1 Introduction

The FIA Motorsport Games is a unique multidisciplinary event that sees drivers competing in the colours of their national flag. In 2022, the FIA will hold the second and extended version of the Motorsport Games with Marseille as host city, while Circuit Paul Ricard will provide the racing venue. Additional activities will strengthen the event's scope.

The second edition of this unique global competition, where motor sport drivers will compete for their nations, will give drivers the opportunity to represent their country through a single entry per discipline, proudly featuring their national flag and national symbols throughout the event.

Gold, Silver, and Bronze Medals will be awarded to the top three in each category, contributing towards an overall medals table, which determines the overall result of the FIA Motorsport Games and the winner of the FIA Motorsport Games trophy. The overall Regulations have been amended to allow more Nations to compete for the final prize. In this way, only the 8 best results per nation will be taken into consideration for the overall final ranking. Also, individual regional rankings will be implemented to highlight the best National Teams on a regional basis.

The event guarantees great entertainment value with an impressive opening ceremony taking place in the host city, multiple disciplines of motor sport (from the very entry level categories all the way to the pinnacles of the sport) in various locations, on and off-track activities and national teams for fans to support.

The FIA Motorsport Games global footprint, limited barriers to entry, and grassroot-to-professional levels of racing also make it a highly effective means of promoting social responsibility. Gender equality is promoted through compulsory mixed gender disciplines, aiming for at least 20% female representation among all participating drivers, and staging "Girls on Track" activations during the event.

The Esports Cup provides an equal, accessible, and inclusive participation opportunity for drivers with disabilities. For example, this was successfully proven by the participation of a deaf driver in the first event edition back in 2019, an example which is to be followed by other drivers around the globe. The FIA Motorsport Games encourages athletes on a grassroot level and promotes young drivers by the inclusion of the Karting Slalom cup (for athletes between 14 and 16 years of age) and the Formula 4 cup (for athletes between 16 and 18 years of age) among the events disciplines.

FIA aims to fulfil its environmental responsibility with the provision of Electric Karting and the first hybrid powered Formula 4 cars by an exclusive supplier, as well as continuing having a carbon offset fuel supply, first introduced in 2020. Having Circuit Paul Ricard already obtaining a 3-star accreditation from the FIA environmental accreditation programme, the federation is also working towards achieving the same accreditation for the entire event in close cooperation with the event's promoter.

This is just a glimpse of why the FIA Motorsport Games 2022 is all about rethinking motor sport events as it will bring a host of new opportunities for athletes to develop their understanding of the spirit, the world of international motor sport, the close connection between sport, social- and environmental responsibility, and the way in which the event and the teams can have a positive impact on the future of motor sports.

The Motorsport Games 2022 – start now!

This rally will be run in compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code (ISC) including appendices, the FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations including appendices, the WADA/NADA Codes, and the FIA Anti-Doping Regulations, as amended from time to time. The French Road Traffic Regulations shall apply. Unless provided otherwise by these Supplementary Regulations, the provisions of the above Rules and Regulations shall apply.

Any modifications, amendments and/or additions to the Rules and Regulations shall be made in the form of numbered and dated bulletins. Additional information will be published in the Rally Guide. All FIA regulations can be found at https://www.fia.com/regulations.

The various documents will be written in English.

2 Values & Legacy

2.1 YOUNG DRIVERS' PROMOTION

The Motorsport Games empower all levels, from grassroot to professional, by limiting the barriers of entry to the different disciplines.

2.2 SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

Gender equality

The participation in certain disciplines requires the presences of both genders to field at least 20% female drivers.

This approach goes along with "Girls on track events" staged at the FIA Motorsport Games.

2.3 ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

The FIA is taking action to promote the adoption of environmental best practice across motor sport. As part of this global initiative, the FIA is committed to



align the environmental performance of the second edition of the FIA Motorsport Games, taking place in 2022 at the Circuit Paul Ricard in France, to the requirements of the "Three-Star" level of the FIA Environmental Accreditation Programme. This represents the highest level, which had been already attained by the Circuit Paul Ricard as the event's venue and is now aimed to be earned by the event itself. This will be achieved under the supervision of a dedicated Environmental Officer who will work closely with the event's promoter, the circuit team, and relevant members of the Motorsport Games organization committee.

In line with this commitment, the FIA will ensure that:

- the FIA Motorsport Games follows all relevant local, regional, and national environmental laws and regulations.
- all major stakeholders and partners are involved and engaged in the process, including during the preparation phase.
- the FIA Motorsport Games becomes an example to follow in terms of environmental management.

SRO commitment

The event promoter integrates the following points into their organisational structure to promote environmental sustainability:

Energy:

- HVO fuel is used for the generators. Travel:
- staff policy promotes sustainable travel. The number of flights is kept at a minimum and hybrid / electric car will be rented at the event if available.

- participants' transport and accommodation the travel agency includes green hotels and offsetting flight options to their offers to the participants.
- transportation at the circuit train options, bikes or electric scooters are available on-site.

Waste:

- a special waste management procedure for the protected rally areas is in place including mats and oil spill kits.
- recycled plastic is used for the events material wherever possible.
- proper waste sorting is overseen by the caterer and no single use plastic is considered.
- the event staff is equipped with metal bottles to avoid the usage of plastic cups or bottles.

ASNs commitment

To act responsibly for the greater social and environmental benefit, all ASNs, delegations and competitors are requested to commit to the program by respecting the environmental policy:

- avoid bringing plastic on-site.
- avoid air travels (if possible).
- prioritise carpooling, bus shuttles, public transport, etc.

5 ENTRIES

5.1 Closing date for entries

See programme in chronological order (SR Art. 3) and FIA RRSR Art. 23.

5.2 Entry procedure

This rally has the status of a restricted international competition. The competition is restricted by invitation only.

Competitor's registration will be opened by the FIA on 15 June 2022 and will close on 26 September 2022. Applications must be made to the National ASN that the competitors wish to represent, including the crew line-up as well as the Car they will take part with. The ASN will then post the entry on the FIA Motorsport Games entry platform.

Drivers listed on the 2022 list of Regional Rallies Priority Drivers are not allowed to participate to the Rally2 and Rally4 Cups.

All drivers and Historic Rally Cup co-drivers are eligible to represent a nation which is not their current ASN so long as they hold the passport of the nation they are representing and start permission from their current ASN. The nationality of Rally2 and Rally4 Cups co-drivers is free.

All competitors, drivers and co-drivers must hold current and valid FIA Grade:

- Rally2: ITC-R licence needed (See FIA Appendix L Art. 2.9)
- Rally4 & Historic: ITD-R licence needed (See FIA Appendix L Art. 2.7)

or above international licences, as well as authorisations issues by their ASN(s).

Entries must be submitted in accordance with the FIA RRSR Art. 22 – Art. 24. See also FIA ISC Art. 3.8 – Art. 3.14

5.3 Number of competitors accepted

5.3.1 The number of competitors shall be limited to:

- Rally2 Cup: 30 cars
- Rally4 Cup: 30 cars
- Rally Historic Cup: 20 cars

For drivers entered with a Rally2 car complying with 2022 Appendix J, Art. 261, it will be possible to use the old part after applying a joker (except reliability and safety jokers). An FIA technical passport is mandatory for Rally2 cars. A valid FIA HTP is mandatory for Historic Rally Cup cars.

5.5 Payment

Payment will be made online on FIA Motorsport Games entry platform.

5.6 Entry fee refunds

The entry fee shall be refunded in full

- if the event does not take place
- to teams whose entry application is rejected

The organiser may partially refund entry fees if a competitor cannot take part in the event due to a duly proved case of force majeure.

5.8 Service Park

The service park is based on the main central parking of the circuit, in front on the control tower. All the rally teams are under big tents split on 4mx8m bay with electricity for every team. Each team should use their own stand barrier to delimitate their area.

They must use the provided tent as service area. An additional surface as an extension of each service bay will be available on the back to allow to put service trucks/vans or tents.

The overview of service area is detailed on Service park layout on Appendix 7. A communication will be published with the allocation bay closer to the rally.

5.9 Insurance Cover

The Organiser will provide by a further bulletin documentary evidence proving that all competitors are covered by adequate third-party insurance.

6 Advertising and Identification

All competitors, drivers and co-drivers must adhere to the Graphical Charter as set in art. 13 in terms of the

decoration of the car, driver and co-driver overalls, service area and team clothing, as well as any restrictions. Any infraction will be reported to the Stewards.

7 Tyres

7.1 Tyres for the Rally2 and Rally4 Cups

See Art. 13 of the FIA RRSR (tyres and wheels).

The types and quantities of tyres will be limited as follows:

The compound allocation will be published in Bulletin 1.

7.2 Tyres information car

The tyre supplier will run a tyre info car approximately 1h00 before each stage, in order to assist and provide information of stages condition to all the drivers.

7.3 Tyres for the Historic Rally Cup

During the rally, there shall be a maximum of 10 tyres said "dry" permitted. Tyres must be uniquely identified with a barcode (or such other method as may be prescribed) and registered with the FIA eligibility delegate before the start of the Competition.

Due to the lack of availability of "wet" tyres in their appropriate sizes, the cars listed as exceptions in the appendix to the FIA authorized wet tyre list may register a maximum of 14 tyres before the start of the Competition. Thus, there is no allowance for additional "wet" tyres.

Checks for compliance with these regulations may be undertaken at any time during the rally and any discrepancies will be reported to the stewards. The number of "wet" tyres is not limited. Only the "wet" tyres as per the FIA authorised tyre list can be used.

8 Fuel

All type of fuel must follow Appendix J Art. 252.9. (RRSR Art. 62).

Except as detailed in Art. 58 of FIA RRSR, crews may refuel only in the designated Refuelling Zone.

Rally2 cars must use only ETS Extra Max fuel. Competitors wishing to be delivered on site must place their order on <u>https://www.myetstorace.com/products-for-races/?race_id=12462</u> before the 6 October 2022.

Rally4 cars must use only pump filling station fuel (gasoline type 98) from the Circuit Paul Ricard petrol station (GPS coordinates: N 43° 15' 8.987", E 5° 47' 39.48").

All Rally2 and Rally4 cars are required to fit FIA-specified refuel couplings. They must transport the adaptor in the car and show it a pre-rally scrutineering.

All Historic Rally Cup cars may refuel in the designated Refuelling Zone and/or at the pump filling station with fuel from the Circuit Paul Ricard petrol station (GPS coordinates: N 43° 15' 8.987", E 5° 47' 39.48"). For Historic Rally Cup only: Additional refuelling zones will be indicated in the road book.

9.3 Registration procedure

Recce cars must be registered with a separate form. A reconnaissance sheet (Appendix 8) should be filled in and give back at latest at administrative checks with the description of the car (model, color and registration number).

Each car must be identified with a reconnaissance car sticker supplied by the organiser. Rally cars used in the event may not be used for reconnaissance.

9.4 Specific regulations

During reconnaissance, all national traffic regulations must be followed, including but not limited to the speed limits. Please note that the Special Stages will not be closed to public traffic during reconnaissance. The organiser may reduce the allowed speed individually by marking the areas in the road book and along the route. Speeding during reconnaissance and / or shakedown will penalised according to FIA RRSR Article 34.2.

9.5 Tracking device

All reconnaissance all rally cars must be equipped with the VDS tracking device. This device will be collected during the administrative checks before the recce.

See fitting instructions in art. 11.3 of this document.

The deposit form on Appendix 2 should be fill up and gave back at recce registration on Tuesday at latest.

10 Administrative checks

10.1 Documents to be presented

To keep the time required for the administrative checks to the necessary minimum, make sure to bring and present the following documents:

- Competitors' licence
- Driver's and co-driver's competition licences
- Driver's and co-driver's ID cards/passports
- Driver's and co-driver's valid driving licences
- ASN authorisation for foreign competitors (if required)
- Completion of all details on the entry form
- Car registration papers
- Authorisation of the owner of the vehicle (if different from the competitor)
- Valid car's HTP (for the Historic Rally Cup)
- Recce car details to fill in the recce registration sheet (See Appendix 8)

10.2 Location and Timetable

The administrative check will take place as per SR art.3 from 16h00 until 19h00 on Tuesday 25th in the Hall of the main control tower of the circuit. Position 13 "the pit building". See Circuit Paul Ricard layout Appendix 3.

11 Scrutineering, Sealing and Marking

11.1 Scrutineering, venue and time

Individual times will be published by Bulletin. Any delay entering to Scrutineering will be penalized by 50 EUR for each 10 minutes delayed. If the delay exceeds 30 minutes, the competitor will be reported to the Stewards. Cars may be presented at scrutineering by a representative of the team.

- Filled out driver/co-driver safety equipment form
- Cars' complete certified homologation form
- FIA Technical Passport (if applicable)
- SOS / OK board (DIN A3 format)

The correct installation of the tracking system will be checked at scrutineering.

11.3 Installation of the safety tracking system



GEOLOCALISATION INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

The VDS GPS unit will be handed over to administrative checks switched on and must remain so for the duration of the rally.

It must be installed inside the cockpit, fixed to the rollbar with a clamp (Rilsan or Colson type). It is forbidden to position it on the gearbox tunnel or between the seats.

Provide a USB power supply (the length of the supplied cable is 0.8 meters).

The box will be started when it is distributed and will not be stopped until the end of the rally. It will therefore be powered for the duration of the event.

Verification of proper operation is the responsibility of the competitor who will have to ensure the solidity of its fixing in the passenger compartment. Under no circumstances can VDS be held responsible for a competitor leaving the road or any other incident in the event of the GPS falling in the competition car.



The GPS starts up when charging or with a long press of 5 seconds on the On/Off button located on the right side of the box (fig 1) the box vibrates and the LEDs flash: it is OK.



WARNING

- It is imperative to connect the GPS box with the supplied cable to your USB power supply.
- The GPS unit and the USB cable must be returned to the entrance of the arrival parc fermé.
 In case of abandonment, it is imperative to bring them back to the PC Course, so that the deposit is returned to you!!! Under no circumstances should you return them to a steward!!!

12.4 Podium and closing ceremony

After the finish of the rally, a medal presentation ceremony will be held at the podium in the ASN village. The presence of the first three crews (Drivers and Co-drivers) of each Cup is mandatory.

The attendance of the first three crews (Driver and Co-driver) of each Cup is also compulsory at the FIA Motorsport Games closing ceremony, which will take place at the Circuit Paul Ricard on Sunday 30 October from 18:00 to 22:00.

12.5 Super Special Stages, regulations and order



For the running of SS14, a dedicated briefing will be done to the 3 participants of each category.

The 3 cars will be split by colors on the road book:

- The car 1 starting on the right side will have to follow the red arrows at every road book deviation during the whole duration of the stage.
- The car 2 starting in the middle will have to follow the blue arrows at every road book deviation during the whole duration of the stage.
- The car 3 starting on the left side will have follow the yellow arrows arrows at every road book deviation during the whole duration of the stage.

A dedicated RB will be issued for every car. See the examples bellow.



12.6 Special procedures and activities

10.6.1 Availability of participants

Participants who park their vehicles in the Parc Fermé upon passing the finish line, must remain available by phone (mobile) until the final classification have been posted.

10.6.2 Classification

A final classification will be drawn up for each Cup and determined as follows (including penalties):

- 1st First placed crew in SSS14, including Section 6 penalties
- 2nd Second placed crew in SSS14, including Section 6 penalties
- 3rd Third placed crew in SSS14, including Section 6 penalties
- From 4th According overall classification after Section 5 including all penalties

The Final classification will not be distributed after the event. The Final classification will be published on the Digital Notice Board.

12.7 Private testing

Drivers are prohibited from testing within a 200 km radius around the Circuit Paul Ricard during the two weeks preceding the rally, except if a request is made by the entrant to the organiser. This request must include:

- exact location (incl. GPS point),
- start and end date,
- driver(s) name(s),
- car(s) chassis number(s).

Any test session is limited to a maximum of 1 day per driver.

The approval must be issued in writing by the rally organiser to the competitor with a copy to the FIA. The organisers are considering the idea of organising a joint test session on Tuesday 25 October. This depends on the number of interested teams.


13 Decals Rules and supplementary advertising

In accordance with Article 6 of the SR and on top of RRSR Articles 27 to 29, all cars, drivers and co-drivers must adhere to the FIA Motorsport Games Brand Guidelines in terms of the decoration of the car, driver overalls, service area and team clothing, as well as any restrictions. Any infraction will be reported to the Stewards.

13.1 French National regulation for registration plates

Due the French traffic law, it is forbidden to drive a rally car on the road with registration plates. For this reason, every crew will receive 2 additional numbers 210mm X 140mm white background, black numbers. The front number MUST be stick on the top right of the front windscreen (see the below description) and the back on the center of the rear registration plate position.





13.2 Motorsport Games regulation

COUNTRY FLAG – FULL CAR WRAP

• Country flag MUST be applied to the entire bonnet and side

• Full car should ideally be finished in primary national colour with side panel of car to feature crop of country flag if possible

COUNTRY NAMES – DOOR DECALS

• Country names MUST be written in English on the left side of the car, and in the native language on the right side of the car

- Official font to be used: Pilat Heavy / Kerning: Optical / Tracking: +40pt
- Type size varies depending on number of characters in country name but must be minimum 150mm in height
- Please find guidelines and examples in the sample diagram (subject to change depending on car model, wheelbase length or position of air intake)
- Colour: white (or black if needed to create best contrast with the livery)

COUNTRY NAMES – DECAL ON BONNET

• Country name to fit centrally on the front of bonnet from one headlight to the other (Depending on name length & gaps on car bonnet/bumper)

REAR REGISTRATION PLATE

• FIA Motorsport Games Team Plate as supplied

RACE NUMBER

• Race number sticker to be placed on each side of the car by the country name and on the bonnet, right side



• Windshield Banner reserved for the promoter

17 Country Information

17.1 Entry Visa Information

A short stay (Type C) sports visa allows access to the Schengen area for up to 90 days within any 180- day period, for sports purposes. The visa inserted in the relevant travel document bears the name of the territories in which the holder is entitled to stay.

HOW TO APPLY FOR A SPORTS SCHENGEN VISA

- determine the Schengen country where you will be spending the most time on your trip (in this case, France). You will need to apply for the Sports Schengen Visa through one of that country's consulate/embassy in your own country;
- select "Sports" as the reason for travelling;
- determine how many "Entries" to the Schengen area you need;
- gather your Basic Required Documents, as well as the documents required for a Sports Visa;
- fill out your application. Different Schengen countries provide different ways of accessing applications; you might have to use an online application portal or fill out a printed application by hand;
- pay the application fee (standard fee for adults is €80). You will likely have to submit a service payment with your visa application. This is a separate cost from the visa fee, which you will likely pay in person, at your subsequent interview appointment at a Visa Application Centre. Please note that these fees are nonrefundable.

Submit your application

Schedule an interview appointment. Interviews are conducted in person either at the embassy or the consulate of the country you are applying to, or at a Visa Application Centre associated with the consulate of the country you are applying to.

When to Apply

You should apply for a Sports Schengen Visa at least 15 days prior to the day you intend to travel, and no earlier than 6 months before you leave.

Where to Apply

You should apply for the Sports Schengen Visa through the embassy or the consulate of the country you are travelling to in the Schengen area, or through a Visa Application Centre associated with the consulate of the country.

If you are travelling to multiple countries in the Schengen area, you should apply through the embassy, the consulate, or the associated Visa Application Centre for the country in which you will spend the most time. And in

case you plan to spend equal period of time in those multiple countries, then you need to apply at the embassy, the consulate, or the associated Visa Application Centre of the country where you will arrive first.

Processing Time for Sports Schengen Visa

The processing time for a Sports Schengen Visa is generally about two weeks (15 days). In rarer cases, consulates can take anywhere between 30-60 days to render a decision on an application.

The FIA will support your delegation and National Team taking part in the FIA Motorsport Games 2022 in the process of Visa application, if required.

17.2 Climate

The weather in and around the Marseille & Paul Ricard area in October has an average high- temperature of 19.7 $^{\circ}$ C (67.5 $^{\circ}$ F), and an average low-temperature is 14.5 $^{\circ}$ C (58.1 $^{\circ}$ F).

The average daily wind speed in October at Paul Ricard is around 23 km/h: the equivalent of about 14 mph, or 12 knots. In recent years, the maximum sustained wind speed has reached 111 km/h, which is the equivalent of around 69 mph, or 60 knots.

Sunrise: 08:05 - Sunset: 18:33

17.3 Time Zone

The region of Provence-Alpes-Côte-d'Azur, France, is currently in the Central European Summer Time (CEST) zone, UTC +2 and will change to Standard time (Central European Time (CET), UTC +1) starting on October 30, 2022.

17.4 Language

The official language in France is French. English is relatively commonly spoken in all areas.

17.5 Currency

The currency in circulation in France is the Euro (EUR).

The EU sets the broad VAT rules through European VAT Directives and has set the minimum standard VAT rate at 15%. The standard VAT rate in France is 20%. It applies to most goods and services.

17.6 Water

Tap water in France is safe to drink, and in line with the FIA Motorsport Games 2022's sustainable approach.

17.7 Electricity

Power in France runs on a 230V supply voltage and 50Hz. 120VAC/60 HZ equipment is not compatible, you will need a voltage converter or transformer to use device rated for this power supply in France.

The Type E plug has two round pins (diameter 4.8 mm, centres spaced 19 mm apart) and a hole for the earth pin. The Type E plug is round, and the Type E socket has a round recess.



17.8 Traffic Rules

In France:

- Speed limit in town: 30 to 50 kph
- Speed limit on roads: 80 to 90 kph
- Speed limit on roads: 110 to 130 kph
- Speed limits are signposted and need to be strictly respected.
- It is forbidden to drive under influence of drugs or with an alcoholic rate higher than 0.50 g/l
- Use of phone when driving is forbidden unless the use of hands-free device
- Emergency vehicles (ambulances, police, fire brigade) have priority
- Front and back seatbelts are compulsory all the time
- All driver and car documents should be always available in the car. (Driving license, insurance and registration documents)


