Art. 1.1 Preamble

An electronic entry application must be confirmed by way of personal signature by the competitor by the latest at administrative checks. The entry form must be accompanied by a copy of the valid competitor's licence. ASN accepts an equivalence between National and International Licences for drivers and co-drivers exclusively participating in an FIA rally competition organised in their home country A change of competitor is permitted up to the close of entries. **Only the competitor entered in the event will be allowed to make this request.**

Art. 4.6 Entry fee refunds

The entry fee shall be refunded in full

- if the event does not take place
- to teams whose entry application is rejected

The organiser may partially refund entry fees, if a competitor cannot take part in the event due to a duly proved case of force majeure.

Art. 5. Insurance Cover

Art. 5.1 he entry fees include the insurance premium to insure civil liability of competitors against all third party risks whilst taking part in the rally.

Art. 5.2 The indemnity provided under their special insurance is € 300 000.00, in aggregate. The insurance company isTBA...., and the number of the insurance policy will be publish by bulletin before the event.

Art. 5.3 This cover will become effective for competitors running within the itinerary of the rally, from the start of the first competition element until the end of the rally or at the moment of permanent retirement or disqualification. In case of withdrawal, the time taken into account will be the closing time of the following TC. Cars having retired and re-started the next Leg shall not be considered to have permanently retired.

Art. 5.4 The organizer declines liability for any accident caused to competitors and competing cars during the duration of the event, even in case of cataclysm, riots, demonstrations, vandalism, etc. Competitors and crew members will have to suffer all consequences (damages, fines and penalties) created by any accident.

Art. 5.5 Vehicles carrying "Service" and "Auxiliary" plates and/or any other special plate issued by the organizer (apart the Safety and Zero cars of the organizer) are not covered by the event's insurance policy. These vehicles circulate under the sole responsibility of their owners and the organizer bears no responsibility for them.

Art. 5.6 Vehicles used by the crews during reconnaissance, even if bearing the event's specific sticker, must be insured by their owners. The organizer bears no responsibility for such vehicles. The same rule applies to those vehicles used by drivers who participate in reconnaissance only.

Art. 5.7 Accident notification

In case of accident during the rally, the competitor or his representative must immediately notify it to the Clerk of the course.

Art. 6. Advertising and Identification

See Appendix 4 of these SR "Decals and positioning of supplementary advertising".

Competition numbers and rally plates according to the 2021 FIA RRSR, Article 27, will be issued by the organizer. Numbers and plates must be affixed on the rally car before the car is brought to scrutineering and must be visible throughout the duration of the rally.

The following stickers will be affixed to the car by the Officials of the rally:

- at scrutineering a "check" sticker, size 10 cm wide x 6 cm high (over the right-side rear window)

Art. 6.1 Obligatory organiser's advertising

Rally plate: 42 x 21 cm **52st Rally Bulgaria** Competition number size: 67 x 17 cm **52st Rally Bulgaria**

The organiser will provide each crew with the number identification (67x17cm), which must be affixed to their car in the stated positions prior to scrutineering. Each panel shall be placed horizontally at the leading edge of each front door, with the number at the front. The top of the plate shall be between 7 cm and 10 cm below the lower limit of the window. **It is not allowed to cut the panel.**

Art. 6.2 Optional organiser's advertising

Additional organiser's advertising: Plate 50/20cm, **Sponsor's logos** Spaces on the vehicle that must be kept free: position on front driver and passage door

Art. 7. Tyres

Art. 7.1 Regulations regarding tyres which may be used during the rally

See Art. 13 of the FIA RRSR (tyres and wheels).

Hand cutting of tyres is allowed in this event under the following conditions:

- The hand cutting must be in accordance with the patterns submitted by the tyre manufacturer to the FIA.

Art. 7.2 Control

Tyres will be marked throughout the rally in accordance with the procedure given by the Scrutineers.

Art. 8. Fuel

Art. 8.1 Fuel requirements

All type of fuel must follow Appendix J Art. 252.9. (RRSR Art. 62).

Art. 8.2 Refuelling

The refuelling is allowed only in the designated refuelling areas or remote refuelling areas designated by the Organizer in the Road Book.

Crew members and support personnel are entirely responsible for compliance with fire safety regulations during the refuelling. Only team members with the team passes will be allowed to go in to the refuelling area.

Art. 9. Reconnaissance of Special Stages

Reconnaissance will be according to FIA RRSR Art. 35. The schedule for the reconnaissance is published in Appendix 2 of these supplementary regulations. Each car must be identified with a reconnaissance car number supplied by the organiser. Rally cars used in the event may not be used for reconnaissance.

Art. 9.1 Registration procedure

Registration of the recce-car is obligatory before the start of reconnaissance. Registration will take place at the Rally HQ according to the programme. The reconnaissance cars must comply with Art. 35.1 and 35.2 of 2023 FIA RRSR has to be registered in the Rally HQ with the official plate. The crew will receive identification number for their car (identification number). Identification number must be affixed on the top of front windscreen and rear window during reconnaissance at all the times. If the crew during the

reconnaissance, for any reason is forced to replace the reconnaissance car, the secretariat must be informed about the details of the new reconnaissance car

Art. 9.2 Specific regulations

During reconnaissance, all national traffic regulation must be followed, including but not limited to the speed limits. Please note that the Special Stages will not be closed to public traffic during reconnaissance. The organizer may reduce the allowed speed individually by marking the areas in the road book and along the route. Speeding during reconnaissance and / or shakedown will be penalised according to FIA RRSR Article 34.2

Art. 9.2.1 Passages

Crews are authorized to drive a maximum of 3 times through each special stage in accordance to the schedules given in Appendix 2 (special stages run twice are considered as one special stage).

Art. 9.2.2 Reconnaissance procedure

During the reconnaissance crews have to stop at the start and the stop of each special stage to allow the marshals to record their passage.

Art. 9.2.3 Speed limit

The reconnaissance of the special stages has to be done at reasonable speed in accordance with Traffic laws of Bulgaria. The maximum speed set for the reconnaissance of the SS is 80 km/h, except for those areas in which there are speed limit signs or in settlement areas (50 km/h or 30 km/h) or other limitations marked in the road book. Infringement of the rules and mainly over speeding on public roads will be also controlled and fined by the Traffic Police accordingly to traffic laws of Bulgaria.

Art. 9.2.4 Direction

Each crew may drive the special stages only in the direction of the rally. The crews must always enter and leave the special stages through the start and stop controls.

Art. 9.2.5 Restriction of reconnaissance

As from the publication of the rally Supplementary regulations, any driver, or his co- driver, or any other team member who has entered or intends to enter the rally and who wishes to drive on any road which is or might be used as a special stage in that rally, may only do so after he has obtained the Organiser's written permission. This shall not apply when the person is known to live along the specific road. Failure to respect this rule shall result in the driver being reported to the Stewards.

Art. 9.2.6 Number of persons on board

During each passage through a special stage, a maximum of 2 persons are permitted in the car.

Art. 9.2.7 Illegal reconnaissance

Illegal reconnaissance performed out of the Time Schedule or performing more passages than permitted will be reported by the Stewards.

Art. 9.2.8 Speeding

Speeding will be penalized according to the Art. 34 of 2023 FIA RRSR.

Speeding during reconnaissance will incur a fine applied by the Clerk of the Course as follows: each km per hour over the speed limit: 25 EUR/km.

Art. 9.2.9 Traffic laws.

- Throughout the rally, both crew members must have a valid driving license and must observe the Bulgarian traffic laws. Infringements will be referred to the Clerk of the Course.

- In the case of an infringement of the traffic laws committed by a crew participating in the rally, the police officers or officials having noted the infringement must inform the offender thereof, in the same way as for normal road users.

-Penalties for infringements during the competition element of the rally:

- a) First infringement:
- Speeding: A fine of €25 per km/h over the speed limit, applied by the clerk of the course,
- Other than speeding: A penalty will be applied by the Stewards.
- b) Second infringement:
- Speeding: A fine of €50 per km/h over the speed limit, applied by the clerk of the course,
- Other than speeding: A penalty will be applied by the Stewards.
- c) Third infringement: A 5-minute time penalty applied by the clerk of the course.

d) Fourth infringement: Disqualification applied only by the Stewards

Art. 9.3 Collection of speed control checking devices

All reconnaissance cars must be equipped with a speed control checking devise. This devise can be collected according the programme in chronological order (SR Art. 3)

Art. 10. Administrative checks

Art. 11.1.1 Scrutineering, mandatory documents

- Cars' complete certified homologation
- SOS / OK board (DIN A3 format)

For each car of the **FIA Priority Drivers**, one spare gearbox and one set of spare differentials (front and/or centre and/or rear) may be used in each rally. These spare components and those fitted to the car will be marked/sealed at initial scrutineering. These cars must have their sump guards removed for sealing of gearboxes and differentials and be kept with the car for the purpose of weighting.

The crew must show the car's homologation form as well as any appendices to this form. If these are not submitted the Stewards may pronounce a penalty which may go as far refusal to allow the car to start.

After scrutineering, if a car is found not to comply with technical and/or safety regulations, the car must be made to comply and re-scrutineered at a time and location mentioned in the supplementary regulations. If the car will still not comply with the regulations, the Stewards, upon the proposal of the Chief Technical Delegate, may refuse the start.

The installation of the tracking system will be checked at scrutineering.

Art. 11.1.2 Timetable for scrutineering

Detailed schedule for scrutineering will be published in a numeric Bulletin together with provisional starting order and will be announced on rally web page

Art. 11.2 Mud flaps

Mud flaps are not mandatory. See ISC Appendix J, Article 252.7.7

Art. 11.3 Windows

See ISC Appendix J, Article 253.11

Use of tinted windows is not authorized in accordance with Article 253.11 "Windows/nets" of Appendix J of the FIA International Sporting Code

Art. 11.4 Drivers' safety equipment

All items of clothing including helmets and FHR (Front Head Restraint) intended to be used, e.g. HANS devices, must be presented for scrutineering. They shall be checked for compliance with Appendix L, Chapter III.

See also Appendix 5 of these regulations

Art. 11.5 Noise level

The maximum noise level permitted is 103 dBA. Cars not complying with this rule will not be allowed to start. The noise will be measured with a sonometer regulated at "A" and "SLOW", placed at an angle of 45 degrees to and a distance of 50 cm from the exhaust outlet, with the car's engine running at 3 500 rpm.

Art. 11.6 Special national requirements

According to the traffic law it is compulsory for the cars passing through road sections and the special stages, to drive with original fitted headlights switched on. Complying with this provision will be checked by judges of fact. Any infringement will be reported to the Stewards.

Art. 11.7 Installation of the safety tracking system

All competitors must make provision in their cars for the installation of the Safety Tracking System. All further details will be published on <u>www.rallybg.com</u>. The GPS will be installed at Service park before presentation of the rally car on the scrutineering. Competition cars not equipped with the GPS monitoring device will not be allowed to start. Any attempt to tamper with, to manipulate or to interfere with the tracking device fitted to the competition car or any device that fails to record a trace due to external interference will be reported to the Stewards who may impose a penalty up to exclusion. GPS units and brackets will be disassembled from the rally cars by the crew after the finish time control (TC12D). In case of retirement the GPS will be given to the provider GPS unit's team by 17:00 on Sunday 03.09.2023

Art. 11.8 DEPOSIT FOR SAFETY TRACKING SYSTEM

A deposit of **150 EURO** must be paid in cash at the administrative check. Deposits are refunded in cash at the Rally HQ after the equipment is returned in full working condition.

Art. 12. Other procedures and regulations

Art. 12.1 Ceremonial start procedures and order

The Ceremonial start is mandatory for all crews and competing cars and will take place on the area of Tzar Asen I Square , Veliko Tarnovo, 5005, Bulgaria on Friday September 1.2023 at 20:00 h.

All competing cars shall enter the holding area placed at the Tzar Asen I Square , Veliko Tarnovo, 5005, Bulgaria till 19:30 h.

Ceremonial start will be run following the numerical competition order. After the Ceremonial start competing cars will be at competitor's disposal.

Art. 12.2 Start procedure for special stages

Start Procedure for Special Stages will be as follows:

- On the start position the crew stops when instructed by marshals;

- When the start marshal confirms the car is on the right start position – 50 cm before electronic controlled start line the car must stay immovable till start moment and the team must visually follow the light signal of light shield;

- On the light shield the time will be shown;
- The Time Card shall be given back to the crew in the minute preceding the start;
- Starting lights RED 10 seconds ready to start;
- Starting lights GREEN Go, the road for start is free;

- If the crew's car crosses the electronic controlled start line before the red lights go out, false start will be fixed automatically, penalization for false start accordingly to RRSR point 48.6;

- The start marshal makes the final decision about false start and notes this in the start report;

- In case of start system malfunction; the start will be given by marshal in accordance with article 48.3. of FIA RRSR

Art. 12.3 Start order and intervals

- Starting order for Leg 1 shall be as follows:
- Priority drivers according to the position they have in ERT.
- All the other competitors at the discretion of the Organizers.
- Start order for Leg 2:

- The start order for Leg2 shall be based on the classification at the finish of the final special stage of the Leg 1.

- Start interval for the Priority drivers' cars will start at two-minute intervals. All other cars will start at one-minute intervals.

Art.12.4 Time keeping

Time keeping is performed with accuracy 1/10 of a second.

Timing will be recorded at the finish line, using electronic beams, and be backed up with stopwatches.

Art.12.5 Service procedures

A limitation for servicing, refuelling and changes of mechanical parts is introduced in 2023 FIA RRSR. Services can be entered only with Service car (SERVICE).

Auxiliary vehicles are not allowed to enter the Service Park. Further details concerning the entrance of service and auxiliary vehicles are given in the Service Road Book.

Art. 12.7.1 Speed limit

Maximum speed in the Service Park may not exceed 30 km/h. Speeding will be penalized by the Clerk of the Course according to FIA RRSR.

Art. 12.7.2 Behaviour within the service park

Only competition vehicles and service vehicles with affixed service plates "SERVICE" (issued by the Organiser) are allowed to enter into the service area. Damages of the surface of the Service Park has to be avoided. Nails, screws and other fittings for fixing anything on the surface of Service Park is not allowed. For damages at the service area assigned to the crew, the crew is liable.

Crews are obliged to put a sufficiently large plastic ground sheet under the competition vehicle as long as service works are carried out. No sustainable and in avoidable damages shall be caused by service works. Refuelling is allowed only at the foreseen refuelling area and in accordance with art. 58 of FIA RRSR. One fire extinguisher minimum 6kg must be present at each service place. After the rally the service park has to be handed over in tidy condition. Crews are responsible for the removal of their waste and sewage.

Art. 12.8 Chicane

Due to safety reasons, chicanes will be positioned on the rally route to reduce speed. The positions of the chicanes are described in the Road book and will be marked during reconnaissance. Judges of facts names will be given in a bulletin. The judges of fact will observe these points for the right passage of chicane.

Art.12.9 Re-start after retirement

Art.12.9.1 General

Any crew which has failed to complete a section may be assumed to re-start the rally from the start of the next section following the overnight regroup unless they confirm otherwise with the Clerk of the Course by completing of the form located in the rear of the road book ('final retirement') and lodging it with the organiser as soon as possible and, if feasible, before the publication of the re-start list.

This shall apply to any car which has been not classified on the grounds of exceeding the time limit or has failed to report to a control, but shall not apply where car has been excluded for breach of eligibility requirements, traffic infringements by a decision of the Stewards.

The car must report to the overnight Parc Fermé prior to the next Leg no later than 1 hour before the scheduled start of the first car. New time for scrutineering will be 1 hour before the start of Leg 2.

The car must retain its original body shell and engine block as marked at pre-rally scrutineering. The competitor must be represented during the re-scrutineering at a time to be advised by the organizers.

Art.12.9.2 Penalties

For all crew which re-start a time penalty will be applied. For every stage or super special stage missed, this time penalty will be 10 minutes.

This time penalty will be added to the fastest time of the driver's class for each missed stage, which shall include the special stage or super special stage on which the crew has retired.

Should retirement occur after the last SS before an overnight regroup, the crew will nonetheless be deemed to have missed that last special stage or super special stage.

Art. 12.10 Finish procedures

The competition part of the rally ends with check in on Time Control TC13D. After the podium all cars will be convoyed by Marshals to the Final Park Fermé will be on area of Service Park - Park Fermé

Appendix 5 – E Extracts from FIA ISC Appendix L relating to overalls, helmets and any other safety requirements

All competitors are reminded of Appendix L of the FIA International Sporting Code, in particular its Chapter III - Drivers' Equipment.

Helmets (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 1)

All crews must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the following FIA standards:

- 8858-2002 or 8858-2010 (Technical List N°41),
- 8859-2015 (Technical List N°49),
- 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP (Technical List N°69)

Frontal Head Restraint (FHR, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3)

All crews must use FIA approved FHR systems homologated to FIA standard 8858. Approved FHRs, anchorages and tethers are listed in Technical List N° 29. See also helmet compatibility chart in Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3.3.

Flame-resistant clothing (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2)

All drivers and co-drivers must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2000 standard (Technical List N°27) or 8856-2018 (Technical List N° 74). Please pay special attention to the prescriptions of Art. 2 concerning embroidery and printing on flame-resistant clothing (manufacturer certificates etc.) <u>as well as concerning the correct wearing of the clothing elements! See also Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Article 53.1.</u>

Biometric Devices (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2.1)

Drivers may wear a device to collect biometric data during racing.

- If the biometric device is integrated into a protective garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856, the garment shall be homologated to FIA Standards 8856 and 8868-2018.
- If the biometric device is a stand-alone device, then the device must be homologated to FIA Standard 8868-2018 only. This device must be worn in addition to the garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856.

Cameras

Cameras must be installed before Scrutineering acording Art. 253, Appendix J

Wearing of jewellery (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 5)

The wearing of jewellery in the form of body piercing or metal neck chains is prohibited during the competition and may therefore be checked before the start.

Protective padding

Where the occupants' bodies could come into contact with the safety cage, flame retardant padding must be provided for protection.

All tubes of the cage identified on Drawing 253-68 and all roof reinforcements must be fitted with paddings in compliance with FIA standard 8857-2001 type A (see Technical List n°23).

Each padding must be fixed in such a way that it is not moveable from the tube. Application:



For all categories.

Wearing of jewellery (Appendix L, Chapter III, Чл. 5)

The wearing of jewellery in the form of body piercing or metal neck chains is prohibited during the competition and may therefore be checked before the stUn.

Appendix 6 – Competitor safety

1. SOS OK signs

1.1 Each competing car shall carry a red "SOS" sign and on the reverse a green "OK" sign measuring at least 42 cm x 29.7 cm (A3)

1.2 In the case of an accident where urgent medical attention is required, when possible the red "SOS" sign should be immediately displayed to the following cars to assist.

1.3 Any crew which has the red "SOS" sign displayed to them, or which sees a car which has suffered a major accident where both crew members are seen inside the car but are not displaying the red "SOS" sign, shall immediately and without exception stop to render assistance. All following cars shall also stop. The second car at the scene shall proceed to inform the next radio point. Subsequent cars shall leave a clear route for emergency vehicles.

1.4 In the case of an accident where immediate medical intervention is not required, the "OK" sign must be clearly shown by a crew member to the following vehicles and to any helicopter attempting at assist.

1.5 If the crew leaves the vehicle, the "OK" sign must be displayed so that it is clearly visible to other crews.

1.6 Any crew which is able but fails to comply with the above rules will be reported to the Clerk of the Course.

1.7 Any crew retiring from the rally must report such retirement to the organizers as soon as possible, save in case of force majeure. Any crew failing to comply will be subject to a penalty at the stewards' discretion.

2. Use of Red Flag

2.1 On passing a displayed Red Flag, the driver must immediately reduce speed, maintain this reduced speed until the end of the special stage and follow the instruction of any marshal or intervention car drivers. Flag will be displayed at all radio points preceding the incident. Failure to comply with this rule will entail a penalty at the stewards' discretion.

2.2 A crew has been shown the Red Flag will be given a notional time for the stage as per Article 52.5 of the 2021 FIA RRC Sporting Regulations.

2.3 The Red Flag will be displayed to crews only on the instruction of the Clerk of the Course. The flag may only be displayed by a marshal wearing a distinctive jacket preferably of the recommended colour stipulated in Appendix III and on which is marked the radio point symbol. The time of deployment of the flag will be recorded and notified to the stewards by the Clerk of the Course.

2.4 No flag other than the Red Flag may be deployed at any point in a special stage.

2.5 A Red Flag must be available at each stage radio point (situated at approximately 3-4 km intervals).

Appendix 7 - MONITORING GPS SYSTEM ONI®

1. General provisions

All competition cars have to be obligatorily equipped with the ONI® tracking system. ONI® tracking system is owned by the Automobile Federation of Bulgaria and will be rented to the competitors. Eventual destruction, non-return or damage of the unit has to be paid for by the competitor to the provider in accordance with the applicable price list. In case of non-returning GPS tracking system immediately after the event, the fine 150 euro will be imposed to the competitor.

2. Distribution of the

ONI® tracking system ONI® tracking system contains following parts:

- tracking unit with display
- tracking unit holder
- power supply cable
- combined antenna roof
- control panel
 - containing:
 - OK button to cancel the alarm / confirm red flag
 - SOS switch for calling emergency.

ONI® tracking system will be installed to every rally car before each event. Detailed information will be published no later than during road books issuing. After arrival to the scrutineering, device administrator will install the tracking unit, antenna and control panel. Antenna and power supply cables can be purchased by the crew for personal ownership. At the end of the rally or after retirement, the tracking unit or complete tracking system must be returned to the device administrator. Usually the devices are collected in the last service area or before finish of the rally.

3. Installation of the unit in the car

3.1 To fit the tracking unit with display, antenna and control panel, it is necessary for the competitor to follow exactly the Installation guide, to keep the unit in good condition and to protect it against damage and fouling (especially the connectors) during the time.

3.2 Foreign and one time rally participants will receive a rental version of the set equipped with magnetic roof antenna.

3.3 Control panel with OK button and SOS switch is in one box for which the competitor has to choose a suitable place for fitting within the reach of both crew members. It is obliged to prepare everything for its installation prior to the scrutineering.

4. The unit operation during rally

To operate the unit, the crews have to meet all instructions as mentioned in the User's guide. Operation during events on SS:

Accident (crash detection)

- The unit evaluates the situation and sends info about accident to rally control. Crew cannot affect this message.

- The display shows message: Are you OK? Confirm.

- 10 s after this question, the siren wails for next 15 s

- If the crew pushes **OK** button, this information is sent to rally control and information about accident is not sent to the unit of following cars in the stage.

Stop in SS

- When the car stops in SS, it is counted as an obstacle. Unit signals to the crew by sound siren and text, that they have stopped. This signal takes 15 s.

- If the crew doesn't push OK, warning message is sent to the rally control and also to other cars, which are currently in the stage arriving to the obstacle.

- With pushing the OK button the crew confirms that they are okay, on the display is shown message OK and information about obstacle is not send to the unit of next cars in the stage.

Request for help

- Changing the switch is confirmed by SOS message on display, also the siren sounds.

- The siren sound can be cancelled by pushing OK button.



Red flag

- When the rally control hangs out the red flag, the display shows big message RED FLAG (with red background) and the siren sounds.

- Crew has obligation to confirm receiving the red flag by pushing the OK button and to reduce the speed according to the sporting regulations.

- The siren sound can be cancelled by pushing OK button.
- The red flag on display can be cancelled only by rally control.

5. Speed checking during reconnaissance

During reconnaissance the crew is obliged to follow traffic rules of Bulgaria. Not respecting this rules, especially exceeding the speed limits, will be monitored via ONI® tracking system. This checking doesn't exclude other checks, i.e. police controls according to their standard procedures.

ONI® tracking system for reconnaissance

Tracking system is checking the speed in every moment during the reconnaissance. Every crew will pick up the ONI® recce tracking unit together with roadbook. Installation of the unit and its using during reconnaissance is obligatory for all crews during the whole schedule of reconnaissance according to the art. 3 Reconnaissance schedule. For speed checking during the reconnaissance, NCL 21 units are used. NCL21 unit is started during roadbook issuing before starting of reconnaissance. For whole reconnaissance

the unit is working on its own battery. It is not necessary to plug the unit to any power supply. It is possible to place the unit on metal surfaces magnets are implemented in the unit. Not using the unit in a rallv car during reconnaissance will be fined. Every attempt to falsify, manipulate or infringe the unit for reconnaissance or any device, which will make impossible to collect data of because external interference will be reported to



the stewards who can penalize the crew up to refusing the start. Decision regarding seriousness of the offence and its repeating is in Clerk of the Course's authority. For exceeding the speed limit, sanctions can be given according to supplementary regulations or championship regulations.
