Dear Motorsport fans,

Croeso i Aberystwyth! It gives me great pleasure to welcome you to the third edition of Rali Ceredigion, Wales's original closed road rally. The Rali is one of the most important motorsport events in Wales, in a territory steeped in British and World Rallying history. This year's rally, which is based in Aberystwyth, has been extensively reworked and developed, and we welcome on board our new title sponsor, JDS Machinery.



We welcome a number of major championships, The FIA European Rally Trophy, the Tour European Trophy, the Motorsport UK British Rally Championship, the Motorsport UK Protyre Asphalt Championship, the JD Tyres Welsh National Tarmacadam Championship and the HRCR Stage Masters Challenge for Historic rally cars. It is a privilege for us to be part of all these Championships and we look forward to welcoming competitors from all parts of the UK, Ireland and Central Europe.

This year the start and finish ramp will be located on the promenade in Aberystwyth at the seafront. A ceremonial start kicks off proceedings on the evening of Friday 1st September. The stage action starts on the morning of Saturday 2nd September with a loop of three challenging closed road stages, followed by a lunchtime service halt in Aberystwyth, then a repeat of the three stages in the afternoon. On the Saturday evening, there will be two runs through the Aberystwyth Town Centre stage before the crews progress to Parc Ferme for the overnight halt. Sunday 3rd September brings more closed road stages, a loop of 3 in the morning, followed by a lunchtime service halt, then the same three stages repeated in the afternoon, after which the ceremonial finish will take place at the Promenade in Aberystwyth.

The total competitive special stage distance will be approximately 100 miles / 160km. The Rally HQ, Media Centre and Service Park will be centred in the Ceredigion County Council properties in Aberystwyth. Safety is of paramount importance to all of us organisers and competitors and we would ask everyone attending the event to cooperate fully with the Safety Marshals at all times.

The host town of Aberystwyth is a university centre with a population of 18,000. On the coast of Mid Wales, it is surrounded by the beautiful Cambrian mountains to the east and the Irish Sea to the west. It has many bars, restaurants, hotels and family attractions. Mwynhewch y Rali, Aberystwyth a Chymru!

1. INTRODUCTION

1.01 Event history

The inaugural running of the event on 8 September 2019, the first ever special stage rally to take place entirely on closed public roads in Wales, was a huge success. Thousands of spectators watched as 120 crews tackled the demanding competitive stages around Aberystwyth with Welsh crew Osian Pryce and Dale Furniss coming out on top.

As the highest profile international rally event in Wales, the 2022 event counted towards the Motorsport UK British Rally Championship, the FIA European Rally Trophy, the Tour European Rally and the Protyre Motorsport UK Asphalt Rally Championship – with New Zealand crew Hayden Paddon and Jared Hudson claiming victory. With sustainability as a core focus, it was the first UK event to fully offset the carbon emissions of all competitors and was the first UK rally to achieve the coveted FIA Environmental Accreditation.







1.02 A focus on sustainability: Promoting sustainable motoring

This year's event will continue to focus on sustainability, will once again offset all emissions associated with the competing vehicles and will introduce a number of ground-breaking initiatives to minimise its environmental impact.

Under the supervision of a dedicated Environmental Manager, the two fundamental goals are to introduce initiatives which will minimise the event's overall impact on the environment and to use the event as a platform to deliver a longer-term legacy of environmental improvement by using local partners to help promote the adoption of lower-carbon transport alternatives.

Rali Ceredigion was the first UK rally to run under the FIA's new environmental management accreditation in 2022 and we want to build on those foundations again this year.

Minimising vehicle movements associated with spectators, the provision of public transport options and waste recycling at all official spectator locations will also help reduce the impact on the environment.

The event will pioneer alternative low-carbon fuel options and spectators will be provided with the option to contribute towards responsible tree planting to offset their impact associated with the event.

5.02 Entry procedure

5.02.1 Entries submittal

Entries must be submitted in accordance with the FIA Regional Rally Regulations Articles 22 to 25. See also FIA International Sporting Code Articles 3.8 to 3.14.

5.02.2 Entry eligibility

Class RC2-RC5 and RGT are open to International licence holders and Motorsport UK and Motorsport Ireland National licence holders competing in cars which are eligible to compete in Classes RC2-RC5 and RGT.

Classes M1-M4, EH1 and H1 are open to foreign competitors who have permission from their ASN to compete. Foreign entrants, drivers and co-drivers must be holders of a National competition licence or above, and drivers must hold a road licence valid for driving within the UK.

Classes M1-M4, EH1 and H1 are also open to registered Competitors in the Championships listed in Article 2.1. Drivers must hold an RS Interclub - Stage Rally (UK only) licence or higher, or Motorsport Ireland equivalent. Co-drivers must hold an Interclub status licence or higher, or Motorsport Ireland equivalent.

5.02.3 Acceptance of entry

The online entry form (available at www.raliceredigion.co.uk) must be used to enter the event.

5.02.4 Entries allocation procedure

Fully completed and paid for entries submitted by the Entries Closing Date will be allocated in the following Priority:

The organisers will select approximately 20 entries at their discretion. No communication will be entered into regarding these.

Entries received over the maximum entry stated will be placed on a Reserve List.

If entries are withdrawn, reserves will be offered entries in the order in which they feature on the reserve list. Any crew placed on the reserve entry list may opt to withdraw their entry and will receive a full refund.

Competitor Championship Registrations will be checked and verified by the Organisers with the respective Championship Coordinators. Any Competitor who falsely states that they are registered for any of the above Championships will be placed at the bottom of the Reserve List, should one exist.

5.02.5 Withdrawal of entry

Entries can only be withdrawn in writing or email to the Entries Secretary at the nominated address or contact details as advised on the Official Entry Form.

5.02.6 Foreign competitors

Foreign competitors, drivers and co-drivers, must present an authorisation from their respective ASN according to Article 3.9.4 of the FIA International Sporting Code.

For each car of FIA Priority Drivers, one spare gearbox and one set of spare differentials (front and/ or centre and/or rear as applicable) may be used in the rally. These spare components and those fitted to the car will be sealed / marked at initial scrutineering. These cars must have their sump guards removed for sealing of gearboxes and differentials, and be kept with the car for the purposes of weighing.

The installation of the Safety Tracking System will be checked at Scrutineering.





The application of all Obligatory Organiser's Advertising will be checked at Scrutineering.

12.03 Mud flaps

12.05 Drivers' safety equipment

All items of clothing including helmets and FHR (Front Head Restraint) intended to be used, e.g. HANS devices must be presented for scrutineering. Please refer to Appendix 5 for a full list of safety equipment. They will be checked for compliance with FIA Appendix L, Chapter III.

12.06 Noise level

The organisers will conduct static sound tests prior to the start.

Competitors entered in FIA homologated vehicles must comply with FIA ISC Appendix J, Article 252.3.6. Failure to do so may result in disqualification of a refused start.

For Competitors in National vehicles, noise tests will be conducted in accordance with Motorsport UK Regulations R4.1 and J5.18. All competitors vehicles must pass these tests which will allow for a maximum of 100dBA at 4500 RPM using the 0.5 metre test.

12.07 Special national requirements

For all National classes, the Technical Regulations of the Motorsport UK Rally Regulations shall apply.

12.08 Installation of the safety tracking system

In association with Sporttraxx and Onthepacenote.co.uk, the rally will operate a mandatory GPRS safety tracking system that will enable the speed an deposition of each competing vehicle to be monitored and logged. Before the start, all cars will be fitted with a tracking device at the entry to Scrutineering. The tracker will remain active throughout the event. This must be retained in the car until the finish of the event where it will be removed by the system providers. Further information will be available in the final instructions.

Should you retire from the event, please return your tracking device to Rally HQ.

Failure to return the tracker or returning the tracker in a damaged state will result in a GBP £300.00 penalty for replacement of the unit. If the tracking device is not returned or payment has not been made to the supplier for loss or damage, the crew will be reported to Motorsport UK under Article C.1.1.13 and your competition licences will be suspended until payment is made or the undamaged tracking device is returned.





13. OTHER PROCEDURES & REGULATIONS

13.01.1 Ceremonial start procedures and order

The ceremonial start ramp will be located at the Promenade in Aberystwyth. Selected Competitors will pass over the ceremonial ramp. Competitors required to attend will be notified no less than seven days prior to the Event via email.

13.01.2 Starting order

The starting order will be in accordance with FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations Article 41.

13.01.3 Restart after retirement

Any crew which has failed to complete a Leg will be assumed to re-start the rally from the start of the next Leg. Competitors will be penalised in accordance with FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations Article 54.2.

Competitors who do not wish to restart must fill in the retirement form included at the back of the timecards and submit it to the CRO as soon as possible.

The competitor must advise the organiser in writing of the reason for retirement, e.g., accident, technical problems, etc, and the intention to have the car re-scrutineered. This shall apply to any car which has not been classified on the grounds of exceeding time limit or failure to report to a control, but shall not apply where the car has been disqualified for breach of eligibility requirements, traffic infringements or a decision of the Stewards.

13.02 Permitted early check in

Early check-in is permitted at the following controls:

Entry to Parc Ferme after Leg 1, TC 8A

13.03 Start procedure on special stages

Electronic Start Procedure

The electronic start procedure for is as follows:

30 seconds

15 seconds

10 seconds

5 seconds

START TIME

5 seconds after the time

RED light will be displayed
RED and AMBER lights will be displayed
RED light will go out
AMBER countdown 5,4,3,2,1
GREEN light goes ON
GREEN light goes OUT





The system is electronically coupled to a start line detection device that records any situation where the car leaves the start line ahead of the correct signal.

In the event of failure of the electronic system, the timekeeper will count down aloud: 30 seconds; 15 seconds; 10 seconds and the last 5 seconds one by one, and then raise a flag or hand for the competitor to start the stage.

In accordance with FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulation 48.4.3, any car not starting from the start line within 20 seconds after the start signal will be considered as retired and immediately moved to a safe place. This car will be allowed to re-start on the next day as per Article 54 of the Regional Championship Regulations.

13.04 Refuelling

Competing cars may only be refuelled using commercially available pump fuel at roadside filling stations specifically indicated in the roadbook, or in the refuelling zone provided by the organisers. No refuelling from cans, drums or similar is permitted in the Service Area or any other area outside of the defined Refuel Zone. Competitors are not permitted to use their own refuelling systems inside the Refuel Zone.

The Refuel Zone provided by the organisers will comprise of Vital Equipment who will be dispensing fuel within the area. Details of the fuel available can be found in Article 8.2.

The responsibility for refuelling is incumbent on the competitor alone. Only two team members in addition to the crew may enter the Refuel Zone for the purposes of refuelling the car.

In order to access the Refuel Zone all personnel involved in refuelling operations must wear clothing that provides adequate protection against fire and includes at least: long trousers, long-sleeved top, closed shoes, gloves and a balaclava, all in accordance with FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulation Article 61.2.3.

No person should be in the vehicle when refuelling is taking place and the engine should be switched off. Fuel should not be poured straight from a can and a hand pump must be used in the first instance, then either a funnel or other appropriate pouring attachment must be used.

When necessary as part of service that changing a fuel tank or any item of the fuel circuit, emptying and/or refilling is permitted in the service area, provided that:





- The work is carried out under the knowledge of the organisers, who are to be informed in writing in advance
- No other work is carried out on the car while the fuel circuit is open and/or empty and/or refilling
- A suitable safety parameter is established around the car
- Only sufficient fuel is added to reach the next refuel zone

13.05 Environmental Mat in a refuelling zone

The Organiser will protect the ground with an environmental mat.

13.05.1 Finish procedures and other activities after the finish of the rally 13.05.2 Finish ceremony

A finish ceremony will be held at the Final Time Control at Aberystwyth Promenade. All finishing crews and cars will be arranged in the finish holding area & media zone, prior to crossing the finish ramp. The finish ceremony shall be held generally in accordance with FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations Appendix 4.

13.06 Availability of participants

Competitors who park their vehicles in Parc Ferme after crossing the finish ramp must remain available (by mobile phone) until the final classification has been posted.

13.07 Classification

The official final classification will not be distributed after the event. It will be published on the Official Notice Board and Digital Notice Board.

13.08 Official time used during the rally

All clocks will be set to BBC / British Telecom time. Rally time can be checked by using www.time.is.

13.08.1 Gravel note crews

Gravel Note Crews are prohibited.

13.08.2 Damage declaration form

The damage declaration form on the rear of the timecards MUST be completed by the competitor and given to the CRO at the final control or as soon as possible after retirement. This form refers to any third party damage the competitor may have contributed to during all sections of the rally.

13.08.3 Timecards

Timecards will be issued at the Competitor Safety Briefing. Refer to Article 3 of these Supplementary Regulations for date, time and venue.
