" and Final Parc Fermé, cars are under Parc Fermé conditions and will be observed by marshals.

12.4 Permitted Early Check In

Crews may check in early without incurring a penalty at the following control:

- TC 6C End of Section 2 Leg 1 / Overnight Parc Fermé
- TC 12C End of Section 4 Leg 2 / Finish Holding IN
- 12.5 Super Special Stage
 - Not applicable
- 12.6 Special Procedures

12.6.1 Leg 1 – Section 1 – *Friday, May 19th, 2023, start procedure:*

- Start of Section 1 will be in accordance with Article 41.3 of the 2023 FIA RRSR. Cars will start from "TC 0" Service OUT.
- 12.6.2 Start Intervals
 - All cars will start at **3 minutes'** intervals, except for the Ceremonial Start, cars will start at **1 minute** interval.
- 12.6.3 Time cards change during the rally:

When retiring, the crew are obliged to hand their time card either to the next time control or otherwise to the Sweeper car.



20 APPENDIX 5 - EXTRACTS FROM FIA APPENDIX L

- 20.1 Chapter III Article 1 "Helmets"
 - 20.1.1 When the use of an FHR, according to article 3 below, is mandatory, drivers competing in circuit competitions, hill-climbs or rally special stages, registered on the FIA Calendar, must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the following standards:
 - 8858-2002 or 8858-2010 (Technical List N°41),
 - 8859 (Technical List N°49),
 - 8860-2010 (Technical List N°33), or
 - 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP (Technical List N°69)
- 20.2 Chapter III Article 2 "Flame-resistant clothing"
 - 20.2.1 In circuit competitions, hill-climbs, special stages of rallies and selective sections of crosscountry competitions entered on the International Sporting Calendar, all drivers and codrivers must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2000 standard (Technical List N°27) or FIA 8856-2018 standard (Technical List No 74).
 - 20.2.2 Embroidery sewn directly onto the overalls shall be stitched onto the outermost layer only, for better heat insulation. Backing material of badges and thread used for affixing them to the overalls must be flameproof. The stitching of badges can go through all the layers, provided that the thread is flameproof and compliant with ISO 15025. Printing or transfers on drivers' clothing must be carried out only by the manufacturer of the product and must not reduce the performance of the suit as defined in the 8856-2000 or 8856-2018 standard. (See Appendix 1 of the FIA 8856-2000 Standard or Appendix F of the FIA 8856-2018 Standard for detailed requirements and instructions for use). Any FIA-approved 8856-2018 garment customised using printing or transfers must be accompanied by a certificate from the manufacturer.
 - 20.2.3 Substances which may circulate in any cooling system worn by a driver are restricted to water, or air at atmospheric pressure. Water systems must not require the saturation of a garment in order to function.
 - 20.2.4 For competitions taking place in extreme heat, it is recommended that a cooling system be used (connected, for example, to the underwear designed for that purpose and homologated according to the FIA 8856-2000 standard or to the FIA 8856-2018 standard).
- 20.3 Chapter III Article 3 "Frontal Head Restraint"
 - 20.3.1 The wearing in an international competition of any device intended to protect the head or neck and attached to the helmet is prohibited unless the device has been homologated according to the FIA 8858 standard. Homologated FHR systems are listed in the FIA Technical List N° 29. The minimum reclined HANS collar angle shall be 60° from the horizontal.
 - 20.3.2 Any padding used between the driver and the HANS® yoke must not be more than 15 mm thick when the driver is seated in the car fully equipped with the harness tightened. The padding must be covered by a flameproof material in conformity with the standard ISO 15025 and the padding must not be wider than 8 mm on each side of the HANS® yoke.

20.3.3 The FHR device must be worn in accordance with:

- 20.4 Chapter III Article 4 "Safety Belts"

20.4.1 Drivers must be properly restrained in their seat by safety belts in conformity with the technical regulations for the vehicle concerned, at all times during a competition when it is mobile on a circuit, pit lane, special stage or competition course.

22 APPENDIX 7 – START LIGHT SEQUENCE



- 10 seconds before the start, the clock starts counting down and the digits 10 -> 9 -> 8 -> 7 ->
 6 -> etc. are displayed one after the other on the screen, together with a red flashing long line.
- At "00" seconds a steady green long line is displayed that gives the "GO" signal for a start.
