ARTICLE 1 - ORGANISATION

1.1 Nature of Event

The Event is an S1 Rallysprint closed to members of the North Shore Sporting Car Club.

The Whiteline Tarmac Rallysprint Series will be conducted over Private Roads within the Sydney International Dragway on the following dates:

- Round 1: Thursday 12th October 2023
- Round 2: Thursday 16th November 2023
- Round 3: Thursday 14th December 2023
- Round 4: Thursday 8th February 2024
- Round 5: Thursday 7th March 2024

The Event is a competitive event, designed to test the skill of the driver and co-driver plus the reliability and mechanical condition of the competing vehicle.

1.2 Authority

The Event is to be held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices, the National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport Australia, the National Rally Standing Regulations (NRSR), the Rallysprint Standing Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations which may be issued by the organisers and approved by Motorsport Australia.

The Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Safety 1st, Integrity and Legal, and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au.

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at https://sport.aig.com.au/motorsport-australia/downloads/.

Note: Under the terms of the Motorsport Australia Public Liability Insurance policy, competitors may be required to pay an excess of up to the first \$10,000 of any claim.

The Organiser reserves the right to abandon, postpone or stop the Event in accordance with the NCR.

1.8 Integrity, Alcohol, Drugs and Other Substances

Motorsport Australia's National Integrity Framework and any associated policy (including the Australian Anti-Doping Policy. Motorsport Australia's Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy, the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy), apply to any activity authorised by Motorsport Australia as published at www.motorsport.org.au

Any Participant including the holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol, any drug or other banned substance. In addition to any penalty imposed by Motorsport Australia, a further penalty/s may be applied by Sport Integrity Australia.

Consumption of alcohol in any Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day.

1.9 Smoking

Smoking (which includes e-cigarettes and "vaping") and any naked flame is prohibited within 3 metres of any refuelling/defueling operation.

1.10 Judges of Fact

1.11 Official Notice Board

The Event will be utilising the free Sportity App as the Official Noticeboard for the Event. It is essential that each Competitor downloads the App on their phone and/or tablet so that they can keep up to date with all the Event information moving forward. The app will not ask for any personal details, so it is safe and easy to use. Just follow the simple instructions below to download the app.

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS: Rallysprint Standing Regulations 8.2 (a):

- a) A fire extinguisher complying with Schedule H is NOT mandatory.
- b) Vehicles electing to compete with a fire extinguisher must adhere to Rallysprint Standing Regulations 8.2 (a). **PLEASE NOTE:** This means that if you DO have a fire extinguisher in the vehicle it MUST meet the Rallysprint Standing Regulations (See link above).

MUD FLAPS: National Rally Standing Regulations Vehicles General (VG) - 4.2

a) Mud flaps are NOT a requirement.

REFLECTIVE SAFETY TRIANGLES: National Rally Standing Regulations Vehicles General (VG) – 5.1
Rallysprint Standing Regulations 8.2 (h)

a) Reflective safety triangles are NOT a requirement.

FIRST AID KIT: National Rally Standing Regulations Vehicles General (VG) - 5.3

a) First aid kits are NOT a requirement.

2.2 Entries, Entry Form and Entry Fee

2.2.1 Entry Form

Entries are open when these Supplementary Regulations are published.

The Online Entry Form is to be completed in full and can be completed here: https://nsscc.com.au/twilight-rallysprint/#entries.

There is no other way to enter the Event other than via the online entry form. Any queries about the Entry Form should be sent to the Event Secretary at adriana.pallister@nsscc.com.au

Once an entry has been received, the Driver/Co-Driver will receive an email with a link to re-open the entry form. This will allow the crew to make changes to the entry form and upload any documents that may have been missed when entering the Event. **PLEASE NOTE: The online entry form will close when entries close for each event and no other changes or uploads to the online entry form will be allowed after that time.**

Entries from competitors under the age of eighteen (18) years must be countersigned by a Parent or **Guardian.** For minimum age please refer Article 2.8.

Entries may be refused in accordance with the NCR.

2.2.2 Entry Fee

- The Entry Fee will be \$345.00 per round if your Crew consists of a Driver and Co-Driver
- The Entry Fee will be \$385.00 per round if your Crew consists of only a Driver (SD Entry)

OR SAVE MONEY AND ENTER AS A SERIES ENTRANT:

- The Full Series Entry Fee will be \$298.00 (for a Crew consisting of a Driver and Co-Driver) per round for 5 events (Total: \$1,490.00 to be paid in full).
- The Full Series Entry Fee will be \$330.00 (for a Crew consisting of only a Driver) per round for 5 events (Total: \$1,650.00 to be paid in full).
- The Full Series Entry Fee for Juniors (age 14 18yrs) will be \$255.00 per round for 5 events (Total: \$1,275.00 to be paid in full).

Competitors must pay the full entry fee when completing the Online Entry Form via credit/debit card. No other forms of payment will be accepted. An entry will only be accepted once full payment has been received.

Only competitors whose entry fee has been paid in full by the close of documentation will be permitted to start the Event.





2.2.3 Series Entry Conditions

The series entry for Juniors is only available to persons who are under 18 years old prior to Thursday 7th March 2024. There is a maximum of ten series entries available for Juniors.

A series entry for Juniors must consist of a Driver and a Co-Driver (See minimum age requirements in Article 2.10). A series entry for Juniors is only available to fully paid NSSCC members (not NSSCC Summer Members).

Series entry fees must be paid in advance prior to the Series Entry Deadline of 2000 hrs Monday 9th October 2023.

Series entry fees are non-refundable except where a round is cancelled by NSSCC.

2.2.4 Entry Fee Inclusions and Exclusions

The entry fee includes:

- Motorsport Australia Permit Fee
- Motorsport Australia Insurance (see conditions)
- Event Door Stickers with Competitor Number
- On site Medical Support FIV
- Electronic Digital Timing
- Transponder Rental
- Rental of Sydney Dragway Facilities
- Wear and tear allowance of club equipment
- Cost of food for volunteers

NOTE the entry fee does NOT include:

Venue damage: Competitors will be responsible for damage to equipment such as barriers, fences, concrete walls, lighting masts, lighting towers, curbs, venue plant and machinery etc. (Damage is not limited to these items and damage to any item at the venue will be at the discretion of the event Clerk of the Course). See Article 7 – Insurance.

2.3 Number of Entries

Entries will be limited to 90 plus five (5) reserves. The Clerk of the Course may increase entries up to 110 at his discretion.

2.4 Entries Close

Entries close at 2000hrs on the following dates, or at such a time when the maximum entries and reserves have been filled:

- Series Entries Close: Monday 9th October 2023
- Round 1 Entries Close: Monday 9th October 2023
- Round 2 Entries Close: Monday 13th November 2023
- Round 3 Entries Close: Monday 11th December 2023
- Round 4 Entries Close: Monday 5th February 2024
- Round 5 Entries Close: Monday 4th March 2024

Late entries MAY be accepted AT THE DISCRETION OF THE ORGANISERS.

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2.5 Entry Refund

Individual entry fees will not be refunded for competitors who withdraw within 24 hours of the start of the Event.

A condition of the discounted Series entry is that there will be no refund should the competitor withdraw of their own choosing. A Series entry is not transferrable to any other competitor. If a Series competitor cannot attend one or more rounds, then they forfeit that round and the entry fee.

2.6 Round Cancellation

If a round is cancelled by NSSCC for any reason (such as a weather event or mandatory government restrictions):

- Single Round Entry (Rounds 1 to 5): Your entry will be transferred to the next round.
- Single Round Entry (Round 5): Your entry fee will be refunded.
- Series Entry: A refund of one fifth of your total series entry fee per round cancelled, less \$50.00 will be provided following the final round.

2.7 Change of Entry

Competitors may, at any time up to the close of Documentation Verification, change the vehicle or crew members upon written notification to the Secretary of the Event. A change of driver or vehicle may necessitate the competitor to be reseeded. Please provide all changes in writing to adriana.pallister@nsscc.com.au or via the Online Entry Form system.





2.8 Starting Order

The starting order will be determined by seeding using the NSW Seeding List, Past WTRS Results and / or whatever other information the organisers deem relevant. The seeded list of entries will be available within 24hrs of the start of each round and will be published on the Official Noticeboard (Sportity).

2.9 Crew Eligibility

Crews must consist of two members, a Driver and a Co-Driver, to receive Series Points.

A crew may consist of only a Driver BUT will forfeit any Series Points.

The Competitor and both crew members shall be required to hold a current Motorsport Australia Speed Licence or superior.

A crew member may only enter each event only once as a Driver and must use the same vehicle (unless a replacement vehicle is authorised as per Table 2.1) but they may compete with different Co-Drivers throughout the competition. **Only one Co-Driver will be nominated to appear on the results**.

Co-drivers will not be required to compete in the same vehicle throughout the Event.

Should both crew members wish to drive, then this will be permitted under the same crew eligibility rules BUT a separate entry form and entry fee will be required for each combination of crew.

2.10 Crew Minimum Age

The minimum age for competitors for this event is:

DRIVER: 14yrs: BUT MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN EXPERIENCED RALLY or CIRCUIT DRIVER OR CO-DRIVER WHO IS 18yrs OF AGE and over.

The Approval of the Co-Driver in the case of a Junior Driver is at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

CO-DRIVER: 14yrs

2.11 NSSCC Membership

This event is closed to current financial members of North Shore Sporting Car Club only.

2.12 NSSCC Summer Membership

Crews who are current financial members of a Motorsport Australia Affiliated Car Club (other than NSSCC), may apply for a discounted Summer Membership via the North Shore Sporting Car Club website: https://nsscc.com.au/portal/. To comply with a single club Motorsport Australia event requirement, this membership is discounted to a single cost of only \$25.00 and will cover all 5 events in total (the expiry date will be 31st March 2024). To be eligible for this membership YOU MUST SHOW PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP of another car club at event documentation.

PLEASE NOTE: this option is not applicable for the junior entry discount option. Juniors must be full financial members of NSSCC.

2.13 Competitors Briefing

A competitor briefing will be held at Event Headquarters at 1715hrs on the day of the Event.





ARTICLE 3 SCRUTINEERING & DOCUMENTATION

3.1 Scrutineering:

The Scrutineering process will be different for:

- Vehicles with a Motorsport Australia Log Book
- Vehicles without a Motorsport Australia Log Book

Scrutineering for Vehicles WITH a Motorsport Australia Log Book:

A vehicle with a Motorsport Australia Log Book does NOT need to be checked by a Scrutineer.

The Competitor, Driver and Co-Driver must, prior to the Event fill out a copy of following Self Scrutiny forms. The forms can then be uploaded to the Online Entry Form:

- 1. Event Entry Self-Scrutiny Statement of Vehicle Compliance:

- 2. The Competitor must also upload images of the Vehicle Log Book including the vehicle details page and the event log. These images will need to be uploaded onto the Online Entry Form.

Spot checks on competing vehicles will be made during the event/s by the Event Scrutineers. The Vehicle Log Book must be ready to be checked at any time during the event/s.

Scrutineering for Vehicles WITHOUT a Motorsport Australia Log Book:

A vehicle without a Motorsport Australia Log Book will need to be checked by an approved Motorsport Australia Rally Scrutineer. There are two options for Scrutineering:

- Regional Scrutineering: Competitors are requested to have their vehicles scrutineered by a
 Motorsport Australia Regional Rally Scrutineer in the 2 weeks prior to the Event. The list of
 Regional Rally Scrutineers is available at
 http://www.rallynsw.com.au/info/organisers/scrutineering/
 - o The competitor must download the Event Scrutineering Form prior to attending regional scrutineering. The form can be downloaded from Sportity.
 - If the correct form is not used, the vehicle will need to be re-scrutineered at the Event.
 The Competitor is to fully fill out the form prior to visiting the Scrutineer (the Scrutineer will ONLY sign the form).
 - o The completed form can be then uploaded onto the Online Entry Form.

It is recommended that regional scrutiny be utilised where possible to reduce demand at the venue on the date of the Event.





2. **Event Venue Scrutineering:** Event Venue Scrutineering is available at the Sydney International Dragway Scrutiny Bays on the Eastern (dragstrip) side of Rally HQ (Blue Building). See Appendix A location map for details. Event Venue Scrutineering is available between 1500hrs and 1715hrs on the day of the Event.

There is limited time for Event Venue Scrutineering.

- o The Event Scrutineers will have a copy of the Event Scrutineering Form.
- o Please attend Scrutineering BEFORE you complete Event Documentation.
- o Please line up with your vehicle in the Scrutiny Bays and wait to be Scrutineered.
- o It is the Competitors responsibility to present their vehicle to the Scrutineer in a timely manner to ensure that enough time is allowed for the vehicle to be checked for compliance. It is recommended crew arrive early, as it's expected to be busy and delays will occur.
- o Once Scrutineered, please bring the completed form with you to Event Documentation.
- 3. The Competitor, Driver and Co-Driver must, prior to the event fill out a copy of following Self Scrutiny forms. The forms can then be uploaded to the Online Entry Form:

Compulsory equipment which will be checked at scrutiny includes (Please also refer to Table 2.1):

- Safety Cage Structure and Safety Cage padding, (cage not mandatory) but if installed in compliance with Motorsport Australia Manual; Technical Appendix Schedule J;
- Full harness seat belts (not mandatory) but if installed, in compliance with Motorsport Australia Manual; Technical Appendix Schedule I;
- Fuel shall be in compliance with Motorsport Australia Manual; Technical Appendix Schedule G;
- Helmets and apparel in compliance with Motorsport Australia Manual; Technical Appendix Schedule D;
- The car in a "ready to rally" condition, including driving lights (if they will be used).
- Competitors are advised that any in-car video or moving film cameras must be installed in the vehicle prior to scrutiny so that the camera and its mounting can be inspected.



3.2 Documentation

Documentation is located at the Sydney International Dragway Carpark – in the Blue building. See Appendix A map for location details.

It is highly recommended that as much of the documentation be provided prior to the event via the Online Entry Form.

At Documentation Verification competitors will be required to present the following documents **if not** already provided via the Online Entry Form:

- Completed Event Scrutineering Form/s specified in 3.1
- Motorsport Australia Licence for the Driver / Co-Driver (as per table 2.1)
- NSSCC Car Club Membership Driver / Co-Driver
- Other (Motorsport Australia) club proof of membership if the crew person is using a NSSCC "Summer Membership"
- Motorsport Australia Disclaimer for the Driver and Co-Driver/s:

3.2.1 Fastlane Documentation

A Fastlane documentation service will be offered to all competitors who have fully completed their entry form and have provided the Event Secretary with current documentation listed above including Motorsport Australia Licence and NSSCC Club Membership details.

To qualify for Fastlane documentation, all documents must be electronically submitted via the Online Entry Form by the close of entries for each event. You will be notified by the Event Secretary if you qualify for Fastlane Documentation. If you qualify, you will only need to present at documentation:

- Completed Scrutineering form (If you are attending Event Venue Scrutineering only)
- Photo Identification for both the Driver and Co-Driver/s

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ARTICLE 4 EVENT DETAILS

4.1 Rallysprint Headquarters

Rallysprint Headquarters will be located at the Rallysprint Service Park, Blue Building, within the Sydney Dragway in the main carpark. (See Appendix A for maps)

4.2 Directions to Rallysprint HQ and Service Park

Sydney International Dragway, Ferrers Road, Eastern Creek, NSW - GATE A. (See Appendix A for maps)

4.3 Servicing

All servicing will take place at the Service Park. For reasons of competitor and service crew safety, no Servicing or Refuelling is permitted outside designated Service Areas as identified in the event documentation.

No service vehicle may drive on a competitive stage during the running of the Event without the express permission of the Clerk of the Course. If vehicle recovery is required, service crews are asked to contact Rally Headquarters for instruction.

There is NO pump fuel available within the Service Park. Competitors will need to provide their own fuel supply. A Shell service station is located approximately 3km away on the corner of Brabham Drive and Great Western Highway, Eastern Creek.

ARTICLE 5 GENERAL INFORMATION

5.1 Reconnaissance

As per the Event Schedule, prior to the start of competition, each competitor will be given 2 runs of each course as reconnaissance at non-competition speed. Observers will be on course to monitor competitors during reconnaissance and any competitors deemed to be driving at excessive speed or in an unsafe manner will be excluded from the Event. **RECONNAISSANCE IS COMPULSORY.**

5.2 Road Book / or Course Markings

A Road Book will not be issued. A course map is available on the event web site here https://nsscc.com.au/twilight-rallysprint/

The finish of stages will be indicated by a Yellow Chequered Flag board prior to the timing line and a Red Chequered Flag Board on the timing line.





5.3 Starting and Running Order

Cars will run in numerical order. Crews will depart start controls at no less than 30 second intervals. Such departures shall be single vehicle starts.

It is the competitor's responsibility to be ready on time and in order at the start of each run. Any competitor failing to report to the start in the correct order may forfeit that run.

5.4 Pacenotes

The use of pacenotes is permitted for this Event.

5.5 Penalties

Hitting a Chicane or No-Cut Corner Bollard and gaining an advantage – 5 seconds

Incorrect side of bollard and gaining an advantage – 30 seconds

The Clerk of the Course reserves the right to take into account all official documents when compiling the results, including control cards and to correct any verified recording errors.

5.6 Timing and Results

The primary timing system used will be an electronic transponder system triggered at the start and finish lines recording time to 1/10th of a second at the Flying Finish with a transponder in each competing car.

Should a car have more than one driver entered, a separate transponder will be supplied for each driver. Each driver is responsible for ensuring their transponder is fitted at the time of their competition run. A secondary system will use a large display clock at the start line and a laser beam.

Results shall be determined by a cumulative time from the best three runs of the first five competitive runs of the course. For promotional or sponsorship commitments additional runs may be approved at the Clerk of the Courses discretion.

Single Driver entries (SD Class - All entries with no Co-Driver) will be included in results as a separate class BUT will not be eligible for outright awards. A separate class award will be awarded for the SD Class.

Provisional results will be available 30 minutes after the last car completes the event. The results are official and final 72 hours after the Provisional results are published, should no protests on the results be received.

Protests must be lodged in accordance with the NCR.





5.7 Finishing Qualifications

As per table 2.1, only the best 3 attempts at each stage will contribute towards results for each competitor.

Competitors must start each section from a standing start under the vehicle's own motive force and must complete the section without assistance from other vehicles in a reasonable time as determined by the Clerk of the Course or their nominee

Any crew that enters or leaves the course in other than the prescribed direction shall be deemed to have aborted that run and no time will be recorded.

5.8 Medical

A paramedic will be in attendance for the duration of the Event.

5.9 Event Signage

It is a condition of entry that all competing cars display the event and/or series sponsor signage provided at documentation whether they are competing in the full series or not. The event signage supplied is outlined in Appendix B.

5.10 Re-Joining

An aborted run or a Did Not Finish (DNF) for a run does not constitute a retirement. If a crew presents ready to start at their nominated start time for the next run they may continue the event.

5.11 Retirements

Any crew retiring from the event must notify the Clerk of the Course.

An accurate reason for withdrawal and any damage to vehicles or other property must be supplied. An Incident Report must be completed if a competitor or other person sustains any injuries and the Organisers may require any crew to complete an Accident Report or other Motorsport Australia forms.

Failure to comply with these conditions may result in competitors being referred to the Stewards who may consider an act as a Breach of Rules in accordance with the NCR and with further reference to these regulations.

5.12 Postponement, Abandonment or Cancellation

An event may be abandoned, postponed or cancelled for reasons of force majeure in accordance with the NCR and:

- if there are less than 35 entries; or
- by reason of "Force Majeure".





ARTICLE 6 INSURANCE

Occupants of any vehicle competing, must comply with the event entry conditions.

PROPERTY DAMAGE:

Each competitor/crew is liable for any damage which they cause, however a claim may be applicable under Motorsport Australia insurance, through the insured entity, which is the Event Organiser, to compensate for the cost of that damage. An excess of \$5,000 is payable where an insurance claim is made. If the cost of any damage is less than this excess, the competitor/crew is required to pay only the actual cost of rectification, in which case where the cost of that damage is known the organisers reserve the right to invoice the competitor/crew at the event and payment of any such invoice is required on the issuing of that invoice.

EXAMPLE: If a plastic barrier is damaged (and witnessed by a judge of fact) a cost of \$400 per barrier will be invoiced by NSSCC on the night and must be paid immediately.

PERSONAL INSURANCE:

Although Motorsport Australia Licence holders are covered by Motorsport Australia personal accident insurance, all crew members are encouraged to have their own personal health insurance and be a current member of an appropriate ambulance service.

ARTICLE 7 WORKPLACE HEALTH & SAFETY ADVICE FOR ENTRANTS AND SERVICE CREWS

All personnel are asked to assess the risks associated with any practice that they are involved with and take action to minimise the potential injury to themselves and any other personnel. Please observe the following rules to assist our event to be a safe one.

- No smoking within the service park. Smoking (which includes e-cigarettes and "vaping") and any naked flame is prohibited within 3 metres of any refuelling/defueling operation.
- Use a liquid proof ground sheet beneath the car during all servicing and re-fuelling operations
- Jack stands must be used when working under vehicle
- Suitable fire extinguisher required to be readily available when refuelling

Prior to the Event, please consider how the above will impact all aspects of your team's involvement and come prepared to comply with the provisions on the day of the event. Non-compliance places the safety, health and wellbeing of yourselves, other crews, officials and volunteers at risk.





ARTICLE 8 PASSENGERS

Each Round will include a Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the Motorsport Australia MSPRA Policy.

ARTICLE 9 EVENT AND SERIES POINTS

- 10 points will be awarded to the winner.
- 2nd place will receive 9 points.
- Through to 10th place who will receive 1 point.
- Class points will be allocated in the same way.

Drivers and Co-Drivers will automatically be included in Series Results. If your Crew does not have a Co-Driver, you will not be eligible for Series Points.

Crews will accrue points individually and not as teams.

Where there is more than one Co-Driver in the same vehicle, points will ONLY be allocated to the 1st nominated Co-Driver. Co-Driver changes must be made in writing to the Event Secretary at least 24 hours prior to the event to be eligible for points. Only the 1st nominated Co-Driver will be shown on the Entry List.

Where a Co-Driver competes in more than vehicle, they will only score points in the highest placed for Outright and Class.





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ARTICLE 10 AWARDS

10.1 Event Awards

Event Trophies will be awarded to Drivers and Co-Drivers (individually) as follows:

- 1st Outright
- 2nd Outright
- 3rd Outright

Certificates (or Trophies) will be awarded to 1st placed Drivers and Co-Drivers (individually) in the following classes:

- 2wd up to and including 2000cc
- 2wd over 2000cc
- 4wd up to and including 3500cc
- 4wd over 3500cc
- Juniors 1st 2nd and 3rd (Driver only)
- SD (Driver Only)

10.2 Series Awards

Overall Series Trophies will be awarded to Drivers and Co-Drivers (individually) as follows:

- 1st Outright
- 2nd Outright
- 3rd Outright

Overall Series Certificates (or Trophies) will be awarded to 1st placed Drivers and Co-Drivers (individually) in the following classes:

- 2wd up to and including 2000cc
- 2wd over 2000cc
- 4wd up to and including 3500cc
- 4wd over 3500cc
- Juniors 1st 2nd and 3rd (Driver only)

Should there be less than 3 entries in a class or category the Organisers reserve the right to combine or not award for those classes or categories.

The Organisers reserve the right to add to these awards.





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
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APPENDIX A - SERVICE PARK/RALLYSPRINT HQ/SCRUTINY LOCATION MAP









APPENDIX B - VEHICLE NUMBERING AND SIGNAGE REQUIREMENTS

The following stickers are compulsory on <u>all</u> vehicles entered in this event and are provided by the Event Organisers at Event Documentation:

- **Door Plate Stickers:** To be placed at the top of both front doors. Door Plate Stickers are usually 450mm(W) x 150mm(H).
- **Yellow Door Numbers:** To be placed near the Door Plate stickers on the front doors towards the front of the vehicle.
- **Smaller Yellow Numbers:** To be placed on the top passenger side corner of the windscreen, and on the matching place on the rear windscreen.
- **J Stickers:** For juniors under 18 years. To be placed in visible places at the front and back of the vehicle.
- **SD Sticker:** For Single Drivers ONLY. To be placed on the top passenger side corner of the windscreen.
- NSSCC Sticker: To be placed on the LH and RH front guard.
- PLEASE NOTE: These and any other partner stickers provided at documentation MUST BE on the vehicle before commencing competition.
- **Non-Compulsory Stickers:** The Bumper Sticker does not need to go on the competition vehicle and is for your personal use (it is great on a toolbox or on your everyday car). Bumper Sticker pictured below.
