#### Art. 1.1 Preamble

This event is a National Championship Rally, promoted by Rally New Zealand Club Inc and will take place on 6-10 November 2024 in the Northland area. The Rally forms Round 6 of the 2024 New Zealand Rally Championship. This rally will be held under these Supplementary Regulations, the MotorSport NZ National Sporting Code and its Appendices and Schedules particularly Appendix Three, Schedule R being the Standing Regulations for all Rallies and Appendix Two, Schedule A – Driver and Vehicle Safety requirements. All Crew shall ensure compliance at all times with the national road traffic regulations when travelling on public roads. Unless provided otherwise by these Supplementary Regulations, the provisions of the above Rules and Regulations shall apply.

Any modifications, amendments and/or additions to the Rules and Regulations shall be made in the form of numbered and dated bulletins. Additional information will be published in the Rally Guide. #### Art. 4.4.1 Entry fees

Entries close Friday 18 October at 1700hrs.Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organiser with an additional Late Entry Fee of \$150.00. All entry fees include GST.

### Art. 4.6 Entry fee refunds

The entry fee shall be refunded in full

- if the event does not take place
- to teams whose entry application is rejected

#### Art. 5. Insurance Cover

All New Zealand residents and overseas visitors to New Zealand are covered by 24 hour no fault personal injury accident insurance, where that accident is deemed to be an accident as defined in the Injury Prevention, Rehabilitation and Compensation Act 2001. Overseas visitors are recommended to have personal travel and medical insurance.

Third Party or Comprehensive Vehicle Insurance is the responsibility of the entrant/competitor.

The service vehicles, management vehicles and reconnaissance vehicles including those bearing special plates issued by the organisers may never be considered as official participants in the rally. They are therefore not covered by the insurance policy of the rally and will remain the sole responsibility of their owner.

Competitors and all crew members are covered by Public Liability under a master policy held by MotorSport New Zealand for an amount of **NZ \$10 million** for the entire event. In the event of an accident the competitor or his/her representative must notify the Clerk of the Course in writing within 4 hours. The competitor must provide full details including the names and addresses of those involved including witnesses.

# Art. 6. Advertising and Identification

### Art. 6.1 Obligatory organiser's advertising

Competition numbers, advertising and Driver's and Co-Driver's names will be in accordance with Sch R, Part One, Article 4, and NSC Part V, Article 56 current MotorSport NZ Manual. See Appendix 4.

The organiser will provide each crew with the number identification (67x17cm), which must be affixed to their car in the stated positions prior to scrutineering. Each panel shall be placed horizontally at the leading edge of each front door, with the number at the front. The top of the plate shall be between 7 cm and 10 cm below the lower limit of the window. It is not allowed to cut the panel.

#### Art. 6.2 Optional organiser's advertising

Negotiations with potential sponsors are still underway. Current advertising requirements are:

A1 APRC plate where required Whangārei

A2 Whangarei

### Art. 7. Tyres

#### Art. 7.1 Regulations regarding tyres which may be used during the rally

The use of studded or spiked tyres is prohibited under pain of exclusion.

### Art. 7.2 Tyres for use on reconnaissance

The types used during reconnaissance must be either an FIA approved road tyre or an equivalent standard road type designed primarily for normal road use meeting the following criteria.

Tyres must not exceed a tread depth of 8.5mm. Straight circumferential grooves may be no wider than 10mm. All other











grooves at an angle to the circumference may be no wider than 7mm.

Crews are permitted to use their Rally Car and Rally Tyres for the reconnaissance of Whangārei SSS9/10.

#### Art. 8. Fuel

#### Art. 8.1 Fuel Specification

Fuel shall comply with the provisions of the Appendix Two, Sch A, Part Two, Art 3 of the current MSNZ Manual. The use of unleaded commercial petrol available at petrol filling stations is permitted.

### PROCEDURE IN REFUEL AREA

- Only actions inside a Refuel Area directly involved in the refuelling of the competing vehicle are permitted.
- The responsibility for refuelling including the required fire extinguisher operator is incumbent on the competitor and their team members alone.
- Engines must be switched off throughout the refuelling operation.
- It is required that the driver and co-driver remain outside the car during refuelling.
- Solely for the purpose of assisting with the refuelling procedure of their car, two team members of each crew
  may access the Refuel Area. They may only enter the Refuel Area ten minutes before their car's arrival and
  must leave once refuelling is completed
- Competitors are reminded of their requirement to have a Fire extinguisher with operator on standby to be provided by the competitor while refuelling.
- All competitors must supply and use absorbent spill mats during refuelling
  - The use of kitty litter or drip trays is not permitted
- If a spill occurs the car must be pushed away from the spill without starting the engine
  - The car is not permitted to leave the Refuel Area until the spill has been cleaned up to the satisfaction of the refuel marshals
- A car may be pushed out of the Refuel Area by the crew, the two team members and/or officials without incurring a penalty.

### **APPAREL FOR REFUEL AREAS**

The team member refuelling the car, and the extinguisher operator must at a minimum wear the following apparel during refuelling operations;

- Cotton overalls
- Gloves
- Balaclava
- Covered shoes that are non-flammable material i.e. no running shoes

It is not permitted for the driver or co-driver to refuel the car wearing their competition apparel however they may act as the extinguisher operator.

#### PROCEDURE AT COMMERCIAL FILLING STATIONS

Competitors are permitted to refuel using commercial petrol stations that the route directly passes however may not perform any other actions at these locations and their service crew are not permitted to assist.

This fuel must be dispensed directly into the tank of the competing car.

The crew must use solely the equipment on board and only the pumps with no external physical assistance. Competitors are reminded they must still respect the roadbook at all times including transiting remote refuels.

### EMPTYING AND/OR REFILLING THE TANK IN THE SERVICE PARK

When necessary, as part of service (i.e. changing of fuel tank, changing of fuel pump, changing of fuel filter, changing of any other item of the fuel circuit), emptying and/or refilling is permitted in a service park provided that:

- The work is carried out with the knowledge and approval of the Service Park Manager
- Fire extinguisher with operator on standby to be provided by the competitor.
- No other work is carried out on the car while the fuel circuit is open and/or during the emptying and/or refilling operation.
- A suitable safety perimeter is established around the car.
- Only sufficient fuel is added to reach the next refuel zone.
  - Crews will be held responsible for any fuel spillage and subsequent environmental damage.











### Art. 8.2 Distribution during the rally

Refuel Areas (RA) will be established as follows -

- Building and Fire Services 30 Kioreroa Road, Whangarei
- "GULL" petrol filling station at Whangārei 130 Tauroa Street, Raumanga, Whangārei as identified in the road book

Plus Remote Refuel Areas (RA) -

- Leg 1 Hikurangi
- Leg 2 Waiotira Hall
  - o Note: All Competitors will need to make their own supply arrangements.

Full details will be shown in Rally Guide 2 and the Road Book.

### Art. 9. Reconnaissance of Special Stages

Reconnaissance of the Special Stages will be by convoy, with official lead and trail vehicles in accordance with the Time Schedule in Appendix 2. During Special Stages all Competitors must remain within this Convoy. Late entry into a Special Stage is not permitted.

Reconnaissance will be according to MSNZ Sch R, Part One Art 8. The time schedule for the reconnaissance is published in Appendix 2 of these supplementary regulations.

- Thursday 7 November –Northern Special Stages 1 8 -between 0730-1600hrs.
- Friday 8 November Southern Special stages 11 -18 between 0730-0950hrs. SSS 9 & 10 between 1215-1245hrs. SSS 9 & 10, cars will start in groups of 10 and crews are permitted to either use their Recce car or Rally car and rally tyres.

### Art. 9.1 Registration procedure

Before starting reconnaissance, all crews must register at the Rally Secretariat on Wednesday 6 November between 0900hrs – 1800hrs to receive documentation and 3 sets of car numbers. The 2 large numbers will be placed on the rear side windows and the 1 small number on the co-driver's side top corner of the front windscreen.

#### Art. 9.2 Specific regulations

During reconnaissance, all national traffic regulations must be followed, including but not limited to the speed limits. Please note that the Special Stages will not be closed to public traffic during reconnaissance. The organizer has reduced the allowed speed on Special Stages to 80kph unless the traffic signs, the road book or Bulletins indicate a lower speed limit. Speeding during reconnaissance and / or shakedown will be penalised according to Art 12.5.6 of these regulations

A Two Pass Reconnaissance is available for All Competitors who purchased notes from the official notes supplier.

Headlights – For safety, headlights **MUST** be switched on while driving on **ALL** Special Stages.

Rally cars may not be used for reconnaissance except for the Pohe Island Super Special Stage.

### Art. 10. Administrative checks

### Art. 10.1 Documents to be presented:

To keep the time required for the administrative checks to the necessary minimum, make sure to bring and present the following documents:

- Competitor (Entrant) licence
- Driver's and co-driver's valid civil driving licences
- ASN authorisation (for foreign competitors)
- NZ Competitors only Current Car Club membership cards
- Completion of all details on the entry form including details of the Official representative authorised for the purpose of receiving any official notifications
- Confirm receipt of Sportity QR Code

Competitors will receive their signed Clearance form on completion of administrative checks. This form is required to access Scrutineering.

#### Art. 10.2 Timetable











Venue: Rally HQ, Rock n Roll Club, Pohe Island Road, Whangārei

■ **Time:** Wednesday 6 November from 0900 – 1800hrs

Friday 8 November from 0900 – 1400hrs (Allcomers and those not doing recce)

Crews may have another team member collect their documentation only if their entry form is completed and they have **physically signed** the indemnity with the Secretariat, otherwise they have to register in person.

To assist competitors, administrative checks may be completed outside these times at the International Rally of Whangārei office in Auckland by appointment on Wednesday 30 October.

### Art. 11. Scrutineering, sealing and marking

Competitors are required to hold an Administration/Documentation Clearance Form prior to Scrutineering.

Competition numbers, rally plates and advertising decals shall be affixed to the car before attending Scrutineering.

### Art. 11.2 Drivers' safety equipment

All items of clothing including helmets and FHR (Frontal Head Restraints) intended to be used, e.g. HANS devices, must be presented for scrutineering at the same time as the vehicle is scrutineered. They shall be checked for compliance with Sch A, Part One, Art 4.2 of the current MSNZ manual.

#### Art. 11.3 Noise Level

Refer MSNZ Sch A, Part One, Art 3.8 and 5.2 for relevant details.

# Art. 11.4 Installation of the safety tracking system

All Competitors must make provision in their competition vehicle for the RallySafe GPS and tracking system. An overview of the system and installation instructions is available on <a href="https://www.rallysafe.com.au">www.rallysafe.com.au</a>

A RallySafe Briefing will be held at 1500hrs on Friday 8 November at the Rally Secretariat. This briefing is for competitors who have questions or who have not used the equipment before.











RallySafe wiring loom, antennae and mounting kit can be purchased directly from RallySafe. Orders must be received by RallySafe to allow time for shipping to New Zealand.

The RallySafe GPS units and tracking systems will be available at Documentation (Wednesday 6 November 0900-1800hrs) and (Friday 8 November 0900-1800hrs). These units must be fitted in accordance with MSNZ App 3 Schedule R Art 12 prior to scrutineering, where the correct functioning and installation will be checked.

Competitors who retire must return their RallySafe GPS unit to the Rally Secretariat. All other competitors must return them to the RallySafe Official at the Finish, or before their cars are removed from Parc Ferme.

An event cost of NZD\$230.00 Including GST is included in the entry fee.

If the unit is damaged whilst in the care of the competitor, the competitor is responsible to pay for repairs or replacement as necessary. # Art. 12. Other procedures and regulations

#### Art. 12.1 Ceremonial Start procedures and order

The Ceremonial Start will be preceded by a display park on John Street, Central Whangarei. This display park will open at 1600hrs, and all competing vehicles must be in place by 1645hrs. Competitors are to enter from the junction of Robert & John Street and continue on John Street to be parked by the Marshalls. Cars will go over the start ramp via Cameron Street, and then turn right and exit on James Street. To facilitate access and arrival cars must arrive as per the following schedule:

• **1615hrs – 1625hrs**: Cars 1 – 20 arrive to display park (parked closest to ramp)

1625hrs – 1635hrs: Cars 21 – 40 arrive to display park.
 1635hrs – 1645hrs: Cars 41 – 60 arrive to display park.

1615hrs – 1715hrs: Driver Autograph Signing – Compulsory for NZRC and APRC Competitors

• 1715hrs – 1730hrs: Opening Ceremony

1730hrs: First car starts in Reverse Numerical Order

A representative of the team may deliver the car to the display park. A penalty for late arrival will be \$25.00nzd per minute.

Crews must be present with their cars and be wearing their driving suits at least 15 minutes before their Ceremonial Start Time.

Competitors will start at approximately 30 second intervals in Reverse Numerical Order as per the Start List published at 1600hrs.

#### Art. 12.2 Finish procedures

### NZRC Cat 5 and One Day Competitors

The finish of the rally for Day One only competitors will be at TC 10A. From there competitors must follow the directions of Officials. A Finish Ceremony to recognise NZRC Cat 5 Competitors will take place at Parc Ferme – Mitre 10 Mega immediately after the final time control. This will take place as soon as practical once all vehicles have entered the final control. Those competitors in the above classes who intend to compete in Day 2 will rejoin at TC10B without penalty.

#### Two Day Event Finish

The finish of the rally will be at TC 18B. From there competitors must follow the directions of Officials to drive over the finish ramp at the Service Park, Pohe Island and return to the final Parc Ferme.

#### Art. 12.3 Permitted early check-in

Competitors may book in early at TC2A, TC6A, TC9A, TC9, TC10A, TC18A and TC18B without penalty. Competitors must follow the instructions of the control marshal for the entry into TC0.











### Art. 12.4 Whangārei Super Special Stage, regulations and order

The SSS will be held in the afternoon to provide a sporting spectacle for the spectators. Competitors will start at 1-minute intervals. Between SSS9 and SSS10 cars will be held in a Neutralisation Zone located on Te Matau ā Pohe. Red Flag – if the competitor in front of you has not cleared the jump the following competitor will STOP for the Red Flag.

#### Art. 12.5 Special procedures and activities

#### Art. 12.5.1 Promotional Requirements

NZRC Competitors are required to attend the Official Welcome function, Thursday 7 November at 2000hrs at the Whangarei Council Building Te Iwitahi Civic Centre, 9 Rust Avenue. Our event Sponsors along with the associated District Council, City Council and other business representatives will be present. This is your opportunity to assist in showcasing the support in having the APRC International Rally of Whangarei return to the region again. Drivers or codrivers that are not arriving into Whangarei until Friday and therefore unavailable to attend must notify the Clerk of the Course on <a href="info@rallynz.org.nz">info@rallynz.org.nz</a>

NZRC Competitors are requested to assist the Organiser's promotion of the event by providing a single ride per car for a VIP guest as part of the Shakedown at Pohe Island on the afternoon of Friday 8 November. Competitors may take part in the Promotional VIP Rides provided they have completed and passed Scrutineering Checks.

NZRC Competitors will be required for an autograph signing session from 1615-1715hrs at the Ceremonial Start display park.

Competitors are requested to assist the Organiser's community engagement plan by participating in a meet and greet and signature session at the Hikurangi Refuel on Saturday 9 November.

Post Parc Ferme Media Activation - All crews to stay for 15mins after exiting the Parc Ferme for media and spectator activation by Mitre10

### Art. 12.5.2 Starting interval and start order

For each Leg, Competitors will start at one-minute intervals.

- For Leg 1 National Competitors will be seeded at the organiser's discretion.
- For Leg 2 Crews will be seeded in the order of their performance on Leg 1.

### Art. 12.5.3 Starting system for special stages

### Art. 12.5.3.1 Start

The competitors start time will be allocated at the start line by the Start Marshal using the RallySafe system. The countdown will be provided within the car via the RallySafe in car display. Time cards will be filled out by the timing marshal from the safety tracking system tablet as per Manual 36, Schedule R, Article 12.5 (2) Method 2.

A false start will be detected by a photocell placed 40cm after the starting line, with the RallySafe system as backup.

### Art.12.5.3.2 System Failure / Start Backu

In the event of a system failure the Start will be by lights -

- RED until 10 seconds before the start
- At 10 seconds the RED and AMBER lights show
- At 5 seconds the RED light goes out and the AMBER light counts down the last 5 seconds.
- The GREEN light shows at 0 seconds and for 6 seconds afterwards.
- There is also a digital clock for competitors.

#### Art. 12.6 Flexi service

Flexi-servicing of 20, 45 and 30 minutes shall permit the removal of the competing cars from a parc fermé to an adjacent Service Park, with common entry and exit time controls. The operational window of flexi-servicing time starting from the arrival of the first car into the parc fermé is declared on the rally itinerary.











#### **RUNNING OF FLEXI-SERVICE AND TIME SCHEDULES**

For the operation of 45 flexi-servicing, crews will enter the parc fermé. Should a car be unable to be restarted and driven under its own power from the Parc Fermé to the service area before the flexi-service, the marshals and/or team personnel shall be permitted to push or tow the car to its dedicated service bay.

Crews may then either enter the Service Park or leave their car in the parc fermé.

The competing car may be driven by an authorised representative of the competitor only once from the parc fermé to the Service Park and vice versa, respecting all the formalities of time card presentation and related penalties.

The competing car may be returned to the parc fermé before the 20,30 or 45 minutes have elapsed without penalty

Should you require further information of this process approach a CRO for clarification.

#### Art. 12.7 Time card changes during the Rally

Time Cards will be issued at Time Controls TC0, TC4A, TC8A, TC10B, TC14A

#### Art. 12.8 Driving conduct

Competitors must note the provisions of Appendix Three, Schedule R, Part One Art 7 and Sch P, A3R.4 of the current MSNZ Manual

The penalty for a breach of these Articles during the Event including Reconnaissance are:

- 1st Traffic infringement \$100
- 2nd Traffic infringement \$500 plus 5 minutes penalty minimum
- 3rd Traffic infringement \$1,000 plus exclusion from the Event.

#### Art. 12.9 Traffic offence notice & accident reporting

Upon entering every Parc Ferme, Competitors are required to notify a CRO in writing if they or any member of their team have received a Traffic Office Notice. The submission of an entry is also an agreement that the New Zealand Police may advise the Organisers of the details of any notices issued.

#### Art. 12.10 Accident procedures / red flags

Crews should refer to the page at the front of the Road Book which deals with the action that must be taken in the event of an accident. Failure to follow these procedures will be reported to the Stewards of the Meeting.

#### Art. 12.11 Retirement

Any crew retiring permanently from the rally must report such retirement to the Organisers as soon as possible using the telephone number in the road book and lodging the "Notification of Withdrawal from Rally Form" in the road book with a CRO, Senior official or Sweeper. Failure to comply will be liable to a sanction at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

#### Art. 12.12 Removal of cars from the final Parc Ferme

All cars must be kept in Parc Ferme until the Stewards have authorised, that Parc Ferme can be opened and final results have been approved. All cars must be removed from the final Parc Ferme at the latest by 1800hrs on Sunday 10 November. The security of these vehicles cannot be guaranteed after this time.

#### Art. 12.13 New Competitors

Any Driver(s) who is competing at one of their first three rally events or is competing for the first time after a period of two years must attend the new competitor special briefing. The venue for this will be at the Rally Secretariat at Pohe Island on Friday 8 November at 1500hrs.

#### Art. 12.14 NZRC competitors

The "Power Stage" will be SS5 Helena 2. If for any reason this stage is interrupted or cancelled the "Power Stage" will then be SS8 Marlow 2. The NZRC Portfolio allows competitors to restart and contest the Power Stage. Accordingly, at the discretion of the Cotc, these competitors may restart and contest the Power Stage. The NZRC Portfolio allows competitors to rejoin at the exit of the next service park. These competitors will not be classified in the final event classification.

For the purposes of NZRC Points allocations, Leg 1 will be considered to begin at TC0 and conclude at TC10A. Leg 2 will be considered to begin at TC10B and conclude at TC18B<sub>2</sub>

#### Art. 12.15 Parc Fermé











Overnight Parc Ferme - All Competitors must respect the itinerary including Parc Fermé.

Saturday Overnight Parc Ferme NZRC Cat 1,2,3\_& 4 Competitors must respect the itinerary including Parc Fermé. For all other competitors, a park adjacent to the Parc Fermé will be available on Saturday night which may be used at the competitor's discretion. As per Article 12.2 TC10A is the final TC for Leg 1 for these competitors and TC10B is the re-joining point for Leg 2.

Should a car be unable to be restarted and driven under its own power from the Overnight Parc Fermé to the service area before service, the officials/marshals and/or team personnel shall be permitted to push or tow the car to its dedicated service bay. The maximum distance that towing is allowed between Overnight Parc Fermé and the Pohe Island Service Park to be 5kms. No other work than towing can be done.

#### Art. 12.16 Official time used during the rally

The official time for the event will be NZDT UTC +13.

#### Art. 12.17 Flying Finish

The Flying Finish warning sign will be placed 100m prior to the Flying Finish.

Three, Two, One, boards will be used to advise the remaining distance to the Stop Control.

#### Art. 12.18 Re-joins

For competitors competing in the International Rally of Whangārei, it is permissible to re-join the event should a competitor fail to complete sections 1, 2, 3 or 4.

#### The following requirements will apply to re-joins;

- Re-joining point: TC2B exit TC from Hikurangi Regroup
- Re-joining point: TC4C exit TC from Service Park Pohe Island
- Re-joining point: TC6B- exit TC from Hikurangi Regroup
- Re-joining point: TC8C exit TC from Service Park Pohe Island
- Re-joining point: TC10B Parc Fermé Out Mitre 10
- Re-joining point: TC14C exit TC from Service Park Pohe Island

Rejoins will be at the sole discretion of the Clerk of the Course, Competitors who wish to rejoin must advise the CRO at the earliest opportunity.

A competitor who rejoins after submitting a Temporary Withdrawl, shall not feature in the final results as per Sch R, Part One, Art 27, of the current MSNZ Manual, Allcomers and NZRC Cat 5A, 5B, and 5C Competitors who finish Leg 1 at the TC10A Parc Ferme In will rejoin at TC10B and be classified in the final results

#### Day One Competitors wishing to compete on Day Two

They may leave their car in a secure parking area located adjacent to the overnight Parc Fermé. They must then report to start Leg Two at TC10B 10 minutes before their due start time. Competitors whose car is not already in Parc Fermé may start from the area immediately outside the Time Control exit area.

#### Art. 12.19 Servicing

An area of approximately 7.5m x 6m will be allocated to each competitor.

Competitors who wish to share service crews or with large trucks and Service Vehicles are requested to make an application with details and dimensions of the extra space required to the Secretary of the event by 25 October 1700hrs.

Service Park allocations will be published on the Notice Board by 0800hrs Thursday 7 November. The service park will be in operation from Thursday 7 November 1400hrs.

Competitors are requested to liaise with the Service Park Manager to oversee the placement of large Service Vehicles; these are to be in place by 1400hrs Thursday 7 November.

Access to the service park is available only to competing cars and Service Vehicles with the correct "Service "decal. All servicing must be carried out using a groundsheet to collect debris and to contain spilled fluids.

#### Art 12.20 Overnight Parc Ferme In - TC10A

TC10A will close at 2030 hrs.
