1.1 General information

RALLY ITALIA SARDEGNA 2025 will be run in compliance with the 2025 FIA International Sporting Code and its appendices, the 2025 FIA World Rally Championship Sporting Regulations, the National Sporting Regulations which comply with the FIA regulations and these Supplementary Regulations. Modifications, amendments and/or changes to these Supplementary Regulations will be announced only by numbered and dated Bulletins (issued by the organiser or the Stewards).

Additional information will be published in Rally Guide 2, issued on 8 May 2025. Rally Guide 2 has no regulatory value, except as stipulated in Art. 12.24 and 12.25 of these Supplementary Regulations.

In SS 3/6 Sa Conchedda there are two stretches on tarmac for a total of 1,31 km.

In SS 8/11 Lerno - Su Filigosu there are two stretches on tarmac or concrete for a total of 2,19 km.

In SS 9/12 Tula - Erula there are two stretches on tarmac or concrete for a total of 0,60 km.

In SS 13/15 San Giacomo - Plebi there are two stretches on tarmac for a total of 0,47 km.

In SS 14/16 Porto San Paolo there are three stretches on tarmac or concrete for a total of 0,26 km.

There will be no physical official notice board. All competitors will be informed only by Sportity notifications about the publication of any documents on the Digital Notice Board. 4 ENTRIES

4.1 Closing date for entries

The closing date for entries is Tuesday 6 May 2025 at 23:59 (CEST).

4.2 Eligible Cars

According to Art. 12.4 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

4.3 Number of cars accepted

The maximum number of cars accepted will be limited to 90. If more than 90 entries are received, the organiser reserve the right to decide which entries will be accepted in addition to the Priority drivers.

4.4 Entry procedure

Manufacturers, WRC2 and WRC3 competitors who wish to score points in their Championships in Rally Italia Sardegna 2025, must make their entries by using the electronic standard rally entry form for their Championships available in the FIA application at <https://registrations.fia.com/rally>.

Any non-priority competitor wishing to take part in Rally Italia Sardegna 2025 must register and fill in the electronic entry form published at <https://registrations.fia.com/wrcita> duly completed before the closing date for entries.

In addition to submitting the online registration entry form to the FIA, the competitors are also required to send the following documents to m.furlanetto@rallyitaliasardegna.com before the closing of entries. Foreign drivers must submit an approval from their ASN in the same e-mail. The entry application will only be accepted if accompanied by:

- Proof of payment of the total amount of entry fees.
- Scanned pdf copy of the International Competitor licence.
- Scanned pdf copies of the Driver and Co-driver international competition licences.
- ASN authorisation for all foreign drivers and co-drivers (Art. 3.9.4 of the 2025 FIA International Sporting Code).
- Scanned pdf copies of the Driver and Co-driver passports or identity cards.
- Scanned pdf copies of the Driver and Co-driver driving licences.
- Passport photos of driver and co-driver.
- Scanned pdf copy of the first page of the car homologation certificate (not for Rally1 cars).
- Scanned pdf copies of the car's registration papers.
- Scanned pdf copy of the entry form duly signed.

By entering the rally, the competitor and the crew submit themselves to the sporting jurisdictions specified in the 2025 FIA International Sporting Code and its appendices, the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations and these Supplementary Regulations.

4.5 Entry fees / Entry packages

4.6 Refunds

Entry fees will be refunded in full only:

- to candidates whose entry has not been accepted.

- in the case of the rally not taking place.

5 INSURANCE

5.1 Introductory remarks

The entry fee includes the insurance premium for the competitors' civil liability to third parties for risks arising from circulation during the rally, along the route (fixed route and/or alternative) described in the Road Book or in RG2 or given out by Bulletins and Clerk of the Course Communications.

5.2 Damages covered by the Insurance

The Insurance Policy of the Organiser respects the FIA standards for WRC. It covers only the damages caused to third parties (including co-driver) or properties of third parties by the Organiser or by the Drivers entered in the rally while circulating in the Rally route or while in the Rally official areas. The Organiser's insurance does not include Driver to Driver damages.

5.3 Organisers' responsibility

The organiser decline liability for any accident suffered by competitors or competing cars during the duration of the entire event, even in case of cataclysm, riots, demonstrations, vandalism, etc. Competitors and crew members shall suffer all the consequences (material, criminal and sporting) raised by any type of accident.

5.4 Insurance coverage

The maximum amount covered by the Insurance Policy is € 25,000,000.00 for each accident for damages to persons and for damages to goods.

5.5 Duration of the insurance coverage

This insurance, for all competitors, will become effective at the start of procedure for car scrutineering. The insurance ceases at the end of the event (Podium - Prize giving Ceremony) or at the end of final scrutineering (for the selected cars) and in case of withdrawal or disqualification from the rally. In case of withdrawal, the time taken into account will be the closing time of the following TC.

Cars having retired and restarting the next day (Art. 54 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations) shall not be considered to have permanently retired.

5.6 Assistance or service vehicles

Vehicles carrying "Service" or "Auxiliary" plates and/or any other plate issued by the organiser, with the exclusion of organiser's Safety and Zero cars and/or cars used by Officials and Delegates listed in the present Supplementary Regulations, are not covered by the event's insurance policy. These vehicles circulate under their owners' responsibility and shall have their own insurance.

5.7 Insurance during reconnaissance

Vehicles used by the crews during reconnaissance, even if bearing the event's specific stickers, must be insured by their owners. The organiser bears no responsibility for such vehicles. This same rule applies to the drivers taking part in reconnaissance only.

5.8 Accident Notification

In case of an accident the competitor or his representative must immediately notify it to the Clerk of the Course. Place, circumstances under which the accident occurred, causes and consequences must be described. Likewise, the names and addresses of any witness or injured person must be indicated.

6 ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATION

6.1 Restrictions

All political, religious, or abusive advertising is forbidden.

Advertising for tobacco, tobacco products and smokers' requisites is forbidden in Italy. Advertising for alcohol is restricted by law and is not allowed on competing cars, service cars, equipment and/or clothing.

6.2 The organiser's advertising

6.2.1 The organiser's advertising on the competing car (see Appendix 4) is:

- Front rally plate: 2025 Rally Italia Sardegna & Sardegna
- Competition number on front doors of the car: Sardegna
- Competition number on the roof of the car: Sardegna
- Rear window panel of the car: Sardegna

6.3 Identification

Competition numbers and rally plates according to the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 27, will be provided by the organiser. See also Appendix 4.

Numbers and plates must be affixed on the rally car before the car is brought to scrutineering and must be visible throughout the duration of the rally.

The following stickers will be affixed to the car by the scrutineers:

- At scrutineering: a check card, size 6 cm x 6 cm (at roll-cage driver's side).
- Before the start: a "3 min" or "2 min" sticker (on the roof over the windscreen, co-driver's side) on cars with intervals of 3' or 2'.

7 TYRES

7.1 Tyres specified for use during the rally.

In addition to complying with Articles 13, 14 & 15 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, the following types of tyres are confirmed for use:

All 4WD cars must use tyres from the FIA nominated tyre company **HANKOOK**.

For all 2WD cars the make and type of tyre is free. However, competitors are reminded to comply with:

- 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 13.1.4; each tyre must have barcode numbers supplied by the 2025 FIA-approved barcode supplier.
- 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 13.3.1.
 - At pre-rally scrutineering, the tyre manufacturer will be recorded by the FIA.
 - During the whole rally, all tyres must come from the same tyre supplier.

7.2 Quantity of tyres

The maximum number of tyres for the rally (including shakedown) is **36** for Rally1 cars and **26** for all other cars. Tyres used in Shakedown are not included in the above quantities (qty used in Shakedown is free).

Tyre orders must be placed no later than on Thursday 8 May 2025 using the Hankook Order Form (available at the rally website).

7.4 Tyre Marking Zones

- At the Shakedown (Technical Zone between the TC and Start).
- After TC 0, 3C, 6D, 9C, 12D and 15C.

8 FUEL

Use of FIA Fuel is mandatory for all FIA Priority drivers. The supplier appointed by the FIA for 2025 is TotalEnergies, Supply, refuelling services and fuel orders will be handled by Sodifuel.

All non-priority drivers must use the FIA fuel, following the same conditions and rules as the priority drivers.

For environmental and safety reasons, all competitors must refuel in the designated refuel zones. Refuelling is not allowed in the Service Park (no refuel from cans, drums or similar), except as detailed in Art. 58 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

8.1 Ordering procedure and price per litre

The fuel order form, available on the rally website, must be sent by email to wrc@sodifuel.com by Thursday 8 May 2025.

The cost of the FIA fuel is € 8,75 + VAT per litre. Only credit card or pre-payment by bank transfer is accepted. A copy of the transfer must be sent to Sodifuel before the deadline of the orders. In case of questions related to fuel ordering procedures, please contact directly wrc@sodifuel.com.

8.2 Closing date for ordering FIA fuel

Thursday 8 May 2025.

8.3 Refuelling operations

Crews are required to remain outside their cars during refuelling. A member of the crew will open the vehicle to allow the operative to attach the pipework. The crew will be responsible for indicating to the refueller the amount of fuel required. The crew only shall close the vehicle and secure the opening once they are happy that they have the right amount of fuel added. Use of a mobile phone is forbidden at the Refuelling Zones.

8.4 Fuel distribution during the rally

Refuel zones will be operational as follows:

Thursday 5 June	Olbia RZ 07:30 - 13:30 and 16:00 - 19:00.
Friday 6 June	Olbia RZ after TC 1B and 3C. Remote Monti RZ after SS 2 and 5.
Saturday 7 June	Olbia RZ after TC 6D and 9C. Remote Oschiri RZ after SS 8 and 11.
Sunday 8 June	Olbia RZ after TC 12D and 14B.

9 RECONNAISSANCE

See also Art. 35 in the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

9.1 Procedure for reconnaissance registration

The competitor must send the organiser in advance an information form (see Website/Rally Guide 2) to m.furlanetto@rallyitaliasardegna.com, including details of the reconnaissance car, mobile phone number and place where the crew is accommodated. The form must be signed and submitted by Monday 2 June 2025 at the latest at individual time of the administrative checks.

All reconnaissance and rally materials may be collected at the administrative checks by the nominated competitor representative, holding a written proxy (see Art. 10).

9.1.1 Identification of reconnaissance cars

The identification numbers and R sticker given at the administrative checks, shall be displayed and remain visible during reconnaissance, as follows:

- The identification numbers on the front doors of the car.
- The R sticker on the top middle part of the windscreen.

9.2 Participation in reconnaissance only

Any driver holding an appropriate international licence but not entered in the rally may apply to take part in the reconnaissance. The regulations on reconnaissance must be respected in their entirety. A registration form for this purpose will be sent on request. The final permission for taking part in recce is left to the discretion of the organiser. An administrative fee will be charged (see Art. 4.5.3 Reconnaissance Only of these Supplementary Regulations).

9.3 Tracking system for reconnaissance

With reference to Art. 35.4.4 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, all competitors must make one iOS or Android smartphone available and equip their reconnaissance cars with a smartphone-based application RS Lite developed by the FIA official supplier STATUS AWARENESS SYSTEM (SAS). SAS will distribute individual event access codes during the reconnaissance registration.

Rental of smartphones is also available from SAS, to be requested when completing the access code purchase on the SAS website and collected during the reconnaissance registration.

Access code costs:

- all competitors: € 40,00 + optional smartphone device rental € 100,00
- payment must be done online and in advance on the SAS website: <https://wrc.statusas.com/shop/recce/>.

9.4 Specific and national restriction

9.4.1 Passages

Crews are authorised to drive a maximum of 2 times through each special stage in accordance with the schedules given in Appendix 2. Reconnaissance Groups 1 and 2 will be defined once the Entry List is published. The special stages must be driven in the same direction as the rally, at a reduced speed and fully respecting the Traffic Laws. All special stages are run twice during the rally but may only be driven as one stage during recce. All passages through the special stages will be recorded by the marshals. Time cards will not be used.

9.4.2 Speed limits

The maximum speed allowed during reconnaissance is 70 km/h on special stages unless a lower speed limit is indicated by traffic signs or by written instructions in the Road Book (or in Bulletins). All crews are reminded of Art. 34.2 in the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

9.4.3 Tyres for use on reconnaissance

Only road-homologated series production tyres for asphalt are allowed (2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 35.2).

10 ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

Document checks will be done online, before the event, but original documents along with the duly signed entry form must be brought to the administrative checks. All required documents as per Art. 4.4 must be scanned and sent to the organizer by using the following address: m.furlanetto@rallyitaliasardegna.com latest on 6 May 2025 at 23.59 CET.

Notwithstanding the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 30.1, drivers and co-drivers are not required to report personally to the administrative checks.

Each Competitor shall nominate in advance to the Organiser one authorised representative to complete the administrative checks.

10.1 Documents to be presented

- International Competitor licence.
- Driver and Co-driver international competition licences.
- ASN authorisation for all foreign drivers and co-drivers.
- Driver and Co-driver passports or identity cards.
- Driver and Co-driver driving licences.
- Driver Declaration and undertakings duly signed by the Driver and Co-driver.
- Car homologation certificate (not for Rally1 cars).
- Car registration papers.
- Entry form duly signed.

11 SCRUTINEERING

11.1 Venue and Timetable

Sealing and marking of Rally1 cars:

- Venue: Individual service bays, Service Park
- Date and time: Wednesday 4 June from 07:00

Scrutineering / component sealing of all other cars:

- Venue: Olbia - Musselli Service, Via Niger ([40° 56.616'N 9° 31.121'E](#))
- Date and time: Wednesday 4 June from 12:00

Detailed timetables will be published in a Bulletin.

11.2 General requirements

11.2.1 Competition numbers and rally plates must be affixed to cars in the stated positions prior to scrutineering. See Art. 6 and Appendix 4.

11.2.2 All cars must have a complete certified homologation form available at scrutineering (2025 FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J, Art. 251.2.1.8). In addition, homologation forms for the catalytic converter and roll cage (if homologated) must be with the car at scrutineering.

11.2.3 Sealing of the cars will be carried out according to 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations Articles 16 & 17. Therefore, all underbody protection must be removed for scrutineering, but must be kept with the car for weight checks. Car's chassis and cylinder block will also be marked (2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 31.1.6). Sealing wires must be installed as instructed by the car manufacturer.

11.2.4 After scrutineering, if a car is found not to comply with technical and/or safety regulations, the Stewards may set a deadline to comply with the requirements otherwise start in the event may be refused.

11.3 Mud flaps

Fitting of transversal mud flaps (all wheels) is mandatory in conformity with 2025 FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J, Art. 252.7.7.

11.4 Windows

The use of transparent and colourless anti-shatter films (maximum thickness: 100 microns) is compulsory on side and sunroof windows, unless they are in polycarbonate (see Art. 253.11 of 2025 FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J). Window nets are not allowed.

The use of silvered or tinted films is authorised, on the rear side windows, on the rear window and on the sunroof, on the following conditions:

- Silvered or tinted films fitted on rear side windows must have an opening equivalent to the surface of a circle of 70 mm in diameter so that the driver as well as the contents of the car may be seen from the outside.
- With the unanimous agreement of all manufacturers registered in the 2025 FIA World Rally Championship, the FIA has granted a waiver to Appendix J, Art. 253-11.1.1 and allows the additional application of silvered films on the rear half of the front side windows in Rally1 cars. This change is in consideration of extreme air temperatures recorded inside Rally1 cars and is important for safety reasons only.

11.5 Drivers' safety equipment

At scrutineering competitors must produce all items of clothing including helmets and head restraints intended to be used. Condition of the equipment and compliance with 2025 FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix L, Chapter III will be checked. Also, see Appendix 5 of these Supplementary Regulations.

11.6 Noise level

At any time on the road sections, the noise level must be in conformity with 2025 FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J. See also 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations Art. 18.4.

11.7 Special national requirements

Competing car must be equipped with two (2) fluorescent jackets (one per each member of the crew).

11.8 FIA Safety tracking device (2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations Art. 18.2 and 53.2.1)

All competitors must make provisions in their rally cars for the installation of the FIA Safety Emergency Console System, and the system must be installed before the car is brought to scrutineering.

No deposit will be collected for the rally safety tracking equipment, but all the damage caused will be invoiced afterwards. Systems may be collected either by the crew or a representative.

For installation and operating instructions see Appendix 6.

The FIA Safety Safety Tracking Device may be removed in the final parc fermé by a team member under the supervision of a scrutineer. In any case, the device must be returned to STATUS AWARENESS SYSTEM (SAS) truck in Service Park no later than one hour after the Stewards have authorised the opening of the parc fermé.

Should a competitor retire, the tracking unit and associated cables must be returned to SAS office in the Service Park as soon as possible.

11.9 On-board Cameras

The competitor of any car which carries an on-board camera must have the prior agreement of the Promoter.

The fixings of the camera and camera recorder must comply with the 2025 FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J, Art.253.2.

Competitors wishing to use an on-board camera must apply via the WRC Accreditation Portal at the latest by Tuesday, 27 May 2025. Any requests presented after this date will not be considered and the competitor will not be authorized to install an OBC on their car.

Those registering for an OBC for the first time should first use this link: <https://qrco.de/WRCOBCRegistration>.

Those who have already applied for an OBC in the last 12 months should use their e-mail address to register via this link (no password required): <https://qrco.de/OBCForm2025>.

An authorization sticker, which must be affixed to the car in the vicinity of the authorized camera prior to Scrutineering, must be obtained from the HQ when collecting documents and other materials (Art 10.2).

Any contacts about OBC prior to the event should be addressed to Miguel Fonseca, accreditation@wrc.com.

12 OTHER PROCEDURES

12.1 FIA eLearning course and Drivers' Safety Briefing

All drivers and co-drivers who have not yet participated in any WRC event in 2025 must complete the FIA eLearning course and pass the assessment for FIA Safety Tracking Device by Monday, 2 June 2025, 21:00 hrs and are required to attend the Drivers' Safety Briefing on Wednesday, 4 June 2025 at 19:00 at the Museo Archeologico.

Instructions for the eLearning course will be sent to the competitors by email once the Entry List is published.

12.2 Shakedown

See Article 36 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

All P1 and other requested drivers will be required to complete their first passage of Shakedown according to the Start List that will be published on Wednesday, 4 June at 18:30.

- FIA P1 drivers shall complete a minimum of 2 passages in total of the Shakedown.
- FIA P2 and P3 drivers must complete at least one passage of the Shakedown.
- Participation is optional for non-priority drivers, and they are permitted a maximum of 3 passages in total of the Shakedown stage.

12.3 Official time used during the rally

Official time throughout the entire rally will be that of GPS (UTC time + 2 - CEST).

12.4 Start order and intervals

The start order for all sections will be given in accordance with Art. 41.2 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

Start intervals are 3 minutes for P1 crews, 2 minutes for P2 and P3 crews and 1 minute for all other crews. The Clerk of the Course may, for safety reasons and with the knowledge of the Stewards, reposition drivers or change the time interval between them.

The start intervals for the Power Stage will be defined as per Art. 50.3 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

12.5 Control procedures and timecard handling

The complete set of Time Cards for the whole rally (including the Shakedown) will be delivered with the rally materials at the administrative checks. It is imperative for all crews to carry at least all the Time Card sets for a whole day inside the car (cf. for example procedures at regrouping controls).

Time control procedures will be as described in 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, Arts. 43, 44, 46, 48, 49 and 55. Any writing on the time cards can only be done by the rally officials, except filling in the car number and markings on the boxes reserved for competitor's use.

12.6 Start procedure

The official start of the rally will be at TC 0.

12.7 Starting system of special stages.

The standard light sequence mentioned in Article 48.2 and Appendix VII, of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations will be used.

Should this start system fail the start will be given as specified in Article 48.3 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

12.8 Permitted early check-in

Crews are authorised to check-in early without incurring a penalty at TC 6C and 12C (Flexi service OUT).

12.9 Water distribution

The organiser will provide water for crew consumption at the STOP Controls of all Special Stage.

12.10 Car Wash facilities for competing cars

Official car wash facilities for competing cars will be available after Shakedown and before TC 3A, 6A, 9A, 12A, 14A, 16A.

The exact location of the car wash facilities will be shown in the Road Book.

12.11 Organisers promotional activities

PR activities, crew requirements and related schedule for Wednesday 4 June and Thursday 5 June will be aligned with the P1, P2 and P3 teams ahead of the event.

12.11.1 Wednesday 4 June

- Family photo P1 crews, in overall (details of the departure location and transportation will be announced in a CoC Communication)
- WRC Promoter driver and co-driver photo shooting, helmet and overall required (mandatory for all priority drivers participating in their first WRC competition in 2025), details of the location and time will be announced in a CoC Communication.

12.11.2 Thursday 5 June

- FIA WRC Media Pen: see Art. 12.11 of these Supplementary Regulations.
- Meet and Greet (with one P1 driver per manufacturer team and selected P2/P3 drivers) will be held from 18:30 to 18:45 in Casa ACI/Sardegna, in the Service Park.
- Autograph signing for P1 crews will be held from 19:20 to 19:50 at the Podium, in the Service Park.
- Official crew presentation: see Art. 12.12 of these Supplementary Regulations.

12.12 FIA WRC Media Pen

An FIA WRC Media Pen will be organised on Thursday, 5 June from 16:30 to 18:00 in the interview area in front of the Podium in the Service Park. The FIA WRC Media Pen is mandatory for all P1 drivers and P2 drivers, as well as P1 manufacturer team representatives, and upon request by the media to the FIA Media Delegate or National Press Officer for all other priority drivers or co-drivers. Attending competitors are required to be present for a duration of 30 min minimum, or until dismissed by the FIA Media Delegate. P2 drivers are recommended to come from 17:00 onwards.

12.13 Official Crews presentation

The Official crew presentation per Teams (Drivers, Co-Drivers, Team Principals & Team Members) or group of competitors, without cars will be held on Thursday 4 June as from 20:00 at the Podium in the Service Park (a detailed timetables to be published in a Bulletin).

12.14 Media Zones

The Media Zone is located at the entry of the Service Park, prior to the Regroup / Service IN. This Media Zone will be operational as follows:

- at TC 3A, 6A, 9A, 12A, 15A and 16A

All priority drivers (and co-drivers upon request) must be available for media interviews for a minimum of 15 minutes or until they are given permission to leave by the FIA Media Delegate. It is the duty of team/driver press officers to manage the time available appropriately and to be aware of the need to allow for interviews and the giving of relevant information upon request.

Access to the Media Zone is restricted to the following:

- Accredited media and Team Media personnel holding a green pass.
- Team principals or team representatives, who are, in view of the FIA Media Delegate, performing media duties and displaying a pass with an active NFC sticker issued by the FIA Media Delegate for this event on their pass.
- Holders of a red All Access pass

No other personnel will be allowed in the Media Zone unless authorised by the FIA Media Delegate and holding the correct pass and approved access. Requests for the delivery and activation of the NFC sticker (excluding red all access and green media passes) should be sent by email to:

FIA Media Delegate (TBA), no later than 15:00 hrs on Tuesday 03 June 2025.

12.15 Meet the Crews sessions

All Meet the Crews sessions will be held in the Podium in conjunction with the regroupings as follows: TC6A e TC12A. Required crews and teams' principals will be nominated in a Bulletin.

12.16 FIA post-event press conference

All winning drivers and codrivers, as well as the representative of winning manufacturer, must complete on-stage interviews as part of the prize giving ceremony, as this will count as the official contribution to the FIA post-event press conference. Although, all drivers and codrivers and team principals, as nominated by the FIA WRC Media Delegate, must attend further peer-to-peer interviews at the Service Park Media Zone after the cars have been driven into the final parc fermé. Crews are kindly reminded of the obligation to be available for media duties for up to one hour from the start of the press conference, unless dismissed by the FIA Media Delegate, as stipulated in Art. 38.2 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

12.17 Re-start after retirement

With reference to Art. 54 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations any crew which fails to complete a section will be assumed to re-start the rally from the start of the next section following the overnight regroup. If not, they must confirm with the Clerk of the Course by completing the form located in the road book and lodging it with the organiser as soon as possible before the publication of the re-start list.

Any crew re-starting the rally must present their cars at the overnight parc fermé at the latest four hours before the start of the next Section following the overnight regroup.

For cars driven by Priority drivers, a special time card will be used for the maximum of 3-hour service (4 hours for P1).

12.18 Power Stage

With reference to Art. 50 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations special stage 16, Porto San Paolo 2, will be run as the "Wolf Power Stage". Notwithstanding Art. 50.2 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 56.2.2 a) applies at the regroup TC 15A/B.

After having completed the Power Stage the selected crews for Live TV must follow the Road Book to drive the car to the Podium of the Power Stage. After the podium ceremony these crews will have to drive to TC 16A following the Road book and time card requirements completed on the podium.

All other crews will have to drive directly to TC 16A following the Road book.

12.19 Flexi Service

Services on Friday and Saturday evening are Flexi Services as stipulated in Art. 59 of the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

12.20 Finish procedure

The finish of the competition element of the rally is at TC 16A. Thereafter crews must follow the instructions of officials during the podium ceremony.

From the podium, crews are obliged to drive their competing car to the final parc fermé following the route described in the road book. Between TC 16A and parc fermé, competitors will be under parc fermé conditions and will be observed by marshals. There are no time controls at the podium or at the final parc fermé, but the maximum allowed time from the podium to the parc fermé is 15 minutes, which will be controlled by the marshals. Any crew exceeding that time will be reported to the Stewards. Recovery of any competing car which fails to arrive under its own power at the final parc fermé shall be the responsibility of the competitor. The permission of the Clerk of the Course must be obtained before any recovery arrangements are made.

All cars selected for the final checks must be driven without delay to the parc fermé and then to the scrutineering.

12.21 Exhibition driving

Exhibition driving ("doughnuts") is strictly forbidden everywhere. All infringements will be penalised with a minimum of a 5-minute time penalty, applied by the Stewards.

12.22 Final parc fermé

12.22.1 Competing cars subject to final scrutineering at Olbia - Musselli Service, Via Niger (40° 56.616'N 9° 31.121'E) will remain in the venue of scrutineering, under Parc Fermé rules, until they are released.

12.22.2 Removal of the cars from the final parc fermé

All cars must be removed from the final parc fermé within 60 minutes after the Stewards have authorised the opening of the parc fermé. After this time the organiser will not be responsible for the surveillance of the cars.

To collect the cars, competitors or their representatives must present the receipt issued to the crews at Administrative checks.

12.23 Service Area Entry

All Priority drivers will have the entry in their service area from the rear. All Non Priority drivers will have the entry in their service area from the front.

12.24 Dismantling of the service park

Dismantling of the external structures (tents and walls) that constitute the working areas in the Service Park can only begin after the end of the Podium procedures on Sunday 8 June, approximately at 6pm. Any intervention carried out before 6pm will be penalized with a fine of 500,00 €/h, notified to the competitor by the Clerk of the Course.

12.25 Environmental prescriptions

Organiser's Environmental Policy will be published in detail in Rally Guide 2 and will be considered as an integral part of these Supplementary Regulations and all competitors must comply with it.

12.26 Working Prescription

Organiser's Working Prescriptions Policy will be published in detail in Rally Guide 2 and will be considered as an integral part of these Supplementary Regulations and all competitors must comply with it.

13 IDENTIFICATION OF OFFICIALS

Officials will wear Tabards as per Appendix 7 to these Supplementary Regulations.

FIA WRC3 Championship

- First: Two awards (driver and co-driver)

All other classified crews

- All other classified crews will receive "Classified crew" awards (driver and co-driver)

14 FINAL CHECKS AND PROTESTS

15.1 Final checks

Post-rally scrutineering will take place on Sunday, 8 June 2025 at Olbia - Musselli Service, Via Niger ([40° 56.616'N 9° 31.121'E](#))

Selected competitors for final scrutineering are requested to provide proper equipment (including all sealed spare parts) and technicians at the final scrutineering venue.

Selected cars must be driven to the final scrutineering venue by a designated team member (who must be present at the arrival), accompanied by an Official.

15.2 Protest deposit (2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations Art. 65.2)

The protest deposit is € 1000,00.

If a protest requires the dismantling and reassembly of a clearly defined part of the car (engine, transmission, steering, braking system, electrical installation, bodywork, etc.), an additional deposit may be specified by the Stewards in accordance with Art. 13.4.3 of the 2025 FIA International Sporting Code.

The expenses incurred in the work and in the transport of the car shall be borne by the claimant if the protest is unfounded, or by the competitor against whom the protest is lodged if it is upheld.

If the protest is unfounded, and if the expenses incurred by the protest (scrutineering, transport, etc.) are higher than the amount of the (additional) deposit, the difference shall be borne by the claimant. Conversely, if the expenses are less, the difference shall be returned.

15.3 Right of review deposit (2025 FIA ISC, Art. 14.4.3)

The right of review deposit is € 1000,00.

15.4 Appeal deposit (2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 65.5)

The International Appeal Deposit is € 6000,00.

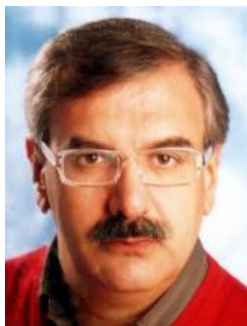

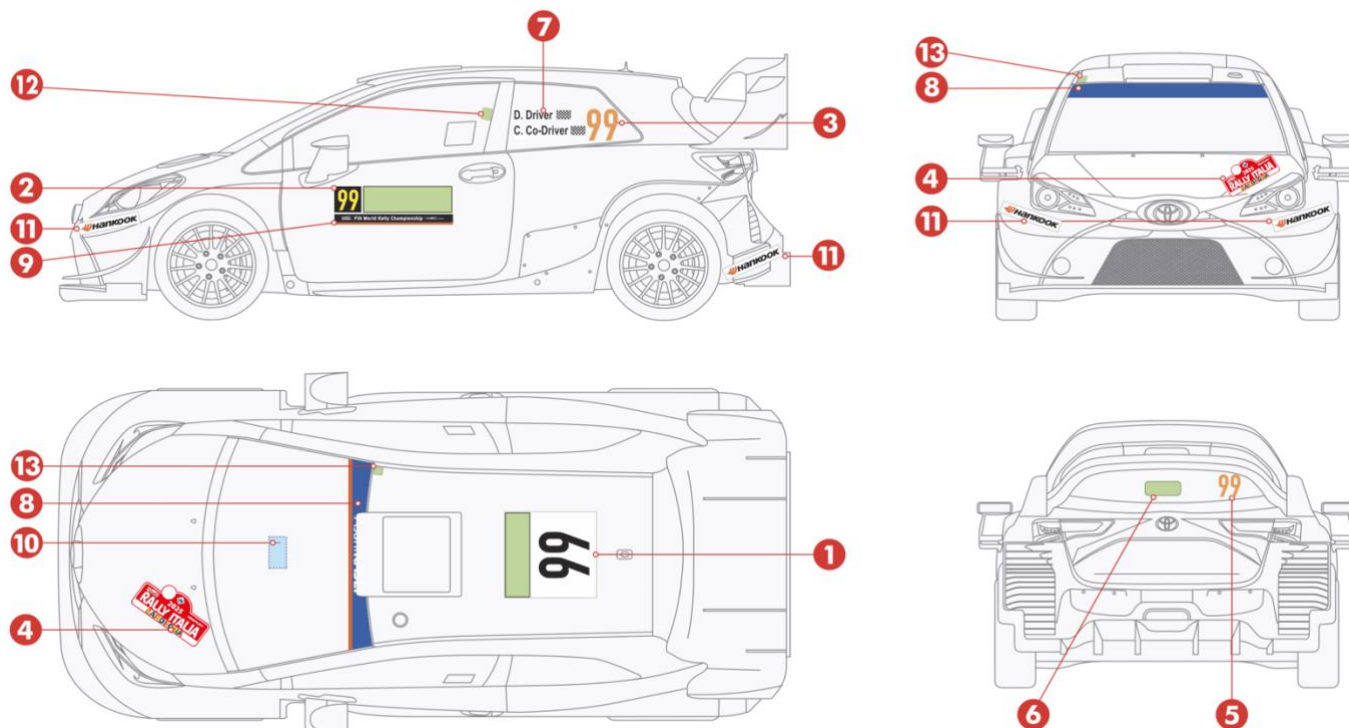

APPENDIX 5 - DRIVERS' SAFETY EQUIPMENT

All competitors are reminded of Appendix L of the 2025 FIA International Sporting Code (ISC), in particular its Chapter III – Drivers' Equipment. These regulations apply to Shakedown as well.

Helmets (2025 FIA ISC, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 1)

Priority 1 drivers and their co-drivers must wear helmets according to the FIA standard 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP. This also applies to all Priority 2 crews competing with a World Rally Car.

All other crews must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the following FIA standards:

- 8859-2015 (Technical List N° 49),
- 8859-2024 or 8859-2024 ABP (Technical List N° 107),
- 8860-2010 (Technical List N° 33) or
- 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP (Technical List N° 69)
- **see also Technical List N° 25**

Drivers and co-drivers who wear full-face helmets must contact the FIA Medical Delegate wrc.medicaldelegate@fia.com or the Chief Medical Officer in order to carry out a test before the start of the event. This test is described in the Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 1.3.

Frontal Head Restraint (FHR) (2025 FIA ISC, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3)

All crews must use FIA approved FHR systems homologated to FIA standard 8858. Approved FHRs, anchorages and tethers are listed in Technical List N° 29. See also helmet compatibility chart in Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3.3.

Flame-resistant clothing (2025 FIA ISC, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2)

All drivers and co-drivers must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2018 standard (Technical List N° 74).

Please pay special attention to the prescriptions of Art. 2 concerning embroidery and printing on flame-resistant clothing (manufacturer certificates etc.) **as well as concerning the correct wearing of the clothing elements! See also the 2025 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, Article 53.1.**

Biometric Devices (2025 FIA ISC, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2.1)

Drivers may wear a device to collect biometric data during racing.

- If the biometric device is integrated into a protective garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856, the garment shall be homologated to FIA Standards 8856 and 8868- 2018.
- If the biometric device is a stand-alone device, then the device must be homologated to FIA Standard 8868-2018 only. This device must be worn in addition to the garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856.

Wearing of jewellery (2025 FIA ISC, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 5)

The wearing of any type of jewellery, such as but not limited to, neck chains, bracelets or watches is prohibited during the competition. Exceptions to this rule, providing the CMO and/or Medical Delegate do not consider that due to size or location they may delay rescue or hinder emergency care, are:

- i. the wearing of watch(es) by co-drivers, on the condition that the watch(es) is worn over the overall,
- ii. the wearing of a single band-style ring providing it does not restrict the natural range of motion of the hand, and
- iii. the wearing of body piercing(s) providing they are not worn in and/or around the oral cavity.
