#### **Art. 3.5 – REGISTRATION (Reminder)**

*In order to score points in the Championships, Competitors must register with the FIA, by using the registration form which can be found at: <https://registrations.fia.com/rally>*

*Registration must be made only with the name of the Competitor (as it appears on the international Competitors' licence), at the latest before the beginning of the first rally in which he wishes to score points. However, points will not be awarded retrospectively.*

### **1.1 Preamble**

Qatar International Rally will be run in compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code (ISC) including appendices, the 2025 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations including appendices, the ASN Rally Regulations (only when related to national cars) the WADA/NADA Codes, and the FIA Anti-Doping Regulations, as amended from time to time. The National Road Traffic Regulations shall apply. Unless provided otherwise by these Supplementary Regulations, the provisions of the above Rules and Regulations shall apply.

Any modifications, amendments and/or additions to these Supplementary Regulations shall be made in the form of numbered and dated bulletins.

If one of the drivers will be the competitor, he must hold a valid a competitor's licence and a driver's competition licence.

In compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code, foreign entrants/drivers must be in possession of the approval of their own ASN which must accompany the entry form.

A copy of the bank transfer must be attached to the application form. Please ensure that the entrant's name and account holder are included as reference on all bank transfers. Any bank charges incurred must be paid by the entrants in addition to the entry fees.

#### **4.6 Refund of entry fees**

Entry fees will be refunded in full:

- To candidates whose entry has not been accepted.
- In the case of the rally not taking place.
- In the case of force majeure for the competitor, after investigation by the Stewards.

### **5. INSURANCE**

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**5.1** The organizer provides a third-party liability insurance with a coverage limit per any one occurrence of 1.000.000 € (one million euro).

The insurance cover will be in effect for competitors running within the itinerary of the rally, from the start of the first competition element until the end of the rally or at the moment of permanent retirement or disqualification.

Cars having retired and re-started shall not be considered to have permanently retired.

**5.2** In case of an accident, the competitor or his representative must notify the Clerk of the Course in writing as quickly as possible and within 24 hours. He must explain the circumstances under which the accident occurred, eventual causes and consequences. Likewise, he must mention the names and addresses of any witnesses. He must also mention the names and addresses of any eventual injured people.

**5.3** Competitors are reminded that only damage caused to third parties by the organizers and the entered drivers is covered by the insurance policy taken by the organization. Injury to the drivers themselves or damage to participating cars is not covered by this insurance.

**5.4** Entrants and competitors are free to take on at their own convenience any individual insurance policy that they deem fit, independently from the abovementioned liability insurance.

**5.5** The service vehicles, even those bearing special plates issued by the organizers, may never be considered as official participants in the rally. They are therefore not covered by the insurance policy of the rally and remain the sole responsibility of their owner.

**5.6** In addition to the insurance cover provided by the organizer, all competitors are required to provide their own insurance covering all cars used in Qatar to cover civil liability towards 3rd parties for the entire duration of their visit in the case of foreign crews, or permanent cover in the case of Qatari residents.

A copy of such insurance cover must be presented to the organizer, alternatively a declaration of indemnity accepting full financial and legal responsibility must be provided.

5.7 By submitting their entries, the competitors, drivers and car owners waive any claims or rights to pursue action for damages in connection with the event against the organizer.

## 6. ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATION

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As per FIA RRSR Arts. 27 and 29.

Identification numbers, rally plates and organiser's advertising must be affixed to the car for scrutineering and must be visible for the duration of the rally.

See Appendix 4 of these SRs "Decals and positioning of supplementary advertising".

### 6.1 Obligatory organiser's advertising

Rally plate: Qatar International Rally / QMMF

Competition number: Qatar International Rally / QMMF

The organiser will provide each crew with the number identification (67x17cm), which must be affixed to their car in the stated positions prior to scrutineering. Each panel shall be placed horizontally at the leading edge of each front door, with the number at the front. The top of the plate shall be between 7 cm and 10 cm below the lower limit of the window. It is not allowed to cut the panel.

### 6.2 Additional organiser's advertising

Additional organiser's advertising: QMMF.

Spaces on the vehicle that must be kept free: See Appendix 4 of these SRs

### 6.3 Advertising restrictions

Advertising of alcoholic products, tobacco, inappropriate topics or pictures, political subjects, or any advertising that is prohibited by the laws of state of Qatar or which may cause offence are not permitted.

### 6.4 Driver and Co-driver identification

As per FIA RRSR Art.28, except that no flag is allowed beside the driver and/or co-driver first initial(s) and surname.

## 7. TYRES

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### 7.1 Regulations regarding tyres which may be used during the rally

See FIA RRSR Art. 13 (tyres and wheels).

In addition to complying with the FIA RRSR, the following quantities of tyres are confirmed for use during the rally:

### 7.2 Tyres for use on reconnaissance

Tyres for use on reconnaissance are free.

## 8. FUEL - REFUELLING

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As per FIA RRSR Arts. 61 and 62.

All types of fuel must follow ISC Appendix J Art. 252.9. (RRSR V3 Art. 62).

The official refuel zone located at the exit of the service park will be operational during the following periods:

\* A short deviation is necessary to access the filling station (total route excess: 450 m). The alternative route will be shown in an appendix at the end of the road book.

## 9. RECONNAISSANCE OF SPECIAL STAGES

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Reconnaissance will be according to FIA RRSR Art. 35. The schedule for the reconnaissance is published in Appendix 2 of these supplementary regulations.

### 9.1 Procedure for registration

Reconnaissance registration will take place at Rally Office according to the rally program. A reconnaissance registration form must be completed before commencing reconnaissance. The crews must register in person.

Competitors will be issued with three reconnaissance numbers (that must be fixed to the top right corner of the windscreen & rear side windows) and one rear windscreen plate.

Rally cars used in the event may not be used for reconnaissance.

Should a crew's reconnaissance car be replaced for any reason, the secretariat must be informed of the details of the replacement car.

A reconnaissance record card will be supplied which must be carried in the car for the duration of the reconnaissance. This card will be stamped appropriately recording every run on each special stage. Failure to produce this card will result in refusal to participate in the reconnaissance.

This procedure will not apply for the reconnaissance of SSS1.

Reconnaissance record cards must be returned to the Rally Office according to the program.

### 9.2 Specific regulations

**9.2.1** During reconnaissance, all national traffic regulation must be followed, including but not limited to the speed limits. Please note that the Special Stages will not be closed to public traffic during reconnaissance.

**9.2.2** Unless a lower limit is indicated by traffic signs or by written instructions in the road book or in a bulletin, the maximum speed on special stages during reconnaissance is 90 kph.

The speed of reconnaissance cars during reconnaissance (as well as their routing and position) will be monitored by means of GPS tracking devices.

Speeding during reconnaissance will be penalized according to FIA RRSR Art. 34.2.2.

**9.2.3** Reconnaissance of the super special stage is allowed only on foot during the period mentioned in the programme, without limitation of the number of passages.

### **9.3 Collection / return of speed control checking devices**

All reconnaissance cars must be equipped with a speed control checking device that will be available at the Rally Office during reconnaissance registration. The equipment must be returned to the Rally Office together with the reconnaissance record cards according to the rally program.

## **10. ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS**

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### **10.1 Documents to be presented**

To keep the time required for the administrative checks to the necessary minimum, make sure to bring and present the following documents:

- Competitor's license
- Driver's and Co-driver's competition licenses
- Driver's and Co-driver's valid driving licenses
- Driver's and Co-driver's ID cards / passports
- ASN authorization for all foreign competitors and/or drivers
- Car registration papers
- Car insurance cover certificate
- Car owner authorization to participate in the rally (if not one of the crew members)
- Driver declarations and undertakings forms, signed by the Driver and Co-driver

### **10.2 Timetable**

According to the rally programme. A detailed schedule will be issued by means of a bulletin.

Any delay on the presentation at administrative checks will result in the following penalties:

## **11. SCRUTINEERING, SEALING AND MARKING**

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### **11.1 Scrutineering, venue and time**

Cars may be presented at scrutineering by a representative of the team.

See programme (SR Art. 3). A detailed schedule will be published by means of a bulletin.

Any delay on the presentation at the time control installed at the entrance of the holding area will result in the following penalties:

< 15 minutes	€ 100	> 30 minutes	€ 200
16 to 30 minutes	€ 150	> 60 minutes	Start may be denied

Cars must be presented at scrutineering with the competition numbers, rally plates and all advertising (compulsory and optional) affixed.

### Scrutineering mandatory documents

- Cars' complete certified homologation
- SOS / OK board (DIN A3 format)

For each car of the **FIA Priority Drivers**, one spare gearbox and one set of spare differentials (front and/or center and/or rear) may be used in each rally. These spare components and those fitted to the car will be marked/sealed at initial scrutineering. These cars must have their sump guards removed for sealing of gearboxes and differentials and be kept with the car for the purpose of weighing.

The installation of the tracking system will be checked at scrutineering.

On-board camera positions and mountings (see SRs Art. 12.12) will be checked at scrutineering.

#### **11.2 Mud flaps**

See ISC Appendix J, Art. 252.7.7.

#### **11.3 Windows**

See ISC Appendix J, Art. 253.11.

#### **11.4 Driver's safety equipment**

All items of clothing including helmets and FHR (Front Head Restraint) intended to be used, e.g. HANS devices, must be presented for scrutineering. They shall be checked for compliance with Appendix L, Chapter III.

#### **11.5 Noise level**

On special stages only, the possibility of bypassing the exhaust silencer is recommended, provided that the exit of the exhaust gases is in conformity with Appendix J and, for cars fitted with a catalytic converter, that the gases themselves pass through this catalytic converter. At any time on the road sections the noise level must be in conformity with Appendix J.

#### **11.6 Installation of safety tracking equipment**

For every vehicle, it is mandatory to mount a tracking system, live satellite tracking, data recording and emergency signalling device that will be used to monitor the position, movement and status of all competing cars at all times during the rally. This apparatus will be provided by the organiser.

The installation of the provided tracking system will be checked at scrutineering.

Any misuse of the system(s) during the rally will result in the competitor being reported to the Stewards who may impose penalties which may go as far as exclusion.

## **12. OTHER PROCEDURES**

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### **12.1 Rally start**

The official start of the rally will be at TCO (Lusail Boulevard).

Cars must be driven by one of the drivers or a team representative to the Start area, where they will enter between 16.30h and 17.00h.

Any delay on the presentation at the time control installed at the entrance of the Start area will result in the following penalties:

< 15 minutes	€ 100	> 30 minutes	€ 200
16 to 30 minutes	€ 150	> 60 minutes	Start may be denied

Tyre marking for SSS1 will be done in the Start area.

The Start area will be under vigilance. Access to the Start area is limited to team members and media representatives with appropriate identification.

No service will be allowed inside the Start area.

## **12.2 Electronic start procedure**

See Appendix 6 of these supplementary regulations.

## **12.3 Finish procedures**

The competitive element of the rally will conclude at TC13C. From this point, all cars are subject to Parc Fermé rules until the Parc Fermé is opened at the instruction of the Stewards.

Competitors are reminded that attendance at the finish ceremony and prize giving is compulsory for all classified crews and crew members must wear their approved overalls.

In the event a car is not driveable for the above procedure, this must be reported to the clerk of the course and the crew members concerned must still attend the podium finish ceremony.

Immediately after the publication of the Final Classification and opening of the Parc Fermé a convoy will be organized for all classified rally cars from the Service Park to the location of the Prize Giving (Lusail Boulevard). Cars may be driven by the crew or by one team member.

Post-event Press Conference (for invited drivers only) will take place at 18.30h.

Prize Giving Ceremony will start at 19.00h. Cars will pass by the ramp in reverse order of the final classification.

After the conclusion of the ceremony cars will be released and may be driven back to the service park.

## **12.4 Permitted early check-in**

Crews are authorised to check in before time without incurring any penalty at the following time controls:

- **TC1A / TC7A / TC13C**
- **TC7C** (FIA RRSR Art. 59.2.4).

## **12.5 Super special stage procedure and running order**

SSS1 (LCSC Karting Academy) will be run under Super Special Stage regulations (FIA RRSR Art. 51).

A tarmac circuit of approx. 1,09 km will be used for this purpose.

The start will be given to two cars at the same time in the same manner as for the other stages. The two cars will start at opposite points of the circuit. For each car, the flying finish line will coincide with its own start line.

The organisers reserve the right to “match” competing vehicles for the super special stage on grounds of public interest.

For any competitor,

- SSS1 will consist of 2 runs
- in each run he will do 2 complete laps to the circuit
- for the second run he will use a different start/finish line
- the time on SSS1 will be obtained by adding his times on Run 1 and Run 2
- a touch in any barrier, the displacement of a tire or the overthrow of any plastic cone used to define the limits of the track will be penalised by 5 seconds to be added to the total time of the competitor.

The total length of SSS1 will be 4,36 km (2 runs x 2 laps x 1,09 km).

The maximum time allowed to complete each run of SSS1 will be 4 minutes.

Any crew who does not start SSS1 or fails to complete any run within this maximum time will be considered as retired on Section 1 and will incur penalties as laid down in FIA RRSR Art. 54.2.

If the running of SSS1 is interrupted, this will be signalled to the drivers by showing red flags. When given this signal, the driver must immediately reduce speed and follow instructions of any marshals or other officials. Failure to comply with this rule will incur a penalty at the discretion of the Stewards.

If the super special stage is interrupted or stopped for any reason, the dispositions of FIA RRSR Art. 52 will apply.

With reference to FIA RRSR Art. 44.2.6, the start time for Run 2 will be considered as the special stage start time, which will be entered in the timecard at the Stop control.

## **12.6 Special procedures and activities**

### **12.6.1 Availability of participants**

Participants who park their vehicles in the Parc Fermé upon passing the finish line, must remain available by phone (mobile) until the final classification has been posted.

### **12.6.2 Classification**

The official final classification will not be distributed after the event. The final classification will be published on the DNB (Sportity APP – Password **QIR2025**).

### **12.6.3 Organisers' promotional activities**

- Thursday, 6 February – Pre-rally Press Conference (according to the programme)
- Saturday, 8 February – Post-rally Press Conference (according to the programme)

The list of drivers requested to attend each function will be issued by means of a CoC Communication.

## **12.7 Official time used during the rally**

Official time throughout the entire rally will be that of GPS.

## **12.8 Briefing**

The pre-rally briefing will be on a written form and posted on the DNB at the time indicated in the programme.

## **12.9 Starting intervals**

Minimum start interval will be 2 minutes for all cars except on section 1 (TC0) where it will be 1 minute minimum.

## **12.10 Timecard change during the rally**

Timecards will be issued at the following time controls:

**TC0 / TC1B / TC4A / TC7A / TC7D / TC10A.**

## **12.11 Compulsory itinerary of the rally**

The compulsory itinerary of the rally is defined in the Road Book by the road direction diagrams and, between the road direction diagrams, by the defined roadway. Any deviation will be reported to the Stewards (cf. FIA RRSR Art. 19.2).

To clearly define the limits of the road and to minimize accidental situations of shortcutting, the route of the special stages will be marked by a number of QMMF flags – maroon colour on the right side and white colour on the left side of the route – each one associated to a metallic fence.

The dimensions of the fence and the flag as well as the aspect of the set are shown in Appendix 7.

Any touch on a metallic fence and/or the associated flag as well as a deviation from the route limits defined by the flags will be penalised as follows:

- 1<sup>st</sup> offence: 5 seconds
- 2<sup>nd</sup> offence: 10 seconds
- 3<sup>rd</sup> offence: 30 seconds
- Beyond 3 offences: penalty at the discretion of the Stewards.

The sets flag/metallic fence will be already in place during reconnaissance.

Further sets flag/metallic fence may be placed by the organisers where they believe competitors have deviated from the roadway during reconnaissance or the first running of the stages. All modifications made will be informed to all competitors before the start of the concerned stage (cf. article 19.2 of FIA RRSR).

### 12.12 On-board cameras

See FIA RRSR Art. 18.1.

If required by the Organiser, a competitor must carry an on-board camera or other recording device. This will be fitted by the supplier of the recording device and must be approved by the scrutineers.

The competitor who wishes to carry an on-board camera in his car must have the prior agreement of the Organiser and supply the following information no later than one week before the start of reconnaissance: competitor's name, car number, competitor's address, use of footage and model name of the device(s) used.

All camera positions and mountings used must be shown and approved during scrutineering before the start of the competition.

### 12.13 Power Stage

With reference to FIA RRSR / V3 Art. 50.1, SS13 - Al Thakhira 2 will be the Power Stage.

## 15. FINAL CHECKS AND PROTESTS

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### 15.1 Final checks

The final checks will take place close to the service park (same place of pre-event scrutineering) after the arrival of the cars at TC13C.

Any teams required to undergo final checks must immediately follow the instruction of the marshals in charge, even if this prevents them from proceeding to one or more time controls (TC).

A representative of the entrant must be present at the final checks, as well as mechanics and proper equipment, would the scrutineers wish to dismantle the car.

The complete original FIA homologation form and other necessary certifications must be available for final checks. For national cars the corresponding original ASN documents must be available.

### 15.2 Protest deposit fees

The protest deposit fee is: € 1.000.

If a protest requires the dismantling and reassembly of a clearly defined part of the car, any additional deposit will be specified by the Stewards upon a proposal of the Chief Scrutineer.

### 15.3 Appeal deposit fees

- Sum for international appeal deposit (FIA): € 3.000.
- Sum for national appeal deposit (QMMF): QR 8.000. (only for the national event)

All protests and/or appeals must be lodged in accordance with ISC Arts. 13 & 15 and, where applicable, with the FIA Judicial and Disciplinary Rules.

### **1. Helmets (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art.1)**

All drivers and co-drivers must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the following FIA standards:

- 8859-2015 (Technical List N°49),
- 8859-2024 or 8859-2024-ABP (Technical List N°107)
- 8860-2010 (Technical List N°33) or
- 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP (Technical List N°69)

### **2. Frontal Head Restraint (FHR, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3)**

All drivers and co-drivers must use FIA approved FHR systems homologated to FIA standard 8858.

Approved FHRs, anchorages and tethers are listed in Technical List N° 29.

See also helmet compatibility chart in Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3.3.

### **3. Flame-resistant clothing (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2)**

All drivers and co-drivers must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2000 standard (Technical List N°27) or 8856-2018 (Technical List N° 74).

Please pay special attention to the prescriptions of Art. 2 concerning embroidery and printing on flame-resistant clothing (manufacturer certificates etc.) as well as concerning the correct wearing of the clothing elements!

See also Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Article 53.1.

### **4. Biometric Devices (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2.1)**

Drivers may wear a device to collect biometric data during racing.

- If the biometric device is integrated into a protective garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856, the garment shall be homologated to FIA Standards 8856 and 8868-2018.
- If the biometric device is a stand-alone device, then the device must be homologated to FIA Standard 8868-2018 only. This device must be worn in addition to the garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856.

### **5. Wearing of jewellery (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 5)**

The wearing of jewellery in the form of body piercing or metal neck chains is prohibited during the competition and may therefore be checked before the start.
