2.9 Official Notice Board

During the event, individual and general communication between all Rally Officials (Rally Control/COC, Rally Secretariat, CRO, Stewards, Technical Staff etc.) and the competitors/crew members will primarily and as far as possible be conducted via Sportity App.

For this purpose, each competitor is required to nominate ONE official representative authorized for the purpose of receiving any official notifications. As some of these notifications can be issued while rally cars are on stages, this person can neither be the driver nor the co-driver. This person should be a team representative who is based in the Service Park during the event.

This contact (name, title, phone No., email) must be nominated before Friday 4th July 2025 and sent by email to info@emc-ug.com and will be used both for general and individual communications.

The Official Notice Board will be the Digital Notice Board (DNB), available in the Sportity App / CRO Whatsapp Group and published also on the rally website at www.emc-ug.com. There will be no physical official notice board. All competitors will be informed only by Sportity/Whatsapp notifications about the publication of any documents on the Digital Notice Board. Sportity app is downloadable for iOS devices on Appstore and for Android devices on Google Play. Channel password is EMCR25.

4.2 Entry Procedure

- 4.2.1 Anybody wishing to take part in this Rally must send a fully filled entry form, which is endorsed by their Club, together with the entry fee to the Rally Secretariat before the close of entries. Entries can be sent to info@emc-ug.com
- **4.2.2 For Foreign Competitors/Entries**, documentary proof of authorization from their parent ASN must accompany their entry form as per Article 2.3.7 of the FIA Sporting Code.
- 4.2.3 No amendments may be made to the entry form, except in the cases provided for in the present prescriptions. Should it turn out, at the time of scrutineering, that a car does not correspond in its presentation to the group and / or class in which it was entered, this car may, upon the proposal of the Scrutineers, be transferred to the appropriate Group and or Class upon the decision of the Stewards.
- 4.2.4 By the very fact of signing the Entry Form, the Competitor / Entrant and all the crew members submit themselves to the sporting jurisdictions specified in the International Sporting Code and its Appendices, the FMU National Competition Rules and these Supplementary Regulations.

- **4.3.2** In addition to cars such as described in 4.3.1,
 - Production cars (Group N) and Touring Cars whose homologation expired a maximum of 4 years previously, with Turbo restrictors and weights as currently valid in Group N of Appendix J (Maximum 33 mm restrictors).
 - Cars whose Group N homologation was extended by FIA to 30th December 2017 by special application, with Turbo restrictors and weights as currently valid in Group N of Appendix J (Maximum 33 mm restrictors).
 - **2WD Championship:** Cars of a 2 Wheel Drive transmission with naturally aspirated engines not exceeding 2000cc shall be permitted in this Championship.
- **4.3.3 Non-Homologated Cars (Group S):** Production and Touring vehicles whose homologation expired over 4 years previously and running total conformity with their FIA Homologation papers but with Turbo restrictors as currently valid for Group N (Maximum 33 mm).

In addition, vehicles not homologated by the FIA, in their original production form must meet the technical requirements of FIA Appendix J. Turbo charged or Supercharged engines must be fitted with restrictors as currently valid for group N (Maximum 33mm).

- **4.3.4** The Stewards may, for reasons of safety, re-seed all drivers including FIA seeded drivers.
- **4.3.5 Clubman Rally Championship:** shall be reserved for drivers in their 2nd year of competition with cars engines not exceeding 2000cc shall be eligible for this Championship

CRC competitors shall be classified as finishers after completing at least 60% of the total competitive distance of the event. A separate Itinerary shall be issued. (Article 7.3.3 FMU NCRS 2025)

5.0 INSURANCE

Competitors attention is drawn to the fact that Uganda Law requires all vehicles driven on a public road to be insured against Third party Risks. It is the Competitors responsibility to ensure that they are properly covered. Competitors are further reminded that during transport or liaison sections, all competitors shall be governed by the current Uganda Road and Traffic Act.

Note: The entry fees include the insurance premium that will cover the competitor for "Limited" third party civil liability during the rally. This insurance is as follows

This policy does not cover personal accidents to driver and co-driver.

So Drivers are encouraged to source their own personal or team insurance cover for this event.

5.2 Competitors and / or drivers take part entirely at their own risk. The Organizer declines liability in any accident caused by or to competitors and their vehicles during the running of the event.

Competitors shall be entirely responsible for any accident or breach of laws in which they may be involved and will declare in writing to the Organizer particulars of any incident from which liability may arise and shall indemnify the Organizer in regard to any liability to any person whatsoever.







- A competitor and / or Driver shall have no claim against the Organizer or the owners of private property arising out of any act or default of or by them, their servants or officials, before, during or after the Rally.
- The Organizer strongly recommends that every crew member of a competing vehicle be insured for personal accident.
- Any accident, which may give rise to a claim under any insurance cover relating to the event, must be reported to the Organizer in writing as soon as possible.
- 5.6 Under no circumstances will any entrant, driver, service crew, or official admit any liability or sign any form of paper, which may admit or imply liability in any accident or incident, which may arise.
- The organizers insurance cover will come into effect from the Official start of the rally and will cease at the end of the rally.
- 5.8 The service vehicles, even those bearing special plates issued by the Organizer, are not official participants in the rally. They are therefore **not** covered by the insurance policy of the rally and will remain the sole responsibility of their owners.

6.0 ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATION

The Competition numbers, Rally plates and other advertising shall be affixed on the car before scrutineering. (See Appendix 4)

6.1 Rally Plates:

The organizers will supply each crew with 1 set of Rally plates as stipulated in Appendix 4

6.2 Identification Numbers

6.2.1 Rally Plates / Competition Numbers and Drivers names Competition Numbers:

The Organizer will provide each crew with the following which must be affixed to their car in the positions stated.

 $2 ext{ x front door panels measuring 67 cm long by 17 cm high including a 1 cm white surround. This panel shall comprise a 15 cm x 15 cm competition number box which shall always be at the front of the panel.$

Numerals will be fluorescent yellow (PMS 803) of height 14 cm and stroke width 2 cm on a matt black background. The remainder of the door panel is reserved for use of the Organizer.

Each panel shall be placed horizontally at the leading edge of each front door with the number at the front. The top of the plate shall be between 7 cm and 10 cm below the bottom window line.







6.2.3 No signage, other than the colour scheme of the car, shall be placed within 10 cm of the panel.

6.3 Driver and Co-Driver Names

- 6.3.1 The names of the Driver & Co-Driver **must** appear with his / her competition licence national flag on the rear side window of both sides of the car, under the competition number. The first initial(s) and surname of both driver and co-driver shall be: In addition Names shall also appear in the front fenders.
 - In white Helvetica: upper case for the initial(s) and first letter of each name with the remainder in lower case.
 - To a height of 6 cm and stroke width of 1.0 cm.
- **Class Plates:** The organizers will supply 2 Class plates per competing car.

7.0 TYRES

The use of slick or studded tyres is prohibited. The inside of the tyre must be filled only with air. Any device or material used to maintain the tyre inflation is prohibited.

8.0 FUEL

The maximum lead content permitted in Uganda is 0.85 grams/litre.

The use of AVGAS and other competition fuels is permitted except for cars entered under the FMU 2WD Championship.

8.1 Fuel Distribution

Competitors are entirely responsible for providing and distributing their own fuel throughout the event. Fuel Zones will be used.

9.0 RECONNAISSANCE

Reconnaissance is not practice. The Traffic Act of Uganda must be strictly adhered to and safety and rights of other road users respected. During reconnaissance, any speeding offence whether recorded by police or officials on a competitive section or on a road section, will result in a penalty being levied by the relevant authorities or the Stewards.

9.1 Registration

9.2 Specific and /or national restrictions

Competitors are only legally exempt from Uganda's speed limits during the rally in live competitive sections.

- **9.2.1** Reconnaissance Cars: Series production cars allowed. Art. 35.1.2 Specific Prescriptions for all FMU Rally Championships shall apply.
- 9.2.2 Reconnaissance is considered a safety factor and hence must be undertaken by all crews.







Any crew that will fail to undertake reconnaissance will be reported to the stewards.

9.2.3 Crews may share a vehicle during reconnaissance.

9.3 Speed limits

The maximum speed allowed during reconnaissance is **50 km/h** on special stages unless a lower speed limit is indicated by traffic signs or by written instructions in the Road Book (or in Bulletins). All crews are reminded of **Art. 35.4.4** in the 2025 NCRS.

Liaison Speeds limits will be monitored and penalized as per art. **35.2.2.** Maximum allowed is **80km/hr and 50km/hr** through trading centers. **NB, There is no Speed lift instrument for Liaison Sections**

11.0 SCRUTINEERING

Scrutineering: TBA

- Any crew and car reporting after scheduled time as given in these supplementary regulations shall incur a penalty of UGX 1,000/= for every minute late.
- Any crew and car reporting 1 hour after scheduled time will not be allowed to start except in cases of force majeure duly recognized as such by the Stewards.
- 11.1.3 The crew must show the cars homologation form as well as any appendices to this form. If these are not submitted, the Stewards may pronounce a penalty, which may go as far as refusal to allow the car to start.
- 11.1.4 The Crew must also present valid driver's license, Competitor's License, Third Party Insurance for the Car, Crash Helmets and FIA Clothing.
- 11.1.5 It is not necessary for the crews to be present during scrutineering before the start; however, their representative must be duly designated in writing.

 Only two persons per car shall be allowed at the scrutneering.







12.0 FEATURES OF THE RALLY

12.1 Start Area / Start Parc Fermé

12.1.1 All cars shall be in the start Parc Fermé 30 minutes before the official start. Failure shall incur a penalty of UGX 100,000.

12.1.2 Start; Friday 11th July 2025

12.1.3 General Conditions

While the cars are subject to Parc Fermé rules, any repair or refuelling is strictly forbidden; any breach of these regulations shall be reported to the Stewards who may impose a penalty as indicated in Article 12 of the International Sporting Code.

Note: There shall be a technical Zone immediately after the Parc Fermé.

Strictly No-Smoking and consuming of alcohol in Parc Fermé.

12.1.4 Starting System:

12.1.4.1 Competitive Sections.

Rally-time Clocks with a starting light system equivalent to Traffic Lights. The system signals as follows:

30/20/10 seconds before start time : Orange Light for 1 second.
 5 seconds to start time : Orange Light for 3 seconds
 2 seconds to start time : Red Light for 1 second.
 1 second to start time : Orange Light for 1 second.

Start time : Green Light.

12.1.4.2 Should these Rally-time clocks fail the start will be signalled by the marshal in accordance with the FMU NCRs.

12.1.4.3 Start Interval

Start of Special Stages: **3** Minute interval Or at the discretion of the COC.

NOTE: START ORDER shall be in **REVERSE-ORDER** system

- Any late arrival by a crew at the start of the Rally, of a Leg or Section shall be **penalized** by **10 seconds for every minute** or fraction of a minute late. Any crew reporting more than **15 minutes** late shall **not** be allowed to start.
- **12.2.1** The Stewards may amend exclusion times, assign times or nullify any road or competitive section if conditions make this necessary.







12.2.2 A false or jump start, particularly one made before the signal has been given, will be penalized according to Art. 48.6 (FMU NCRs) as follows:

1st offence : 10 seconds 2nd offence : 1 minute 3rd offence : 3 minutes

Further offences: At the discretion of the Stewards.

The Stewards may impose heavier penalties if they judge it necessary.

12.2.3 Tracking is mandatory in this event. All vehicles shall be installed with a tracking device. All vehicles shall appear at scrutineering with their tracking devices already installed and the device shall be connected direct from the vehicles main charging battery.

Recce Cars will be registered and fitted with Trackers

Specially designated tracking officers shall be monitoring all participating vehicles.

Any crew/vehicle which disappears on the tracking radar for up to a minute shall be required to press the panic button for safety follow up.

Any crew/vehicle disappearing from the tracking radar for a minute and more without pressing the panic button shall be subjected to stewards hearing with options of penalties ranging from 10 minutes to disqualification.

Service Parks

Strictly No Smoking and Consuming of Alcoholic drinks in the Service Parks.

12.2.4 A designated re-fuel zone shall be set up adjacent to the Time Control out of Service Parks.

12.3 Start Area / Start Parc Fermé.

All cars shall be in the start ParcFermé at **Across the Bridge Resort** by 0630hrs on Friday 11th July 2025. Cars reporting beyond the times of 0700hras shall incur a cash penalty of 50,000/= UGX. Cars reporting after their gazzeted start time as per published start list on each leg shall NOT be allowed to start the event.

12.4 Super Special Stage

There shall be a Super Special Stage and the starting order shall be entirely at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

If a car fails to correctly complete a Super Special stage, it may be removed by the organizers to an adjacent Service Park, where it may be repaired according to the Supplementary regulations and the itinerary. Alternatively, the car will be placed on the road section after the "OUT" Control of the Super Special Stage. In either







case, the crew will be allotted a stage time of 5 minutes plus the fastest time of that loop.

Any such car will be deemed to have reported to the respective Time Controls immediately following the Special Super Stage at its due time, in either case, the crew shall be subject to all normal rules, regulations, service restrictions and time penalties applying to the rally.

Any crew recording an actual time in excess of 5 minutes plus the fastest time will also be allotted a maximum time of 5 minutes plus the fastest time.

12.5 Change of Time Cards during the Rally

Time Cards shall be issued to each competing crew after administrative checks. Time Cards are to be handed in as per time table below:

TC 1A, 2A, 2D, 2F, 4A, 6A, 7A & 7B. These **MUST** be handed in as indicated.

It is the sole responsibility of the Competitor to ensure that the entries made in his Time Cards are correct before leaving a Control.

12.7 Official Time

The official time during the event shall be East Africa Standard Time (GMT + 3 hours). An official clock at the start shall display the official time.

The Chief Marshal shall synchronize all official clocks. The 0 car shall also check them.

13.0 IDENTIFICATION OF OFFICIALS

Time Control - A red reflective vest / tag in various colours indicating duty / hierarchy.

An identification tag shall be used to identify the various officials.



Notes for Competitors and Medical Boards

INCIDENT ON A SPECIAL STAGE

40.3.1 In the case of an accident where urgent medical attention is required, the followingapplies:

- The SOS switch on the emergency console must be activated as soon as possible (ifapplicable).
- When possible, the red "SOS" sign should immediately be displayed to the following carsand to any helicopter attempting to assist.
- As soon as possible, the red reflective triangle must be placed in a conspicuous position on the same side of the road as the car at least 50 metres before the car's position, in order towarn following drivers, even if the car is off the road.
- **40.3.2** Any crew which has the red "SOS" sign displayed to them, or which sees a car which has suffered an accident, and the OK sign is not shown, shall immediately and without exception stop to render assistance. All following cars shall also stop. The second car at the scene shall proceed to inform the next safety marshal on stage. Subsequent cars shall leave a clear route for emergency vehicles. All crews stopped by this procedure will be allocated a time according to Art. 39.
- **40.3.3** In the case of an accident where immediate medical intervention is not required, or of a carstopping for any other reason on or beside a special stage, whether temporarily or permanently, the following applies:
 - The OK switch on the emergency console must be activated within one minute (if applicable)
 - The green "OK" sign must immediately be displayed to the following cars and to any helicopter attempting to assist. If the crew leaves the vehicle, the "OK" sign must bedisplayed so that it is clearly visible to all other competitors.
 - The red triangle must be placed in a conspicuous position on the same side of the road as thecar by a member of the crew at least 50 metres before the car's position, in order to warn following drivers, even if the car is off the road.
- **40.3.4** Should it not be possible, for whatever reason, to display the **OK/SOS** board in any of theabove situations, this may be replaced by an evident and clearly understandable sign language shown by the crew outside of the car:
 - an arm and thumb up to indicate "OK"







• Crossed arms above the head to indicate "SOS".



40.3.5 Any crew which is able but fails to comply with the above rules will be reported by the clerkof the course to the Stewards.

RED FLAG Procedure:

The Provisions of article 5.5.4.3 of the Regional Championship regulations shall apply.
